## The United Offering of 1919

---

**Resolution adopted in St. Louis,**

**October 16, 1916**

---

*Resolved*, That the United Offering of 1919 be given to the Board of Missions, to be devoted to the training, sending and support of women for mission work at home and abroad, and to the care of such workers when sick or disabled—provided that at least \$10,000 be expended for the erection, completion or renewal of a building or buildings in the mission field, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of a committee composed of the President of the Board of Missions, the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and the members of the Conference Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary. Also,

*Resolved*, That to our united gifts shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves or of their substance to the work of the Master in the mission field.

### **A Prayer for More Workers**

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Report of President

The year before the Tri-ennial is always one of preparation, and the past twelve months have been no exception. Never, perhaps, in our history have we worked harder to see our house in order—to perfect our tasks in diocesan and general work, so that when your delegates went up to the great festival they were ready for the full enjoyment of privilege and responsibility which comes to our gathering.

The setting was unusually interesting. We met in the city of the Saintly King, whose piety and devotion to the welfare of his subjects stand out in history as does his splendid presentation in bronze, overlooking the landscape far any away—the ideal of a Christian warrior.

The Diocese, the home of the venerable Presiding Bishop, with whom in the old days Maryland had many ties, and to whom our first greetings were sent; who with his half century of experience, such as comes to but few men, combines the freshness of thought and energy of action which has ever made him notable among his fellow men. It was a privilege to take part in the honors accorded him, not only by his own people but by the Church in council assembled.

Next and most important was the early service in Christ Church Cathedral, filled to the doors, necessitating the use of the front choir stalls for the communicants in addition to the chancel rail. The offering was collected by the fourteen aides as we sung our "Holy offerings rich and rare." These aides, who with the reverend clergy guided the vast throng at every turn. All these brought the fulfillment of our hopes for the last three years. The list of the departed read by Bishop Tuttle chronicled the passing to higher service of many known to us. Miss Sally Stewart, whose long life had been such a factor from the days when the Auxiliary was a new and untried factor to the last Tri-ennial celebrated in New York, when she saw the great cathedral service with its gifts—the sounding note of purposes of which she had never dreamed—"Her works do follow her."

The afternoon meeting was held in the Odeon, where Auxiliary officers were entertained in the boxes by special hostesses, and where Mr. George Gordon King, with great deliberation, gave us our figures backward—beginning with cents 4; dollars 147, and best of all, our \$352,000, our high-water mark. Many looked for more, some for less; but all were grateful that with so many other demands we had not gone below our average increase either in Diocesan or general totals.

Our sessions were uneventful, so far as the legislative work in this, our only business session in three years. The most important suggestion, perhaps, was contained in the Report of the Committee on the Junior Auxiliary Report, looking to its severance from the parent stem of the Woman's Auxiliary and its incorporation into the Board of Missions as a separate department. As there was no discussion upon this important and far-reaching measure, for which the Auxiliary was entirely unprepared, it only remains to be seen how it will be adjusted in each Diocese under the several Bishops and Parish Rectors, to whom as well as to the Board of Missions we are still auxiliary.

The report given by our Secretary, Miss Tiffany, of the completion of the fund of \$100,000 for St. Mary's, Shanghai, was received with the greatest enthusiasm, and rarely has a greater meed of appreciation been given an Auxiliary officer, of which her fellow members were duly proud.

The Reception of the English guests was a noteworthy feature. Miss Forbes, representing the S. P. G., brought a most cordial greeting from Mrs. Davidson, the wife of the Archbishop of Canterbury, to which Maryland had the honor of being deputed to reply.

The presentation to us of the Pilgrimage of Prayer—a return to the days when pilgrims went from door to door with cross on breast and brow, and of their welcome in hamlet and hall—was most stirring; and in the National Mission of Repentance and Hope, so soon to follow, we shall have our own Pilgrimage of Prayer, by which in succession we shall take up different places and objects for our petitions, and in which we may follow the footsteps of our sisters over seas.

