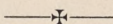

## President's Report.



The year following the Triennial Meeting brings always fresh lessons to be learned, new facts to be assimilated or freshly filled storehouses in the rich harvest of opportunity to be set in order.

I recall to your recollection some of the points in which we need to be vigilant. We have been told by our officer at the Church Missions House, that the first duty we owe is to our Parishes and rectors in auxiliary aid for their apportionment and after that to gird up our loins for the contributions to the sum allotted to us, for our own \$100,000.

At the risk of seeming insistent, the Diocesan officers would like to call your attention to the schedule of "designated contributions" furnished by the Secretary, Miss Emery, at the Missions House. A careful study of this, which counts upon our apportionment, will reveal the ease with which our full quota may be accomplished. The report of our own devoted Secretary will show you how nearly we approximate to it in Auxiliary, Juniors and Little Helpers' totals, but we have not yet reached our measure, let us do it this year.

If one should say, the total has already been met, the \$100,000 has been raised, I feel sure that there is not a Maryland woman who would wish that others would achieve work for us, we must meet our own obligations. We are also asked by Miss Emery to bear in mind the progress we have made in our growth, the care with which we should avoid calling too frequently upon our often overtaxed missionaries when home on furlough. Our own resources should be utilized, the "Spirit of Missions" should be taken and read more largely and study classes conducted. The Educational Secretary, in the formation of these study classes, is finding a hearty welcome.



The Church Missions Publishing Company has found, in the past year, a wide circulation for its United Study Course on Alaska. One on Japan will be furnished at an early date. All these show that the Study Class has come to stay.

The Normal Classes in which students shall be trained, the exchange of Diocesan officers, missionary talks with and without lantern slides, and best of all the increasing study of the Bible as the completest missionary text book, with the close fellowship of intercessory prayer, all these will tend to make our auxiliary work solid in foundation, "beautiful for situation", and in the result "the joy of the whole earth."

Your President has endeavored to fulfil her calling in answer to invitations from our sister Diocese of Easton, My Lady's Manor in our own Diocese, and a most stimulating meeting in the Diocese of Tennessee, where upon the mountain tops we met for a survey of our travels behind us, and the glorious promised land stretching out before us.

In the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Hart Colt, of Hartford <sup>Conn</sup> County, our Auxiliary loses from its earthly sight one of our earliest officers. Her life was so beautiful, so filled with alms and good deeds, so gentle, that her own people, to whom we offer our sincerest sympathy in their great loss, will be comforted to know how far-reaching is the example she leaves to us all.

Our work grows, and never did the words spoken by the Patriarch mean more than it does today in our responsibility for the world's need, "Thou shalt not see my face unless thy brother be with thee."

## Recording Secretary's Report.



The opening service of the Semi-Annual Meeting of the Maryland Branch was held in Grace Church, Baltimore, on Tuesday Morning November 15th, at half after ten o'clock.

After a celebration of the Holy Communion, an address was delivered by the Bishop of Maryland. He spoke first of the evidence of good work and steady growth as shown by the last annual report of the Maryland Branch. He described in glowing terms the marked impression made by the Woman's Auxiliary at the recent convention in Boston, and concluded his encouraging helpful remarks with the suggestion that the members of the Maryland Branch lay especially to heart the aspiration of St. Paul for the Church in Philippi "That your love may abound more and more."

After luncheon at Lehmann's Hall, the Missionary Meeting was held at two o'clock, Mrs. Sioussat presided, and the attendance was very large.

Addresses were made by Deaconess E. M. Dorsey on Missionary work in the Mountains of California, by Bishop Rowe on the conditions of work in his great diocese of Alaska, and by Mr. Kokici Morimoto of Tokio, Japan, on what Christianity really means to such Japanese as have embraced its teachings.

These addresses were most interesting, but the greatest enthusiasm of the meeting was awakened by the splendid personality and stirring words of the noble Bishop of Alaska.

In a brief report, the Treasurer of the United Offering stated that Maryland's contribution to the Boston thank-offering of \$150.00 amounted to \$3,952.84. The Rector of St. Matthews Mission, Sparrows Point gratefully acknowledged



the \$1,500 contributed towards the building of a Parish House. This most inspiring meeting closed with the benediction by Bishop Rowe.

The Annual Meeting was held at St. Peter's Parish House on the afternoon of May 23rd. The President, Mrs. Sioussat, presided, and the attendance was very large. Delegates were present from thirty-one of the fifty-two Parish Branches. Reports submitted by the various Officers and Chairmen of Committees showed on the whole satisfactory conditions of work and growth. Mrs. Sioussat read a letter from Miss Emory giving many valuable suggestions for the future. The annual election of Officers, taken for the first time by ballot resulted as follows:

The Business Meeting over the Rector of St. Peters, Rev. Wm. H. Falkner took charge. After a brief service and a cordial address of welcome, he introduced the speaker of the day, Rev. H. St. George Tucker, President of St. Pauls' College, Tokio. Mr. Tucker gave an exceedingly clear and interesting account of Missionary work among the young men of Japan, explaining that among the intellectual class the prevailing attitude of mind at present is far more one of utter indifference to all religion than of actual dislike to Christianity.

