PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

Since our Semi-Annual Meeting we have had visits from Mrs. S. A. Knickerbocker, President of the Central New York Branch of the Womens' Auxilliary to the Board of Missions, and from our honorable Secretary, Mrs. A. T. Twing.

The exhortations of these two earnest workers still ring in the ears of many of us, and with the beginning of the new year, I would have all know what they said, and humbly pray that what we were privileged to hear from their lips may serve as a guide and stimulus to great and good things in the future of the Louisiana Branch.

Mrs. Knickerbocker, who came to us first, told how the officers of the Central New York Branch visit each town and village of their diocese, in order to speak face to face with the church members and to explain to them the aims and objects of the Women's Auxilliary to the Board of Missions, as well as to urge upon all the necessity of systematic giving. As a consequence of these visits and of the personal appeals made by the ladies of the Central New York Branch, deep interest in the missionary work is kept up and all their pledges are regularly fulfilled.

Besides this, they have already begun to raise the sum to be contributed by them to the united offering at the General Council in 1895 and for this object they have already accumulated nearly \$1000 by each member dropping one cent a week into a mitebox reserved for that purpose.

Why cannot we do as much? Who is there among us who cannot give one cent a week to endow a Missionary Episcopate, the object to which the united offering is to be devoted. An explanation of this united offering is not here out of place. It is an extra gift, entirely over and above the ordinary contribu-

tions of the Auxilliary; it is a THANK offering from all the Branches at the General Meeting for a specific object.

Still more recently, only three weeks ago in fact, Mrs. Twing stood before us and told us what our organization is, that the Women's Auxilliary is an Auxilliary to the Board of Missions. She explained "how it was authorized primarily, not by a rector for the benefit of parochial missions, not by one bishop alone for the benefit of diocesan missions, but by the Board o Missions composed of the united bishops, clergy and laity, for the benefit of the general missions of the church." Ah! what a vast field of work is opened before us, fellow members of the Woman's Auxiliary. With Mrs. Twing, I beg you to ponder well on the glorious aims of our organization and to work in unity towards their fulfillment.

There is work at home for us and we must do it first. We must visit the widow and the fatherless, and succor the stranger within our gates. This is charity, but home charity is not missionary work. The truest, widest charity leads into the fields of missions beyond our city, beyond our country, beyond the ocean; yes, even to the end of the earth.

God is omnipotent, and can accomplish His ends without any aid from us, yet it is His will that we should be a means towards their accomplishment, and that we carry His light into the darkness, and to all lands, and to all people less blessed than ourselves.

Mrs. Twing spoke of our own missionary's work in Japan, undertaken as the Catherine Pritchard Memorial. You all know Miss Suthon went from our city, and you have also heard of of her ill-health. For two years she could do nothing on this account, and was ordered to the sea shore to recuperate her exhausted vitality. This led to her going ultimately to Amori, a seaside town, where she was the only English speaking person among twenty-five thousand inhabitants. Here, with renewed vigor, she began her work. In the words of Mrs. Twing: "Did not the hand of an all wise God lead the earnest

woman to Amori? And has not the loving Father blessed the work!" The success of Miss Suthon has answered the question. Alone, she has accomplished nearly as much as all the other missionaries together. Her work has grown steadily and numbers have been instructed, baptised and confirmed through her instrumentality.

Mrs. Twing advises us to recognize our Junior Branch and suggests forming it into two sections, one to be composed strictly af of the children, the other to consist of the younger members of the congregation who have outgrown the chirdren's Branch proper, and these retain the name of Junior Branch. She proposes that both organizations be permitted to select the president and other officers from among their Branch, but for both Branches to be under the guidance of a member of the Women's Auxilliary.

This is a most wise suggestion. Even older persons do not become heartily interested in a cause, unless they personally work for it. If the children know and feel that the work is to appear as their very own; that they are to prepare the objects, and fill and pack their individual Christmas and Easter boxes with their own hands; that they must manage their own finances, write their own letters, and elect their own officers; then their interest will grow with the work, and their labor increase with their interest.

A letter has been received from Miss Hampton, asking us to continue our yearly subscriptions for the support of the missionary in charge of the work in Cashier Valley. On this you will be called to vote to-day.

We have also received a letter srom the Connecticut Branch asking if the Louisiana Banch would undertake to educate one or more of the daughters of the necessitous clergy. To this request a reply has been sent to the effect that, as we had not yet raised that for which we were pledged, it would not be advisabie to undertake anything more at present.

We have also received an Easter greeting from the Committee on Systematic Giving, which will be read to you.

Let me express the hope that with the new year of activity which is about to open for the Louisiana Branch of the Womans Auxilliary our zeal may increase. Let us push forward with renewed energy in spreading the glad tidings throughout the land. And may our Heavenly Father protect, direct and bless this, our mitsionary work, gladly undertaken for Christ, our master's sake.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Our last annual meeting was held in Christ Church Chapel, on Friday, April 14, 1893. After the celebration of the Holy Communion, Rev. Mr. Noll congratulated the Auxiliary on the work which had been done and conveyed to them the wish of the Bishop that they would extend their work in home as well as foreign missions.

The president, Mrs. Richardson, then called the meeting to order. Delegates from the following parishes answered roll call: Alexandria, Laurel Hill, Napoleonville, Orleans, Williamsport.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The treasurer reported collections for the year, \$1,058.15; disbursements, \$853.75.

