The Department of Religious Education has a splendid program to offer the women of the Auxiliary this year. At the Triennial meeting in Denver, five subjects which have a definite relation to the work of the National Council in all its departments, and are of special help to the missionary work of the Church, were studied and discussed.

Each of these five subjects—Family Life—Property and Economic Conditions—Interracial Contacts—International Relations—and Religious Thinking of Today were presented in a splendid address by someone most familiar with the subject. These addresses, as well as the report of the Committee on Findings, have been published and sent to the Woman's Auxiliary Branches with the hope that they will be used to build their program of study and work. These, with the Spirit of Missions and the Diocesan paper and the book

to be used for this year's study, "Building a Christian Nation", are full of suggestions and knowledge that will help us to realize our responsibilities as Christian women, to help make America God-Conscious.

This department of the Woman's Auxiliary offers no general program of activity since the needs and opportunities vary so greatly in different localities.

The secretary suggests that each Branch of the Auxiliary make a careful study of local conditions, and then decide upon a definite program for this year, being very particular not to duplicate work already being done and co-operating as far as possible with the recognized agencies at work in the community.

In addition to any special program of social service undertaken, the Auxiliary Branches in New Orleans co-operate in supporting by gifts and personal service the work of the City Missionary in the various institutions in which he ministers.

This school is one of the group of schools for Negroes in the Southern States, which seeks to train Negroes for leadership in their own race. It is partially financed by the American Church Institute for Negroes, and this pledge helps to meet the Diocesan obligation for its maintenance.

This fund provides religious and educational training for illiterate and isolated white people in the marshes of Southern Louisiana. The Mission is largely maintained by the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese.

HOW TO BUILD A PROGRAM

A well rounded program will contain certain elements, the elements of worship, study, work and gifts.

There are four steps we should follow in planning our programs.

1st—Analyze

Study the needs of the Parish and community.

Cooperation with other Church organizations—

Work in Church School, Y.P.S.L., Social Service.

Study the needs in the mission fields.

Study the share the Church must take in meeting these needs.

Study the problems the world is facing.

2nd—Prepare

Work out a definite schedule of worship, study, work and gifts.

Variety and change in weekly and monthly devotions.

Participation in the greater devotional services,

Corporate Communion, Intercessions, etc.

Study classes.

Inlist interest of whole group, active cooperation of Rector. Canvas parish for new members, stimulate interest of old members, train young women in the work, make them feel their responsibility, our need of them.

3rd—Carry through

Careful preparation. Each meeting a complete unit, alert officers, short peppy program revolving about a central theme, devotionals leading up to report or presentation of subject. Budget and plan of financing, organization of all departments complete.

4th—Measure results

Take stock often

Check success or failure of program of work, of each department

Monthly remittances

Think always of the future