The Pageant was a wonderful presentation of the life of the Church from the earliest days, beginning with the Council at

Jerusalem. A touch impossible in any other field was brought when for the period of "The Early Church in our Country" the frontiersmen were shown, the pioneers with their gold-washing utensils, their picks and shovels, their kettles swung upon poles for their evening meal, and into their midst stepped the Presiding Bishop who, as Priest and Prelate, had done so much to lay firm foundations for the Church in the Winning of the West. Not that our work there is completed—far from it—for on the very last day of our assembling the list of things overlooked in the distribution of aid for the Bishops and their work has grown into a poster of prodigious dimensions. To these many of us were asked to give assistance and from them you may hear later.

Our meetings with Bishop Brent—his wonderful charge to us at our own Executive Meeting—should fill us with new spirit for the coming year. He carries with him our most earnest prayer and the gift of a consecrated life from our members in Miss Graves, who goes out to work under him.

And now the summing up of the matter is that we see to it that these words of privilege received, of blessing enjoyed and of vision presented may not vanish as a tale that is told, but that with faces turned ever onward we shall renew our vows, take up our line of march so that when the Master cometh—He shall find us watching.

## Report of the Secretary Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary

MAY 25, 1915, TO MAY 30, 1916

The year began with the largely attended Semi-Annual Meeting in November. The growth of this attendance year by year, especially the numbers present at the Corporate Celebrations of the Holy Communion, is a source of great encouragement, and the Missionary addresses of the afternoon are always a great inspiration to the whole Auxiliary in beginning its winter's work.

The Diocesan officers again decided to pursue the policy of urging the Branches to unite in doing a few things well, and recommended for their principal work three special objects as follows: 1st, for the Diocesan Field, the raising of the Bishop's Fund for Parish Houses; 2d, for the Domestic Field, Bishop Rowe's Hospital work in Alaska; 3d, for the Foreign Field, the completion of the Fund for St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. These suggestions have been loyally followed and much money has been raised in spite of the great and insistent claims for War Relief, to which practically all our members have felt in duty bound to respond to the best of their ability.

In many Parish Branches there is a vivid consciousness of the Auxiliary's responsibility for part of the Apportionment, and co-operation in this matter between the Branches and their Rectors is far more intelligent and cordial than it used to be.

Box work is not increasing. In fact it rather lessens in value as money contributions grow, and this is not wholly a cause for regret so far as general Missionary work is concerned, but in the Mountain Mission Districts miscellaneous boxes continue to be invaluable, and many fine ones have been sent from Maryland this year.

Through the Churches and in other ways Baltimore women have much to stimulate their Missionary zeal, so the Officers

deemed it unnecessary to plan for more than two extra Meetings with addresses. One of these, on the subject of Mountain Missions, was given in January, at the meeting of the Executive Board, the other in April by Archdeacon Stuck.

The atmosphere of inspiration is often for us City women, in the air we breathe, but this is far from the case in the country, and the most discouraging feature of our work is the painfully slow growth of Missionary interest throughout our rural communities. So far as I know, not one new Country Branch has been formed in the past year, and from several already in existence come pathetic accounts of less, not growing interest, and little, if any, work done. We must face the problem as it has been faced in neighboring Dioceses, and find like them some practical means of creating interest among these scattered women and showing how they too can help in the great Cause. Plans must be carefully laid by the Officers, and the co-operation of some other members must be had in putting them into effect, but other Dioceses have overcome many difficulties and Maryland can do it too.

This brief review of the year's work shows nothing that is striking, much that is encouraging, and some things that we must regret. Should not each one of us ask herself: "How far am I responsible for the success or for the failures?" We individual members make the power of the Auxiliary as a whole, each of us can do a little more if she will.

Let us never be contented with well-doing, but constantly put before ourselves bigger and broader aims, and, as we realize our own great privileges, may we never forget to help and inspire the many who have not had our opportunities to learn the duty and the joy of active service for the King.

## Report of the Educational Secretary of Maryland

1915-1916

It is with mingled feelings of gratitude and disappointment that we report the fourth year of systematic Mission Study in Maryland—gratitude for the spread of the work into twelve new parishes, and disappointment in its discontinuance in five, and especial disappointment in the lack of expansion of Mission Study among the men of the Church. This latter work was most happily begun by Dr. Jefferys last year and continued by Mr. Schutz this year, but there has not, as yet, developed any leader, clerical or lay, to carry it on and enlarge it.

