TENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY.

OUR last Annual Report closed with humble petition to the Lord of the Harvest to send forth more laborers. His Divine Blessing has been freely granted. As we gather here to-day to keep the Harvest Festival, and witness the in-gathering of the fruits of the year, we find such unprecedented increase as should inspire each heart to sing a glad Te Deum, and in loving gratitude reverently renew its service to the Master. Since the organization of the Mass. Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, no yearly record has been equal to that which we now present. Never have we shown such strength in numbers, in purpose and accomplishment—so much vital energy and so large a financial result. We report 113 parishes, enrolled as co-workers; the support of 66 scholarships, of two free hospital beds, and two children in St. Mary's Orphanage, Shanghai (China); an offering of \$16,563.33, and the value of Missionary boxes \$12,653.52; in sum total, \$29,216.75—\$5,788.92 in excess of any annual offering yet presented by our Diocesan Branch of the Auxiliary. The Lucy Lee Chickering Memorial Fund, completed last year, has yielded its first annual interest, affording the Domestic Committee the privilege of a special appropriation of \$40. The Grace H. Hamlen Memorial Scholarship has begun its good work in St. Mary's School, Dakota. New and enlarged schemes have been successfully undertaken in the Indian, Foreign and Domestic Divisions; while our Mexican Committee, encompassed by difficulties that would appal any less endowed with faith and true courage, have proved themselves strong in wisdom and prudence, and sufficient to the accomplishment of most noble work. The retirement of Mrs. Henry B. Mackintosh, Chairman of the Dakota League, and of Miss Abby R. Loring, Chairman of Domestic Committee, must be felt by all as a serious loss. With affectionate and grateful remembrance of many years of faithful service, and with keen regret, we are compelled to accept the necessity which deprives us of our beloved co-workers. We cordially acknowledge the efficient services of Miss Woods, Diocesan Treasurer, and

Mrs. A. T. Twing, Honorary Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, in supplying these vacancies in the Board of Officers.

The great assistance rendered through the generosity of the Rector, Wardens and Vestry of St. Paul's Church, in granting the free use of the Church buildings, and that of the Rector of the Church of the Good Shepherd and the trustees of the Huntington House, in giving us the privilege of storage, again demand hearty expression of grateful appreciation.

Sixty-four Parishes or Missions are yet unconnected with this Diocesan organization. It will be a happy day when all of our parishes, having learned that the aim and desire of the Woman's Auxiliary are to *facilitate, not to control*, parochial missionary effort, shall be united in one grand body of workers. Among those which for years have been enrolled, there are a few, not inconveniently distant, that do not, by presence of delegates at the monthly meetings, by correspondence or any other evidence of interest, betray knowledge of the fact that they belong to our association. We beg leave affectionately to assure them that we give them kindly remembrance as we hear their names from the roll call at each meeting, and still await their return with cordial desire and promise of welcome.—As, in the fulness of "the joy in harvest," we review the blessings of the year, may we not believe that much of our prosperity is due to the Missionary Services which have been held, in the majority of the Parishes in this Diocese, during the past twelve months? By the mighty influences of prayer and praise hearts have been warmed, views of christian duty enlarged, and ways and means opened for obedience to the Divine Command to preach the Gospel to *every creature*.

The first decade of our life as a Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is completed to-day. Your kind forbearance is asked, as we pause for a brief retrospect ere we cross the threshold of the second. Many here present well remember that autumnal day in the year 1877, when, in response to a call from the Bishop of the Diocese, a large number of Church-women met in the Church Rooms of Boston. The missionary spirit had long been active, and the hearts of some christian women seemed all aglow with love and sympathy. Many a well-furnished box had gone out from the Parish Societies, carrying cheer and substantial aid into the homes of the hard-working missionaries of the west and south. The Dakota League, commenced under the leadership of Mrs. Mary D. Burnham, was already old in service in behalf of Indians, and enrolled 75 parishes. 42 parishes, through the energetic efforts of Mrs. Sarah F. Hoyt (appointed by the Bishop) were most earnestly interested in Foreign Missions. The struggles of "The Church of Jesus" in Mexico were arousing the sympathies of christian people throughout the land; by request of Bishop Paddock, Miss Anna M. Means awakened the interest of the church-women of Massachusetts, and accomplished a work for Mexico long to be remembered. All evinced hearty and enthusiastic readiness to accept the plans presented by their Bishop for establishment of a Diocesan Missionary Organization, which should effect general and systematized work for missions. The Mass. Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions dates from that day; the code of regulations there and then adopted is that of the present time.—As we glance at the records of ten years, it is cheering to note how the good work has steadily advanced, blessing and being

