The United Offering of 1919

Resolution adopted in St. Louis,
October 16, 1916

Resolved, That the United Offering of 1919 be given to the Board of Missions, to be devoted to the training, sending and support of women for mission work at home and abroad, and to the care of such workers when sick or disabled—provided that at least \$10,000 be expended for the erection, completion or renewal of a building or buildings in the mission field, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of a committee composed of the President of the Board of Missions, the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary and the members of the Conference Committee of the Woman's Auxiliary. Also,

Resolved, That to our united gifts shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves or of their substance to the work of the Master in the mission field.

A Prayer for More Workers

Almighty God, Lord of the harvest, we humbly beseech Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and especially to put into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to Thy work in the Mission field; that so the bounds of Thy blessed kingdom may be enlarged; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Report of President

To the year of preparation has come the period of completion. In days gone by we rested on our oars after the race was won. To-day there is no time in which we may drop out of line, our rest must come to us on the march, for the sound of the tread of the armies of the world is a daily clarion call, and we may not lay down our armor until we can no longer wear it.

Maryland has given her testimony, has discharged her obligations, completed her pledges—even to those of the “Poster” of great dimensions; and although it is only a touch here and there, we may feel that we have our part in the far reaching, far flung battle line of the Church’s work.

In these days of perplexity our eyes are fixed upon the Cross, in our daily procession, and then upon the Flag. What that Flag has meant in following the Cross through all these years our history as a people can give account, what it will mean in the future will by God’s help be no less. We are to pour out our substance, after our souls and bodies, to aid the right, and it is ours to see to it that we balance our burdens in their due proportion and keep up in the fullest measure the work at home and abroad in our Mission Field, whose needs demand as never before our steadfast works added to our faith.

In our march abreast of ever increasing responsibilities, the Woman’s Auxiliary is using its well-organized machinery for the additional equipment needed for Camp and Field, and we observe with thanksgiving the ready response to our appeals.

The Bishop of Maryland, losing no time in going straight to our boys in the Camps, has asked us for the present to turn our plowshares into swords, and to give aid needed at once,

in caring not only for the lads who go out from us in the warfare of the world, as allies against a foreign foe, such as no age has ever known, but to aid him in the fight against the flesh and the devil, and in ministrations and recreations for the Cantonments. It is needless to say how gladly we welcome this opportunity, and we pledge our faith to him for the coming year, and for as long as he may need us.

You will hear of the budget for Auxiliary work, yearly pledges and our new business venture from the devoted Officers, without whose faithful work our labor would be but lost. We welcome the incoming reinforcements and the wave of progress which our new Vice-Presidents and Chairmen will bring.

For our Committees appointed at the Tri-ennial—as Chairman—the report is given that the message of faith, love and hope sent to our English sisters has had its cordial return greeting from Mrs. Davison, who dates not from Lambeth near the water but from the Old Palace, Canterbury, where we pray God they—the Archbishop and his family—may be kept under the shadow of His wing who neither slumbers nor sleeps.

From the Central Committee on Woman's Work in the Church comes greeting to us of "joy and sympathy, joy that you stand side by side with us in the great world struggle for the rights and liberties of nations, sympathy because you will be called upon to enter into the fellowship of suffering and sacrifice," and if further inspiration were needed it can be found in the endurance and fortitude with which their work is pursued—meetings held in spite of unlighted streets, with shaded lanterns to guide them, or pathetic funeral processions when the latest victims of the air raids are escorted by their sisters to their last resting place. We hear of the munition workers who in the midst of their midnight dinners have short prayers offered for those who care to join, and each night 200 or 300 of these weary girls stay to pray for those who are fighting.

We live in stirring times, and the Pilgrimage of Prayer now closing has marked our road with the Stations of the Cross,

where we may rest as did the Pilgrims of old to gather up strength for the journey which lies before us. We hear the call, "Lift up your hearts," and we make answer now and for all time, "We lift them up, unto the Lord."

Report of the Secretary Maryland Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary

MAY 30, 1916, TO MAY 29, 1917

The first Auxiliary Meeting of the season was held November 3, just after the return of the delegates from the Triennial at St. Louis, and the beautiful address of Bishop Brent on this occasion was an inspiring beginning for the Winter's work. The Semi-Annual Meeting, with its delightful talks from Bishop Tucker and Miss Margaret Bailey on the subject of Woman's Education in China and Japan, followed very shortly, and soon after this the Officers issued their annual leaflet, telling every Parish Branch what the Maryland Auxiliary planned to do.

