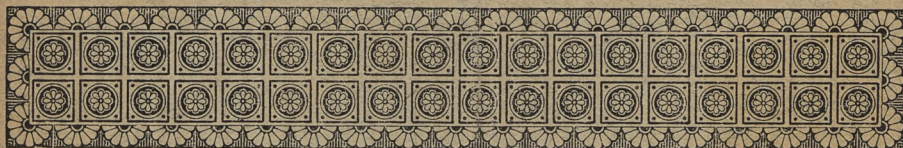

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The opening service of the year was held on Wednesday, Nov. 11th, 11 A. M., at Grace Church, with the celebration of the Holy Communion. Addresses were made by Bishop Paret and Bishop Coleman.

At 1 P. M. a generous lunch was served in the Parish building, a pleasant social reunion for the Bishops, clergy, officers and delegates.

The afternoon session was opened by Rev. Arthur C. Powell. The calling of the roll noted 125 ladies present. Our President addressed the meeting, explaining the purposes of the Woman's Auxiliary, and calling especial attention to the work of the Maryland Branch.

She was followed by Rev. Mr. Collins, about to enter the missionary field of China. He pleaded that we remember the missionaries in our offerings and our prayers, that linked with home countries, missions live, and without their support and encouragement, must die.

The Central Fund, among other points, was then discussed, the majority deciding that each branch pledge a stated amount.

Mrs. Decatur Morgan made a beautiful and stirring appeal to women, in the spirit of the Master, to consecrate time and talent to his work. After singing the Doxology, Rev. Dr. Leakin pronounced the Benediction.

There was a good attendance from the different parishes at the second regular meeting of the year, held in Emmanuel Parish House, May 16th, 3 P. M.

The opening service was conducted by Rev. Dr. Eccleston, Rector of Emmanuel, and Rev. Mr. Fletcher, Rector of St. Barnabas. After the reading of the minutes of the last meeting by the Secretary, the Treasurer gave a full report of the collec-

tions of the past year. It was cause for congratulation that our pledge for opening a silent church had been promptly met, with most encouraging showing from the mite chests. An annual sum of \$300., to continue so long as there is a silent church in Maryland, and a church woman who cares for it.

Miss Emery was listened to with deep interest. She warmly commended systematic giving, citing its wonderful success in the Connecticut Branch, bringing to them a large sum for distribution to different mission fields. She led us with kindling anticipation to the grand auxiliary meeting of the coming autumn, to the inspiration of being co-workers with such a goodly company of Christian women, the bond uniting us, love for the Master's work. She reminded us of our privilege in having this meeting in our city, the birthplace of the Woman's Auxiliary, organized in Baltimore in 1871; and still our woman's way of working, dear with use, sanctified with prayer, cheered with hope that the Master knows and values our loving service.

Maryland had sent in the past year a rich gift to China, our young Missionary, Rev. Mr. Ingle, arriving in time to cheer discouraged workers. Bishop Hare's visitation to that far-off land, accomplishing so much in 90 days absence from his diocese. His return saddened by the death of Rev. Charles S. Cook, the best educated of the Dakotas, who gave his life, struggling for the elevation of his people. As an evidence of appreciation of his faithful labors, she asked, that we contribute our share towards sending 1000 prayer-books for distribution by the several Missionaries. His last request of the Woman's Auxiliary to supply a great need. White, black and red people pleading for help; let us learn their needs and be quick and active to respond.

Our President followed in a brief address. With loving zeal urged only a larger faith to reach the measure of our ability, believing that a more general use of the auxiliary mite chests will enable us to meet every obligation of our first claim, work in Maryland, and give us the great happiness of minister-

ing to noble work beyond our own narrow borders. She accompanied Miss Emery to the all-day meeting in Washington, it proving a time of refreshing. She has been happy to visit several of the branches during the year, such contact always proving helpful, and she hopes that renewed activity will follow all attempts at better acquaintance with the principles of the Auxiliary. At Hannah More Academy, it gave her pleasure to confer the prizes offered by the Auxiliary for the almost obsolete accomplishment of darning and patching. This Diocesan school for girls maintains its well established reputation for training the daughters of the church.

It is hoped the appointment of three vice-presidents, in the convocations of Cumberland, Annapolis and Baltimore County, will fulfil the intention expressed in the Constitution, Article VI.

The Indian Aid Association is fortunate in having for its Secretary, Miss Haughton, who brings personal and inherited interest to the work.

Miss Carter's work in Minnesota has enlisted much interest, a contribution coming from the Clifton Mission of poor mothers. One of the admirable bands radiating from Mrs. Howard's centre at Memorial, ever ready in missionary work. Bishop Whipple writes, "You may know the joy it has given me that our dear sister, Miss Sybil Carter, has taken charge of these brown daughters of Our Father. I believe under God that she and her fellow-workers will have solved the problem of the elevation of Indian women."

Miss Gilman continues her office of Secretary of the Indian Rights Association. There have been no meetings called, but in response to appeals in behalf of just legislation for the Indian, signatures have been obtained and petitions sent to members of Congress.

The work of the Church Periodical Club has been sanctified, and its life quickened, by the death and memory of its noble founder, Mrs. Fargo.

Copies of our Annual Report have been sent to every diocese. A like report returned often proving a stimulus to more

earnest endeavor. In the words of one, "We need in every parish, somebody who cares to know what is going on in the mission field, somebody who cares, not that things just suit her, but that in all the world there is one soul astray, one lamb unfolded."

The Secretary has with pleasure circulated leaflets, sent by the General Secretary and sister dioceses, in behalf of the united offering for the Missionary Enrolment Fund.

From China, Japan, Africa, the Indian field, women all eager to unite with us; surely we may catch the universal enthusiasm and pray that our thank-offering may prove us indeed mindful of the blessings, countless and above price, that have fallen to our lot.
