

The United Offering of 1916

At the conference of Diocesan officers held in New York, October 13th, the question of the object for the United Offering of 1916 was one of the most important matters to be decided. After careful consideration, the following resolution was unanimously adopted :

Resolved, That the United Thank-offering of 1916 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission field, and devoted to the training, testing, sending and support of women workers; also to the care of such workers when sick or disabled.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field, or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

A Prayer for More Workers

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for the Diocese

Blessed Lord, who has taught Thy children to pray for each, send Thy blessing upon the Diocese to which I belong. Give grace to its Bishops and clergy, that they may win souls to Thee, and guide Thy people in the narrow way. Grant to us growth and increase, if it be Thy will, and teach us to give largely of our substance, for the glory of Thy name and the work of Thy holy Church. Make these souls, for whom Thou has died, true to Thee, to all their vows and duties in this life, and so prepare them for the joys of Thy heavenly kingdom, for Thy mercy's sake, O blessed Jesus, who with the Father and Holy Ghost livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

Report of President

This exquisite Spring Day finds us gathering in our Cathedral Under-croft, already associated with our work as no other place could be, in numbers which have visibly increased within the year.

We are confronted today as we come up to this our peaceful abode of the Spirit, with conditions in the outside world which are far beyond anything which our utmost stretch of imagination would have foreseen; conditions so dreadful in their chronicles of disaster and death that our minds are absolutely benumbed by forces which seem to have mobilized all the Powers of Darkness. In this period of storm and stress a special cause for gratitude is found in that, notwithstanding the great outpouring of aid for humanity, our interest has not been deadened, nor our exertions slackened in missionary work.

Great inspiration comes to us from our Sisters in the Mother Church of England who have suffered such losses, but "although all this is come upon them"—have shown such courage not only in pressing on to the march of their high calling, but there comes to us, as through a trumpet call, their message sent out from the last meeting of the Central Committee of Woman's Work, meeting in the Chapter House at Westminster, their plans for the "Work of Reconstruction after the War," in four papers, gathered in pamphlet form, of which your President hopes to receive a number for distribution. They are "The Spiritual Basis of Reconstruction of the Home Life, Church Life and National Life." Special committees are now forming to "utilize the spirit of service aroused in the younger women throughout the country." In our own land another agency has been added to those already formed for our concentration or advance of work. At the primary meeting of the Provincial Synod in Pittsburgh, in Nov., 1914, the organization of the Woman's Auxiliary in that department

was perfected and a constitution drawn up in which Maryland was represented on the Committee of Five, and the Resolution offered in the Synod by the Bishop of Pennsylvania, to raise a million dollars, was sent to the Auxiliary, asking their co-operation, which they gladly gave, pledging their support "in faith and nothing wavering." In the approaching session of the Synod the ten Dioceses which comprise the Province of Washington, under the leadership of our beloved Bishop of Maryland, there will come a stimulus which will make itself felt for us when our Triennial reckoning is called for.

Details of the good work done by the committee in charge of St. Mary's School, Shanghai, of perhaps the best special meeting ever held at the Lyceum when Mrs. Pancoast, of Philadelphia, spoke to us, a meeting under the auspices of Christ Church Auxiliary, with their devoted President Miss Carter, the full quota for the Parish Houses, for our own Bishop, the varied objects for which the Parochial Branches work, are fully set forth in our Annual Report. Your President has represented Maryland at Memphis as Missions Associate, and later as head of the Committee on International Relations. She has made many visits by day and night to those asking Missionary information—but with all this, in view of the appeals for the service of men and women in the field, with the increasing need of aid to the fast growing Church—does not the old story of the battle with wind and wave come to us when the fishermen, discouraged at the small results, from what seemed to them such great efforts, cried out "Master, we have toiled all night and taken nothing," with the echo of the command in answer to his lament, "Launch out now into the deep." Does there not await us the blessing which would be increased to the breaking of our nets—if the faith and energies were equal to the test?

It is high time to wake up out of sleep, to show for what we have enjoyed of high privilege, in crowded missionary meetings, splendid institutes for Mission Study Classes, a greater growth,

to win back what we have lost—to gain fresh Parish Branches so that there may be no Church centre of life in our Diocese without a Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, Junior or Baby department. The change in our Diocesan year brings our work to September so that we can add a post scriptum of congratulation, that the sum of \$2000 promised on the Apportionment to our Diocesan Board of Missions has been more than fulfilled—that we have made good showing on the Emergency Fund—and it only remains for us to arouse to the realization that our energies must be turned in this short year which remains to us—to the United Offering for which the Triennial of 1916 will need and expect a much larger sum than ever before. Maryland has always been well to the fore. Let us see to it that she keeps her place among the seven great Dioceses. “And so much the more—as ye see the day approaching.”

