TO SECRETARIES AND TREASURERS.

The Parish Secretaries are asked to make as prompt an acknowledgment as possible of all communications received, giving each time her name and address.

In asking for the loan of letters, please give the date when they will be used, and return them immediately after this date, for use elsewhere.

When you have accepted an assignment, communicate at once with the missionary you have agreed to aid, keeping memorandum of his address, etc., for use when the box is ready to send.

Have the name of your parish on the outside of every barrel sent, as well as inside.

When the box is sent report the valuation, including freight, to the secretary or treasurer of the committee from whom the assignment was received.

In May the General Secretary sends to each parish a blank to be filled out with the names and addresses of the officers, number of members, and the money and boxes sent during the year. These should be returned by June 15, as the report has to be sent to Miss Emery before August first. If no work has been done, the blanks should be returned with the list of officers to the Secretary.

"The Apportionment" is the amount of money asked of each parish for the Board of Missions, to help meet its appropriations.

In addition, the Woman's Auxiliary is asked by the Board to raise \$100,000 toward woman's work under the appropriations. Of this the share of the Massachusetts Branch is \$5000. Pledges are made by the Massachusetts Branch for specified objects under appropriations, in making up this \$5,000.


Pledges made for work not included in the appropriations are "specials" and are not included, and do not apply on the \$100,000.

Money for general expenses should be sent to Mrs. Macomber.

Money for the United Offering should be sent to Mrs. Macomber.

Money for the work of the various committees should be sent to the treasurer of such committee.

Money sent direct to missionaries should be reported, and with the report should be sent a voucher for the amount—preferably a receipt from the missionary receiving the gift.

BY-LAWS.

I. There shall be a Public Anniversary of the Society in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or a sermon; upon which occasion a collection shall be taken up in behalf of the Society.

II. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Society upon the third Wednesday in October, unless otherwise duly notified, at such time and place as the Officers and Standing Committee shall indicate.

III. The election of Officers and of the Standing Committee shall take place at the Annual Meeting, and they shall continue in office one year, or until their successors shall have been appointed.

IV. In case of the vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled by nomination of the Standing Committee, which nomination shall be approved by the Society at a Stated Meeting; and any person so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting.

V. Ladies coöperating with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, will be considered members of the Society.

VI. Ladies appointed by the ministers, or by the benevolent organizations of Churches working with "The Woman's Auxiliary, etc.,," as delegates, shall be enrolled accordingly, and shall be the members entitled to vote at its meetings; Provided, that the number of such delegates from any church shall not exceed three for each division of the work undertaken by said church or any of its working Societies. The Officers and Standing Committee shall also be entitled to vote at its meetings.

VII. The Stated Meetings of the Society shall be on the third Wednesday of each month.

VIII. At Stated or Special meetings of the Society, twenty members entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum; but at the Annual Meeting, members representing not less than one-third of the Churches connected with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, or else not less than forty members entitled to vote, shall be necessary to form a quorum.

MASSACHUSETTS BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT.

THE past has been a memorable year for the Massachusetts Auxiliary. The General Convention has met within our borders, and we have had the privilege of entertaining the Woman's Auxiliary during its sessions; hearing and learning from those at the front the needs, the difficulties, and the opportunities which confront them; in which it is surely our bounden duty and should be our greatest pleasure to share.

Intercourse with Officers of the Auxiliary from all parts of the world, which the meetings at "Headquarters" made possible, brought us closer together and made us realize how small, and yet how real, a part we are of the vast army of women in the The King's Service.

We remember lovingly to-day the many members of the Auxiliary who have been called to higher service during the year that has gone. Among these we mention by name two only—women of our own Diocese—Deaconess Mary Douglas Burnham, founder of the Dakota League and second president of the Massachusetts Branch of the Auxiliary, a life-long friend of many of us, well known and beloved throughout the Church; and Mrs. Emily Appleton, whose exemplary life, loyal service, and generous gifts made possible many works of mercy and charity at home and abroad. We thank God for their good example. We pray that we may follow in their footsteps.

