PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

I doubt whether there are many present who know that when the Woman's Auxiliary met last October in Baltimore, that it was in that city, twenty-one years before, the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was organized. At that time it was but a handful of earnest women who were interested in the work, and the missionaries returning home from foreign lands met with but cold and scanty welcome. Thank God! such is not the case now, as we can testify, who were present at the meeting in Baltimore and witnessed the warm welcome given the missionaries, Miss Mailes, from Japan; Mr. and Mrs. Francis Hawks Potts, from China, and Miss Carter, from the White Earth Indians. None who were there can ever forget the cordial and hospitable reception they met with from their sister workers on that occasion, nor the admirable manner in which, from first to last, it was conducted; the dignity, impartiality and grace with which Mrs. A. L. Sioussat presided. Nor can we ever forget that solemn communion service where 1250 women, Representatives from every State in the Union, met to partake of the broken body and shed blood of this same Divine Lord and Master. Just before that holy service \$16,000 was placed in the alms basin, which, before the day closed, reached the sum of \$21,000, as the offering from the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, for the enrollment fund.

It was to be expected that your delegates should return home enthused with mission work. And with what pain we now hear Christian women say they do not believe in missions. Is Christ's parting command nothing to them? Are they wiser? And do they know better than

He who so loved us that He gave his life that we might be saved? When they say they do not believe in helping foreign missions, as so little good is done for the amount expended, what do they think of the statement of Dr. Laws, who has just returned from Missionary work in Africa, who reports that on the banks of Lake Nyassa, which a few years ago, was the habitation of cruelty, there are to-day Christian schools with 150 teachers and 7000 scholars. How was this accomplished but by the sending of missionaries! How can any one who gives the subject a thought say missionaries have done no good! Who can live without Christ who have been taught of His love? And can we Christian women fold our hands and shut our purses and refuse to help send the glad tidings to those who so sorely need it!

And at our own doors the fields and streets are ripe for harvesting, where there are hundreds, nay thousands, o white and colored children who know nothing of God, but to blaspheme His Holy Name, and who have never heard of Him who laid down His life for them. Will you not, then, dear Christian women, help in every way you can, that work which Christ laid upon every one of his disciples. And if you can do no more, pledge yourselves to pray daily for the spread of the Gospel and for the success of missions.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

During the past year we have had two general meetings the reports of which are as follows:

The Sixth Annual Meeting was held in Christ Church Chapel on Friday, April 29, 1892. After the celebration

of the Holy Communion, Rev. C. S. E. Partridge, (Missionary from Hankou, China) delivered an interesting address. Bishop Sessums called the officers to take their places. The president, Mrs. Richardson then called the meeting to order. After calling the roll, the minutes of the last meeting and reports were read and approved.

A letter was read from Miss Hampton telling of the good done by the money sent to Cashier Valley, N. C. Letters were read from two of our missionaries, one among the Indians in the Santee Agency and the other in North Carolina, thanking the ladies for the boxes received, and also for the loving sympathy expressed in the letters which does so much to cheer them in their loneliness. An extract from a letter received from Miss Suthon was read telling of foreign work.

Miss Emery's letters were the subject of discussion, both in regard to the Enrollment Fund, and as to what suggestions the Louisiana Branch would give to make the meetings more interesting and as to ways and means; also extending an invitation to the ladies to be present at the general meeting in Baltimore in October. The New Jersey Branch having sent a circular in reference to the Enrollment Fund, it was decided that this Branch heartily endorses that circular, particularly Article 2nd; "That the income of the fund be appropriated for a term of three years, until the next meeting of the General Convention, to some new missionary work;" also that this Branch adopt the plan proposed by the Ohio Branch of having Tuesday in Whitsun Week as a day of united prayer for self consecration and more earnest efforts in missionary work, and that the offerings on that day constitute Louisiana's share of the united offering in Baltimore.

Bishop Sessums spoke at length on the subject of Diocesan Missions. It was decided that each Parochial Branch be asked to contribute to a fund for this purpose, this fund to be held by the Treasurer subject to the order of the Bishop. Ten dollars was contributed by one of the members as a begining. The report of the President and the other officers of the Junior Auxiliary were then read and approved.