Report of the Secretary

Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary

MAY 27, 1914, TO MAY 25, 1915.

The year now closing has been in some respects the most successful in the history of the Maryland Auxiliary. A review of what has been done shows much to encourage, but at the same time we must regret that growth in number of Branches has been but slow, that the few new ones formed have been exactly balanced by the number formally withdrawing from our ranks; also that in most Branches the number of women enrolled is far smaller than we should expect, in proportion to the number of women in the Parish.

We have on our list 55 active Branches—3 of them—St. Matthew's, Oakland; Holy Innocents', Baltimore, and The Chapel of the Nativity, Forest Park, are new; and of the 55, two have large and flourishing Chapters B. St. John's, Waverly; St. David's, Roland Park, and St. Stephen's, Millersville, withdrew by note to the Secretary, stating in each case the impossibility of awakening in their people a practical interest in Missions; and in addition to these Branches we have in country Parishes, five apparently dormant or nearly so, therefore unable to report any special work.

These facts speak for themselves and are indeed a source of regret to all of us who know them, but as already stated there is much to encourage as we see month by month in many Branches not only slow growth in size, but marked increase in work done, and, what means most of all, a broadening and deepening of the motives that prompt the doing. As we note this gradual awakening of Spiritual interest in our Mission work, we naturally seek the contributing causes, and of these we must specially mention two. First of all is the manifest influence of the Mission Study Classes held in many Parishes during the last two years, of which a full report will be made by the Educational Secretaries. The other great source of inspiration, I regret to say, enjoyed chiefly, by city and suburban Parishes, has been the frequent opportunity to hear and meet missionaries from the field. In two previous years a certain group of city Parishes had arranged for themselves monthly meetings

of this character, and last autumn the Executive Committee decided to try the experiment on a larger scale. A Sub-Committee was appointed, and four General Meetings planned. The first was in November, when Rev. Mr. Greisser, of Soo-Chow, gave a very interesting talk on evangelistic work for the women of China; the next in January, an illustrated talk on Alaska, by Rev. Mr. Betticher; the third in February, on the Work of our Church in the East, an illustrated lecture by Mrs. Pancoast, of Philadelphia; and the fourth in March by Rev. Mr. Mayo, on Mountain work in Virginia. The large attendance on each occasion proves conclusively the wisdom of the plan, and the Committee felt well repaid for the trouble and expense incurred in making the arrangements. It is but just to state that the entire cost of these addresses was defrayed by subscription on the part of six city churches, and two or three friends; the treasury of the Auxiliary was not touched. It is proper to also mention the very large extra Meeting held under the auspices of the Auxiliary at Albaugh's Theatre, in behalf of the fund for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, when Mrs. Pancoast again pleaded its cause and showed to another audience her collection of beautiful slides. As we remember the constant opportunities for inspiration given to us who live in or near the city, we realize how much is lost by the many Auxiliary Branches that in scattered country Parishes have little or nothing to stimulate their work and interest. Each year this loneliness is more and more impressed on those of us who communicate with them by letter or by occasional visits, and it seems that the time is at hand when the Maryland, like other Diocesan Branches, must plan and carry out some method by which the great subject of Missions and our duty towards them can be more thoroughly presented to the women in our country towns and villages. This is a duty we must not evade; from those to whom much is given much will be required, and how great has been the abundance showered on most of those here today! Let us begin to think of the others and plan what we may do for them. The problem is not insoluble, it has been faced and solved in many a State beside our own—with thought and prayer we can solve it too.

Of box and money contributions this is not the time to speak in detail. They have fully reached the average—possibly gone beyond it. The Branches have loyally followed the suggestions made by the officers in regard to concentrating their forces on a

few things, contributing more liberally to the Current Expense Fund, and systematically helping their Rectors, as well as the Auxiliary, by giving when possible to such objects as count on the apportionment.

The Semi-Annual Meeting was very largely attended—more members than ever before availed themselves of the privilege of Corporate Communion. The Quiet Day was more generally appreciated by churchwomen than in previous years, and the Monthly Meetings of the Executive Board grow steadily in size and interest. We have much to make us deeply, truly, humbly thankful,—shall not our Thanksgiving be shown forth not only by our lips but in our lives? Each woman here can give if she will next year, at least a little more of prayer, or time, or money. We need not all give alike, but we can each give something, and firmly resolve that with God's help our Auxiliary will do its own full part in spreading the tidings of Salvation throughout the world.

Report of Meetings

1914-1915

During the year there have been eight regular meetings of the Executive Board. Of these, four were regular business meetings, while at the other four the time was almost wholly occupied with addresses by visiting Missionaries.

