RESOLUTIONS

ADOPTED BY THE

Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

1st. That there be four officers for the general work and supervision, to be elected annually by vote, viz: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer.

2nd. That each Parish have its own officers, viz: Rector of Parish, who will be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer; that said officers hold their own meetings, send their own contributions direct to Miss Emery, bearing in mind this special clause, viz: that each Treasurer keep an exact account of whatever moneys, boxes, &c., are sent, their destination, valuation, time of sending, and all particulars.

That each Treasurer report these to Secretary of each Parish, to be embodied in regular form,—ready to be put into the hands of the Diocesan Treasurer, at the close of the working year.

3d. That each Parish have its own monthly meeting, --where it must select two or more delegates, to attend the general meetings, wheresoever designated, three times in the course of a working year, on a day not interfering with special Parish work.

4th. That any Parish, not having separate organization, is invited to send delegates to the general meetings,—and that the Auxiliary will be glad of interest

and sympathy in the work, and whatever little may be spared from needs nearer home.

5th. Whilst these resolutions are submitted, with the hope that they will have the effect of systematizing and centralizing our work in the Diocese, they are not intended to interfere with any Parochial arrangement.—If the Rector of any Parish wishes to preserve the name of organization, familiar to his congregation,—said name will not interfere with connection with our work.

The Parochial Secretaries are requested to prepare for publication in our next annual Report, a complete list of subscribers to the Woman's Auxiliary, and each Report should date from Sept. 1st, to supplement Miss Emery's, which is necessarily incomplete, from the fact that she does not receive the entire amount raised in this Diocese for missions. It is therefore, most important that each Parish should report all boxes and money and their destination. Although the general Secretary to the Board of Missions reports boxes and work among the Colored People, the Bishop of Maryland should be the Central Point to receive all applications for assistance, and all reports of work done in his Diocese, for he alone can prevent that unequal distribution of benefits which might occur where several Parishes, ignorant of what each is doing, are interested in the same work, to the neglect of unknown fields.

In his recent interesting address to the auxiliary, Bishop Paret stated that, of a population of 700,000 in the Diocese of Maryland, 200,000 are freedmen.

The Board of Missions last year reduced its appropriation for the eight millions of Negroes in the United States from \$21,000 to \$12,000. To supply this defi-

ciency, a commission has been formed of five clergymen and five Bishops of whom our own Bishop is one.—Is it not our duty to give all we have for the Freedmen to that Commission?

While asking nothing from the Auxiliary, Bishop Paret gives us his entire sympathy and support in our general work, and he noted the encouraging Report this year of an increase of \$1,502.00 over that of last year.

May we not look forward to the same growth in another year, and, without taking anything from claims already recognized, may we not give something to help our Bishop in his great work?