blessed, knitting together in ties of sweet christian fellowship the hearts of fellow-workers, as they shared unlimited joys and—a very few—heart sorrows. The name of Mrs. L. L. Chickering, the first President, and that of Miss Grace H. Hamlen, the first Secretary of the Dakota Division, will ever awaken memories of devoted and consecrated labors. With reverent affection we think of them to-day, and recall the sense of irreparable loss so universally felt as each was called to leave to others the work she so loved, and enter into the rest eternal.

“O fellowship divine!
We feebly struggle, they in glory shine,
Yet all are one in Thee, for all are Thine!”

During ten years the Mass. Branch has given to Mexican and Haitian Missions \$8,864.32—and in missionary boxes, the value of \$987.37; to “Freedmen,” \$6,842.83—boxes, \$16,527.29; to Indian Missions, \$21,917.46—boxes, \$33,706.14; to Foreign Missions, \$23,436.05—boxes, \$2,045.13; Domestic Missions, \$23,049.11—boxes, \$47,986.20; to general purposes, \$4,097.43. In sum total, \$189,459.33.

With the courage that results from happy experience, we may enter upon the second decade; but with no idle dreams of labor ended, or even of rest! The work has but begun. The notable events in ten years of the world's history teach of opportunities and responsibilities from which we dare not turn away our eyes and our hearts. From east and west, from north and south, of our own dear country, come pleading cries for help. Far distant portions of God's fair earth, in obedience to the mighty powers of science and commerce, are rapidly nearing us, and Christianity must be armed and equipped to go in and possess the land. For “a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindred, and people, and tongues,” souls, for whom the dear Lord laid down His Life nearly 2000 years ago, are still living and dying in the darkness of ignorance and sin. And we have the Gospel of Life, and Light, and Love! And we have the command, and the privilege, and the opportunity to be co-workers together with God. We *must* have the will and the effort, and God will supply the blessing.

So shall we hasten the coming of that glorious day when “The kingdoms of this world are become the Kingdoms of our Lord and His Christ”—when,

“From Earth's wide bounds, from Ocean's farthest coast,
Through gates of pearl, streams in that countless host,
Singing to Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, Alleluia!”

DOMESTIC DIVISION.

As we look at the year lying behind us, and think of giving a report of the work done, we are almost at a loss, for such work as ours varies so little as time goes on. But lest if we say nothing you will think we have done nothing, we will try to give you in few words (as happily suggested by members of your committee) an idea of what has been accomplished.

First, we can tell you that several new parishes have been enrolled on the list of the Auxiliary, and seem to be thoroughly inspired in their desire for the work before them. The receipts in boxes filled for the missionaries and in money given is about the same as last year, but the interest in all branches of missionary effort is increasing steadily and surely.

The missionary in Montana, under Bishop Brewer, has been supported this year as last. By our sending to Bishop Brewer the necessary salary of \$500, much needed work has been done which else would have been left undone. The coming year is the last of the three years for which we are pledged in this direction. Your committee of the domestic department is responsible for the fulfilment of this pledge. May we not hope that as this is the last year, the contributions from the several parishes will be remembered, and sent in more readily than ever as free-will offerings from glad and thankful hearts. In addition to the \$500, our proportion of Sister Eliza's salary has also been raised, and this must be sent her as long as she continues in the work, which we hope will be for many years.

The Altar Society now so well known has grown greatly in usefulness. It stands always ready to supply surplices, cassocks, stoles, altar linen, &c., to parishes which cannot get such things for themselves. It is very desirable that the Society should receive the patronage of the strong parishes, that it may be able to meet the requests of those that are weak.

The scholarships which were taken by the Sunday Schools of Massachusetts in the Mormon schools have been supported again this year by the Penny Collection offering.

The Children's Twenty Minute Society has, through its president, Miss Ellen Hodges, consented to work with us, and we are sure that our power for good will be much increased by the addition of this force.

Let us then take up the new year gladly, resolved to do with our might what our hands find to do for Him whom we must love with all our hearts and souls and minds.

