The United Offering of 1916

At the conference of Diocesan officers held in New York, October 13th, the question of the object for the United Offering of 1916 was one of the most important matters to be decided. After careful consideration, the following resolution was unanimously adopted. It is as follows:

Resolved, That the United Thank-offering of 1916 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission field, and devoted to the training, testing, sending and support of women workers; also to the care of such workers when sick or disabled.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field, or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

A Prayer for More Workers

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for the Diocese

Blessed Lord, who hast taught Thy children to pray for each, send Thy blessing upon the Diocese to which I belong. Give grace to its Bishops and clergy, that they may win souls to Thee, and guide Thy people in the narrow way. Grant to us growth and increase, if it be Thy will, and teach us to give largely of our substance, for the glory of Thy name and the work of Thy holy Church. Make these souls, for whom Thou hast died, true to Thee, to all their vows and duties in this life, and so prepare them for the joys of Thy heavenly kingdom, for Thy mercy's sake, O blessed Jesus, who with the Father and Holy Ghost livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

Report of President

It is with deepest interest and a note of triumph that we gather for our Spring meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in this undercroft of the Cathedral of the Incarnation. In the thirty-seven years of our existence as a Diocesan body, there has been no more important epoch-making day in our calendar and, as in our journeyings through the land we reach some signal stage in a great ascent, our first impulse is to turn, that we may see the road over which we have travelled, the country which lies behind us, so today we look back along the years in which we have developed from a small gathering of Parish Branches—a feeble folk—to the goodly company here assembled, representative of our forces in this old Diocese of Maryland with its sturdy traditions, its fine historical setting. At this altitude the memories of old days and old friends come back to us—memories of those who laid our foundations strong in faith and hope—who made it possible for us to tell our story today.

From among the records of those early days, kept by one who was both a faithful Parish Secretary, and for many years a devoted Diocesan officer, and who has only now after a long life of service laid down to rest until His appearing, a message may well be chosen for our admonition today.*

She wrote with a keen grasp of the situation in the Mission field, as one of its pioneer workers in the old Indian Aid Association, antedating the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary, and in our modern day, looking forward to the growth of the seed which we have planted to be harvested by crowds of devoted church women thronging the aisles of this great Cathedral which we may never see; her earnest plea, her thoughtful application of what she had studied in her day cannot fail to inspire us.

She finds a trumpet call in Archbishop Trench: "I cannot believe that we have earnest piety ourselves, unless the blessings which we ourselves possess are imparted to others, unless they are like fire in our bones from which we can set others alight with that flame which Christ came to kindle on earth." * * * "When a church is not expanding in its missionary work there is something wrong in the heart."

A challenge comes from Dr. Chalmers—"Every man, every woman, is a missionary now. There are no moral blanks or neu-

tral characters. We are either the sower who sows and corrupts, or the light that splendidly illuminates the darkness, or the salt that savors, but dead or alive—every man speaks”—and after a review of faith among the Indian converts and asking the question “would any of you walk nine miles to attend a Missionary meeting? These Indian women do it,” she turns to China: “One-third of the human race is in that land; every third child born into the world looks into the face of a Chinese mother, every third pair given in marriage plight their troth in a Chinese cup of wine, every third orphan weeping through the day, every third widow wailing through the night watches, every third person who dies is a Chinese”—one can but ask “what catechism will this third child learn? What prosperity will follow this bridal? What solace will be afforded those widows? What watch, care will be given these orphans? With what hopes will these multitudes depart.”

We have answered some of these questions from time to time and we hope to prove our faith by our works in the nearly completed Fund for Christian Education in Wuchang, China, that locality which has become a household word in your ears since the Jubilee days; St. Hilda's, scarcely more than a dream in 1888, used for the higher class of Chinese women, for whom the Church is still laboring and praying that they may be reached in a Diocese administered by the first Bishop of Hankow, James Addison Ingle of Maryland, still a student when she wrote —“They do hear in their own tongues the wonderful works of God.”

Today from this point of Ascension we hear a roll call which would have stirred the souls of our founders; our welcome from Bishop and Priest has been an inspiration for which they would have given thanks. We report our work for our beloved Diocesan as virtually accomplished and realize that he has probably some more important task hidden away in his bosom to “prove us united.” We rejoice in our Juniors, in their splendid healthy normal growth, and their efforts with Diocesan Study Class Leaders for the intelligent dissemination of missionary intelligence, which we trust may invade the indifference of many women of leisure and wake them up. We treasure too our Babies' Branch who are indeed our Little Helpers, and so it goes from Bishop to baby, a solid working force for the speedy coming of the Kingdom.

