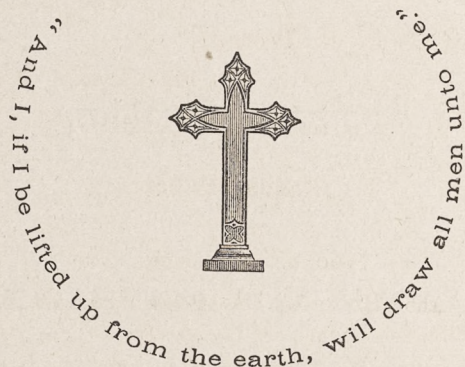

### REPORT OF THE SECRETARY.

FOR seven years the work of the MASSACHUSETTS BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY has gone quietly and steadily on, gaining for itself, as we like to believe, more of interest and trust in the hearts of the women of the Diocese.

From time to time it is well to look back over the years that are gone, for in this way alone are we able to realize what has really been accomplished. When work goes on so steadily, and with perhaps comparatively little to distinguish one year from another, we are tempted at times to feel that after all little is accomplished; but when we look back to the beginning, and see what in these few years has been the gain, we may indeed be filled with gratitude for the past, and courage for the future.

The record of the year just ended has much of special encouragement in it. Several new parishes have been added to the list of those already connected with the Auxiliary, and in spite of great financial depression the receipts for the past year have much exceeded those of 1883, and more than equalled those of 1882, the year which showed the largest annual amount ever contributed by the Auxiliary.

The average representation of parishes at the nine monthly meetings has been thirty-two.

The anniversary service was held in Trinity Church, on the evening of November 7th. The Bishop of the Diocese presided, and a most interesting sermon was preached by the Rt. Rev. Daniel S. Tuttle, D.D., missionary Bishop of Utah.

A marked feature of the past year has been the starting of a memorial fund in memory of our late President, the interest of this fund to be used by the different departments in turn. Mrs. Chickering's affections were very closely connected with the Auxiliary, and surely no more fitting memorial could be raised than this, which will serve to keep fresh in the minds of her fellow workers, the memory of one whose heart was ever in the missionary work of the Church of God.

With the coming year, new hopes and plans are filling the hearts of the Committees in the different departments of the work; they can however, after all, but present the always increasing need. It remains with you of



the Auxiliary to say how far their hearts are to be gladdened by your ready co-operation in the work of aiding those, who, in Christ's name, go forth to preach His Gospel to the world.

### DOMESTIC DIVISION.

In presenting to you the report for the past year of the Domestic Department of this Society, we rejoice to tell you that the work has been greater than ever before. Let us be heartily thankful, for you remember that at the close of the year of 1883 we were forced, to our sorrow, to acknowledge that the work had fallen off.

As two years ago we were called upon to extend our sympathy and help to those ruined by the fires in Michigan, so this year we have "lengthened our cords" in behalf of hundreds rendered destitute by the overwhelming floods in Ohio. This call we have met generously, and the value of the boxes sent in response has somewhat enlarged our sum total.

The growth in the work, however, is not, in any great degree, *due* to this call. A greater general interest in the welfare of the missionary has been shown.

In sending of clothing the larger parishes have done largely, Some of the smaller parishes who have done nothing for Domestic Missions before have helped us this year, and some who never before felt themselves able to supply the much needed "clerical suit" have this year overcome the difficulty,—no doubt to their own satisfaction, as well as to the great happiness of the missionary who has received it.

The \$150.00 which at the beginning of the year we partially promised to the Rev. Dr. Lee for his school at Bolivar, Tennessee, has not been forthcoming, but by means of the offerings sent to our department from the Sunday schools, amounting in all to about \$84.00, we have taken a new scholarship in one of Bishop Tuttle's schools for Mormon children.

The expense of supporting this scholarship is \$40.00 per annum, and as it is named "The Massachusetts Sunday School Scholarship," we trust that it may be continued by this annual collection.

Our pledge of \$100.00 toward Sister Eliza's salary has been fulfilled as in the past. Let us not forget in the coming year the valuable work which she is doing!

We appeal to you again for the labors of those missionaries who are struggling to build churches and rectories.