For the whole Auxiliary there were three general meetings, the first being the Semi-Annual Meeting, November 4th. The Holy Communion was celebrated at St. Paul's Church and was followed by luncheon at the Parish House. The afternoon Missionary Meeting was held as usual at Hazazer's Hall. As Mrs. Sioussat was unavoidably absent, the Bishop kindly presided throughout, and stimulating addresses were made by Miss Dodson, of St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai; Dr. Jefferys, of St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, and by Rev. Arthur Gray, D. D., of the Church Missions House.

In March there was a General Meeting at Albaugh's Theatre, in behalf of the fund for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio, attended by many men as well as women, when Mrs. Pancoast lectured and showed her beautiful slides.

The third and last of the general meetings was the Annual Meeting, held at the Pro-Cathedral, Tuesday, May 25th. Encouraging reports of work done were presented and the Annual Election was held, resulting as follows:

Report of the Educational Secretary of Maryland

1914-1915

The educational work of the Diocese began with a Mission Study Institute in December. The senior class was led by Miss Tillotson, Assistant Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, who proved to be a most inspiring and helpful leader.

Besides the normal class, which formed the "inner circle" of the Institute, there were many "listeners," whose wrapt attention and earnest faces added no little to the interest of those four days of study and discussion.

I find by referring to last year's report that the addition this year to the Honor Roll of Parishes with classes for Mission Study is eight. They are:

Holy Innocents', Baltimore.
Church of the Transfiguration, Arlington.
Christ Church, Baltimore.
St. Paul's, Baltimore.
Memorial, Baltimore.
St. James', Irvington.
Chapel of the Nativity, Govans.
St. Thomas', Garrison Forest.

One of the most significant developments of the year is a Study Class for Men, under the able leadership of Dr. W. H. Jefferys, of Philadelphia. These men representing ten parishes are pronounced by Dr. Jefferys of unusual leadership calibre.

There was also a small class of men at Ascension that met for the discussion of Religious Problems, which we hope is the beginning of much greater things.

I want to take this occasion to acknowledge *my* debt as well as that of the whole Church to my Associate Leaders through whose efforts the work has been done, bringing in new parishes, interesting new people, devising ways and means, and in every way loyally and cordially forwarding the Master's work. This work has been done by busy women, sometimes at the cost of genuine personal sacrifice, and I thank them in the name of the Church most sincerely and heartily.

May I in closing repeat what I have so often said that Mission Study is like mercy, "twice blessed, it blesses him who gives and him who takes." The information gained through systematic study leads to deeper consecration, more earnest prayer, a wider vision, and the joy of service.

Church Periodical Club

MAY 1915.

Bishop Lloyd, in a recent address to the Church Periodical Club, said: "No men work under harder conditions than our domestic Missionaries and their devoted wives stand by them, enduring all manner of discomfort and deprivation." The greatest trial of all is the loneliness and the intellectual and spiritual isolation. Here the Church Periodical Club steps in with books and magazines and friendly letter. "I have witnessed great joy, in a lonely Western home, over the arrival of a magazine." The Rev. Guy Madaro, of Alaska, writes: "Upon handing to a man several magazines he remarked, these will keep me from the saloon for three nights." This is the work that the C. P. C. stands for.

The Correspondent and Assistant Librarians are to be found at the Diocesan House every Friday morning from 10.30 A. M. to 1.30 P. M. Books and magazines are received, sorted out, and, if acceptable, stamped, and put in packages for mail or express. Much care is taken in the selection of books, as the Modern Novel is not always free from bad taste and bad morals.

Monthly meetings are held by the Librarians, where reports are made, and letters from the field are read.

Visitors are always welcome on Fridays. The clergy of the Diocese have been invited to come in when convenient and select reading matter for their parish reading rooms and clubs. During the past year the parish reading rooms, in and near the city, have been supplied with reading matter. The Church Home, several hospitals, The Port Missions, Shut-in Societies, City Jail, and Bay View have received several packages each. Solomon's Island and the Glen Burnie reading room supplied with books and magazines. Through the Custom House a great many illustrated maga-

zines were sent to light houses and light ships. The Memorial Branch of the G. F. S. sent a cheque of \$3.00 to be used in mailing books to St. Matthew's Hospital in Alaska.

A layman in the South sent his cheque for a subscription to Annals of Surgery for Dr. Teusler, St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo.

The "Lonely Women" in mission fields were not forgotten, nor the neglected little ones in mountains or upon the plains.

During the past winter, from the closet in the Diocesan House and from other stations in the Diocese, hundreds of packages have gone out and hundreds of magazines are forwarded, we hope regularly, as the following report shows:

Report of the Junior Auxiliary

1914-1915.