After the singing of a hymn the benediction was pronounced by Rev. Wm. Wroth.

Refreshments served by the ladies of St. Peters' brought to an end this pleasant and inspiring meeting.

There have been five regular and two special meetings of the executive committee; the average number of parishes represented has been fourteen.

## Corresponding Secretary's Report.



The year has been one of unusual privilege, beginning with the inspiration of the great Missionary Convention held in Boston in October last. Alluding to the meetings there held of the Woman's Auxiliary, their crowded attendance, their spiritual uplift, the Bishop of Maryland in his address at the November meeting said, "the whole atmosphere was charged with Missionary electricity." Feeling its kindling influence and the great possibilities of the Mission Field, his exhortation was, "I pray that ye abound more and more."

We note the ready response in reports from the branches, some telling of increase in members, in offerings, of a larger circulation of the spirit of Missions and above all a deepening interest in what the church is doing for Missions. At one branch, conducted by the rector, which meets twice a month, different Mission Fields have been presented and at weekly meetings during Lent, the United Study Course on Alaska. Under such helpful guidance, membership has trebled and offerings doubled. We commend the zeal of another branch which meets every week from October to May inclusive, has monthly a corporate communion and closes with a special church service. The weaker branches share the word of commendation for what they are doing. We need their co-operation and would that every woman in the Diocese could catch the enthusiasm of our motto, "Every Church Woman, a worker for Missions."

Attention is called to the Central Fund. A contribution sent annually from each branch would defray the necessary expenses of the organization, printing, postage, etc. To the Church Missions Publishing Company (211 State Street, Hartford, Connecticut,) we are indebted for the carefully laid out course on Alaska, which stimulated the formation of eight study classes. To those who would work intelligently, we recommend these publications for the clear and concise information given of different Mission fields.

The report of the Foreign Committee tells of the deep interest of the Maryland Branch in the Memorial to our late beloved Bishop J. Addison Ingle. We must still labor and pray for the \$5,000 needed to complete the sum required for the erection of "Ingle Hall", Wuchang, China.

Archdeacon Neve spoke in March to Grace Church branch on the needs of Mountain Missions in Virginia. At Emmanuel Parish House, March tenth, Miss Lucy Jarvis of Connecticut addressed a general meeting on the helpfulness of study Mission classes. March thirtieth, a Quiet day service was held in Christ church, conducted by the Bishop of Maryland with corporate communion for the Woman's Auxiliary and Girls Friendly. The keynote of his address was reality in Prayer, Fasting and Alms-giving, or deeds of mercy. A helpful exposition of the true meaning of Lenten observance, drawing all workers nearer to Christ as co-laborers with Him.

The general secretary, Miss Emery, calls our attention to the following resolution passed at the Triennial meeting in Boston. "Resolved:—That the gift of \$100,000, a year from the Woman's Auxiliary for the work undertaken by the Board of Missions, which the General Secretary asked for three years ago, be kept steadily before the diocesan and parochial branches by their officers, and the increase in giving noted from time to time." Towards the above sum our report this year gives:

An increase of \$708.14 over what was given to the apportionment last year. We are asked to plan and work that for the coming year the women may give at least \$2,000, the Juniors \$275, and the Little Helpers, \$60.

The United Offering treasurer reports many letters written and five hundred boxes distributed for the United offering. Growing interest is urgently requested that Maryland's contribution for 1907 may be a generous one.

With regret we record the resignation of the correspondent of the church Periodical Club, Miss Elizabeth Mc Lane, who has given of her time and means gladly to send out literature to those in lonely places hungering for intellectual stimulus. Let each branch have a librarian, who will report what is done, and another year will show a more generous response to the great need.

With sorrow we place upon record the loss of one of our most faithful and efficient workers, Miss Marie Trimble Davis, for ten years treasurer of the Memorial branch and but a few months its President when she was called "to higher service" in the presence of our Lord. Let us emulate her loving zeal that others might know something of the joy of being "servants of His doing His pleasure."

While we note with thankfulness what we have done, may it only be an earnest of the much more we can do, till "this work, Christ's legacy, be a very part of ourselves."

## Indian Aid Committee.



We gratefully note continued interest and a broader scope in the offerings for Indian Missions.

The Indian Lace Sale, November 29th, was of unusual interest, being held at the Episcopal residence through the courtesy of its gracious hostess.

Miss Sybil Carter spoke of the wonderful success of her ten lace schools, not only providing means of livelihood but elevating and christianizing the Indian women. Medals had been awarded the beautiful exhibit at Paris and Charleston exhibitions, and the Grand Prize at the World's Fair.

The result of the sale was \$114.00.

Miss Thackara's self-denying work in Arizona, where single-handed and alone she has for ten years bravely carried on a hospital for the Navajo Indians, aroused general interest and a ready response in her time of need. We would strengthen and uphold the missions in South Dakota, where the value of Bishop Hare's labors for thirty-two years among the Sioux Indians is untold.