We all know with how much greater zeal the people of a parish will come together to worship God and to work for Him if they have a building, be it ever so small, which they can call God's house and which they have consecrated to His service.

We know, too, that the missionary will lead his people with a braver heart and brighter faith if he has a house in which he and his family can live, as Christians should, happily and to the glory of God.



Calls for this object come to us constantly. Let us not turn aside, but with conscientious thoughtfulness give according as God has blessed us, remembering that we are but His stewards and that "He loveth a cheerful giver."

May we ask you here not to forget the Altar Society! A society formed more than a year since, and which is now doing most efficient and helpful work in furnishing surplices and altar linen to those parishes who may desire its services. Both money and workers for the support of this society are solicited.

We have nothing new to tell you of the work! It is the same old story! We *must* plant—God *will* give the increase; and while we rejoice and give thanks that with God's help we have, this year, done more in the carrying forward of His kingdom, do not let us be content. Pray that we may press onward, each of us doing with our might whatever our hands find to do, knowing that we must work while it is day, for the night cometh when no man *can* work.

## INDIAN AND FREEDMEN DIVISIONS.

(IN CHARGE OF THE DAKOTA LEAGUE.)

The work of the Dakota League for the past year has been remarkably free from unusual events. It has moved on with that steady calm which is the surest indication of progress and success in its peaceful labors. The training of children, the care of the sick, the quiet flow of Christian influence, always presents an outward repose which is a true exponent of the strength and richness of its current.

The destruction of the buildings of St. Mary's School has been the only incident, and this apparent calamity has proved not even a slight obstacle, it has been found a positive means of opening new doors of usefulness. The Bishop has not yet selected the site for the erection of the new building, but it will probably be nearer the homes of the scholars, and where there are now no Christian schools.

It is a most gratifying fact that while this is the only event which has called for special sympathy and aid, the receipts for the Indian branch of the Dakota League work have been unusually large. We cannot help congratulating ourselves on this most certain indication of the hold which Indian Missions have upon the consciences of their friends, who thus year by year rise to the responsibility of carrying them forward. And yet, appeals come from places in our country where our hands have never yet been stretched forth. Most interesting glimpses have been shown us into the lives of the Navajos of New Mexico, a people of great intelligence, all ready for the touch of civilization and Christianity. Nothing has been done by us in those wide regions of the North West, Oregon and Washington Territory. From the Shoshones who have themselves repeatedly urged upon us their needs, we have been obliged to turn away without giving



them the help they ask. A recent article in the Spirit of Missions on the Indians in Minnesota, shows how large is the field there, and how wonderfully rapid the progress of the work. While we have shown a steady interest in that work, yet so fast does it extend that we need to make our efforts more active to keep pace with its increasing demands.

Thus the greatness of the work to be done will not let us remain satisfied with what we are already doing; but the very facility which we have gained in all these years—the increased working power of our organization—the certainty which we feel of your ready and reliable support—all these gains within our Society, as well as the indirect stimulus of improved public opinion, make us long with deeper ardor to extend our labors.

There is another thought which has pressed upon the minds of your Committee, and which the history of Indian Missions has deepened every year—that is, the feeling of our responsibilities towards those whose minds have been roused by the teachings of Christianity. Hundreds of Indian boys and girls have been brought by the government from their homes and placed in the schools at Hampton, at Carlisle and in Philadelphia. There has been opened to them a new life. The gate of learning has been unlocked. Not one of those children will ever be the same again. The innocence of their savage life is gone. Henceforth if they return to sin and barbarism they do so as responsible beings. They have been forced to this accountability by the privileges that have been given them. But think of the young man or young woman of eighteen to twenty-three, leaving the guarded life of the home school and going back to the native village. There the terrible struggle begins. How lonely, how hard will be that struggle, how doubtful the victory, if no where within reach is there any ministration of the Church! It is true we cannot establish churches, we cannot found missions, but we can, each one of us, be faithful in the work we are already doing, and endeavor to strengthen and extend it, so that at least no mission need be abandoned, and so that it will be more possible that in every Indian village, these poor tempted children will find the strength and comfort of the Church to sustain and cheer them.