The absolute pledges undertaken this year were for our own Bishop's Fund, for Hospital work in Alaska and for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, with a small pledge for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio. It is believed that all will be fully met. In addition to the special objects, for which Maryland made itself responsible, much has been contributed to other Missionary work. Each of the many claims presented at St. Louis had so much to recommend it, that it was hard to decide which we should help, but we are glad to report that many a struggling Missionary Bishop has received substantial aid from us.

The Box work has about maintained its average, but not exceeded it. Money contributions from nearly all the Branches are larger than formerly, and there is a corresponding decrease in the demand for boxes.

Attendance at the monthly meetings in Grace and St. Peter's Parish House has steadily grown, and at the four addressed by special speakers Bishop Brent, Mrs. Wetmore, Mrs. Hubert Lloyd and Bishop Rowe was really very large. There is no doubt of the popularity of such meetings.

An unusual and important piece of work was undertaken in mid-winter in connection with the Pilgrimage of Prayer. With the cordial co-operation of the Bishop and many of the Clergy, the Officers undertook in January the detailed arrangements for the season of special prayer which was to come to us in the first week in Lent. So far as was possible every parish, City or Country, was helped to do its part, leaflets were printed and widely distributed, and a little Manual of Prayer issued. In the City, services were arranged for every day of the week, each under the auspices of some special group of Church-workers, beginning with our own annual Quiet Day. The result of this earnest preparation on the part of many people was most encouraging. The services were well attended and found spiritually helpful—undoubtedly many private lives were deeply influenced. In these days of turmoil and perplexity we most truly need Heavenly guidance if we are to choose aright just what we ought to do. May we be always steadfast in our work for missions, giving it first place in our hearts and lives, and ever praying that our Lord and Master may so fill each member with a spirit of love for Him that the Maryland Auxiliary, as a whole, may never fail in loyal service.

1916-1917

There is no formal report of the Red Cross work done in many parishes, but the amount is undoubtedly very large, and represents much expenditure of time and money.

In addition to this, \$309.64 was raised by various parish branches, as a direct contribution to the Library War Service Fund for American soldiers. These facts clearly reveal the determination of Auxiliary Women to do their full part for their country as well as for their church.

Report of the Educational Secretary Diocese of Maryland

MAY 1917

Five years ago this month a Senior Educational Secretary was appointed for Maryland, the Junior Educational Secretary up to that time having been the only one in the Diocese. Since then systematic missionary education has been pursued earnestly, steadily and prayerfully. We gratefully acknowledge that the Master has taken the small crumbs of our endeavor and through the ever-increasing co-operation of our Institute and parochical leaders, has blessed them and multiplied them most abundantly, so that to-day we can report the following encouraging statistics:

In addition to these parochial classes, there were three others, non-parochial. One was taught in Burgundy Alley, and consisted of 3 Serbians, 1 Italian, 2 Greeks, 1 Russian. Another was taught in the leader's own home five nights a week for six weeks. In this class there were three Jews, two of whom have become Christians, and one has become a missionary to Mexico from the Methodist Church.

Our Bishop outlined most aptly and concisely in his greeting to the Institute last autumn the method and the goal of Mission Study, in just four words—Information, Inspiration, Determination, Action. This year that outline has been followed out to its blessed last syllable! From the classes themselves came the determination that action should follow the inspiration gained through information, and \$748.00 has been sent to the mission field as one result of Mission Study in Maryland.

This is one result of our year's work, but there are others—the greater realization that even *we* can be workers together with God—the beautiful fellowship—the realization of the true value of life and of work—the value and power of prayer—these, and things like these, are leading us on, we hope and believe, to a life more worthy of Him who died that we "might have life, and have it more abundantly."

Report of the Church Periodical Club

FROM APRIL, 1916, TO APRIL, 1917

The Church Periodical Club withholds the usual annual Report, with detailed account of the winter's work, only stating, that the outlook for future advancement in this department of missionary is very bright.

That an intelligent interest is growing is evidenced by the gradual, if slow, addition to the list of annual subscribers, and the generous donations of really first-class books and magazines. By this means many institutions and parish Reading Rooms were amply supplied with interesting and wholesome material for weeks to come. Slides were made from photographs of mountain Missions and sent to Father Lobdell in North Carolina. Twenty-five new books, selected by clergymen from selected publishers' lists, formed a part of the "Special" work.

The Central Board has recently formed a committee to organize special work for Chaplains in the Army and Navy. This is not a new work, merely a development and extension of what has been done for some Chaplains for many years. Special emphasis should in every case be laid on the fact that *no one must give up regular sending, nor divert their present contributions.*

The committee is now conferring with the Red Cross Society, which has no department organized for such work. Notices will be sent out as soon as the plan takes definite form. We beg the co-operation of all Church people in order to carry out the plan and follow the instructions given to us. Librarians will be requested to form committees in their parishes, who will collect suitable reading matter, and prepare for forwarding as directed.

