## The United Offering of 1916

At the conference of Diocesan officers held in New York, October 13th, the question of the object for the United Offering of 1916 was one of the most important matters to be decided. After careful consideration, the following resolution was unanimously adopted. It is as follows:

*Resolved*, That the United Thank-offering of 1916 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission field, and devoted to the training, testing, sending and support of women workers; also to the care of such workers when sick or disabled.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field, or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

### A Prayer for More Workers

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### A Prayer for the Diocese

Blessed Lord, who has taught Thy children to pray for each, send Thy blessing upon the Diocese to which I belong. Give grace to its Bishops and clergy, that they may win souls to Thee, and guide Thy people in the narrow way. Grant to us growth and increase, if it be Thy will, and teach us to give largely of our substance, for the glory of Thy name and the work of Thy holy Church. Make these souls, for whom Thou hast died, true to Thee, to all their vows and duties in this life, and so prepare them for the joys of Thy heavenly kingdom, for Thy mercy's sake, O blessed Jesus, who with the Father and Holy Ghost livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

## Report of the President

Greeting to the Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary! Sincere congratulations on the work of the year crowned by our service of praise and thanksgiving in their Second Annual Meeting in the under-croft of the Cathedral.

The stimulus of the General Convention has brought forward movement and while the year following a Triennial is not so fruitful as that which precedes it, we have already started on the strength of our inspirations.

In our Foreign work the interest for the coming year will center about St. Mary's School, Shanghai. Those who were present at the Meeting in the Church House of the Parish of St. Michael's will recall the stirring appeals of Mrs. Ely for this institution, which came upon the heels of the Macedonian cry of Dr. Teusler for St. Luke's Hospital, with other pleas for help, until it seemed as if in the multitude of counsellors there had ceased to be wisdom. However what appeared a forlorn hope to the little band of women who met in the gallery of the audience chamber—through their faith and works was turned to a vision of triumph, and today the Parlor meeting, with gifts from individuals have without interfering with the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, made a fine beginning for the sum needed. You will later hear of requirements and present conditions of that stronghold of the faith in which for a quarter of a century Miss Dodson has held her post in the education of Chinese women, and so we wish our confreres all over the land God-speed in their work of upbuilding this great agency for knowledge, that knowledge which must be given to the Orient not only for their sakes, but for the preservation of those who come after us, who will one day confront a great united and civilized cordon of nations of those who only yesterday were asking for first aid in Western learning.

We enter this year upon a novel resetting of our Ecclesiastical Calendar, the Bishop having placed the Convention in the Autumn instead of Spring for the first time in the over-century life of the Diocese. There will be therefore seventeen months of work to compress into the ordinary working year, as the months of June, July, August and September are fallow in this part of the

world. We are to have eleven hundred dollars to raise for our Diocese and we count it an honor that he relies on us for that amount, to which we promise to come as nearly as we can.

In the outlook over wide fields, it is interesting to note how many agencies are at work for the spreading of the light. The Girls' Friendly Society, which for some years has taken up Missions, reports through the Woman's Auxiliary at headquarters in New York a goodly sum, and it has given the President of the Maryland Auxiliary great pleasure to fill the position of Diocesan Associate for Missions, speaking to the girls in their regular Branch Meetings.

Over the water, the band of women who enjoyed the privileges of the Pan-Anglican keep up their activities, as the "Central Committee on Women's Work" and their minutes forwarded from time to time are most inspiring. They send their greetings to their sisters in the States and this contact forms a link which connects us with the church throughout all the world.

We look for a year of labor, and trust that the end will find us with a nearly completed St. Mary's Fund, our Diocesan apportionment made up and good headway made in contributions to the general "laying by." This year we have tried to emphasize the three-fold plan.

First—to increase our sum in the Mission side of the duplex envelope for General Missions.

Secondly—to confer with our "Spiritual Pastors and Masters" to be sure that the money that the Auxiliary gives may receive credit from the Parish Treasurer, and lastly in our work to make a careful selection of designated offerings. If these simple rules were followed out faithfully, the fund would grow and while like the Kingdom, it may increase without observation, yet it would be a proud day when we could prove that we had put our talents where they had multiplied an hundred-fold. To our Bishop who goes abroad for his much needed rest we give our loving wishes, that he may have safe transport, a pleasant sojourn, and a swift return to his own people.

## Report of the Secretary Maryland Branch, Woman's Auxiliary

MAY 26, 1913, TO MAY 27, 1914

It is pleasant to note the gradual increase in the number of the Parish Auxiliaries. During the year three new and independent branches have been formed, one that had been unable to do Auxiliary work for several years resumed its activities, and at least three, and possibly more, Auxiliary chapters have been organized, composed of young women too old for the Junior Auxiliary, who yet desire to do their own work and get credit for it, instead of having it wholly combined with what is done by the Seniors of the Parish branch. To offset these gains there have been some losses. Two or three country branches have felt it their duty to abstain from all work except that of helping their Rector collect the Parish Apportionment, not realizing that the results of this very effort, if reported to the Auxiliary Treasurer, would stand for real Auxiliary work. And in one or two cases branches belonging to large and prosperous churches are nearly at the point of death from the apparent difficulty of finding in the Parish women who care enough for missionaries and their work to be willing to act as leaders in helping them. Still all things considered, the Secretary can report for Maryland a very successful year.