Report of the Secretary Maryland Branch, Women's Auxiliary

MAY 28, 1912, TO MAY 27, 1913.

During the year there have been seven regular and no special meetings of the Executive Board. Without exception these were well attended, and real interest shown by the delegates in discussion of the problems arising from time to time.

The number of Parish Branches is the same as last year with the exception of the nominal loss of one, caused by the merging of the separate Auxiliaries of Grace and St. Peter's Church.

But of these Branches several have done little or no work, and the problem of how to interest, encourage and help these small or weak Auxiliaries is one that should engage earnest thought on the part of the Diocesan officers and indeed of all members of the Maryland Branch who really care for its work and growth.

So far as already reported to the Secretary, the number and value of boxes is much the same as last year, but not quite so large. The natural effort of the Rectors to raise their Parish apportionments has in some cases really reduced the power of the Auxiliary to fill and send its accustomed box, while in other Parishes the Branches have been so afraid of undertaking too much that it is doubtful whether they have allowed themselves to undertake all that could have been easily accomplished.

The money contributions have been devoted first to securing for the Bishop of Maryland the sum of \$650.00, for use at his discretion.

Next to raising \$300.00, for general educational work in Japan and \$300.00, for Mr. Ancell's school, at Yangchow, China.

It was after mature deliberation that the officers decided to recommend as part of our united work this special offering to Mr. Ancell, but it seemed to them right that when so many of our members had had the privilege of hearing Mr. Ancell's own account of his work and its needs at this critical time in China's history, we should feel it a duty as well as a pleasure to try and secure for him a measure of substantial help.

The fund for St. Hilda's School is nearly completed. No special efforts have been made in its behalf.

The Semi-annual meeting, held November 16th, was well attended and very interesting.

It opened with the celebration of the Holy Communion at St. Paul's Church, when the sermon was preached by Bishop Murray. Luncheon was then served at the Parish House, instead of as formerly in a public hall, and at this time we had the pleasure of entertaining representatives of at least five other Diocesan Auxiliaries, who were attending The World in Baltimore.

The Missionary meeting at Hazazer's was in all respects a fine one.

The addresses were given by Misses Emery and Lindley, of the Church Missions House, Miss Wood and Rev. Mr. Ancell of China, and Rev. Mr. Chapman of Japan.

The full reports of our year's work are not yet in hand and we cannot now compare them with past records.

A certain amount of uncertainty and possible loss must be expected when a radical change in the method of reporting and collecting Missionary funds is first introduced throughout our Parishes, but other Auxiliaries have adjusted themselves to new arrangements. So must we.

New difficulties should stimulate us to new effort and courage in meeting them.

With each year the work of our Church in the Mission field is growing, the need of men and women and money is greater, we would not have it otherwise. But we must grow too, not our Auxiliary in the abstract, but the women who compose it. Surely by God's help we can and will, if each one of us here today but makes the firm resolve that in the coming year she herself will do just a little more in her own Parish towards the world-wide spread of the Gospel of Christ.

At the close of the meeting the delegates were delightfully entertained by the Bishop and Mrs. Murray in the adjoining Cathedral grounds.

Report of the Educational Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary of Maryland

MAY 27, 1913

Having only been appointed Educational Secretary a year ago, the work of this past Winter must be judged simply as a time of seed sowing, looking to the future for the harvest. Last September a letter was sent to every Parish in the Diocese in which there was a Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, asking for cooperation in the effort for increased Missionary Education, by the appointment of a Mission Study Leader in each Parish. In November a Mission Study Institute was held for the training of these future leaders, to which were invited delegates from every parish that had in any way responded to the letter sent in September, and to some of whom we still had hopes, even though they had not responded at that time.

During the Institute a class for Seniors was taught by Mrs. Nicholas Mitchell of Philadelphia, Educational Secretary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania.

The class for Junior Leaders was taught by Miss Grace Lindley, from the Church Missions House, N. Y., Junior Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

We were greatly gratified by securing 25 delegates from various parishes including Hagerstown, Bel Air, Frederick, Westminster and Annapolis. The interest was keen and sustained throughout the entire three days, and we hope this is the first of many such stimulating occasions.