The generous offerings at their annual Convocation, specially of the Indian women, prove them self-helpful and worthy of our encouragement. Under auspices of the Grace Church branch and also at Memorial, Archdeacon Appleby made an interesting appeal for the ~~Red~~ people of Duluth, Minnesota among whom he has labored for twenty-five years.

The missions among the Arapahoes in Oklahoma and for the Oneidas have claimed our sympathy and help. The study of missions in Alaska enabled us the better to realize the general progress of the Indians wherever the church has reached them, and should stimulate us to give generously for their support.

## Report of Foreign Committee.



Five meetings of the Foreign Committee were held at the Diocesan Library during the past year. Its work consisted chiefly in stirring up interest in the Ingle Memorial Fund and in Dr. Teussler's Hospital in Tokyo. Arrangements were made for a Parlor Meeting for Dr. Teussler, held on December 7th, 1904, and for an Ingle Memorial Meeting, held at Memorial Parish House on February 17th, 1905. This meeting was addressed by Mr. John W. Wood of the Church Missions' House and was largely attended. Pledge cards were sent out in advance with the invitations, and the result was most successful in arousing interest, not only in the different Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, but among those who do not ordinarily attend Missionary Meetings.

During the year \$1,058.31 has been raised for the Ingle Memorial, \$386.50 for Dr. Teussler, and \$5.00 for Bishop Ferguson's work in Africa. To this must be added \$50.00 for Dr. Teussler and for St. John's College, Shanghai, which was handed in at the Parlor Meeting, but not included in the general offering.

## President's Report.



At the yearly meeting of the Junior Department, on May the sixth, admirable reports were read by the Parish Secretaries of twenty-two branches. It is obvious that this report must necessarily be confined to a brief summary of its chief accomplishment in work and study.

In October, one hundred and fifty dollars were sent to the "United Offering", which was made at the great Auxiliary Service in Boston on October 6th. In November, six hundred Christmas gifts were sent to the Rev. Amos Ross, (Indian Priest in South Dakota,) for his five Sunday Schools; one hundred to the Rev. D. H. Sandford, for a Christmas Festival in Oklahoma, and many smaller boxes to various Missionary stations in Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and Tennessee. Several appeals for "Specials" were responded to; among these being Miss Thackera's Hospital work in Arizona, Dr. Woodward's Hospital at Hgankin, China, work at Cape Mount, Africa, and scholarships in the schools at Arden and Beaufort, (North Carolina).

Two scholarships have been supported in one of Bishop Hare's Indian Schools—one named for our Bishop, the "William Paret" scholarship; and another, the "Wm. M. Dame", and there is a new one this year in St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai, China, called the "J. H. Eccleston" scholarship; and another in St. Hilda School, Wuchang, China, called the "Addison Ingle" scholarship, in memory of the noble young Bishop whose memory the Juniors have so delighted to honor. One of the last letters he ever wrote was in acknowledgement of their greeting, which was accompanied by a gift of one hundred dollars, and since his death there has been contributed over one hundred and fifty dollars towards the Addison Ingle Memorial Hall. The Juniors are realizing the importance and responsibility of the apportionment fund, and besides offerings from the Branches, the offertory at the May meeting was devoted to this object.

The annual Epiphany Service is becoming every year a more fruitful inspiration towards enlisting the interest and



energy of the children of the church, and we gratefully acknowledge the help and encouragement of the Rector of St. Peter's Church in arranging it.

This service was held on Sunday afternoon, January the eighth.

Hundreds of children crowded the church—presenting an inspiring sight—and the hearty responses and singing made it an occasion of unusual enthusiasm.

Addresses were made by the Rev. James Watson Norris, D. D., of the Brazil Mission; the Rt. Rev. Ethelbert Talbot, Bishop of Central Pennsylvania, and the Rev. Wm. Howard Falkner; and the singing was led by the St. Cecilia Guild.

Missionary Study is on the increase, and not only has there been systematic reading on subjects of general interest in many of the branches, but some have taken courses during the year in Japan, China and Alaska.

One of the older Juniors after taking a course in a Students' Volunteer Class, held a weekly class to which were invited delegates from each branch, who took back to their branches the subject matter taken up. Five weeks being given to talks on Japan and five to China.

During Lent three branches took up the course on Alaska prepared by the Church Missions Publishing Company, and, in short, the Junior Branch which omits missionary reading or study at its meetings, is the exception.

At the General Convention in Boston there was a missionary exhibit of Study Helps and Methods, and the Maryland Juniors were represented by scrap-books on China, Alaska and the Indians, original papers on missionary subjects, and specimens of the "envelope library", which is a method of sending reading matter to remote hospitals for distribution. The earlier years of the Junior Department recorded faithful work and generous giving, and year by year its advancement is shown in steady upward growth in its threefold aim—not only the giving—but in study and prayer for missions.