Report of the Junior Auxiliary of Maryland

1916-1917

On Saturday, November 3, the work of the Junior Auxiliary started for the year 1916-17.

Six conferences were held, one each month from November through April, and an interesting speaker was present at four of the six conferences. Our officers remain the same, with two exceptions, Miss Bruce Kinsolving has been appointed by the Bishop, Assistant to the President, and Miss Emory will teach a Manual Training Class in connection with our box work. We think this will be a great help to our work, especially in our attempt to interest boys.

The main problem of the year has been an understanding and working out of the New Plan drawn up at the October General Convention in St. Louis. This plan is to co-operate with the Sunday Schools, arranging to have every Sunday School scholar a member of the auxiliary and every auxiliary member in Sunday School, and the children that up to this time have been reached by neither, a member of both. In order to fulfill all the necessary work in connection with giving to Missions, it is planned to have week-day meetings to do box work. After a visit to a New York Conference on the subject of the New Plan we feel we have sufficient understanding of it to go ahead next winter, working through an Extension Committee and starting many new branches in connection with the Sunday Schools. The organization of the Extension plan is as follows: In the City of Baltimore we are to have a Central Committee of seven, representing the Diocesan Board of Religious Education, the Sunday Schools and the Junior Auxiliary. Under this Committee will be four Archdeaconry sub-committees, each composed of three members—a representative of the Archdeaconry, a representative of the Junior Auxiliary and a Sunday School Representative. All these groups are to meet together this spring to outline their work for next winter.

This year we have one new Parish branch, to our credit, doing exactly what the St. Louis Convention suggested.

Besides this new model branch we have this year added seven to our number, some of which have done excellent work. Mrs. Rhodes, the vice-president in charge of the older girls, has worked hard this winter and has been well rewarded. She has had four Interparochial Classes at her house, with an average attendance of 75 girls; the girls have raised \$104.00 for St. Agnes School, Kyoto, and \$100.00 has been donated besides; a sewing class of 17 has been formed from these meetings and 66 articles of clothing have been made for Mr. Lobdell's Mountain Mission in North Carolina. Next year the girls plan to work for Bishop Thomas and his Indian Village. Besides this work Mrs. Rhodes is taking 16 girls with her to Silver Bay.

Miss Ridgely, in charge of the Little Helpers, reports that she has in hand \$219.00. Our treasurer, Miss Harrison, reports that the usual scholarships have been met this year, with the exception of the one to St. Hilda's School, given for many years by the Juniors of St. Johns, Ellicott City. This scholarship will be kept up, but by the church, as there has been no Junior branch at St. Johns this year. \$100.00, special, was sent to Archdeacon Stuck for his buildings at Fort Yukon, \$50.00 was raised for Dr. Teusler's hospital, \$200.00 raised for St. Agnes, Kyoto, and \$50.00 for screening at St. Hilda's. Our pledge for \$500.00 to the Bishop for the Paret Memorial is completed after five years' work.

Miss Kinsolving, the United Offering Treasurer, reports that last autumn at the General Convention \$430.84 was given to the United Offering Fund by the Juniors of Maryland. This was \$200.00 more than our Juniors gave in 1913 and we hope in 1919 our offering will be twice as large as in 1916. This year we have collected \$54.00 as a start.

Besides gifts by money, our Juniors sent away this year 925 gifts as Christmas presents to children that otherwise might have had no reminder that Christ came into the world to bring love and joy to all men. The gifts were sent to St. Peter's, Callaway, Va.; St. John's, Endicott, Va.; South Dakota Indians; Miss Ridgely, Africa, and Miss Scott, China.

Miss Pitts, our Educational Secretary, reports one normal class of leaders with 10 parishes represented, 25 classes and meetings, holding from 3 to 8 sessions each, in which 376 children were enrolled, with regular attendance of 287. Not enough money was raised to send a delegate to Silver Bay, so we are sending with Miss Pitts two delegates to St. Albans Summer School near Washington, one representing the Archdeaconry of Annapolis and one that of Baltimore. Our Educational Secretary will also attend the Conference for Church Workers at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

And now, in closing my report, I want to beg of each one of you to try to more fully realize in this time, when the world is filled with such strife and sorrow, the true meaning of being a Missionary, whether at home or in the field, and to try this summer and next year to help in making the Junior Auxiliary of Maryland a more vital agency to spread His Kingdom.
