## The United Offering of 1913

At the conference of Diocesan officers held in Cincinnati October 8th, the question of the object for the United Offering of 1913 was one of the most important matters to be decided. After careful consideration, the resolution offered by the committee appointed by the conference was unanimously adopted. It is as follows:

*Resolved*, That the United Thank-offering of 1913 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission field, including the training, testing, sending and support of women workers; also the care of such workers when sick or disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$20,000 be devoted to buildings for the use of women workers, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field, or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

### A Prayer for More Workers

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### A Prayer for the Diocese

Blessed Lord, who hast taught Thy children to pray for each, send Thy blessing upon the Diocese to which I belong. Give grace to its Bishops and clergy, that they may win souls to Thee, and guide Thy people in the narrow way. Grant to us growth and increase, if it be Thy will, and teach us to give largely of our substance, for the glory of Thy name and the work of Thy holy Church. Make these souls, for whom Thou hast died, true to Thee, to all their vows and duties in this life, and so prepare them for the joys of Thy heavenly kingdom, for Thy mercy's sake, O blessed Jesus, who with the Father and Holy Ghost livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

## Foreword

---

It is the duty of your President, in this Foreword, to present to you a wider survey of the field than could be given in the detailed reports of our devoted Diocesan officers. On this occasion of the assembly of ourselves together we must call to mind the World movements intended to help each individual soul in its onward path.

Behind us lies the Pan-Anglican still sending to us its message through the Committee on Woman's Work, in which the Hon. Mrs. Creighton, the Hon. Mrs. Montgomery and the Hon. Mrs. Davidson keep touch with the delegates of 1908. The minutes of their meetings, and the papers read before them, have been given at our own Executive sessions. Then comes the inspiring history of the Edinboro Conference, in which our only part was to catch the echoes given at Cincinnati, in the session which culminated in Bishop Brent's stirring address, the birth night of the impetus to the fast-coming World Conference on Faith and Order. The effect of the Golden Jubilee here in our midst has not been suffered to pass away. Your officers still keep its memory in their Continuation Committee to which will be assigned an important part in work to come. Each demonstration has brought to us its ever memorable lesson; still another is to be unrolled before us in the near future.

The project of the production of scenes from the Mission field in their most faithful exactness has been tried with success in two of the largest cities of our land, and the World will come to Baltimore in the early autumn Allegorical presentations, illustrating the triumph of the Cross, its rescue from Infidel pollution, and the long-fought warfare, still waging, with the Crescent, meant much to the faithful of the Middle Ages, and formed a part of the great instructive force of the folk gatherings. It will, we are sure, mean no less to those who work in our great Object Lesson, to those who see it, and to those who must be content to hear about it. Today we are to learn more of the movement from one of our Clergy who has already given from

his busy life his devoted energies to the service—the Rev. Romilly F. Humphreys, of Grace and St. Peter's, and a layman who is putting into it his sterling business knowledge and consecrated activity—Wm. F. Cochran, Esq. This long continuing pageant gives the history of the world's redemption from darkness to light. We bespeak for it your warm interest, your earnest prayers.

Congratulations are due for our fulfillment of the pledge for colored work, asked of us a year ago by our beloved Bishop. We hope to furnish him a similar amount for the coming year (as nearly as we can make it), to be placed at his disposal. Our Jubilee pledge for St. Hilda's shows a steady, healthy growth, and the end is now in sight.

It is not often that we can help the Bishop of Alaska outside the regulation Auxiliary way, but at this juncture in the life of our aboriginal tribes you are asked to bend your energies to the persuasion of our law-givers in Congress assembled, to the fact that there is needed a speedy enactment of Attorney-General Wickersham's bill to arrest the wretched traffic in every form of evil which is fast depopulating our near-Arctic Diocese. The more activity that we can bring to bear on the daily mails, in petitions and reminders, the better chance we shall have of its passage.

(1) Our aims for the coming year are the steady support of the Mission study classes, parochial and Diocesan. Our Educational Secretary, Miss Duer, will be ready to direct and advise you. In this connection your President wishes to record the profit which she derived in holding such a course in the Parish at St. John's, Hagerstown, Rev. J. Poyntz Tyler, Rector.

