The United Offering of 1910.

At the conference of diocesan officers held on Monday, October 7th, the question of the object for the United Offering of 1910 was one of the most important matters to be decided. After careful consideration, the resolution offered by the committee appointed by the conference was unanimously adopted. It is as follows :

"Resolved, That the United Offering of 1910 be given to the Board of Missions for woman's work in the Mission Field : including the training, sending and support of women workers ; also the care of such workers when sick and disabled ; but that a sum not exceeding \$15,000 be devoted to a building, or buildings, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

"Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers, that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field."

Prayer for More Workers.

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into thy harvest and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for the Diocese.

Blessed Lord, who has taught thy children to pray for each, send Thy blessing upon the Diocese to which I belong. Give grace to its Bishops and clergy, that they may win souls to Thee, and guide Thy people in the narrow way. Grant to us growth and increase, if it be Thy will, and teach us to give largely of our substance, for the glory of Thy name, and the work of Thy holy Church. Make these souls, for whom Thou hast died, true to Thee, to all their vows and duties in this life, and so prepare them for the joys of thy heavenly kingdom, for thy mercy's sake, O blessed Jesus, who with the Father, and Holy Ghost, livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

Report for Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Since we met together a year ago, there has come to us the completion of our hopes and aims in the great gathering over the waters in our mother church, in the old country from which we have received so much in tradition and truth and although it may seem remote in these materialistic days, yet it is near with the nearness of blood ties and the inheritance in this church in these United States of America.

Beginning with the notes of the Penitential Psalm, in Westminster Abbey at noon of June 15th, and ending with the triumph song of the Thanksgiving Service in St. Paul's on June 24th, the last echoes sounding throughout the aisles of the quaint and beautiful old Cathedral of Southwark that same night, there was nothing lacking in this splendid presentation of the Church among English speaking peoples.

Your greetings were carried to those into whose faces you will never look in this world. Your methods in Auxiliary, Junior and Babies Branch, your times and sessions of ingathering in the united offering at our Triennial, nay, the story of the very beginning of the Colony and the Church as here developed were all eagerly heard and cordially welcomed.

In parlor or parish house, in the fine old castle Hall, or the dear Rectories which nestle down by the Churches in the green fields and woodlands, the welcome was the same for the delegate who endeavoured to bring her small contribution to the great movement. And in returning, your President has striven to convey to you so much as was possible of the spirit of consecration, the wonderful Pentecostal fire which marked the moments and the days of our first great Pan Anglican Congress.

Nor is the work finished, for the Committees are still meeting and earnest efforts making that the flame thus kindled may burn with such a steady pure light that all men shall see it and the "Glory of God shall cover the Earth as the waters cover the Sea."

It has been a great pleasure and will always be, to give the few glimpses of the places and people which could be gotten into an hour's lecture and your representative will be glad to give it whenever desired by the Rector or Auxiliary Branches.

Beginning with this amazing roll call of the church throughout the world, the year has been notable for many new happenings.

Both at home, in our own Auxiliary, in the Diocese and the large field of which the Mission House in New York is the centre, great changes have come, in so merciful a fashion, however, that we are sure some signal advance all along the line must come with them.

The honoured head of our Diocese, our Bishop for so many years, has felt the need of aid in his care of all the Churches, and your prayers were asked that those to whom the choice was left might be guided aright.

Those prayers have been answered and we believe that he who, on the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels in his own Parish church, was set apart for the office of Bishop in the Church of God, combines that thorough knowlege of the needs of our beloved Diocese with the wider outlook into the world beyond, which will carry our Missionary work throughout our own borders into all the world, and the auxiliary offers to him the same loyal affection which so many years ago we consecrated to the Bishop of Maryland, pledging ourselves so far as we can, in the admonition of her who was blessed among women, when preparing the household for the great work which should be done among them at the wedding in Cana of Galilee. She said "Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it."

We have been long accustomed to wait for the sound of the trumpet in Dr. Lloyd's stirring appeals at the beginning of the year, and to regard with complacency the making up of deficits by Mr. Thomas of blessed memory, at the end.

In the good providence of God, both have been removed from us and if the work is to be done we must lay hold of it and do it.

Our apportionment, one part of the \$100,000 which in San Francisco was laid upon us as our share in keeping up the appropriations of the Board, has never been fully completed. Shall we not see to this in the short twelve months which remain to us before our next meeting in Cincinnati? Through designated offerings and direct gifts to the Board.

In our own circle of auxiliary officers we were filled with dismay by the necessary withdrawal from her active labors of our devoted Secretary Miss Davis, but again mercy and goodness have followed us, for in her unanimous election as Honorary Secretary for life and the acceptance of Miss Tiffany and Miss Gardner of the positions thus left vacant we gain a trio of strength which will mean much to us in the coming years.

Our Foreign Committee has done such fine work under its Secretary, Miss Packard, and Treasurer, Miss Williams, that it is with great regret that we have to give them up. While Mrs. Brune in her faithful care of the Babies Branch, has left a record which they—growing up so fast, and we who must give our places to them some day, will always remember.