In reviewing the work done for the Freedmen, your Committee does not feel the same encouragement as in considering the Indian branch. There has been a falling off in the receipts, and considerable embarrassment in meeting the pledges long since given for this work. A promise deliberately made by the Society to support some one object is, of course, binding upon the Society, and should be fulfilled to the exclusion, if necessary, of all other demands. It is very natural that in such work as that for the Freedmen, where new and interesting enterprises are constantly being started, parishes should forget the claims of the original pledge, especially as the parish committees are constantly changing, and the new members do not realize the duty of assuming the responsibilities of their predecessors. Let us beg you, however, most earnestly, to remember that the stability, the abiding usefulness of missionary work depends entirely upon the steady, systematic, reliable aid, given to institutions already in progress. With this in mind, building each year solidly upon the old foundations first laid, keeping up the support of those to whom we were first pledged, let us go forward, always ready for the new appeals but not forgetful of the old, feeling the freshness and enthusiasm that comes from reports of new undertakings, but guarding sacredly every step of ground we have gained in the past.



With this warning appeal which your Committee makes, not unmindful of your generous aid, your true sympathy and your earnest labors; but in all faithfulness as your stewards, most anxious that your work shall be firmly established and your influence be conscientiously exerted, we close our report, thankful for the work already accomplished, and looking forward with courage to the opening year.

### FOREIGN DIVISION.

Through another year, our Auxiliary has been permitted the privilege of doing something in the great work of spreading the Gospel abroad among the nations of the earth. Such a service is surely its own reward—yet additional encouragement and incentive come to the hearts of the workers in the reports from one missionary centre and another, telling of the fields that are already “white unto the harvest,” and calling for more laborers to gather into the garner.

Japan, especially, seems open to receive the truths of our religion, if only Christians will be faithful to their responsibilities. The increased interest in the mission schools has been marked during the past year, and the number of communicants at Osaka nearly doubled. Dr. Harrell, the physician who went out in March to the new Medical Mission at Tokio, is full of hope and courage with regard to that work. He was provided, by the ready response of a Boston clergyman to our appeal, with a necessary and expensive set of instruments for his special work as an oculist. The Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary has undertaken to raise \$8,000.00 for the hospital building for this mission, and looks to Massachusetts for fifteen hundred of this sum for the land.

Very interesting farewell services were held in the church of St. John the Evangelist in this city, in March last, at the departure of Miss Mary Mailes of Boston for Japan, to labor among the native women at Osaka.

Turning now to Africa (I quote from the Report of the Foreign Committee in New York), “In the judgment of one who has been conversant with the details for a long time, the work was never more promising.” The new Missionary Bishop elect, the Rev. Mr. Ferguson, writes:—“God's blessing has manifestly rested upon our work of training the daughters of Africa during the year just closed.” Speaking of these African girls, let us say, that the appeal of Mrs. Brierly for some of them who would be forced to return from the Christian influences of the mission school to the most degrading rites of heathenism, touched the hearts of some of our ladies here so deeply, that they immediately raised money to redeem several girls from this fate.



The robes of the new Bishop have been generously given by Emmanuel Church, Boston, and money raised by others toward additional expenses of his outfit.

With regard to China, the testimony of one of the latest workers in the field is, that where he expected to find bitter opposition, and possible persecution, the work seems open to all and religious freedom comparatively established—only indifference and contemptuous toleration are to be overcome.

We regret to have to record the return home of the missionary, supported by our Branch, Miss Martha Bruce, with health seriously affected by the climate of China. She has done good work there in teaching, and the progress made by her pupils was highly commended.

From the receipts of the Sunday School Penny collection for foreign work, have been established two scholarships in St. Timothy's school, Osaka, called respectively the Massachusetts Sunday School and the Bishop B. H. Paddock Scholarships. It would be very pleasant if others could be supported in memory of the former Bishops of the Diocese.

With all these encouragements, the work indeed is great and the laborers few, while in view of the appeals which come from every part of our own broad land, making constantly fresh demands on our sympathies and our resources, we can understand the feeling of those who tell us there is too much to be done at home, for one to think of countries so remote and so distinct from us in civilization. But still for this work of ours, we ever plead the solemn injunction of the Saviour: "Go ye into all the world," and His answer to the questioner of old, asking, "Who is my neighbor?"

