SECRETARY'S REPORT.

THE first general meeting for the year was held in St. Peter's Chapel, January 21st. There was an unusually large attendance, over one hundred ladies being present.

Revs. Dr. Grammer, Dr. Leakin and Mr. Griffith made addresses, referring encouragingly to what had been done in the past, as incentive for renewed zeal and endeavor in the great possibilities opening before us. Dr. Grammer warmly welcomed our new President, Mrs. ALBERT L. SIOUSSAT, under whose intelligent guidance, familiarity with every need of the work, and inspiring activity, we have every reason to go forward, to thank GOD and take courage.

Mrs. Sioussat then opened the business meeting. After the election of a Secretary, the calling of the roll was responded to by representatives from St. Peter's, Grace, Emmanuel, Christ, Ascension, St. Luke's, St. Barnabas, St. Bartholomew's, Holy Innocents, Memorial, Trinity (Towson), and Trinity (Dorsey, Howard County). The New Consti-

tution was presented, article by article submitted and voted upon with much interest, adding three Vice-Presidents.

Our General Secretary, Miss Emery, whose presence ever quickens our lagging energies, was listened to with marked interest. She presented the claims of the Church Periodical Club as worthy of our aid, sending literature to hungering minds in remote and poor parishes. The wrongs of the poor Indians touched our hearts more deeply, as she pictured the situation at the different Missions during those troublous days. Alluding to the Mission work in China, the money only needed to send forth the willing laborers, she closed with an earnest plea for loving self-denial, that we may give more freely and willingly wherever GOD's work calls.

Your Secretary regrets she has not accomplished more service entering upon the duties of the office. She begs leave to report that she has sent a copy of the last year's report to every Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. The acknowledgments received show that a responsive chord has been touched in co-workers far and near.

The report of our winter's work shows a growth that is most encouraging. Branches have been established in St. Luke's, St. Michael and All Angels, and Memorial, whose earnest spirit and

generous contributions prove them to be workers indeed.

There have been several organizations of the Church Periodical Club.

The Junior Missionary Society, by its steadfast adherence to principle, and courageous work amid many discouragements, has realized a goodly sum for the Bishop's work, as well as for the Indian field.

Especially should be noticed, the gathering in of the children, the School-girls' Missionary Chain having been undertaken and carried on with an enthusiasm most laudable.

A most interesting meeting in behalf of Indian Rights, under the auspices of the Auxiliary, was addressed by Mr. Herbert Welch. He exposed the evils of the spoils system, and proved the need of judicious action on the part of those who love justice, to see that these wrongs are not done to a people, helpless to help themselves. Its substantial showing was the election of twenty-five members to the Indian Rights Association, and of a Secretary in Miss Elizabeth Gilman.

The President of the Auxiliary desires to return cordial thanks to Miss Turner, President of the "Twenty Minute Society" of Boston, from whom two barrels of articles were received and distributed in our Diocesan field. The contents were

most dainty and acceptable, and in addition to the pleasure bestowed, they discoursed eloquently to us of results obtained from loving hands with their moiety of time devoted to earnest service.

By invitation, our President has visited several of the Parishes, submitting a plan for united work among the women of the Diocese,—Mite-boxes to be distributed, into which can be placed a penny a day, or a month, or a week, by each member; the aggregate to swell the sum pledged for the maintenance of one of the twelve silent Churches, whose care weighs heavily upon our Bishop's heart.

Thus gathering the fragments in His Name, we may hope for a store of blessing.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

BALTIMORE BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Article I.

This Association shall be known as the "MARYLAND BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY" to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

Its object shall be, by means of individual and corporate effort, to diffuse Missionary intelligence and to increase Missionary activity among the women of the Diocese; also, to unite Societies already in existence, and to urge the formation of such where there are none.

Article III.

All Parish Societies, and all individuals desiring to be members of the Diocesan Branch, will be so considered.

Article IV.

The Officers of this Association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, Secretary, and Treasurer. The aims to which these officers shall direct the intention of the body, shall be the raising of money for the support of Missionaries and Teachers, for the education of those preparing for the

work, and other Missionary objects,—the making, collecting and transferring of clothing and other material aid,—and the circulation of papers and leaflets which may serve to stir up a public interest in Missions—Diocesan and General.

Article V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at business meetings, to call special meetings when occasion shall arise, and together with the Vice-Presidents to obtain fresh information from the Missionary field, to be circulated whenever opportunity shall offer.

Article VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents to enlist the interest and sympathy of the Parishes about them, in the different sections of the Diocese, and to preside over meetings in the absence of the President.

Article VII.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to conduct correspondence of Association, especially with General Secretary of Woman's Auxiliary, to keep minutes of the proceedings of the Association, to send out notices of stated and special meetings, to keep a record of Missionary Reports, and to prepare an Annual Report.

Article VIII.

The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed to the Diocesan organization, to pay all debts, and to present an Annual Report.

Article IX.

There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Branch on the Tuesday before the Diocesan Convention in May,—at such hour and place as may seem desirable,—also one on the second Wednesday in November.

Article X.

Election of Officers shall take place at one of these meetings, and they shall continue in office for one year, or until their successors shall have been appointed. In case of a vacancy in the office of President, the names of persons nominated by the Parishes shall be submitted to the Bishop for his approval and appointment.

Article XI.

In order to defray necessary expenses for printing, postage, and stationery for use of Association—as well as to meet objects to which the Association may be pledged as a whole—a Central Fund will be formed by the contribution of twenty-five cents yearly from each member where it is possible. The collection of this sum to be made in whatever way the Parish Branches shall find expedient.

Article XII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any semi-annual meeting,—notice having been given at the previous meeting.