We cannot mourn for those who have been taken to their homes, but from the Diocesan officers Mrs. West's interesting work, the Church Periodical Club, must miss her sadly.

Are we reckoning up the possibilities of our united offering for 1910?

Our Special Treasurer, Mrs. Wilton Snowden will tell us that "The Summer is over, the harvest is ended, and we are not"—where we ought to be.

We rejoice that twelve precious months are still left us that we are here today to renew our vows, to take up the strain of the Congress hymn, and plead,

Still breathe on us! Great God of morn
 That zeal of Saints and Sages,
 So tongues unheard and isles unborn
 Shall hymn thy praise through ages.

We bless thy name for one and all
Who founded for Thy glory,
Each low sweet shrine, each Minster tall
To tell mankind Thy story.
May we, their heirs our lamp display
Of love and wisdom burning,
Till twilight melt in golden day,
At our dear Lord's returning."

Report of Recording Secretary

The number of Parish Branches is fifty-three, one more than the number reported last year. The women of Grace Church, New Market, Frederick County announced in February that they had organized themselves into a Branch, had twelve members, with regularly chosen officers. During the year there have been seven regular but no special meetings of the Executive Board. The average number of Branches represented at these meetings has been fifteen, the same number as last year. The Semi-Annual Meeting took place November 19, 1908, at St, Peter's Church. In the morning there was a Celebration of the Holy Communion, with an address by the Bishop of Maryland. At the crowded Missionary Meeting in the afternoon the speakers were Miss Mann, of Japan, and Rev. Arthur S. Lloyd, then Secretary to the Board of Missions. The Annual Business Meeting was held at the Church of the Holy Comforter, Lutherville, on the afternoon of May 25th.

Interesting addresses were made by Rev. W. H. H. Powers, Rector of the Church, and by Miss Ridgely on the Work at Cape Mount, West Africa, and refreshments were hospitably served at the home of one of the members of the Lutherville Auxiliary. The attendance was large and enthusiastic.

Corresponding Secretary's Report

The work of the year began with the impetus of the largely attended and enthusiastic Annual Meeting held in St. Peter's Church, November 19th.

While the enforced absence of our devoted President was deplored by all, there was cause for gratitude that our beloved Bishop willingly assumed the responsibility of the meeting. His loving greeting, "I thank my God upon every remembrance of you," gave the word of commendation that ever quickens the zeal of earnest workers.

Miss Mann gave a graphic account of thirteen years of successful work in Japan, to which field she returns with undaunted courage.

Deaconess Goodwin, of the "Church Students' Missionary Association, N. Y.," told of the inspiration gained from the meetings of the "Pan-Anglican Conference."

Rev. Arthur S. Lloyd, D.D., gave encouraging features of Missions in China, Japan and the Philippines, and brought forcibly to us the realization that "it is worth while" to do our part in the world's work for Christ.

At the Annual Autumn Meeting of St. Timothy's Branch, Catonsville, Miss Coles spoke feelingly of the impressiveness and solemnity pervading the meetings in London, exemplifying what is being done by devoted men and women, giving not only their means but their very selves to carry the story of Christ's love to all mankind.

On the eighteenth of March an illustrated lecture on the Pan-Anglican Conference given by the President, brought vividly to us the privileges of that wonderful missionary gathering. The proceeds were generously given to fulfill the pledge made for the hospital at Sagada in the Philippines.

Five years ago, our own missionary, Miss Margaretta S. Ridgely, left home and all she holds dear to labor in far-off Africa. Her return to us this winter has given a

number of the branches the opportunity of hearing of the work accomplished. It appeals more nearly to our cordial support and continued interest in so self-sacrificing a field, to which she will return with renewed devotion.

Mount Calvary and other branches heard from Mrs. Walter Hughson, of North Carolina, of her husband's work among those long neglected and deserving mountaineers of the South. Nobly carrying on his work, she appealed for the hospital which he had founded before his death.

In March, Mr. Arthur Gray, of Amherst, Virginia, made appeals for help in extending his work among the remnant of an Indian tribe still living in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Among other interesting appeals were those of Rev. I. H. Correll, D.D., of Japan, and Rev. Edmund J. Lee, of China.

A "Quiet Day of Prayer and Meditation" with Corporate Communion Service for the "Woman's Auxiliary" and the "Girls' Friendly Society" was held in Emmanuel Church, Wednesday in Holy Week. The service was conducted by Rev. J. Houston Eccleston, D.D., whose helpful words upon the topic "Repentance" as taught in 2 Cor., VII Chapter and 11th Verse were a privilege and inspiration to his hearers,

We note encouraging activity and an increasing desire for information.

The Epiphany appeal put each parish in the Diocese in touch with the work of the Auxiliary, and kindled interest in redeeming the pledges.

We welcome branches organized at Grace, New Market, and St. Stephen's Chapel, Thurmont.

Mission study classes have been held in many of the branches, and for these, work is made easy by the course laid out each year by the Educational Secretary of the Church Missions House.

A digest of the "Spirit of Missions" is commended. Presented to a meeting it gives valuable information of every part of the field.