To the Triennial Meeting in New York may be traced a good portion of this success, more especially on the spiritual side. Quite a number of Maryland women were in attendance at some or all of those wonderful New York meetings, where for two weeks numbers of women from all parts of our country and from abroad met daily to discuss how they themselves could help in the cause of missions and to listen to the stories told by the missionaries who came day by day to tell of their needs, the hopes, the plans, above all, the blessings of their work. Those of us who were so fortunate as to attend these splendid gatherings were fired with new enthusiasm to bear a part, and in coming home they gladly spread the message confided to them so that in many a

Parish branch the winter's work began under the inspiration of new power and new enthusiasm.

In the tangible results as to boxes and offerings in money it is too soon to compare the work of this year with that of last; though we believe when counted up they will show a decided increase, but it is not too soon to bear witness to the growth of interest shown to the officers in many ways and from many sources, to the growth of intelligence in discussing and deciding the complex questions connected with the Diocesan and Parish Apportionment and the Auxiliaries' part in them, and above all to the spirit and practice of intercessory prayer which in branch after branch is growing to be the great motive and duty of the members, both collectively and apart.

As we look back, we have much to be thankful for, but as we look forward, how much there is to do! As our knowledge grows of the great work Christ asks us to do for Him, as our love for Him and for those who are spending their very lives in His service increases, surely each one of us must have a clearer vision of her individual responsibility. Let us take from the measure of success achieved inspiration to do more and better work for the future, and let us band together to do the work, the strong parishes and the strong members trying faithfully and tactfully to help the weak.

As we are interested ourselves let each one of us strive to interest others. So only may we gradually hope to lead every Maryland Church woman to feel that if she is indeed Christ's loyal and loving servant, she *must* bear a part by her own prayers and gifts of money and of time in smoothing the way for the noble band of men and women who so liberally and lovingly obey the command to preach the Gospel in all the world, and are truly the disciples of Christ.

## Report of Meetings

1913-1914

During the season just closed there were nine regular meetings of the Executive Board, with an average representation at each of twenty Parish Branches, and three general meetings for the whole Auxiliary.

The first of these was the Semi-Annual Meeting, November 18, when a celebration of the Holy Communion was held in Grace and St. Peter's Church, followed by luncheon in the adjoining Parish House.

The afternoon Missionary Meeting was held at Hazazer's Hall and very largely attended. Stirring addresses were made by the Bishops of Southern Brazil and Alaska, and Miss Grace Lindley of New York, as well as by our own Bishop Murray.

On the 13th of February there was held a Mid-Winter Meeting in St. Paul's Parish House, at which the Rev. Arthur M. Sherman presented the Subject of the New China Fund in an address of much beauty and power.

The third and last of these general meetings was the Annual Meeting, held at the Pro-Cathedral on Tuesday, May 26 and also very largely attended.

Reports from the various officers were presented and the Annual Election held, resulting as follows:

## Report of the Educational Secretary of the Women's Auxiliary

Diocese of Maryland

FALL 1913—SPRING 1914

The educational work extending from the Fall of 1913 through the Spring of 1914, opened with a Mission Study Normal Institute held at Emmanuel Church, Baltimore, November 19th to November 22nd inclusive. Eighteen prospective leaders were enrolled in the Senior class taught by Miss Edith Walker (Diocese of New York) taking as the subject, "The Emergency in China." Fifteen in the Junior class, of which Miss Gertrude Ely (Diocese of Pennsylvania) was leader, gave their attention to the "Forward March in China." The interest was keenly sustained, each member gaining inspiration for the work to be done in her own Parish.

Immediately after the Institute Miss Edith Duer, Educational Secretary of the Women's Auxiliary, laid aside her duties for a year's stay abroad. It was with mingled feelings of regret for her absence and joy that a period of needful rest and recuperation was to be hers, that we wished her Godspeed. To her faithful seed-sowing we must accredit all that may appear of growth in this report of our Senior work. Its continuance along lines of prayerful, intelligent endeavor to learn more of ways and means for the spread of Christ's kingdom shows how strong and true a leader she had been.

After December 1st, 1913, the work was combined under one Secretary. Personal visits have been made to many Senior and Junior Branches; addresses given; helpful Mission study literature suggested and provided. The educational Secretary also conducted a Diocesan Normal Class weekly through Lent, which was faithfully attended by fifteen Branch Leaders whose interest and co-operation was most encouraging. A long desired forward movement has been realized by the Interparochial Study Classes for Senior girls and young women not heretofore interested in Missions. Five of such classes have been under the leadership of the Junior extension vice-president and Mrs. Lelia S. Goode. The Sunday

School use of the Lenten Mission Study course on China, "The Flowering of the Flowery Kingdom," as well as Lantern illustrated lectures upon the Mission fields of our church, in one instance marked a feature which it is hoped may be multiplied throughout our diocese.

