Consider the contents of this annual report at your first meeting in early Fall.

Have your secretary keep on file all business communications from Diocesan Officers. When a project or request is sent to your Branch, discuss it carefully and freely; then promptly report action taken to Diocesan Corresponding Secretary.

Keep ON FILE, for reference, the sample line of leaflets sent to you by Educational Secretary; also those sent by Treasurer of United Offering. THOROUGHLY ACQUAINT YOURSELF with contents of these leaflets. Order any number of them, as you need them. Directions for ordering on back of all leaflets.

Try to have your Branch prepare at least one box a year. The Missionary Box and Appeal Secretary will help you to decide where to send your box if you want suggestions. When you begin work on a box, notify recipient and the Diocesan Missionary Box and Appeal Secretary. When it is ready for shipment, advise likewise.

Send report from your Branch in time for the FOUR GENERAL MEETINGS. It will keep us in close touch.

ALL ITEMS OF MONEY should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer, except those of the United Offering, which go to the Treasurer of that fund. If call is imperative and time too short to send money through Diocesan Treasurer, prepare voucher slip and mail to said officer on THE DAY you forward money to its destination, and credit will be given your Branch.

Report changes of address or temporary absence, and do not fail to notify Corresponding Secretary when changes occur in your list of officers.

ALL DIOCESAN OFFICERS will be glad to answer questions at all times.

Apply to the secretaries of the various departments for further information.

Help the Louisiana Branch to be in close touch and to work in a clear, business-like way.

MINUTES.

The annual meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church Cathedral Chapel, Thursday morning, April 25, 1912, with Mrs. Henry Leverich, Jr., presiding.

Preceding the meeting was a celebration of the Holy Communion, Dr. William A. Barr, Dean of the Cathedral, officiating, assisted by the Rev. Luke M. White of Shreveport, La. The latter also delivered the address.

The program for the day was presented by the Program Committee and it was moved and adopted that the program be accepted as it stood.

Minutes of last annual meeting, reports of Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, United Offering Treasurer, and Treasurer of the Church League of the Baptized were read and adopted.

Reports from twenty-nine (29) Branches were read by their appointed delegates and were listened to attentively. Study classes, increased membership and deep interest were features of many of the reports.

The President's address was full of enthusiasm for the work. She bespoke our best efforts and most earnest prayers toward increasing the strength of the Auxiliary in the Louisiana Diocese.

The Committee on the Memorial to Mrs. Ida A. Richardson reported that the consensus of opinion of the Branches heard from was "That the offerings of the annual meetings be devoted as a memorial to Mrs. Richardson." Discussion on this plan resulted in a motion being made and adopted that the offering of the annual meetings for five (5) years be devoted as a memorial to Mrs. Ida A. Richardson.

After a lengthy discussion, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That the memorial to Mrs. Ida A. Richardson begin with the offering of April 25, 1912; that there be added to this offering the amount now in the treasury, and this amount be further increased to the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00),

which amount shall for this year be applied to the development of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Louisiana."

The expiration of the time limit of the program having been reached, ballot on adjournment or continuance of the program resulted in vote to complete program.

A motion was made and adopted that "The Committee on Revision of the Constitution and By-laws of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary be now considered and that each article of the Constitution and each-By-law be considered and passed on separately.

Article 4, Section 1, amended to include Honorary President.

Article 8 amended to read: "A quorum shall consist of nine (9) and at least five (5) Parishes be represented."

The following resolutions were offered and adopted:

"Resolved; That the foregoing Constitution and By-laws of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary which has been considered seriatum be herewith adopted as a whole, and that they become operative at once and that the Constitution and By-laws heretofore in force are herewith superseded and annulled."

Resolved, "That the Officers provided for in the Constitution herewith adopted enter upon the offices to which they are severally appointed immediately after the adjournment of the present annual meeting, and that likewise hereafter officers regularly appointed according to the Constitution will enter upon their offices immediately after the adjournment of the regular annual meeting at which they are appointed."

