## FOREWORD

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**T**O THE END that every woman of the church may have available useful information about the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, this little book is offered. With it go the prayers of your Educational Secretary that it may be helpful in arousing interest in the work that we are trying to do in behalf of the Master's kingdom, so that with grateful hearts and sure knowledge we may look forward to greater service under the inspired leadership of our beloved Bishop.

### THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

The Woman's Auxiliary was created in 1872 to help carry out the work of the church through the Board of Missions. In 1920 it was made the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, thereby enlarging its work in helping to carry forward the whole program of the church.

The object of the Auxiliary is to bind the womanhood of the church together in Spiritual bonds for the up-building of the Kingdom of God here on earth, and the carrying of Christ's Gospel to all mankind. Miss Emery, one of our great leaders, once said, "Everything a Christian person does for Christ which makes the world more nearly His, has its Missionary aspect—every Christian is a Missionary." That is why we say "Every baptized woman **should** be a member of the Auxiliary."

### THE GENERAL CHURCH PROGRAM

The General Church Program is the Missionary hand-book of the church and should be in the home of **every** church family. It was gotten up to give the story of the work of the whole church, and to stress the importance of every member of the Church sharing in the responsibility of the whole task.

We are not members primarily of the parish, or even of the Diocese, but members first of all of the whole body, the General Church.

If the church is to fulfill its Divine Mission, parishes must extend their work beyond their own boundaries.

The first thing needed in a parish in carrying out the Program of the Church is a "Rector who wills to do it,"—then if the people are informed, God's work will not stand still.

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

At the Annual Meeting we defined Religious Education as,—

Your Educational Secretary realizes that many have planned the year’s work already and she does not ask them to change their plans; if, however, they wish any assistance in carrying out their programs, she will be glad to help them in any way that she can.

## PRAYER

Make Prayer the foundation of all you do this year. Pray when you come together and before you part, use the prayer leaflet, but also give members the opportunity to pray in their own words for the special work being considered; it helps the spiritual growth of each member to enter into the devotional side of the work, and though the words may be halting, the sense of reality is deepened. We need to practice prayer in this way that we may lose ourselves in a sense of His presence.

## THE CORPORATE GIFT FOR THE ADVANCE WORK

The recommendation of the Executive Board that the Corporate Gift for Advance Work be given Bishop Morris for his work in the Panama Canal Zone was adopted, and provides that the pledge of \$500.00 goes for the same project, a church for white communicants in New Cristobal, in 1931 also.

The church through General Convention plans to carry out one hundred and seventy projects of Advance Work or new work. We must educate, not only our own membership, but our families and our parishes as well, to feel the urgent need of doing more than just our quotas. The allotment which we call our "Quota" is just the bare running expenses absolutely needed to maintain existing work. Where we fail—our Lord's work has to be cut down. Do we want to be responsible for that?
