THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

My Dear Friends and Co-Workers:

We shall all miss to-day the presence of our good, active and faithful Corresponding Secretary. Your prayers were asked for her, as she is now on the ocean, on her way to Europe, and I am sure that it is the sincere wish of every one present that God may grant her a pleasant and safe journey over, and a safe and happy return home. From her report you have learned of the falling off in our work this year. The reason why, I shall leave for you to find out. I trust when we next meet she will be able to report a great leap forward to better things in every way.

It is a great disappointment that the monthly envelope for Diocesan Missions have not been generally taken. The entire amount received from five city parishes and one country parish is \$41.45. The Bishop urges the continued use of them, as it shows what small contributions can accomplish by systematic giving.

At the meeting of Diocesan officers in Baltimore on the 8th of October, 1892, it was resolved to place before the Auxiliary as the object of the United Offering to be made at the triennial meeting of 1895, the endowment of the Episcopate in a missionary jurisdiction, the jurisdiction to be selected by the Board of Missions.

With Bishop Sessums' approval and endorsement a month ago, circulars were sent to the Rectors of every parish, requesting that the circulars be placed in the pews of their churches so that if any of their members wish to contribute to the United Offering, they might do so, and send the amount by their Rector when he attended the Diocesan Council.

The General Convention will meet in October at Minneapolis. When the whole assembly meets as the Board of Missions, the Woman's Auxiliary has its grand Thanksgiving service. At this service on October 3d the Auxiliary will make a special offering to God to be used for His glory and for the spread of His Gospel throughout the world. From every part of our country and from wherever our Missionaries are in foreign lands, from Alaska, and from the Indians in the Western States and Territories, from Japan, China and Africa, and from all who have come to the knowledge of the Gospel of Christ will come their greeting and their offering as a testimony of their faith, gratitude and love. Will not this Diocese do her share? Shall we not, each one, do what we can to manifest our love and gratitude for the many blessings of the past three years. Oh! if only each member of the Woman's Auxiliary as well as every member of the church would realize and believe that it is the "willing heart" our Father wants of His children, and the giving of what they have and not of what they have not. It is the realizing, on the part of every one, that their cent or dime is of as much importance to the prosperity of their church and to the furtherance of missions as a hundred or a thousand from a few.

A letter has been received from Miss Emery asking that a vote be taken at this meeting on the endowment of a Missionary Episcopate, so that your officers and delegates will be authorized to vote according to your wishes.

I sincerely wish every one now present could go on and be present at that solemn service and attend the triennial meeting, for I know you would learn much to interest you in our church work and in the self-sacrificing work of our missionaries. Do not forget that when you were baptised you were made Christ's disciples and are, therefore, called upon to obey His command "to preach the Gospel to all nations," and the night before His

betrayal and cruel death He said: "If ye love me keep my commandments."

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

LOUISIANA BRANCH WOMAN'S AUXILIARY—ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held on Thursday, April 5th, at 11 o'clock A. M., in Christ's Church chapel.

The Rev. Mr. Prosser, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Price, celebrated the Holy Communion, after which the business meeting was called to order by the President. The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved. The Corresponding Secretary read her report for the year ending Easter, 1894. The treasurer's report for the year showed receipts \$1,248.14; disbursements \$975.79; cash balance on hand \$272.35.

The president read a most interesting address.

Reports from the corresponding secretary and Junior Auxiliary were read and approved.

A letter from Miss Suthon, our missionary in Japan, was read, showing the work that was being done there.

A pamphlet on systematic giving was read by the president, who said it had been prepared by the committee appointed at the last convention.

The secretary also read a pamphlet on the subject of the endowment of a Missionary Episcopate. The motion to give the proceeds of a united collection for such a purpose was carried and the selection of the Episcopate to be endowed was left to the Board of Missions.

The monthly and yearly stipends to the churches at Hammond and Cashier Valley were ordered to be continued for another year.

After the election of officers, there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

In making my few introductory remarks, I must thank all who have directed the work of the Junior Auxiliary for their regular attendance at the monthly meetings and for their energy and devotion.

