PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Another year has passed and we meet to-day to give an account of our Fourth Year's Work. The good news comes from Miss Emery that six more Branches have fallen into line, and have become a part of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, and that seven Junior Branches have also been formed. In our own Diocese we have to welcome three Parishes, making in all Nineteen, as willing workers of the Louisiana Branch, and others will follow as soon as they are able to do so.

The Junior Branch has done nobly, and these young members work with a vim and enthusiasm not possible with us older ones, and they are fitting themselves to carry on the work far more ably than we have done. Their young hearts and willing hands will take a more loving interest in all Missionary work, and love being the inspiration to do in His Name, what may it not accomplish? God will bless their efforts, and make them strong to take up and carry out what our feeble hands could not do.

It is with sincere gratitude to Him who strengthens the weakest effort to serve Him, that this year's report shows that Miss Suthon's stipend has been faithfully met, she is as you know our Japan Missionary, and was undertaken in Memoriam of Mrs. Catherine M. Pritchard. Grace Memorial Church, Hammond, has been assisted to the amount of \$60, and the little Cashier Valley Chapel, N. C. \$10.00. What shall be undertaken for the coming year? You have heard what is the work of a Deaconess, what the requirements are in regard to age and education. Our Bishop thinks it will be a good thing to do. Shall we look for such a person and send her on to New York or Philadelphia? Do not fear that the means may not

be forth coming. If the office of a Deaconess is of God's ordering, the sum needed will be found.

On the 8th of August, Mrs. Ann M. Lobdell of St. John's Church, Laurel Hill, entered into rest in her 80th year. She was always a devoted Churchwoman, her heart was in everything connected with the Church she loved, from the moment she heard of the organization of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, she became a member and wrote wishing it was in her power to contribute largely to the object. You all know, that since the war to what a condition the planters have been reduced, and it always means privation of some necessity when they contribute to outside objects. Hearing that the old fashioned feather fan might meet with a ready sale, she went to work, and from the sale of fans in the past three years has contributed \$55.65 to the cause of Missions. She wrote the 16th of April, "I am grateful that He still allows me strength to help in some small way, I feared my fan making would have to be given up, as the last I did were very troublesome, but it is the only way I can help the great cause, I will try and make another shipment before summer." That shipment was made in May, and a few days after she was laid on the bed which she was never again able to leave. Have any of us done as much for the "Great Cause" as that weak, feeble and grand old woman of whom it can be said: "She did what she could" for the Lord and Master she loved so well.

Shall we not in Memoriam of her, Mrs. Ann M. Lobdell take up the work of finding the proper person, and having her educated as Deaconess to work in the Diocese? Whatever our hands find for us to do that meets with the approval of our Bishop let us go forward and do with all our hearts.

We need not fear failure, it is our Masters's work, and undertaken in His Name we are assured of God the Father's blessing on it.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Annual Meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church on Wednesday, December 3rd, at 11 A. M.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. Herman Duncan. After calling the roll, the recording secretary read the minutes of the Semi-Annual meeting which was held on April the 17th, in the Church of the Annunciation; the minutes were approved by the Board. The corresponding secretary read a report which gave evidence of much labor on her part, with gratifying results. The treasurer's report was next in order and was satisfactory in every way.

The Junior Auxiliary sent in a report which was read by the President, (Mrs. Richardson.) Rev. Mr. Duncan read a report from Miss Emery, a summary of Missionary work of Woman's Auxiliary, also read an article on the subject of Deaconesses. Miss Emery's letter of greeting to the Woman's Auxiliary was read, and listened to with interest.

Miss Hampton wrote thanking the Ladies for assistance rendered, and giving flattering accounts of progress made in Cashier Valley. The president wished to know if the Ladies would contribute \$10. to the church in Cashier Valley; 'twas voted upon and decided in the affirmative.

Corresponding secretary read a letter from Miss Suthon (our Missionary to Japan) giving an interesting account of her work and progress.

The treasurer read a letter from Grace Church, Hammond, after which the president wished to know if the Board would continue their assistance to Grace Church, 'twas decided to give \$5. per month, at the suggestion of the vice-president.

The president here read her annual address, full of interest to all who know her, and who are acquainted with her broad views of philanthropy and her generous Christian charity. The president said the Bishop is anxious that this diocese shall educate a dea-

coness; she made a motion that the Woman's Auxiliary take the matter under consideration, Mrs. Reese seconded the motion and requested a report at the meeting of the Branch in April. Mrs. Ferguson made a motion that the president investigate the matter and report at the next meeting, the motion was carried.

The treasurer make a motion that we change the present method, and hold the Annual Meeting in the Spring during the session of the Council. Miss Wharton seconded the motion, 'twas put to vote and carried.

As the time for holding the Annual meeting had been changed, the election of officers was postponed until that time. There being no further business the president declared the meeting adjourned.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts, to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing Societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of this Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together, and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary Box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed for the work of the Association; to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the Societies to greater efforts in working for Missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. The Managers are authorized to hold meetings at such time and places as they please, in their own locality.

ARTICLE XI

All Societies who desire it will be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Corresponding Secretary. Also, delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three of the officers or Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding, and Recording Secretaries shall be ex officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