Although China has been the central thought of the year's course as planned by the Board of Missions, the other Mission fields of the world have shared in the study, interest, and prayers of the various branches.

- 40 Parishes have held Mission Study Classes under
- 42 Individual Leaders,
- 5 Parishes have held Mission Study Meetings with  
Missionary Speakers,
- 5 Interparochial Classes under two Leaders, mak-  
ing a total of
- 638 Enrolled in Mission Study,
- 81 Enrolled in Mission Study in Sunday School,
- 83 Enrolled in Interparochial Classes.

In view of the fact that the Board of Missions is trying to formulate a BOY'S Department of the Auxiliary, we wish to call attention to the need of a Young MEN'S Department, as shown by the Mission Study Class of *Five Young Men* under a male leader reported under the head of the Auxiliary Mission Study classes of Ascension Parish, Baltimore.

The year's reports, in the majority of cases, record a deepening realization of the power of prayer on the part of our Auxiliary workers; and an awakened feeling of personal responsibility for the spread of Christ's kingdom. Is not after all the great aim of Mission Study to inspire and enlarge the prayer-life of our members, to turn indifference into interest, ignorance into helpful intelligence?

## Report of the Junior Auxiliary

1913—1914

The work of the Junior Auxiliary for 1913—1914 opened formally with the first Executive Meeting of the season, held on October 28th.

Looking back over the year's record, while all see disappointments and failures, we count with gratitude our blessings and encouragements, feeling that, under God, we owe many of them to the inspiration and stimulus given to every part of our work by the great Triennial of 1913.

The annual Epiphany Service was held on January 4th when in spite of stormy weather, Grace and St. Peter's was nearly filled with a throng of eager children who listened to the stirring words spoken by Bishop Tuttle, Bishop Thurston, and our own Bishop.

We were fortunate in having the Reverend Arthur M. Sherman of Hankow speak to us at our Annual Spring Meeting held on Saturday, April 25th, in the Pro-Cathedral. There was a splendid attendance, almost all the branches being represented, which meant a great deal, because again we had very bad weather.

After the meeting the Juniors literally took possession of the Episcopal Residence, and enjoyed to the utmost the cordial hospitality of Bishop and Mrs. Murray.

One of the encouraging features of the year's work is the increase in branches. We now have 42 at work, 9 new ones having been organized during the year. One of these is a Boys' Branch at Trinity, Towson, which has inspired us to set on foot plans for starting more branches for boys next year. Three are in the Archdeaconry of Cumberland and we hope to have more branches organized there shortly; a great advance, as Junior work has been very weak in the Archdeaconry.

It is our hope that before long the Junior organizations in many of our Parishes will be graded, as recommended at the recent Triennial the first link in the chain being, of course, The Little Helpers, or Section I, consisting of children under eight years old. Section II, consisting of children 9 to 16, Section III, young people

17 to 21. At 21, we want our Juniors to realize, that as women, they must take their place with the *women* of the Church, giving their youth their energy and enthusiasm to the work of the Woman's Auxiliary.

To make a beginning in interesting these young women, three meetings were held for them, under the direction of Mrs. Rhodes who is in charge of this department. The speakers were, Miss Grace Lindley, Miss Gertrude Ely, of Pennsylvania, and Bishop Lloyd, and we feel that foundations have been laid for more definite work next year.

We find encouragement in the fact that of the money sent through our Treasurer, over two-thirds counts on the apportionment, while we are at the same time making good progress in the payment of our pledge to the Bishop of \$500.00 for the Paret Memorial at Locust Point.

Good work is being done already for the United offering of 1916 under the able leadership of Miss Bertha Hamilton, our United Offering Treasurer, and we hope this will mean a far larger and more representative offering than ever before.

The Juniors are busy preparing 900 gifts which, when Christmas comes, will gladden the hearts of children in Idaho, North Carolina, Africa and China. We are happy to find a growing realization, in leaders and children, of the necessity of having these gifts as perfect in workmanship as they can be made.

The greatest of all our encouragements we find in the development of Mission Study. Last year there were 250 children in 16 Parishes studying missions, this year there have been 378 children in 27 Parishes, and in addition, two interparochial classes of older girls, with 18 enrolled.

Our Educational Secretary in her Annual Report expresses my feeling better than I can do so, when in closing she says: "The most wonderful of all gains is in the awakened sense of the need and power of prayer on the part of those who lead our Juniors. With such a band, taking their plans and hopes, their trials and discouragements, to the Great Leader, and guiding the children to the same great Source of Power, there can be no loss!"
