PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

In giving a statement of the past year's work of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, it is with pleasure, we are able, in the midst of some disappointment, to mention two causes for sincere thankfulness.

The first, is the growing interest of the Junior Branch, whose zeal has steadily increased, as shown by the number of new members added in the first parishes organized and by other parishes falling into line. Should they go on improving in the future as they have done in this their second year's work, they will soon outstrip the Seniors. God grant such may be the case, that all they do may be better and more wisely done, and with a greater desire to serve their Lord and Master with true loving hearts, than has been possible with those who have grown old before undertaking this work.

It is also with sincere gratitude we can point to the report of our Colored Sisters of St. Luke's Church, who have indeed shown what they are capable of, under the good and wise guidance of their Rector the Rev. P. A. Morgan, who, believing in missionary work, has taught his people while struggling to build their own church, it is their duty to do for others as well.

The cause for discouragement during the past year has been the lukewarmness with which the various objects voted for at the annual meetings have been acted upon. Let me entreat, that in future when you vote that any work shall be undertaken, that you will each one assist in having the chosen object faithfully carried out.

Miss Suthon's salary this year has not yet been met, nor have the two hundred dollars (\$200) been raised for the Deaconess Fund. Not only are letters received, but we hear it constantly from Church members, that they do not believe in Foreign Missions, and that our own Diocese needs all the money that can be raised. I scarcely think such persons realize Who it was that said to His Disciples: "Go ye therefore and teach *all nations* baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to observe all things whatever I have commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." And He also said more than once: "If ye *love* me keep my commandments." If each member of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions would give ten cents a month, which is only one dollar and twenty cents a year, there would be ample to pay Miss Suthon our Japan Missionary's salary, give a good amount to Bishop Sessums for the Diocese, and also enable us to raise the two hundred dollars necessary to educate a person as Deaconess, as well as fulfilling the pledges to Grace Memorial Church, Hammond, and to the little chapel in Cashier Valley, N. C.

A letter will be read from Miss Emery in which she presents subjects for consideration and discussion to be brought before the general meeting that is to be held in Baltimore next October. We are requested to decide upon the united offering which is to be handed in at that time. There are also communications from the Ohio and New Jersey Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, both favoring the offering be made to the Enrollment Fund. They also favor the use of the interest on the present amount of the Fund in the hands of the Trustees, for some new Missionary work, to be voted upon at each triennial meeting. The Ohio Branch also urges

that Tuesday of Whitsun-week be observed as Woman's Day for study, prayer and consecration, and the making of an offering for the Enrolment Fund. Bishop Sessums has been consulted on the subject and approves the suggestion. Your vote is asked in regard to it, and I again entreat that you do so conscientiously.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

After Divine Service, at which the Rev. Davis Sessums officiated, the business meeting was held in the Chapel. The meeting was opened by the President's explaining why reports were not ready. She called attention to the steady growth since organizing four years ago, she said that two years ago we undertook to support a Missionary in Japan, thinks it advisable to have separate envelopes for that purpose, and give what one can, she hopes all who can will give. On the subject of educating a Deaconess, the Bishop advised that we do so; the President spoke of having investigated the matter, the results were read. Recording Secretary read a letter from Helen L. Parish on the subject. Three ladies have applied for positions, Bishop Galleher endorses two, the other he does not know. As we have no money, we can not undertake it at present. Mrs. Sniveley wanted to know which one will be selected when we have the necessary funds; President stated the Bishop must decide. The Recording Secretary read questions necessary to be answered by candidates, the President stated no steps could be taken until we secure requisite funds. The President mentioned having received a letter from the Rev. Mr. Morgan, (colored); the Corresponding Secretary read the letter as a report from his Church, (St. Luke's.)

Corresponding Secretary made a motion to change the method of getting up the reports, read Article X, of the Constitution, suggested change as follows:

Delegates shall attend meetings of their parochial societies and keep a record of all missionary work done at said meetings; they shall send a monthly report to the Board and a summary of these shall constitute the yearly report.

The President says 'tis very necessary and wants reports from April to March 31st. Mrs. Reese seconded Mrs. Coyle's motion, 'twas put to the vote and carried.

President desired to know if we shall continue subscriptions to Hammond, thinks as they have no minister, we might use the money to better advantage elsewhere. The Treasurer agrees that we postpone giving until Hammond secures a minister. Mrs. Harris made a motion to continue the donation; Mrs. Ferguson asked if we would be able to continue it, the President assured her that we would, whereupon Mrs. Harris' motion to continue the donation was voted upon and carried.

President desired to know if we will continue assistance to Cashier Valley, decided in the affirmative. Corresponding Secretary apologized for having no report from Cashier Valley.

The President says 'tis now in order to elect officers for the ensuing year. Mrs. Snively kindly says the ladies are satisfied, and makes a motion to re-elect the Board of Managers. Mrs. Harris seconded Mrs. Snively's motion, voted on and carried.

The President suggested that at the next annual meeting the officers shall be elected by ballot, the suggestion was carried.

The President read an interesting article on "Giving," after which the meeting adjourned.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Since our last annual meeting two new Branches have been formed, one in St. George's Church and one in St. Luke's, New Orleans. The Secretary feels that she must say a few words on the subject of the care of box letters. These should be decided upon *at once* and those not to be filled should be returned to the Secretary *immediately*. The Parish Branch, by keeping the letters, not only fails to send the articles for which a request has been made, but prevents any other society from so doing. The following is an extract from the report of the Corresponding Secretary of the Connecticut Branch: "It is suggested that when the Parish Secretary makes an application for work, a committee be appointed to read the letters received and be empowered to act upon them. Otherwise, owing to unpleasant weather and other causes, weeks may go by without having full enough meetings to decide what can be done, and, in the meanwhile, other societies may be calling for just such work as the rejected letters demand. The Secretary receives letters from the General Secretary in New York, and reports to her immediately all work undertaken by the parish societies, and it is so noted on her book. From that time the *Diocesan Secretary* becomes responsi-

ble for their needs." Acting on the suggestion contained in the foregoing, the Board of Managers of the Louisiana Branch passed a resolution to this effect: "In each Parish Branch there shall be a committee of two or three, whose duty it shall be to receive and decide upon the box letters at once, without waiting to call a general meeting, and this committee shall return all the letters, not to be filled by their Branch to the Corresponding Secretary *immediately*. The Secretary would also like to call the attention of the delegates to Article X of the Constitution, *especially* the latter part in reference to *reports*.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of this society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts, to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of this Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together, and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary Box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all monies contributed for the work of the Association; to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the societies to greater efforts in working for Missionaries, in raising money for the cause and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. They shall attend the meetings of their Parochial Societies and keep a record of all Missionary work done at said meetings; they shall send a monthly report to the Board and a summary of these shall constitute the yearly report.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it shall be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the corresponding Secretary. Also delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three of the Officers or Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