Early in the winter Mrs. Thayer, who has so faithfully, wisely and graciously presided over us for thirteen years, resigned her office; since which time we have been without a president. Happily we do not lose her, for she remains with us as Honorary Vice-President.

In the resignations of Mrs. Scudder and Mrs. Abbott the Board has lost two officers who, for more than twenty years, have served the Auxiliary faithfully, and whose presence and counsel we shall greatly miss. Though we lose them as officers we keep them as friends, and count on them as helpers, knowing their prayers for, and service in the work we all love, will never cease. As we part from these, we turn to welcome those who step into the vacant places, bringing with them hopefulness and enthusiasm. We bespeak for them the support of all parish officers, without which it is impossible to accomplish the work entrusted to them.

The growth of the Auxiliary and the increase of work caused thereby make it impossible for one Secretary to do all that is required. An

Assistant Secretary has therefore been appointed to relieve Miss Morgan, who has so long, faithfully and satisfactorily filled the office—working far beyond her strength yet never leaving work undone.

**South Eastern
District.**

THE Vice President in charge of the South Eastern District reports both gains and losses, in her District. Of the losses she says "Some of these are difficult to explain, as for example, in the parishes where there is great parochial activity and apparent prosperity yet no work for Missions."

In the manufacturing districts the long and costly strike made an appreciable difference in the reports from that section. In addition to the harder struggle to meet parish obligations, the women of these Churches felt it imperative to bend every energy to help their needy brothers and sisters.

On the other hand it is gratifying to note that four Branches that have appeared to be moribund have resumed work and are showing encouraging signs of a revival of interest, while one organized in 1904, without any record of work, has this year come into line and is in promising condition.

Finally there is the lonely parish where the active workers of the Branch number not more than one-third of the Membership List, and where from time to time these faithful two or three gather together in His Name, and do simply what they can. Who can tell the value of that work in His Sight?

**North Eastern
District.**

THE Vice President in charge of the North Eastern District reports few changes. One parish society was reorganized, but no new Branches were formed. Still, there has been progress as is shown by the increased offerings for Foreign Missions which seems to be a direct result of the growing knowledge of the work in distant lands. There have been large gains also in the number and value of boxes sent.

Perhaps not so much was given for Diocesan work as in previous years, but now that a Diocesan Missionary has been appointed to succeed Miss King, there is no doubt that the parishes in the District will contribute their share for her salary.

When each person sends in her offering annually for the United Offering it will be seen that the interest in this great thank-offering is growing. Many members of the Auxiliary in the North Eastern District have come to realize in a profounder way the needs of the work and its tremendous responsibilities and possibilities. Enthusiasm has been communicated bringing a deeper sense of personal responsibility for which we are devoutly thankful. So we have great hopes for the future, and trust that another year we may report new Branches formed and better results in the older societies.

We still need to learn the value of giving *in proportion to our ability*. Those of us who have little should realize that large sums come from the aggregation of small ones and gratefully give what we can, while those who are blessed with much should remember that of them much will be required.

**Domestic
Committee.**

THE record of money and boxes given to meet the pledges of the Domestic Committee shows that the Diocese is gaining not only in missionary zeal but in efficiency. The personal boxes sent into the Domestic field are a good gauge of sustained intelligent effort. When a Society undertakes to supply the listed needs of a missionary clergyman's family the result can be achieved only by the expenditure of time and work and money; for the same care and taste must be exercised in preparing a family box as goes into the buying and making of our own wardrobes. Thirty of these personal boxes have been sent by twenty-three parishes, a great gain over the previous year.

There are always some parish Branches wishing to work for a missionary family, yet protesting that it is impossible to make themselves responsible for everything needed. In such cases we try to divide the responsibility between two parish Branches and, if the split is adroitly made, the result is often two good boxes for one missionary, each with a valuation which a few years ago would have been considered a gratifying addition to the meagre salary of our mission priests.