A rising vote of thanks was given the Committee on Revision of the Constitution.

A motion was made and adopted that the President be asked to appoint a Program Committee for the next annual meeting. Said appointment to be made at the first general meeting of the new year.

Moved and adopted that the next annual meeting be divided into two (2) sessions, arrangements for same to be left to the Program Committee.

The nomination of Officers was next in order. The resig-

nations of Mrs. C. C. Robertson, Recording Secretary, Miss Eliza Greenwood, Treasurer, and Miss Amelia Wharton, Corresponding Secretary, having been presented, called forth expressions of deep regret from the Bishop as well as from all women of the Auxiliary. A rising vote of thanks was given them for their long, faithful and devoted services.

The Nominating Committee presented the following report: "After careful deliberation the following ticket was drawn up, and we hope it will meet with the approval of the meeting:"

All nominations were accepted and the names were presented to the Bishop for appointment.

The following resolution, presented by Mrs. Henry Leverich, Jr., was unanimously adopted:

"Resolved, That this annual meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary by a rising vote express their gratitude and appreciation for the long and faithful services rendered the Auxiliary by Mrs. C. C. Robertson, Miss Eliza Greenwood and Miss Amelia Wharton, thereby assuring them of the sincere affection of the women of the organization.

"Be it further resolved, That a copy of this resolution be sent to Mrs. Robertson, Miss Greenwood and Miss Wharton."

A discussion of the use in the Constitution of the words "association" or "organization" resulted in a vote to leave it to the decision of the Bishop.

There being no further business, after a blessing by the Bishop, the meeting adjourned.

ANNUAL ADDRESS OF THE PRESIDENT.

New Orleans, La., April 25, 1912.

Dear Friends and Members of the Auxiliary:

This is the twenty-fifth annual meeting of the Louisiana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and we are here to-day to listen to the report of what has, under God's guidance, been accomplished in the past year for the evangelization of the world. The best fact we have to record is that we have caught in some small measure the new vision in missionary work—"the world-wide vision of the twentieth century."

The great Woman's Missionary Jubilee that came in its gathered power to New Orleans, reached the hearts of many who hitherto had never been closely touched by the compelling force of the missionary idea; that the work, in one way or another, belongs to each woman, and that we are not realizing our privileges as Christian women unless we take an active part in it. This jubilee inspired Auxiliary women to set the following aim:

- 1st. To pray regularly and definitely.
- 2nd. To double membership.
- 3rd. To study and know about missions.

Thus far many branches are using the intercessory prayers found in the "Spirit of Missions" on the page entitled "The Sanctuary of Missions." The house to house canvass has been completed in two branches, and the result is that 102 new members have been added to the Woman's Auxiliary. Twelve Mission Study Classes have been held in different parish branches, these being the good results of the Normal Classes held in New Orleans last November, and lead by Miss Grace Lindley of New York. We will always be grateful to the Board of Missions and to Miss Lindley for all that her visit meant to us.

Through the courtesy of the railroad officials, occasional trip passes have enabled me to come into personal contact with splendid women outside of New Orleans. In Alexandria, Hammond, Baton Rouge, Lake Charles, New Iberia, Franklin and Houma, I found branches well organized and responsive to plans presented for the growth of the Auxiliary in all of its departments. In Crowley, Opelousas, Washington, Lafayette and

Patterson I found no branches, but many true women who showed deep interest. Recently official notice has been received of branches organized in Opelousas, Crowley and Lafayette. I feel certain similar good news will come from the other places in due time. Seven branches in New Orleans have been visited, three of them reorganized, and ALL full of enthusiasm and interest. I am sorry it has not been possible to visit all parishes and missions in Louisiana, but am glad to say I do not feel a stranger to those I have not visited, owing to the frequent exchange of letters.