The semi-annual meeting was held on St. Andrew's Day in Christ Church Chapel at 11 A. M. After service and administration of the Holy Communion, the Rev. H. H. Waters delivered an able address; the President then called the business meeting to order. After the roll call the minutes of the last meeting were read. The Recording Secretary read the semi-annual report and called the attention of the Branch to a notice in regard to a special fund for Diocesan Work. The Treasurer's semi-annual report was read. The Corresponding Secretary read a letter from Miss Emery on Missionary Work, also read triennial report read at Baltimore at the last convention, also read letter from our Missionary in Japan. The President did not write a report but read from the report from Connecticut, she gave a very interesting account of the meeting which she had attended in Baltimore, and expressed the hope that at the next triennial meeting more delegates from Louisiana will attend, better still she hopes a larger sum of money will be contributed. At the meeting there were 1250 women; the offering was for the Enrollment Fund and amounted to \$21,000.

The President says there are two or three things we ought to do, each parish must decide what amount they will raise and how to expend. We are pledged to do something for the Deaconess Fund, we need a Deaconess here very badly and it is our duty to raise a large sum. The President read a

letter from Mr. Stroh stating that the Indian women handed in \$1,000 for Missions, part for Japan and part for negro; the Indian men contributed \$300.

The Bishop read a report of the Committee from the Board of Missions approving of the women's work; he gave great credit to Louisiana's representatives in regard to separate organization, they having opposed it; he spoke earnestly in regard to Diocesan Missions, he asks the parish officers not to let their offerings to their ministers interfere with Diocesan Missions; outside of New Orleans, no minister is paid more than \$1,100, very few receive as much, there are six places vacant, no means to support them. The Bishop wants more ministers, more money.

The Corresponding Secretary read a suggestion from Miss Emery about Sunday Schools having one Sunday set apart for Diocesan Missions. The Bishop said it rests with the Sunday School teachers.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Your secretary had the pleasure of attending the Triennial Meeting in Baltimore, and will never voluntarily be absent from another. The report of the general secretary was read. The Woman's Auxiliary during the twenty-one years of its existence has contributed in round numbers \$3,000,000, one million of which has been given during the last three years, thus showing the wonderful growth of the auxiliary. It was decided that the next offering should be for the endowment of a missionary episcopate. The members of the Louisiana branch are requested to begin already to save for this purpose. The reports do not seem to be understood by all, so it has been thought best to explain them. First—What is the work of the Auxiliary? To increase by means of boxes and money the stipends of missionaries working in parishes and mission schools. Work done outside of these is not, strictly speaking, missionary, but charitable, which, while equally commendable, is a different line of church work and should not be reported. In many of the branches there are not separate missionary organizations, but all the work is done by the

Parish Aid Society or Guild. Therefore, the reports should not state the amount of money *received*, but the amount *expended* for missionary purposes. The boxes or money sent outside of the United States should be designated Foreign; all in the United States, but outside of Louisiana, Domestic; all in the State, Diocesan.

The membership dues of 25 cents are paid by individuals, and the money should be sent to the board to be used for printing reports, the surplus being disposed of by vote at the annual meeting. A parish becomes a branch of the Auxiliary by giving and reporting any amount, large or small, outside of itself; an individual becomes a member of the Auxiliary upon the payment of 25 cents yearly. The bishop has kindly sent a package of letters on the subject of the work of the Auxiliary. These have been mailed with the President's statement of the pledges needed for the coming year to the secretaries of our parochial societies. May we not hope they will be instrumental in largely increasing our funds. "He that soweth little shall reap little, and he that soweth plenteously shall reap plenteously. He that watereth shall be watered again, and look, whatsoever he doeth it shall prosper."

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of the society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of this Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together, and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary Box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings and keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all monies contributed for the work of the Association, to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Misionary spirit, by arousing the societies to greater efforts in working for missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. They shall attend all meetings of their Parochial Societies and keep a record of all Missionary work done at said meetings; they shall send a monthly report to the Board and a summary of these shall constitute the yearly report.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it shall be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Corresponding Secretary. Also delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the president, at the request of three of the Officers or Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