May we not hope that those who have supplied partial needs this year will find their courage equal to undertaking the responsibility for one entire family? For timidity, rather than the lack of ability, must still rob our work of some of its legitimate achievements. Until our missionaries are paid adequate salaries personal boxes are necessary. They have, therefore, been considered in this report to the exclusion of other forms of activity.

We have met all our pledges.

A new Diocesan Missionary has been appointed. We ask for more general interest in her work.

**Dakota
League.**

THE Dakota League records with gratitude the fulfillment of all its pledges. This outcome seemed so impossible at the last meeting, that the Committee's discouragement was frankly voiced; a lack of faith repented of, when gifts sent later not only cleared us of our obligations but again enabled us to send the sum of \$50 to North Dakota.

We beg to call the attention of the parishes to the mention of North Dakota among our annual pledges hereafter, as well as to other slight changes in the List of Pledges, asking that this venture of faith may arouse them to renewed effort, so that next year we may be emboldened to add Sacramento to our list.

Our hearts have been stirred by the presence among us of that devoted and solitary worker in our farthest Alaskan mission—Dr. Driggs of Point Hope. Additional gifts to him should be mentioned.

The memorial to our former Chairman, Miss Lucy R. Woods, has been completed, and a beautiful font of dove-gray marble sent to the Cheyenne Reservation in South Dakota—a field especially appealing to her interest throughout her life.

The Consecration of a Bishop Coadjutor for South Dakota will give Bishop Hare much needed relief from many arduous labors.

The Chairman has had the privilege of attending the Indian Con-

vocation at Yankton Agency, and has also visited the Reservations at Oneida and White Earth. She has returned more than ever impressed with the good work done among these people, and is convinced that we may learn from them lessons of self-respect, generosity, faithfulness, and reverence in worship.

**Work Among
Colored People.**

THE work among the Colored People has been carried on through the year now ending on much the same lines as in previous years, and we are glad to report all our pledges met, and a generous supply of boxes sent. Taking into consideration the late start made in our work, and the unusual appeals made at the time of the Convention, this report is gratifying, and testifies to a decided growth in interest. We certainly work more intelligently and with better comprehension of the Auxiliary idea, that of being workers together.

Each year new parishes are entered on our list of helpers, so that we are gradually approaching the ideal state in which every parish in the Diocese shall join hands with all the rest, each doing according to its ability. Miss Wheeler still serves as our representative in the field. She is stationed at St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, where she finds varied opportunities for helpful ministrations.

Many children and young people have profited by our Scholarships the past year, and we are the more encouraged to continue help of this sort because of the very gratifying reports received of those who have been our beneficiaries. Our Christmas boxes have gladdened the hearts of over 3,000 children in South Virginia. Three good personal boxes were sent to missionaries, while the constant call for miscellaneous boxes for shop and school furnished plenty of employment for all who offered help.

At the last General Convention the Colored Commission was discontinued, the responsibility for work among the Colored People being assumed by the Board of Missions. That we may be an Auxiliary in the truest sense, we must be ready to make such changes in our plans as seem best for the whole work. In whatever way we are called upon for help in the coming year, may the parish officers see to it that there may be intelligent coöperation, disseminating of information and a constant watchfulness that every moment of time and every penny be put to the very best use.

**The Foreign
Committee.**

THE retirement of the Chairman, Mrs. Scudder, is a great loss to the Foreign Committee. That she herself had been in the field, made one feel that she could sympathize and understand, as no one but an actual worker could, the needs and hopes of those for whom she spoke.

All the year the work has felt the beneficial result of the Convention. Interest was aroused, people's hearts were opened, extra sums were given by individuals to the missionaries which, though not given through this Committee, are a blessing to the work.

The finances of the Committee are in excellent condition. The two chief pledges are the salary of Miss Woodruff, serving at Cape Mount,

Africa, and a portion of the salary of Miss Wall, in the Missionary District of Tokyo.