INDIAN AND FREEDMEN'S DIVISION.

IT is with mingled feelings of regret and encouragement that we present our report for the past year; of regret, because we are obliged to announce the resignation of our able and devoted chairman, Mrs. HENRY B. MACKINTOSH. Mrs. Mackintosh became President of the Dakota League in 1875, and chairman of the League when, in 1877, it became a division of the Woman's Auxiliary. Her earnestness, wide knowledge and devotion to the work, are too well known to need any words of ours.

In thinking of the special interests and encouragements of the past year, we note first, the founding of the Grace H. Hamlen Scholarship in St. Mary's School, to be supported for five years by eager and loving friends, who rejoice thus to keep fresh the memory of one whose influence on the Indian work will never cease to be felt.

A Theological Scholarship in Bishop Hare's diocese, with an endowment of one thousand dollars, has been established by a member of Trinity Church, Boston. Very great success has been met with in raising funds for the Segur Colony, Indian Territory; this has been largely due to the efforts of our President, Mrs. Burnham.

Our receipts in money have been greater than in any year since our connection with the Auxiliary. The value of the boxes has also increased, especially in the work among the Freedmen. There is, too, a marked increase in the interest manifested, as shown from many of the letters received.

One or two suggestions and requests we would like to make:—that the value and lists of the contents of the boxes be *promptly* sent to the Secretary; also that each parish hold itself responsible for its proportion of freight charges when boxes are not sent directly by them.

We have already said, that the work for Freedmen has increased during the past year. There is still, however need for much greater effort, and the number of parishes interested is very small.

We wish that those who have thus far taken no part in the work might be induced to do so, for we are confident that their loss is greater than they realize, whilst the cause of the Master suffers from their neglect.

May our work for the coming year be more faithful, earnest and far-reaching than ever before.

FOREIGN DIVISION.

ON this our tenth anniversary it may be well to look back at what has been accomplished in this decade of work, if work that should be called which has seemed to us rather a pleasure and a privilege.

The objects proposed at the outset for the foreign department were the payment of insurance dues of clergymen in the mission field, the support of female missionaries, and the creating and sustaining of scholarships in schools for heathen children.

How far have these objects been carried out? We find that during the ten years the dues of four clergymen have been paid. For some time the salary of a teacher in one or other of the foreign fields was provided by one branch of the Auxiliary, but it was then thought better to give your principal offerings to special objects called for, viz. the purchase of land for a hospital in Japan, and a new mission station in Africa. Nine scholarships were maintained the first year, since when two have been permanently endowed, and you are now supporting thirty-five others, besides those which are included in the fund for the new African station. You are also paying the maintenance of two babies in the Chinese Orphanage. All these mean, as we hope, the training of young lives in the knowledge of God and in work for His kingdom.

Last autumn, moved by a strong appeal from Bishop Ferguson setting forth his pressing needs, we asked you to provide the fifteen hundred dollars required for a new station in his field. Meanwhile there had been placed in the hands of our Bishop, to be disposed of according to his judgment, the savings of a poor woman in one of our factory towns, amounting to eight hundred and thirty-five dollars, and bequeathed by her to foreign missions. His attention being drawn to the object for which we were working, he decided to appropriate that money for the Mission-House, making it a memorial of her, and thus enabling us to realize in one year the full amount required. Bishop Ferguson acknowledges gratefully the receipt of the same, and has already begun to build the Eliza F. Drury Memorial Station. He has appointed Mr. Dennis, a Liberian, as teacher, who is now on the spot superintending the work. Bishop Ferguson hopes by the help of a farm to make the mission self-supporting, and then to transfer the scholarship fund to a second station for which a New York Church has promised the salary of a teacher. Will it not be well for us to go on with the work and complete the second station?

The penny collection of last summer was devoted to a scholarship in this our new mission.

Much in the African work appeals strongly to our feelings at the present time, especially the position at Cape Mount of Mrs. Brierly, holding out so bravely and cheerfully at her lonely post. Dr. Perry, whose arrival eighteen months ago brought her great relief, has been obliged to return home broken down by African fever. How long she, herself, may be spared we cannot tell. Even now we are waiting with anxiety the result of an illness from which she was suffering when the last accounts were received. In this emergency a lady who had been formerly in Africa, Miss Merriam, offered to go out as her assistant. The offer was accepted, and she has probably already arrived at her destination. We must endeavor to hold up the hands of these brave workers as best we are able.

