THE first general meeting of the working year of the Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, was held in the Chapel of Grace Church, Baltimore, on Wednesday, November the third, at twelve o'clock, the Rev. Mr. Stryker of St. Barnabas' Church, presiding. After prayer, and a few appropriate remarks from Mr. Stryker, the Treasurer read a report of last year's work; at the conclusion of which, the resignations of the President, Secretary, and Treasurer were handed in. Before proceeding to business, it was necessary to elect new officers, and the old ones were unanimously re-elected, each one having been nominated, the nomination seconded, and the vote taken. The following resolutions were then submitted to the meeting, and approved, with the addition of amendment or resolution, No. 5.

1st. That there be three officers for the general work and supervision, to be elected annually by vote, viz: President, Secretary, Treasurer.

2nd. FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

THE first general meeting of the working year of the Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, was held in the Chapel of Grace Church, Baltimore; on Wednesday, November the third, at twelve o'clock, the Rev. Mr. Stryker of St. Barnabas' Church, presiding. After prayer, and a few appropriate remarks from Mr. Stryker, the Treasurer read a report of last year's work; at the conclusion of which, the resignations of the President, Secretary, and Treasurer were handed in. Before proceeding to business, it was necessary to elect new officers, and the old ones were unanimously re-elected, each one having been nominated, the nomination seconded, and the vote taken. The following resolutions were then submitted to the meeting, and approved, with the addition of amendment or resolution, No. 5.

1st. That there be three officers for the general work and supervision, to be elected annually by vote, viz: President, Secretary, Treasurer.

2nd. That each Parish have its own officers, viz: Rector of Parish, who will be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer; that said officers hold their own meetings, make their own arrangements, send their own contributions direct to Miss Emery, keeping in mind this special clause, viz: that each Treasurer keep an exact

account of whatever moneys, boxes, &c., are sent, their destination, valuation, time of sending, and all particulars. That each Treasurer report these to Secretary of each Parish at the end of every month, to be embodied in regular form,—ready to be put into the hands of the Diocesan Secretary,—under her signature, and that of the Treasurer, at the close of the working year.

3rd. That each Parish have its own monthly meeting,—where it must select two or more delegates, to attend the general meetings, wheresoever designated, three times in the course of the working year, to facilitate which a day will be appointed, convenient to all, not interfering with special Parish work.

4th. That any Parish, not having separate organization, is invited to send delegates to the general meetings,—and that the Auxiliary will be glad of interest and sympathy in the work, and whatever little may be spared from needs nearer home.

5th. Whilst these resolutions are submitted, with the hope that they will have the effect of systematizing and enlarging our work in the Diocese of Maryland, they are not intended to interfere with any Parochial arrangement, or with the valuable time of the Rector,—should he prefer appointing a President, from among the members of the Society, rather than Vice-President, as submitted in the second resolution. Also,—if the Rector of any Parish wishes to preserve the name of organization, familiar to his congregation,—said name will not interfere with connection with our work, as it is the wish of the Woman's Auxiliary to be inclusive, not exclusive.