While there is so much left undone that we would see done, we cannot be satisfied with the work we have accomplished, but we are thankful that we have been permitted to try to do our very best. Will you say with me that we will take up work this year with increased energy and interest? If YOUR branch has not used Intercessory prayers, will you use them this year? Will you ask your Educational Secretary for the mid-day prayer cards and see to it that EVERY WOMAN wants to have one and thereby be enrolled a MEMBER OF YOUR BRANCH? At least, at Christmas and Easter, won't you confer with your rector and have Corporate Communion?

Give as much time as you can spare to planning to make meetings of your branch so interesting that members will be disappointed if sickness keeps them from attending. Have a Study Class. The helps and text books sent out by the educational department of the Church Missions House are so full and clear that no earnest woman, willing to give a little time, need hesitate to organize a study circle. For those who feel timid about undertaking to lead such a circle, listen to what Bishop Lloyd says and be reassured: "God will never let His work be hurt by you. You may hurt your reputation as a leader, but you can't hurt God's work. He won't let you do that." Circulate that splendid magazine, the Spirit of Missions, as freely as you can.

Let us renew our aim to double our membership this new year. To quote from Miss Emery:

"If there is anything this particular year has taught us, it is the need of reaching the individual woman throughout the Church who has not, as yet, learned

to care for the things for which the Woman's Auxiliary primarily stands. Are we not responsible in some measure for our neighbor who does not care?

If each of us were asked how we became interested in Auxiliary work, most of us would answer, "through some good woman whom we loved and who believed in Missions." Therefore, we are the natural god-mothers and leaders of the Juniors and Babies' Branch. Will you see to it that the young children, and the older girls and boys in your Parish Church become Little Helpers and Juniors? Talk with the superintendent of your Sunday School and help him to make the school MISSIONARY. Help your rector and vestry to introduce the Duplex envelope system when they propose it.

Aim to make your branch a praying, working branch; then they will all be interested, and the money given will be the natural result of their prayers and interest. You need not have DUES. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS will enable your financial department to assist more than DUES ever did.

As baptized members of the Church, let us realize how great our obligations are to further with our prayers, our interest, our service and our gifts the petition that is on our lips so often, "Thy Kingdom come." It was not ONLY to give more money to the Board of Missions that this now great organization of women came into being, but to PRAY FOR and KNOW ABOUT and CARE FOR the men and women who are our representatives at the front in this home land and in foreign lands, and to teach and train the young so that they should consecrate their lives to the Master's service. If the objection is raised, "Missions, Missions, always Missions," meet it with the notable reply of Bishop Doane of Albany: "Yes, always Missions, because they are the life-blood, the heart-beat, the lung's-breath of the body of Jesus Christ."

The year ended has undoubtedly been one of unusual opportunity for growth in missionary spirit—the spirit of love that would make all men know the Father as THEIR Father. Will you take Jesus Christ for your model? David Livingstone said: "God had but one son, and He was a missionary."

THE WORDS OF JESUS CHRIST ASKING YOU TO
BE A MISSIONARY.

I am the truth, and the way, and the life; no man cometh unto the Father but by me. I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

I must work the work of Him that sent me while it is day; the night cometh when no man can work.

Ye shall be witnesses unto me, both in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and in Samaria and unto the uttermost parts of the Earth.

Go work to-day in my vine-yard. As my Father hath sent me even so send I you. I have set before thee an open door. Go ye into the village over against you.

Arise and go into the city. and as ye go, preach. Heal the sick that are therein. Open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light.

Go ye therefore into the highways. Go—preach the gospel. Say not ye, there are four months and then cometh the harvest; behold, I say unto you, lift up your eyes and look on the fields, for they are white already to harvest.

The harvest truly is plenteous, but the laborers are few. Pray ye therefore, the Lord of the harvest, that He will send forth laborers into His harvest. Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you. This is my commandment that ye love one another even as I have loved you. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye love one another.