Most gratefully would we acknowledge the blessing that has accompanied our work thus far, feeling that its limitations have been to a great extent those of our own faith and zeal. What may we not hope to see accomplished in another ten years, if only faith and zeal be kindled to a warmer flame through the only source of inspiration, a deeper and more pervading sense of His love in Whose cause we labor.

MEXICAN AND HAITIEN DIVISION.

THE report of your committee on the work in Mexico will express, as it has year by year, both hope and fear for the future, both gratitude and regret for the past,—but the summing up of the changes and reorganization that have taken place will show you that there is more to be hoped than feared, more to cause gratitude than regret.

When our last report was presented to you, the Board of Missions had resolved to appoint a clergyman of our Church to superintend the work of the Mexican clergy. The Board of Managers could come to no conclusion as to their duty in carrying out this resolution till the spring. Through the winter the position of your committee was exceedingly painful and perplexing, until they took the final step of breaking their connection with the Mexican League. This step was taken after careful inquiry which led to the conviction that the League was unwilling to give its support to the only body of Church workers in Mexico which had recommended itself to your committee, and which had been declared, by the General Convention, as worthy of support. This separation from the League was published in the Churchman, but there was no formal severance of the committee from the League, for the reason that the Mexican Division has never been a branch of the Mexican League.

This action of your committee was followed by that of several other dioceses, and in March, at the request of Bishop Potter, a few clergy and laymen consented to act as an advisory committee, and also to receive and disburse contributions for the Church in Mexico. As soon as the money for his support was raised, the Rev. William Gordon, of Delaware, was appointed as supervisor of the work, and arrived in Mexico early in the summer. The result of this appointment has fulfilled the earnest hope that was in our hearts when last year closed. We knew that the great need of Mexico was a man who would sympathize with the workers, who would cheer their hearts, who would defend them from calumny, who would direct their zeal. All this Mr. Gordon has done. It is only necessary to read the letters of the missionaries to see how thoroughly they confide in him—and to read his letters to see how he values their work, and their characters, and how great he considers the opportunity which our Church has in that country. A leaflet just published contains extracts from his letters from June 9 to September 7, and his report came before the recent Missionary Council in Philadelphia. His opinion of the work may be summed up in these words, quoted from one of his letters :

“ If the good people of the United States could see the very, very great difference between the men, women and children under the care of our work, and those outside, I can’t believe they would let the work and the workers suffer as they do for the want of money.”

As to the support we have given, we can say with gratitude that we have been enabled by generous and prompt contributions last spring to send a sum much in advance of other years to Mexico, and with a very few other dioceses we have kept the work alive up to this point.

Now we have regular, authentic and favorable reports from the field; the missionaries have been thoroughly tried; more perhaps by criticism and

persecution from without, and from winnowing and sifting among themselves, than any missionaries of our Church. We have an energetic supervising clergyman, and we have an unprejudiced and honorable financial committee. It only remains for us to take hold of the work with liberality and system. A few scholarships in the boys' and girls' orphanages, a regular annual sum for salaries, and the work is assured. Let us beg you to take it up again this year with your old interest and generosity increased and made efficient by conscientious, systematic effort.

Our contributions for Haiti the past year have been less, as those for Mexico have been greater, than last year. This may be partly our fault, as the needs of Mexico have so pressed upon us that we have perhaps neglected to urge the cause of Haiti. Yet the missionaries there are in special need of encouragement. They have met with the loss of Mrs. Battiste, one of the early fellow workers of Mrs. Holly. And Miss Alice Baker is now left, by the death of her mother, with a family of little brothers and sisters to care for, as well as her school.

Our Christmas box goes to Haiti by the next steamer, and a little company of young girls is already at work upon a box for Alice Baker, that will be ready for Easter. You will I know continue your interest by keeping up the supply of boxes, but we wish that this year we might send some money as well, for the better support of the work.

And now, with this brief summary of the year's efforts, we leave the future of the work to you. While we are sure of earnest Christian workers in the field, and of faithful supporters at home, we need not fear, but will press on with hope and courage in the path that is so clear before us, knowing that a real consecration to God's service and trust in His promises will insure the final triumph.