Both Senior and Junior Educational Secretaries have since held normal classes, resulting in 19 Senior and 18 Junior classes in 25 parishes.

We hope very sincerely that greater interest in Missions has been aroused through these means, as well as greater spirituality developed in the lives of the class members. It is the aim of these classes not simply to give information but *inspiration*, to deepen and enlarge the prayer life of the members, to widen their spiritual horizon, to impress the indifferent, to teach the ignorant; in short to hasten the coming of Christ's Kingdom here on earth.

I would like to ask that more interest be taken by the people at large and we would be most grateful for donations of money as our expenses are heavy.

Report 1912-1913

The annual meeting of the Junior Department was held on the afternoon of May 3, in the Parish House of Emmanuel Church. After an opening hymn, prayers were said by the Rector, followed by his hearty greeting and an appeal for more of the spirit of unselfish giving.

The reading of Parish reports was omitted that more time be given to hearing special speakers, the first being Miss Grace Lindley (Secretary of Junior Work at Missions House, New York), whose address was full of inspiration. She was followed by our Bishop whose short talk was full of encouragement as well as incentive, and he introduced the Rev. Mr. Ware, who told of the work in progress at the "Bishop Paret Memorial" to which the Juniors have made a definite pledge of \$500.

Five new Branches were welcomed during the year, these being at St. Thomas' Church, Garrison Forest; The Chapel of the Nativity, Forest Park; St. Mary's Church, Hampden; St. Michael and All Angels Church, and Grace and St. Peter's Church, Baltimore. An offertory was taken at this meeting amounting to \$240, \$100 of which will be given toward the pledge for the "Paret Memorial," and \$140 for the "United Offering."

Quoting briefly from the Parish reports, we gather that the scholarship of \$60 in memory of the Rt. Rev. J. Addison Ingle (first Bishop of Hankow), and one of \$50 for the "Wm. M. Dame" in South Dakota, as well as the "J. H. Eccleston" in St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai, China, are still being supported; and one of \$100 to be sent yearly by the girls of our Diocesan School, Hannah More Academy, to be used for the support and education of an Esquimaux girl selected by Bishop Rowe. Besides these, four day scholarships are being supported in Beaufort School, N. Carolina.

The usual joint boxes were sent, one to Africa for Miss Ridgely's girls; 3 barrels (containing 500 gifts) to the Rev. Edwin Ashley (Cheyenne Agency, S. Dakota), and 300 gifts to Hendersonville, N.C., besides separate parish boxes in other directions.

This partial review of work sufficiently proves Junior activity, and to pass on to other items under the head of encouragements;

first by expressing the grateful appreciation of Junior officers to Bishop Murray who has given our greatest encouragement in making possible a special room in the Diocesan House for our use. This already has given greater impulse to every line of work, viz: in bringing better attendance on executive meetings and larger mission study classes. Besides, two special afternoon meetings have been held to listen to addresses from returned missionaries, followed by afternoon tea, which induces the "social hour" to make Juniors better acquainted, and to give contact with the speakers. These were so well attended that many will be planned for next winter. This special room which we share with the Senior Auxiliary has been furnished by generous contributions, and in addition, there is a reference library, leaflet boards, curios, and other study-helps which beginnings give hopeful evidence of far greater growth in the future from having "one's own place." Another help is the interest and cooperation of the Diocesan Secretary for Sunday School work, who not only attends our executive meetings, but is in such sympathetic touch as to urge (in Sunday School addresses) membership in the Junior Auxiliary as the natural outlet for missionary activity. The executive board has been strengthened by the appointment of Mrs. J. Mau- ran Rhodes as special Vice-President; for organizing branches of older girls and young women with a view to their entering the Woman's Auxiliary, and of Deaconess Margaret Peet to become Educational Secretary to succeed Miss Mary B. Pitts, retiring from this office, but leaving with it a record of faithful work and loyal service. Another encouragement is the link with China, in the fact of our being represented by two of ourselves, Miss Scott as teacher in St. Hilda's School, Wuchang, and Miss Tabor (former pupil of Hannah More Academy), working under Deaconess Hart, in Hankow, China.

Finally, this report would be incomplete without a tribute of gratitude to my fellow Diocesan officers, each of whom has so faithfully done her special work, as to make us realize not only the power of loyal good-fellowship, but the joy that comes to those who "work together in unity."