(2) The systematic consideration of the Apportionment, which we hope to aid further by the consolidation of all organizations of Church women in the Diocese.

(3) The United Offering, We have only this year left for its ingathering, and it will require sturdy work and constant prayer that we may make our proportionate increase over and above our past Triennials.

## Report of the Secretary Maryland Branch, Woman's Auxiliary

MAY 30, 1911, TO MAY 28, 1912

During the year there have been eight regular meetings of the Executive Board. These were generally well attended, the Parish delegates showing in many ways increased interest in the problems of Auxiliary Work, and a desire to help in their solution. The Branches are learning the value of co-operation and begin to realize that only by working together can we hope to make the Maryland Auxiliary the strong support it should be to our Church Mission Boards—Diocesan as well as general.

In the last three years there have been few changes in our methods of work, but there is marked growth in the intelligent zeal with which the work is done.

The number of boxes packed and sent has been about as usual. The money contributions have been largely devoted to securing for our own Bishop the \$750 he asked for colored work in Maryland, and to fully redeeming the pledges made last year of \$500 each for Alaska and for St. Paul's School, Tokyo. In addition to fulfilling these promises, for which the Auxiliary is solely responsible, the various Branches and individual members have nobly borne their part with other Maryland Church Women in raising the Jubilee pledge of \$6000 for St. Hilda's School, Wuchang, China. It is pleasant to know that of this large sum there is lacking but little more than \$400, and it is still more gratifying to realize that this extraordinary effort for St. Hilda's has not resulted in weakening the other work.

The semi-annual meeting was held November 7, the last day of the Annual Council of the Third Missionary Department, held at this time in Baltimore, and the usual programme was somewhat modified.

The opening service, with celebration of the Holy Communion, was held at Emmanuel Church, and immediately after it there was an informal business meeting in the Parish House. We

were so fortunate as to have with us representatives from eight of the twelve Diocesan Auxiliaries included in the Third Department, and the reports they gave of their methods of work and results achieved, as well as their frank recognition of the problems as yet unsolved, were most helpful and stimulating to every Auxiliary member present.

After the luncheon at Lehmann's Hall, when the delegates to the Council were also the guests of the Maryland Auxiliary, there was a large and enthusiastic Missionary meeting, when stirring addresses were made by Bishop Talbot, Rev. Arthur Gray and a Chinese Christian student at Goucher College.

One of the valuable features of the Department Council as it affected Auxiliary Women, was the Normal Mission Study Class, conducted by the Educational Secretary, Rev. Arthur Gray, and composed of delegates from the different Diocesan Auxiliaries, each of whom was expected to in her turn teach what she had learned. This plan has in most cases been carried out. In our own Diocese, as in others, there have been many study classes during the last few months, and to the increasing knowledge of Missions and their needs we must surely attribute much of the measure of success we have slowly attained in helping them.

But with our broadening vision we see as never before what is left undone, the opportunity given to each one of our Branches, large and small alike, to do even a little more in the world's great Mission field. The last eighteen months have brought much to stimulate our energies. The Jubilee of Women's Work in Foreign Missions, the Missionary Council, the preparation for the "World in Baltimore," in which so many of us are even now engaged, all give us or have given inspiration and renewal of power which should next year result in deeper, more earnest, and by God's blessing more fruitful work than our Auxiliary has ever done before.

The meeting was largely attended, there being present representatives from 28 Parish Branches, and at its close there was a pleasant half-hour of social intercourse, during which refreshments were served by the ladies of St. Margaret's Branch.

## Church Periodical Club

The work of the Church Periodical Club has shown steady growth in the Diocese during the past year.

Five new Branches have been enrolled. Three of the old Branches, silent for a time, have, under newly appointed Librarians, gone vigorously to work. Other Branches are forming.

This Branch of Mission Work is not widely known, nor fully understood. With this fault removed the power for good cannot be fully realized. Only through the cordial letters received can one appreciate the value to the busy worker in dreary, isolated Mission fields of good literature regularly delivered.