We heartily welcome two new parish branches, members of Mount Olivet Church, and the Earnest Workers of Trinity Chapel, feeling confident that they will be great helpers in the future.

I am anxious that a part of our work for the coming year shall be to enlist parish branches outside of our city. We beg them to join us, for we want to know them.

It is with pleasure that I submit the following reports.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The close of last year's Annual Report told of the preparations for the United Easter box, and now we can tell that this box, containing contributions from the many parish branches in this city, was duly packed at Grace Church on Saturday, March 17th, and sent to the Rev. Geo. Bell, Bell, Buncombe county, North Carolina. An appeal had been sent in from Cheneyville, La., for contributions to enable the parish there to put a roof on their church, which had been torn off by the terrible storm of October, 1893, the sympathies of the members of the Junior Auxiliary were so much aroused by this request, the board unanimously decided to send the money collected as yearly dues. This amounted to \$60.00.

In April Mrs. Twing addressed a children's meeting, but was disappointed at the small attendance. Comparison with other States shows that Louisiana is not yet aroused to enough interest in the work of the Junior Auxiliary, but we must not feel discouraged, for we are able to report a larger number of branches this year than last, and a greater numbers of Delegates. In May the meetings were adjourned until No-

vember, and on the 10th of that month the first fall meeting took place in the Guild room of Trinity Church. In December the various branches were all busy getting off the Xmas boxes, and little was discussed save what referred to them.

The children's semi-annual meeting took place at the Diocesan house early in December, and was probably the best attended of any yet held. A Musical Committee was formed in December to select new Missionary Hymns for the next annual children's meeting, but owing to such limited time were not able to accomplish their object this year. An appeal from Woodriver, La., Platte, was read at the January meeting, asking for a contribution of \$3.00 per year from the Junior Auxiliary of Louisiana. This was voluntarily contributed by the different Delegates.

In February the Board was gladdened by the addition of Delegates from Mount Olivet Church. Under the able direction of Rev. Mr. Noll a Branch of the Junior Auxiliary was formed in his parish, and great encouragement was thus given to us all. We also sincerely welcome Delegates from Trinity Chapel, whose efforts have been so blessed by the forming of a branch in their parish; therefore, with such an increase of Delegates and such steady, earnest work from those already joined with us, we close this year's report with thankfulness to Him who has seen our efforts and blessed the work of our hands.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this society shall be the "Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

ARTICLE II.

The object of the society shall be, by means of union and systematic efforts to diffuse Missionary intelligence, to increase Missionary ac

tivity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of Societies where there are none.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women belonging to the Diocese, who desire to be members of Society, shall be so regarded upon the payment of 25 cents per annum.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Board of Managers.

ARTICLE V.

The President shall call meetings together and preside over them.

ARTICLE VI.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings during the absence of the President.

ARTICLE VII.

The duty of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, and to conduct the correspondence of the Association, especially that with the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and with the Parochial Branches, and to keep a fair record of all Missionary box reports.

ARTICLE VIII.

The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of the meetings and keep a record of all such meetings.

ARTICLE IX.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all monies contributed for the work of the Association, to pay all drafts upon the funds and to prepare a report for each general meeting.

ARTICLE X.

The duty of the Managers shall be to increase, especially in their own localities, a Missionary spirit, by arousing the societies to greater efforts in working for missionaries, in raising money for the cause, and by diffusing intelligence concerning the past and present Missionary work of the Church. They shall attend all meetings of their parochial societies and keep a record of all Missionary work done at said meetings; they shall send a monthly report to the Board and a summary of these shall constitute the yearly report.

ARTICLE XI.

All Societies who desire it shall be considered affiliated Branches of this Auxiliary, and will send their report of money collected and work done to the Corresponding Secretary. Also delegates from all such Societies will be expected at the general meetings.

ARTICLE XII.

There shall be at least two general meetings of the Society in each year, at such place and time as shall be designated by the President and Board of Managers.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three of the officers or managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

The Board of Managers shall consist of one member from each Parochial Missionary Society in connection with this Branch of the Auxiliary.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers. Five shall constitute a quorum for business.