The year began with a most successful Interdenominational Institute—the fruit of the Silver Bay Conference. With the Bishop's consent we merged our Institute into it, the other churches accepting our leaders and dates. We threw open our classes to them, and they added others and threw them open to us, thereby offering the city a faculty of most extraordinary strength. There was an enrollment of 276, of which number 109 were from our Church, as well as four of the eight leaders.

In the presence of heathendom the Church of Christ should be one, and we very strongly believe that the shortest and most effectual way to Church Unity is via the Mission field. There is Church Unity at Silver Bay, and yet one is never so devoted to one's own Church as after a Silver Bay Conference. It is so good to get back to one's own spiritual environment!

One most encouraging feature of the work for the past year is the fact that there is developing in the Diocese a body of trained leaders who are consecrating their time and talents to this work not only in their own parishes but outside. One leader taught seven classes, and several, three or four. We are now longing for the day to come when we may have an Extension Secretary who will travel through the State sowing

the seed that will bring forth the harvest of such a vital interest in missions that Maryland may fully measure up to her responsibilities. There were this year 38 Parish Study Classes under 21 leaders.

How can we care for missions until we *know* about them, and how know until we study? Indifference and apathy are the natural result of ignorance, and amidst the present clamoring, insistent, persistent, all-demanding claims of every day life, the patient Christ, and the work for which He died, *wait, wait for us to care to do it!*

## Church Periodical Club

APRIL 30, 1915, TO APRIL 1, 1916

The Annual Report of the Church Periodical Club, given from April to April, is this year full of encouragement. Although two branches have become silent, two new branches are formed, and one new Librarian appointed. There is a revival of interest in some parishes where work is done in connection with the guilds or auxiliary, while others assist at the Diocesan House on Fridays sorting and sending off packages of literature which is received during the week.

The greater part of the magazines are distributed among the institutions and church reading-rooms in Maryland. Rejected magazines are taken away and sold for the benefit of two city missions, according to our motto, "Gather up the fragments that nothing be lost." The standard of literature sent out by the Church Periodical Club must be a high one. We are grateful to those friends who have given so freely, and especially for the sets of bound books, some of which were given to Dr. Gibson for the Diocesan Library and others sent to libraries in Diocese, Seminaries and Church schools.

The illustrated Lecture given for the C. P. C. by Mrs. Haslehurst, of New York, netted us over \$80, which was handed over to Mrs. Charles Grimes, Treasurer, for the reserve fund. A balance is held for the beginning of the autumn work.

The increasing list of annual subscribers is very encouraging, and with donations from friends, from Parish guilds or auxiliaries, we are enabled to do better work year by year.

In closing, we wish to convey the thanks of the Church Periodical Club to those who have by their interest and by their gifts enabled them to accomplish the work which they have undertaken.

We would express to our Bishop our appreciation of his patience and courtesy, when disturbed by our going and coming while in his study, and our thanks to the President and officers

## Report of the Junior Auxiliary of Maryland

1915-1916

The work of the Junior Auxiliary of Maryland opened formally on Saturday, October 9, at the Diocesan House. This was the first of our five Conferences of the year and was well attended. At eleven we opened with Holy Communion, followed by a business meeting and luncheon, and at two Miss Katherine Scott, of St. Hilda's, China, gave a most inspirational talk of her own work. The other four conferences in December, February, April and May were quite well attended, but next winter we are hoping and planning for even more enthusiasm and greater numbers. We have been very fortunate this year in our selection of a United Offering Treasurer, Miss Bruce Kinsolving, who has visited with Deaconess Peet and myself several branches in the Diocese and has created great interest among the children and a great desire to reach our United Offering goal of \$500. I most earnestly hope this will be realized. Another new officer is Miss Frances Bowdoin, who will become our Assistant Treasurer next fall and who promises to be a great asset to our Board. We have had two new branches added to our number since last year—one of children from 8 to 12, and one from 12 to 18. I hope this will encourage many people who are interested and have so far been inactive; to start to work early next year to have all three sections of the Junior Auxiliary in their parishes. We want them very much, and we need them tremendously. Mrs. Rhodes, one of our vice-presidents, and in charge of our older girl work, has met, I think, with great success during the past year. She has held at her house, during the winter, four Interparochial gatherings to hear different discussions of Missionary life and ideals from Mr. Lobdell, of North Carolina; Mr. Soper, of New York, whom the Silver Bay girls knew; Doctor Agnes Gordon Murdoch, of China, and Chaplain Silver, of Westpoint. Mr. Lobdell, of North Carolina, told the girls of