The year's work was opened October 13th with the first "All Day Meeting" ever held for Officers, Leaders, and older Juniors. So successful was this that it promises to become an established custom. During the year eight Leaders' Conferences have been held at which various Junior problems have been discussed most helpfully. The programme for the entire year was planned by the Leaders, or rather by a Committee of them, and they themselves conducted many of the meetings. This same Committee planned the Annual Spring Meeting, which was held Saturday, April 24th, in St. John's Parish House, Waverly. At this meeting business was reduced to a minimum, the feature of the afternoon being the presentation of a Missionary play, "The Vision," in which the principal part was taken by Rev. R. F. Humphries, our Junior Auxiliary Chaplain, with 28 Juniors in the cast. A chorus of more than a hundred children, trained and led by Miss Crane, supplied the music. About 20 Branches were represented in cast and chorus, and we feel that a new spirit of co-operation has grown out of this united effort. Two new officers have been appointed to the Board during the past year; Miss Elizabeth Neilson as Assistant Secretary, to take charge of the box work, and Miss Clare Goode, succeeding Miss Hamilton as United Offering Treasurer.

It is impossible to give at this time a full financial report. Practically all regular scholarships and pledges have been met, and we hope to equal the record of 1913-1914, which, exclusive of sums sent through our treasury by the Little Helpers, showed an increase over 1912-1913 of more than \$400.00 in money, and \$100.00 in the value of boxes.

At this date we have nearly \$90.00 in hand for the United Offering and are working hard to make the 1916 offering the

largest in our history. Over and above regular gifts this year will be one to St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai, of \$202.25, a direct result of the four Inter-Parochial Meetings for older girls, held under the direction of Mrs. Rhodes and a committee of the girls themselves. Not the least result of these meetings is the fact that about six girls are planning to go to Silver Bay in July, and those of us who have been there rejoice in the thought of the enthusiasm and efficiency they will bring home to their work.

Again our greatest encouragement and inspiration have come through the steady growth of Mission Study. Only our Educational Secretary, whose trained and consecrated service has so largely contributed to this growth can adequately report it. I leave it to her to do so.

The faithful loyal co-operation of officers and leaders alike have brought whatever success has crowned the work of the Junior Auxiliary in the past year. I can find no words to express the joy and privilege which have been mine in laboring with its members in the service of our Lord and Master.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY'S REPORT
OF THE
Junior Auxiliary of Maryland
FALL 1914—SPRING 1915

At Grace and St. Peter's Church, Baltimore, on the morning of December 9th, 1914, the Bishop of the Diocese officiated at the Corporate Communion which was to be the inspiration and guiding power for both departments of the Auxiliary during the ensuing four days of the annual Mission Study Institute. There are few occasions when the co-operation, the essential unity of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese and its Junior department is more emphasized than when their members and new recruits meet together at the altar to consecrate themselves to the days of earnest study under trained leaders which will equip them for greater usefulness in their various Branches.

Again the Juniors were so fortunate as to have the efficient, enthusiastic leadership of Miss Gertrude Ely, Diocese of Pennsylvania, whose class of the past year's institute had done loyal service. Twenty-eight were enrolled from eighteen parishes for instruction upon the year's Junior text-book, "Building the City." This year we were glad to note many additions from our extension Vice-President's inspiring drawing-room meetings and interparochial class. The size of Miss Ely's class, and its varied requirements, made evident the necessity of *graded* Junior instruction at another institute, in fairness to those who come to us as instructors.

Both departments came together daily for noonday prayers and for the Quiet Hour with which the institute closed.

That element of successful teaching which creates a desire for greater knowledge was demonstrated by our institute leader, for the following Epiphanytide normal class of the Educational Secretary were most zealous and earnest to acquire further ways and means of instruction for their branches.

One weekly session for the ten leaders (from eight parishes) was held during each of the six weeks preceding Lent.

The annual Branch Leaders' reports record more than statistics. Many bring personal notes telling of problems met; discouragements bravely faced; growth in numbers and enthusiasm; of growing understanding of the *worldwide* vision of Missions. Above, and most convincing of true growth, is evidenced the heartfelt desire of the Leaders to guide and teach their Juniors along the best, the highest plane of Christian service by ways and means best adapted to the Junior comprehension. The training of Junior prayer-life as a *necessity* is more marked.

It was our privilege to address the Advent meeting of the Junior Auxiliaries of Washington upon invitation of the Junior Educational Secretary of that Diocese. A cordial welcome preceded an interested attendance.

By invitation of the leaders, visits with addresses have been made to many of our Branches, thereby establishing a closer, friendly contact.

We deeply appreciate the loyal co-operation of the Woman's Auxiliary officers, as well as our Associate Junior officers, in all new lines for development of the educational work.