Last year ended with a deficit in both these pledges. This year not only have both these deficits been paid, and Miss Woodruff's salary in full, but our proportion of Miss Wall's salary was increased more than \$100.

Two pledges — the Helen R. Pearson Scholarship, and the "Loving Friends' Crib," have been discontinued. Is there not some parish or individual who will assume these? Two new pledges have been promised. The Church of Our Saviour, Longwood, becomes responsible for the insurance dues of the Rev. E. R. Woodman of the Tokyo District, and a member of Trinity Church, Boston, for those of the Rev. F. E. Lund of the Hankow District; and still another parish hopes to support a "Bible Woman in the Shanghai District."

**Mexico, Hayti
and Brazil.**

DURING the year Mrs. Abbott resigned from her position. Entirely due to her faithful and persistent efforts, the Massachusetts Branch of the Auxiliary has become one of the staunchest and most beneficent friends of the mission in Mexico, and the Church workers in that field will miss her services as truly as will her co-workers in this Diocese.

In the consecration of the Rev. Henry Aves, and in raising Mexico to a Missionary District with an appropriation for its work from the Board of Missions, lies the greatest hope for larger results and a riper harvest in that field. But as the Board makes no appropriation for the Hooker or the Dean Gray Schools, or for the support of the native Mexican clergy, we must make earnest effort to help them by special contributions. We have done this so generously in the past that they have come to depend upon our aid.

The Hooker School is in need of repair and of funds for the general support of its teachers and scholars.

The great progress of the Church in Brazil is sufficient proof of its need in that country, and the effort of its members to help themselves is a stimulating influence to those of us at home, who are better able than they to give of our means. Shall we not see to it that our offerings grow in proportion to the needs there.

Bishop Holly appeals for money with which to build small churches in Hayti, in the districts already occupied by his missionaries, and for the support of young men desirous to enter the ministry, but who have not sufficient means to meet the expenses of attending the Theological School.

The mission work in Cuba has now come under the care of this Committee, and for its many needs we ask assistance. We regret that the pledges have not been entirely met, but there is great encouragement in the fact that fifty-eight parishes have contributed this year, being nearly three times as many as have coöperated with us in the past two years.

Altar Society.

THE Altar Society has sent gifts valued at \$706.98, including freight, to 27 Dioceses.

Church
Periodical Club.

THE Church Periodical Club continues its work with comparatively few changes, but with a steady increase of good accomplished.

Every year more letters of honest appreciation are received, every year new letters of enquiry from possible contributors and, we hope, future officers.

There are many needs as new fields of work open before us, but the one which it would be well to emphasize at this time, is the want of *new* books,—not necessarily fresh from the store, but up-to-date and authoritative. If even a few of our generous friends, and we have many, would offer one, two or three books a year, to be chosen by those who are to receive them, much good could be done and almost endless pleasure given. The correspondence necessary for these gifts could be carried on by the donor, or by the Parish Librarian, as preferred. As one of our friends wrote last winter: “*What* an opportunity the Church Periodical Club has.”

The Treasurers’ reports show a steady gain in parish contributions. This is the test of our strength. Individual gifts fluctuate. We seem to be still wedded to specials, for our reports show almost three times as much given to these as to the work under the appropriation of the Board of Missions.

Will not the parish officers endeavor during the coming year, to send such a proportion of their gifts for the schools, hospitals and salaries, which come “under appropriation,” as will enable us to give our fair share (\$5,000) of the amount asked of the Woman’s Auxiliary towards the support of the woman’s work for which the Board of Missions is pledged.

The reports given and suggestions made all point to one necessary thing if we are to do the work entrusted to us. We must *know* about it—not in a superficial way, but *really* know. Few of us are able to meet the missionaries face to face. Comparatively few are able to attend the great meetings where they tell the story, but all of us may read the *Spirit of Missions*, *The Young Christian Soldier* and the books prepared for the Mission Study Classes, and why is it not possible to organize a study class in every parish? In this way only can we obtain the knowledge which will make us *intelligent* workers.