With the constant demand for more women in the Mission field, we must realize the importance of the "United Offering" of 1910. We are asked that with our

united gifts, united prayer for more faithful workers form a very real part of this offering.

With St. Michael's branch we mourn the loss of a valuable and life-long friend to Missions, Mrs. Henry C. Lay, widow of the late Bishop of Easton. We would emulate her consecrated life and devotion to our Lord and His Church.

The Indian Committee would place upon record a sense of irreparable loss in the death of Miss Sybil Carter.

Her saintly life of self-sacrifice and devotion for the uplifting of Indian women, her own personal charm and beautiful character enshrine her memory in our hearts. "The Sybil Carter Indian Mission and Lace Industry" is a living memorial to her life and appeals to our continued support to carry on the work of its founder in bringing hope and means of livelihood to helpless Indian women.

With deep regret your Corresponding Secretary tenders her resignation of the office held since January, 1890. Physical inability compels the withdrawal from active work.

To the officers and members of the Maryland Branch she would express her grateful appreciation of the loving confidence ever given, which has made the work a labor of love.

While much has been left undone, we may rejoice in the growth of the Auxiliary, the broadening vision and deepening love for missions, ever praying that we realize the glory of our calling in Christ, and the joy set before us in His service.

Report of President of Junior Auxiliary.

This report begins, as usual, with a little review of the year's accomplishment as gathered from the reports presented by the parish branches, at the yearly meeting held on the afternoon of May 8th, in the Parish House of Emmanuel Church. One branch (numbering 49 members) reported a monthly address given by either a visiting missionary or auxiliary officer, and contributions in money to work in Alaska, China, Labrador and Africa.

Another, reported two scholarships to Beaufort (N. Carolina) and another; offerings sent to Asheville, Alaska, Oklahoma, Salina and Cuba.

Another, after reporting a total of one hundred and eighteen dollars in gifts to Christ School (Arden, N. C.), St. Andrew's School, (Suwanee, Tennessee), work among the Oneida Indians, part of the joint box to South Dakota, and to Diocesan missions; reported organized mission study.

Another, a box to Fairbanks, (Alaska) and others reported boxes sent to mission stations in Virginia, and to Morganton, Blowing Rock and Beaufort, (N. Carolina). The joint objects have included a Christmas box containing 300 presents to the Rev. Amos Ross (S. Dakota) and another containing 250, to Christ School (Arden, N. C.), besides thirty-eight dollars towards the library fund of Boone School, (Wuchang, China), and an offertory given at the general meeting, of eighty-five dollars for our apportionment fund, designated for Alaska.

The scholarships named for the Rt. Rev. Addison Ingle, the Rev. J. H. Eccleston and the Rev. W. M. Dame, two in China and one in S. Dakota, are supported by three Parish Branches, and were reported as having been paid.

Besides reports, there were other interesting features of our yearly meeting

Dr. Eccleston's hearty welcome and short address, which included a tribute to Mr. George C. Thomas, was followed by a resolution (on behalf of the meeting) in which was expressed "Our sense of deep sorrow, in the loss of the Church's great layman who was so near the hearts of us all; and to record the profound gratitude we feel for the shining example of a life so wholly consecrated to the service of our Lord and Master, Christ." We were also happy in the presence of Mrs. Sioussat who gave us a helpful and inspiring address, and there was a first report from our Educational Secretary, Miss Scott, who has done splendid work in conducting mission study classes, giving talks, and planning the spread of missionary knowledge.

We have welcomed six new branches during the year, viz: St. Paul's Church, Baltimore, St. John's Church, Waverly, St. Anne's Church, Annapolis, Grace Church, New Market, Sherwood, and Emmanuel Church, Cumberland, including which, the entire enrollment of Parish Branches is 33.

Our Yearly Service was held on the second Sunday in Epiphany in St. Peter's Church, and we are glad to express our appreciation of the kindness and co-operation of the Rector, who welcomed and gave us an encouraging missionary greeting, and of Rev. J. H. Eccleston's talk so full of missionary uplift and inspiration.

The music was hearty and beautiful, led as usual by the St. Cecilia Guild, and the offertory of twenty-five dollars was sent towards the building fund of "Mann Hall" (Boone College, China,) in memory of the Rev. Arthur Mann.

Our plans for next year are hopeful:—one being that the monthly executive meetings (from which we have always gained sympathy and co-operation) will, during the coming year, be one-half a business session, and the other half hour devoted to a missionary programme, the details of which will be carefully planned, and the work divided among Parish leaders, thus widening the nucleus and consequently the spread of this important section of Junior Work. We aim to make mission study so important, that many of us may eventually be brought to realize more and more a sense of personal responsibility, and to desire so to pray, that that Great Teacher our Lord Jesus Christ, may

grant our mission study leaders to truly learn of Him, and their studies blessed to the extension of His kingdom.

Another feature of general meetings, will be the holding of occasional intercessory services where special prayers will be offered for all work undertaken by the Juniors, to ask the blessing of deeper spirituality in all its work, and to realize that "More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of."