We have as yet no Traveling Libraries in the Diocese, which is to be regretted, as it supplies a permanent need—for weeks at least—where no libraries are established. This we hope to have during the year.

Especial effort may be made to interest the children and young people who—individually or in clubs—may be brought to care for children in mining places or elsewhere, in whose interest the carelessly treated book or paper may be guarded and mailed with a card of notification. Among the places to which books and magazines have been sent during the past year are Mexico, Japan, Cuba, Alaska, Nova Scotia, China, Manila, Panama, and Damascus in Syria.

The Diocesan Correspondent will be ready at any time to give information about the C. P. C. to any one who may feel interested. The Annual Report sent out by the Central Office, also leaflets will be mailed upon application to the Diocesan Correspondent, No. 1402 Bolton Street.

Owing to the change of the Fiscal Year from May 1st to April 1st the Annual Report is somewhat curtailed.

## President's Report

Three scholarships are paid in Foreign fields, viz: one in St. Hilda's School, Wuchang, in memory of J. Addison Ingle, first Bishop of Hankow; another the "J. H. H. Eccleston" in Shanghai, China, and the third in St. Margaret's School, Tokyo, Japan.

In the Home field, the "Hannah More" scholarship in Alaska, the "Wm. M. Dame" in South Dakota, a special offering to St. Paul's School, Beaufort, North Carolina, and, besides, several day scholarships to this same school.

Various other sums have been sent to China, Japan, and Alaska; and, for work nearer home, to Tennessee, North Carolina and Virginia.

Joint boxes containing nearly one thousand Christmas gifts were sent to South Dakota and North Carolina, besides separate boxes, which added to these, made a total of fifteen hundred, to make the season a glad one in "desolate places."

Several new Branches have been formed, viz: at All Saints Church, and St. Michael and All Angels Church, and the "Bishop Paret Memorial" Branch, Baltimore; St. James' Church, Irvington; St. Matthew's Church, Sparrows Point; St. David's Church, Roland Park, besides a second Branch (to be called the Senior-Juniors) at Trinity Church, Towson. This Branch answers a resolution made in Cincinnati recommending that "a united effort be made to form Junior Branches of older girls and young women," and the further suggestion was made that between that "Triennial" and the next in 1913, we should create so many of these Branches that at the "Triennial" in New York in 1913, they should go in a body into the Woman's Auxiliary, and, to quote Miss Lindley, "I cannot put into words how fully I believe this is the duty entrusted to Junior Leaders."

At our yearly meeting we were unusually privileged as to speakers, having our own Bishop, whose short talk was not only happy and encouraging, but generous in setting the Juniors a lighter task than he had hoped they might assume, and one they earnestly hope to make good.

He was followed by Mr. Wm. F. Cochran, Jr., who gave a glowing and earnest talk on Missionary Effort, as well as touching on the coming Missionary Pageant and Exhibit "The World in Baltimore," and he was followed by Miss Lindley, Special Secretary of Junior Work, who gave a stirring address. Besides these we had Mrs. Sioussat with us, and a special letter from Miss Scott, written for this meeting.

It is fine to tell of generous money gifts from the Juniors, but far more kindling to realize that we have in Miss Scott one of ourselves working in China, one who took not only fine talent, splendidly trained, into the school work there, but a noble heart full of high purpose and zeal. Another Junior is expecting to return to China with Deaconess Hart, one who volunteered just before the close of her school life, and had been in special training for three years.

I have spoken only partially of the year's accomplishment, and I cannot resist a word as to our desire that our growth may be more far-reaching in asking that Auxiliary women in Parishes where there are no Junior Branches will see to their being formed, not only as the hope of their own future strength, but taking more young people under the broadening influence which makes better Church workers.

Finally, let me speak of something which Junior Leaders have talked of through the year, calling it a dream, that some day there may be a house as headquarters for all Church societies, where each organization may have its own room for conferences and special equipment (in our case, literature, curios, and Mission study classes) and where there may be a big meeting room for the use of all, for Missionary addresses, lectures, and all occasions bringing Church women together—a dream now, but one whose realization may be prayed and worked for.
