PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

After hearing the statements of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, it will be found that the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions has not stood still, but has made a healthy growth during the past year. More parishes have come into the organization, more work has been undertaken, and more accomplished, in consequence of the growing interest in Missions and Missionary work. Those who were present at the semi-annual meeting (which occurred when the Diocesan Council was in session) will remember with pleasure Miss Emery's interesting and instructive address, and that it was then decided that this Branch would give half the amount necessary towards sustaining a female Missionary in Japan. *We must never half do anything!* Let us assume the entire amount, six hundred dollars (\$600). Miss Suthon is from our midst, is one of our own people, and she is known to many of us. It should, therefore, be the ambition of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to maintain her in her work in Japan. Let us assume the entire amount for the support of Miss Suthon, as a memorial to Mrs. Catherine Pritchard, who was a lifelong member of St. Paul, the same church of which Miss Suthon was a member, and from which she went to labor in her far distant field.

A few more members from each parish will easily enable us to raise the amount.

The little church at Hammond can not *yet* stand alone, and the pledges made to the little church in Cashier's Valley must not be forgotten.

The first work undertaken by the Louisiana Branch was fostering and helping Grace Church, Hammond, which is *Diocesan*; the help given the little Missionary Church in North Carolina is *Domestic*, and what has been undertaken in Japan is *Foreign* Missionary work, so that in the three years of the existence of this weak Branch, beginning at home, as in the case of a pebble cast in the waters, the waves gradually enlarge and extend to the shore, we find the circle of our Missionary work widening into Foreign lands. Christ, our Master, has indeed been with us in directing what should be done. He has moved the hearts of His followers to obey His commands, and the *means* will be found to carry on all the work undertaken in His name.

In the last report of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, Miss Emery states that "During the past year a decided advance has been made in organizing and adding to the effectiveness of children's work for Missions. The Connecticut, Michigan, and Western New York Branches have taken the lead in this matter." Shall not Louisiana follow their example, and

can not a Junior Auxiliary to the Board of Missions be organized ere another year rolls by? In some of the parishes the children are already interested in the Indian Missions. Let it be our duty to bring the children of the parishes to work together, and, with God's help, a strong body of earnest young people, imbued with the Missionary spirit, will soon be found in our midst.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The sixth Semi-Annual meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in the basement of Trinity Church on Thursday, May 2, 1889. It being the second day of the meeting of the Council, service was held by the Rev. Mr. Philson. After the administration of the Holy Communion, the President called the business meeting to order. After the reading of the minutes, reports were read by the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer. The President then introduced Miss Emery, of New York, in a few feeling words. She said:

It is with no little pleasure that at this meeting I present to you Miss Emery, the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, whose name and work are so familiar to you. Miss Emery has visited nearly all of the Diocesan Branches, as well as many of our missionary fields in the Territories. She will have so much to say to you that I may be pardoned if I do not intrude upon your time more than to say that from reports read by the Secretaries and the Treasurer we have reason to rejoice in the growing interest manifested in Missionary work, when it is remembered that we organized only two and a half years ago, and at the close of the first year five parishes formed the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, and our total membership numbered only 177. Sixteen parishes have now united with us, and our memberships have increased to 620. Our growth must necessarily be slow, but may we not hope it will be a steady and healthy one until all have united with us in this truly Christian

work? We need the hearty coöperation of our pastors; without it we can not hope to have any but lukewarm interest manifested by their flocks, and it is their fault our quarterly meetings have not taken place in the larger churches of the city. I do so sincerely wish the heart of every woman could be stirred up to realize what this work is; that in doing it they are striving to obey their Master's last command, which ought to be motive enough, and when they know they have gladdened that of one of God's servants, who, in spite of many difficulties and privations, is doing his duty, is it not reward enough? And what should we not do for those who have left country, parents, and friends to carry the Gospel to those whose hearts have never been made glad with the knowledge of God's infinite love to His sin burdened creatures? But I will say no more, for I feel Miss Emery will say more to interest you and to stir up your hearts than I can.

Miss Emery delivered a most interesting address. She held the closest attention of her hearers. She told of the struggles maintained by Christian women in Foreign and Domestic fields. After expressing her pleasure in being brought into close communion with the women of New Orleans, Miss Emery gave the history of the Auxiliary since its organization eighteen years ago. She told of its small beginning; feeble encouragement at first from the clergy generally. She is glad to give encouragement in these latter days. She spoke earnestly upon the necessity for universal giving by all church men and women. Time and again, she said, one heard objections made to assessments of small stations whose people were limited in means. Poverty, she said, was no excuse for failure to help others. The weakest members of Christ's Church on earth had received illimitable blessings from the Father, and nothing should prevent them from enjoying the privilege of assisting others. There are three things necessary to make work in behalf of missions fruitful: The first is, to pray; the second, to know; and the third, to give to missions. Last year when accounts were all in the total amounted to \$276,154.10, given by the Woman's Auxiliary.

At the close of Miss Emery's address the President suggested to the ladies the propriety of supporting the Missionary who accompanied Miss Suthon to Japan. The motion was carried. The Corresponding Secretary read a letter from North Carolina asking for assistance. Being put to the vote, the request was granted. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts, to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing Societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of this Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together, and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary Box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed for the work of the Association; to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the Societies to greater efforts in working for Missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. The Managers are authorized to hold meetings at such time and places as they please, in their own locality.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it will be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Treasurer. Also, delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three of the officers or Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding, and Recording Secretaries shall be ex officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