his mountain people so graphically and sympathetically, at their first meeting, that they determined to work for him this winter. A dance gotten up by Miss Kinsolving was given not long ago and \$50 was cleared for this purpose; other pledges amount to \$30. This money will be used to send one or more girls to boarding school. Two splendid boxes valued at \$50, each containing clothes, were also sent to Mr. Lobdell from a sewing class formed from the Interparochial meetings. Besides this work, Mrs. Rhodes also taught two Interparochial Mission Study Classes (one class of 15 girls and one of 8), and she has interested 7 Baltimoreans and 3 girls from Harrisburg to go with her this year to Silver Bay to learn how to be of more efficient help to the growing church.

Besides learning about missions and sending money to make the good work possible, the Juniors of Maryland sent this year over 1000 gifts to make the little people happy on Christmas day in St. Hilda's, China; Capemount, Africa; Santee Mission, South Dakota; St. Paul's Mission, South Carolina; and Burke County Missions, North Carolina. We have pledged 1000 gifts next year to go to Rev. Amos Ross, South Dakota; the Virginia Mountains; China and Africa.

Our Treasurer, Miss Harrison, reports that the usual scholarships have been met and a good many "specials" given. The "special" of the United Juniors has been to raise \$50 to help screen the new St. Hilda's, where our former Educational Secretary, Miss Scott, is doing such splendid work. The Educational work under our untiring Secretary, Deaconess Peet will, we hope, reap good results and speaks for itself in her report.

Miss Ridgely, in charge of the Little Helpers, reports that she has in hand \$266.55 from 269 children under 8 years of age. These children represent 25 parishes.

And now in closing I want to tell you what a wonderful privilege I think it is for each one of us to have worked all winter in the Junior Auxiliary of Maryland, and to feel that we have done our best, however small that may be, to help spread the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. And next winter after the great General Convention, when we will meet with larger

opportunities and increased interest, I hope we will all realize that our responsibility is greater in proportion and that we will take up our work with renewed zeal and deeper spirituality.

**Diocese of Maryland**

1915-1916

While attending the Silver Bay Conference last summer your representatives were invited to unite with the committee having in view an Interdenominational Mission Study Institute in Baltimore to be held in the autumn.

With the consent of Bishop Murray the invitation was accepted, and our Junior Auxiliary Mission Study classes formed a part of the Institute which was held November 9 to November 12, inclusive, at the First Presbyterian Church, Baltimore.

Miss Alice Lindley, President Junior Auxiliary, New York; Miss Anne W. Hubbard, Educational Secretary Junior Auxiliary, Pennsylvania; Mr. R. E. Diffendorfer, Secretary M. E. M.; and Mrs. E. H. Ziegler held graded normal classes for leaders, and popular, or general classes for young people.

“The Emergency in China,” “Around the World with Jack and Janet,” “Comrades in Service,” and “The King’s Highway” served as text-books.

Our large enrollment was largely due to the enthusiastic unflagging efforts of the committee chosen from the Interparochial class, a number of whom had attended the Silver Bay Conference.

During Epiphanytide we held a Normal Class for Leaders weekly at the Diocesan House. Visits have been paid to local and out-of-town branches.

As the work broadens the need for more leaders presses heavily. The devoted Diocesan Secretary of the Little Helpers

needs assistants for the growing work of her department, which is the foundation stone of the Junior Department. It is a splendid field of service for senior leadership.