We desire to call especial attention to the report of the Secretary. We need to study the statistics there given, in order that we may have a better understanding of the situation in this Diocese at the present moment.

The record of the year’s work has now been given so far as it can be told. Of the things *undone* we may not speak, but resolving that in the year to come there shall be fewer of these, and giving thanks for what we have been permitted to do for His sake and in His name, let us go forward with courage.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

DURING the past year nine Committee and nine Monthly meetings have been held. Also the Quiet Day and the eighth Conference of the Parochial Officers. The usual Anniversary meeting was omitted on account of the General Convention, but the Annual meeting was held on Oct. 19. Service in Trinity Church at 10 A.M. Bishop Rowe preached the sermon and celebrated the Holy Communion, assisted by Dr. Blanchard, Mr. Fitz and Mr. Mosher.

At the Missionary meeting in Jordan Hall, at 2.30 P.M., one hundred and ninety-eight delegates were present, representing sixty-six parishes. After the reading of the annual reports and the nomination of officers for the coming year, addresses were made by Mrs. Van Buren, of Porto Rico; Dr. Hayden, Raleigh, N. C.; Mrs. Graves, Shanghai; Mrs. Aseu, Honolulu; Miss Suthon, Japan; Deaconess Dorsey, California.

The Quiet Day services were held in the Chapel of Emmanuel Church, Thursday, Jan. 12, and were conducted by Bishop Jaggard.

The eighth Conference of Parochial Officers was held in Chipman Hall, Boston, March 28. Seventy-eight parishes were represented by one hundred and sixty-three delegates. The subject for the Conference was: "Our Missionary Obligations." An address was given by Dr. Lloyd.

The average attendance at the Monthly meetings was one hundred and twenty-two delegates from fifty parishes. Nineteen parishes were present at every meeting, namely: St. John's, Arlington; Advent, Emmanuel, St. Paul's, St. Stephen's and Trinity, Boston; All Saints', Dorchester; St. James', Roxbury; Emmanuel, West Roxbury; St. Paul's, Brookline; Christ, St. James', St. John's, St. Peter's and St. Philip's, Cambridge; St. Paul's, Dedham; St. Stephen's, Lynn; Trinity, Newton Centre, and St. Chrysostom, Wollaston. St. James', Cambridge, as last year, sent the largest number of delegates for the year, — sixty-one in all, and also the largest at one meeting, — eleven. There were ten speakers at the Monthly meetings, — Bishop Roots, Bishop Restarick, Bishop Lawrence, Archdeacon Babcock, Rev. F. W. Merrill, Rev. A. H. Backus, Miss Ward, Miss Emberly, Miss Wheeler, Rev. Robb White, and Rev. A. Mann, D.D.



REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1904-5.

THE year just past has been one of increased encouragement and activity in the Junior Department of the Woman's Auxiliary in Massachusetts. It would have been strange indeed if this had not been the case after the impetus that was given to the work all along the line as a result of the inspiring meetings of the General Convention, but it is none the less gratifying to feel the awakening interest on all sides and to realize that it is taking permanent shape in the formation of new branches and study classes among the Juniors. Ten new branches have been organized, making a total of fifty-eight in the diocese, and perhaps the most promising feature of the department is, that in nearly every branch some systematic attempt at Missionary education is being made. A constantly increasing appreciation of the need for united effort along this line has resulted in the formation of Normal classes, to which reference will be made later; but, in passing, it may not come amiss to add that this interest is but part of a wide-spread realization, all over the United States, of the necessity for more systematic and carefully planned educational methods in our Missionary work. It is perhaps at this point that the Junior Department can come into closest touch with the Woman's Auxiliary, and it would surely add largely to the sympathy between them if both Seniors and Juniors in a parish could study the same subjects, year by year, occasionally uniting in a general meeting.