#### MEXICAN AND HAITIEN DIVISION.

We are glad to be able to say to you that in regard to Haiti we have succeeded in furnishing through your ready help the needed boxes of clothing for the missionaries, and their grateful letters have shown how much the boxes were needed—and how appreciated.

A young girl, native of Haiti and under Bishop Holly's own charge while a child, has just returned to Port au Prince after being educated in this country, to be a teacher among her own people. Your Committee asks for your aid to support her in this work.

We have little that is encouraging to report for the Mexican branch. The greatly diminished receipts show with what failing fortunes the year now closes for us. There have been times when it seemed that there was not sufficient support to authorize the very existence of a Mexican Committee, and yet it has been really representative of a few who in the face of all



doubts and difficulties have continued to hope and labor for the Church in Mexico. Last autumn, Mrs. Hooker, the lady in charge of the Girls' Orphanage, visited Boston, and met a number of ladies to whom she spoke. Those who met her then, and especially those who saw her more informally afterwards, were impressed with the simple earnestness with which she regarded her work. It was impossible not to believe that such true consecration, such unselfish devotion, must be effectual, and the very fact that she had labored for nine years in the midst of the discouragements which seem to many who only see them looming portentously on the distant horizon as insuperable obstacles—that simple fact put doubts and fears to shame. The history of the work from Mrs. Hooker's return till spring is a sad one, and need not be related here. That time of perplexity closed with the resignation of Bishop Riley.

In announcing the resignation, the Mexican Commission made this statement: "The work inaugurated in Mexico is one of magnitude and promise, and we feel that it has strong claims upon our sympathies. There are numerous laborers engaged in the field, a large number of congregations, a well conducted orphanage and schools, and two magnificent churches in the Capital. To sustain these branches of Christian effort, and to prevent much suffering on the part of those who rely on our aid, and to secure this wide field of opportunity and usefulness, speedy and liberal contributions are required." Since that time these laborers in the service of Christ have struggled on. From time to time word has come to us of their distress. Only one of them, Signor Valdespino, has left the field, he having been obliged by poverty to take a secular office. Mrs. Hooker has now eighty-two girls for whom she provides a safe Christian home, though all her own resources are strained to meet its bare necessities of food and shelter, so scanty have been her remittances from this country. The Boys' Orphanage is closed, though eight of the boys are under Mr. Maruris' supervision and he greatly needs aid.

Through the year several members of our Church have visited Mexico, and their reports have been the same. A few Christian clergymen, a few Christian women who have stood the test of the crisis in the affairs of the Mission, are hoping and laboring on in the midst of sin and degradation, in the face of poverty and friendlessness. There are two ways in which this state of things has been regarded. One view taken is, that the depravity of the Mexican character is such, the government so given over to corruption, their whole condition morally, socially and politically so debased, that the time is not ripe for any movement of the Church in their behalf. The other view is, that so long as there are any honest Christians in Mexico, who in a spirit of love to those wretched people, and in consecration to their Saviour, are devoting their lives to the work of Christ, then it is the duty of those who first pledged them their support, to continue it. This last conviction is the one which has laid hold upon the hearts and consciences of your Committee. They have not been able to escape from it. The ladies of the Mexican League have held to their work in the same spirit, and there have been those in every diocese who have supported us in this conviction. We have lost faith in individuals, we have found cherished plans fail, but we have not lost faith in the righteousness of



the cause. While questions are raised as to Church government, our minds are full of anxious thought for the children who are being painfully shielded from sin and sorrow. While the ownership of Church property is discussed, we remember that if the Churches are closed, some poor sorrowful creatures may be deprived of the religious life that is as dear to them as it is to us.

It is a woman's work thus to stand in the gap, and with loving patience protect what is good and true until those who have the power settle the questions of government and organization. The argument of those who would abandon Mexico because of its hopeless debasement, seems to us to need but one answer—the words of Christ: "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." In this spirit then we begin our work again, and we ask once more your aid and sympathy, so that even if this coming year closes in doubt and gloom like the past, we may all be spared the reproach of deserting those who in far greater anxieties are still working in their Master's cause.