Corresponding secretary reported boxes sent, thirty-one, valued at \$1,788.45. After reading these reports the president addressed the members present and said the subject of greatest interest is that of diocesan missions and the manner in which the Auxiliary could best aid the Bishop in carrying out his plans. She suggested that each member pledge herself to give ten cents a month for diocesan missions. The suggestion was voted on and carried. Mrs. Coyle and Mrs. Cluverius made a motion that each member get one or two others to do the same, In order to accomplish this, small envelopes are to be provided,

endorsed by the Bishop and sent to the clergymen of each parish throughout the diocese, asking them to distribute them. The motion was voted on and carried. The Bishop spoke on the subject, setting forth the great needs of our diocese and urging them to combine in order to raise the requisite amount. A motion was made and carried to send circulars, one from the Bishop and one from the president, to all the parishes. The Bishop suggested the Auxiliary hold the semi-annual meeting in some of the country parishes. The motion was voted on and carried.

Lake Charles being the place selected, Mrs. Coyle made a motion that henceforth Tuesday in Whitsun week, be set apart in the diocese as Woman's Day, a day of special service of prayer for missionary work and that a collection be taken up for that purpose. The motion was voted on and carried.

The Auxiliary has had the pleasure of meeting Mrs. Knickerbocker and Mrs. Twing and hearing from them most interesting accounts of their personal knowledge of missionary work, as well as their efforts in its behalf.

Encouraging accounts of Miss Suthon's work in Japan have been received.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

The Junior Auxiliary has now entered upon its fifth year of work, having been organized February 1, 1890. The past has given rich evidence of much zeal and devoted action on the part of its members.

We record with much regret the resignations of Mrs. Mary B. Hart as Treasurer, and Miss Emma Turk as the delegate from Grace Church; their devotion to the cause of Missions was very marked and beautiful, and their presence in our midst will not soon be forgotten. Miss C. B. Girault was unanimously elected to the office of Treasurer, and Miss Clemence Charles was unanimously elected Vice-President. Miss Rogers comes to us as the delegate from Grace Church.

From the visit of Mrs. Twing, the honorary secretary to the Board of Missions, we gleaned many valuable ideas; she suggested that the children's little weekly meetings be conducted by themselves; that there be a President, Secretary and Treasurer from among them; that they open their meetings, arrange what they would like to do for Missions, bring articles for their boxes and assist in packing them. The work should be done by the children, with some adult to superintend.

The number of members has greatly increased, so that with the hearty approval of the Bishop of the Diocese, we were able to assist in the much needed repairs upon Trinity Church, Cheneyville. Thanks were extended to Mrs. T. G. Richardson for a delightful entertainment given at the Diocesan House, after the last annual meeting.

Every baptized child of the church is considered a member of the Junior Auxiliary; we therefore ask all to do some little work, however small; let every child bring one new member, so that our next Easter Offering may far exceed any we have yet given.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY—1894.

In April of 1893 our last annual meeting was held at the Diocesan House, and the members of the Board were pleased to receive grateful letters of thanks from the recipient of the united Easter box, and also felt encouraged with the amount raised for Miss Suthon's salary, which was \$44.05. One more meeting occurred in May before the ad-

journey until November, and at this meeting an attempt was made to plan for the winter's work; that was to find out what would be most acceptable for the Christmas boxes in respect of clothing, that the little fingers might be employed an hour or two of the long summer days in Missionary work, and so when Christmas came the work would not be hurriedly done, and as usual done only by a few. But there seemed many obstacles to this, and so the idea had to be abandoned. When the Board re-assembled in November it was with regret they accepted the resignation of the Treasurer, Mrs. M. B. Hart. She had been an officer of the Junior Auxiliary since its organization in Louisiana, and ever an ardent worker. This with the resignation of the Delegate from Grace Church, Miss Turck, caused some changes.

Miss C. B. Girault, our former Vice-President, was elected Treasurer, and Miss Clemence Charles our new Vice-President. Grace Church has given us a zealous and interested delegate in Miss Rogers, and in looking back on the year's work we feel that the membership has increased, the interest in our work widened, and we are more and more encouraged to continue our efforts in missionary work.

During the past year we have been visited and addressed by Mrs. Knickerbocker, president of the Junior Auxiliary for Central New York, and Mrs. Twing, honorary secretary to the Board of Missions.

At the November meeting a motion was made and carried to hold the monthly meetings of the Board each year at a different Parish Church; for the year 1893 and 1894 St. Paul's Church was chosen. The children's semi-annual meeting was held at Trinity Church, December 26th, and the address made by the Rev. Beverly Warner, the Rev. Mr. Bakewell assisting in the services. An appeal was made to our President for help in repairing the roof of the church at Cheneyville, La., and at the January meeting it was unanimously decided to send the yearly subscriptions there. The amount raised was \$62, the largest sum we have handled since our organization in 1890. In March there was a large and generously provided box packed at Grace Church and sent to the Rev. George Bell, Buncombe County, North Carolina; each Parish Branch contributed to this box in proportion to its means, and the result was indeed gratifying to all—we hope most gratifying to the recipients.

During the year a communication was received from Central New York in regard to Junior Auxiliary badges. These badges are Roman Crosses of silver with the words "Soldier and Servant" embossed thereon. Some of our Parish branches have adopted these badges, the Board having agreed that the matter should be entirely optional.

Preparations are now being made for the children's annual service, which always takes place before our summer's adjournment.

We close the report of the past year with feelings of encouragement, and hope that each succeeding year will be even more successful than its predecessor.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of the society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary ac-

tivity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of this Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings and keep a record of such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all monies contributed for the work of the Association, to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the societies to greater efforts in working for missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. They shall attend all meetings of their parochial societies and keep a record of all Missionary work done at said meetings; they shall send a monthly report to the Board and a summary of these shall constitute the yearly report.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it shall be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Corresponding Secretary. Also delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three of the officers or managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