It is satisfactory to be able to report that our pledges for the year have been met in full; and that the amount of our apportionment for General Missions was also paid, with a surplus. In this connection, it has been of the greatest advantage to us for the past two years to have such representatives of the Board as Miss Emery and Dr. Lloyd at our Annual meetings. After their clear and appealing statements, it would be odd indeed if we did not feel that our first duty, as members of the Junior Department, is to the Woman's Auxiliary and the Board of Missions, and that our individual Missionary interests must, if we are loyal, come second.

Again we have regretfully to report the resignation of a Secretary; Miss Sheffield's duties along other lines having made it impossible for her to continue her work in the Auxiliary. In her place the Board has elected Miss Elise Dexter of Brookline, who will take up her work in October.

The usual Junior officers' meetings were held during the year, those in November and February being in the parish-rooms of St. Paul's Church, and the Spring conference at the Diocesan House in April. At the conference the special subject under discussion was the advisability of planning for a regular Mission-Study campaign among the Juniors, starting from sectional Normal classes of leaders, to be held early in the year. It was decided to make the attempt; and, with the approval of the Bishop, the Auxiliary Board authorized Miss Sturgis to appoint two district-secretaries, to have general supervision of the Junior branches in the Northern and Southern sections of the diocese and to conduct Normal classes; a third class being arranged for at the same time, for the Central section in Boston. For the Southern district, Miss Mary E. Brayton of Fall River was appointed; and, in July, attended the educational conference at Silver Bay, for the purpose of studying into the best methods of conducting Normal Missionary-Study classes. Up to this time no one has been secured for the Northern district, but if possible a leader will be found before November. The Boston class will be held at the Diocesan House. Notices of these various classes will be sent to all the Junior officers as soon as the arrangements are definitely completed.

The Eighth Annual Meeting was held in Emmanuel Chapel, Boston, on Saturday, May 13th, and about 350 children were present: the largest number we have ever had. Short reports were read by 36 branch secretaries; the time consumed, owing to the Bishop's skilful management, being only fifty minutes; and the subject matter in nearly every case being interesting: the description of a successful meeting, an interesting course of study, an entertaining lantern talk, etc. Bishop Lawrence presided, and opened the meeting with a short address, after which Dr. Lloyd invited the Juniors to a personally conducted tour through the Church Missions House in New York, and let them into some of the secrets of what the Church's Missionary work stands for. The exhibit, held in connection with the meeting, again proved its value by showing what successful work can be done by our Juniors, especially in an educational way. It is to be regretted that comparatively so few branches have as yet contributed to these exhibits; and it may not be out of place here, to suggest that if each leader would bear it in mind during the winter and set aside, for this purpose, any especially creditable production of her branch, the exhibits would be far more valuable than they have yet been. Last May only eleven branches contributed out of thirty-eight represented in the meeting.

It may be of interest to the branch officers to know that the Junior lantern-slides at the Diocesan House will in future be more readily obtainable than in the past. At first the demand in the diocese was comparatively small; and they were consequently borrowed in other places. Last winter their journeyings took them all over the country; west to Los Angeles and north and south from Maine to Georgia. The demand within the diocese also increased, and it was so often the case that when wanted at home, the slides were in some distant part of the country, that the Committee has finally felt obliged to

limit their travels, and they will in future remain strictly in New England and may be confidently called for, when wanted, by an appeal to Miss Margaret Bush, 1 Joy Street, Boston. A Missionary Library is now being arranged in the Auxiliary Room at the Diocesan House, which will be available the first of the year, and may be of great value to Junior officers if systematically used.

New opportunities are opening to us as the year closes. In each branch, as well as in the diocese, the work must go forward and the interest widen if we are to keep pace with the increasing demands from the Field. As we look back over the past year with gratitude for the inspiration and success which has been granted to us, and lay our plans for the future with renewed enthusiasm, let us remember that only as we work in the spirit of true devotion will our success be assured and our service acceptable to our Master; and let us pray that with renewed faithfulness and consecration, the Junior Auxiliary in Massachusetts may be permitted "to serve and please Him, to the honor and glory of His Name."
