

## BY-LAWS.

---

I. There shall be a Public Anniversary of the Society in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or a sermon; upon which occasion a collection shall be taken up in behalf of the Society.

II. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Society upon the third Wednesday in October, unless otherwise duly notified, at such time and place as the Officers and Standing Committee shall indicate.

III. The election of Officers and of the Standing Committee shall take place at the Annual Meeting, and they shall continue in office one year, or until their successors shall have been appointed.

IV. In case of the vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled by nomination of the Standing Committee, which nomination shall be approved by the Society at a Stated Meeting; and any person so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting.

V. Ladies coöperating with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, will be considered members of the Society.

VI. Ladies appointed by the ministers, or by the benevolent organizations of Churches working with "The Woman's Auxiliary, etc.,," as delegates, shall be enrolled accordingly, and shall be the members entitled to vote at its meetings; Provided, that the number of such delegates from any church shall not exceed three for each division of the work undertaken by said church or any of its working Societies. The Officers and Standing Committee shall also be entitled to vote at its meetings.

VII. The Stated Meetings of the Society shall be on the third Wednesday of each month.

VIII. At Stated or Special meetings of the Society, twenty members entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum; but at the Annual Meeting, members representing not less than one-third of the Churches connected with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, or else not less than forty members entitled to vote, shall be necessary to form a quorum.

### TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT.

YOUR Committee reports with gratitude, encouraging progress in all departments. More parishes are working with us; enthusiasm, and a more intelligent understanding of the needs in the various fields, and of our duty to them, are shown by the gifts for Missions which are larger than for many years.

In view of the increased interest in Missionary literature and the systematic study of Missions, the Board decided at its April meeting to authorize the appointment of an Educational Secretary, whose duty it will be to familiarize herself, as far as possible, with the conditions in the field and with the literature available for the study of Missions; also to organize Study Classes and to conduct a normal class for the training of Teachers. Unfortunately it has not yet been possible to secure the right person for the position; but in order that it may not remain vacant, Miss Sturgis has consented to serve temporarily, in so far as her work with the Juniors will allow. She will conduct a normal class for the leaders of Study Classes, beginning Oct. 27th, and continuing weekly for eight weeks, at the Diocesan House.

The Missionary reference library in the Auxiliary room at the Diocesan House, with its almost complete file of the "Spirit of Missions," and other books upon missionary subjects, will be of value to those who are preparing papers for meetings or "study classes," and may be freely consulted.

The pledges in all departments have been met; details concerning them, as well as all statistics, will be found in the reports of the Secretary and of the Department Treasurers.

Only \$4,075 of the \$5,000 requested for work "under appropriation" was given; but the large increase over previous gifts for this purpose and the growing sense of responsibility in the parishes, arouse the hope that eventually we shall contribute our full share of the \$100,000 for the Women's Work under the appropriations of the Board of Missions.

In the two Districts the work has gone steadily on under the leadership of the Vice-Presidents. In some places excellent results are reported, in others the record is disappointing, but on the whole the outlook in both Districts is encouraging. The meeting held in the

Church of the Ascension, Fall River, brought together the clergymen and representatives from nearly all the parishes in the South Eastern District. Greater value than is sometimes realized attaches to these meetings; for strengthened by the services, inspired by the addresses, cheered by the intercourse with many people interested in the same great work but approaching it from different standpoints, the parish representatives return to their homes with fresh courage and wider outlook. In the North Eastern District a new parish branch has been organized.

The Domestic Committee has had the privilege of sending to St. Matthew's Hospital, Fairbanks, Alaska, five perfectly equipped beds in memory of

All these are beloved and honored names in our own diocese and beyond its limits.

The distress in San Francisco caused by earthquake and fire called out sympathy and gifts from many persons not usually contributing to our work.

Our Missionary in this Diocese has been faithful and efficient. Confidence in the good she accomplishes is growing, as is shown by the larger number of parishes responding to the appeal for her salary.

The Dakota League has continued its usual ministrations. Such heroism as is displayed by many of our Missionaries, and the visible blessing which rests upon their labors, should draw out deeper sympathy and larger gifts for their work. Many people have heard from the Chairman the account of her visit to Indian Reservations. Is it too much to hope that the interest and enthusiasm thus aroused may bear fruit in more generous and intelligent support for this branch of our Missionary work?

In her recent visit to Raleigh, Lawrenceville and other places where the Missions for Colored People are successfully carried on, the Chairman for work among the Colored People of the South took hope and courage to the workers, and received from them such inspiration as will enable her to bring fresh interest to the parish societies she may visit. For the first time (and this is a step in a forward direction) pledges have been made in this department for work under appropriation of the Board of Missions. The organization of the American Church Institute for Negroes will put all the work for the colored people at the South on a firmer basis and should win the support of those who have failed, heretofore, to respond to appeals on their behalf.

The missionaries who have visited us have brought us inspiring news from the Foreign Stations. We have been told of wonderful opportunities now opening before the Church; of how the people plead for

teachers, churches, schools and hospitals, and of how all their efforts have been abundantly blessed. There is much they do not tell us. We do not hear from them of their self-denying labors, their real heroism or the hardships many of them endure because we, at home, fail to realize our responsibility for these conditions. Many have gone to the front from this Diocese. Are there no more women ready to offer for such a blessed service? And should we not aim to support at least one representative in each Foreign Missionary jurisdiction? The schools need more generous help, and if we can remember that these supply the native workers we shall not be behind in our gifts and prayers for them. The Hospitals also should receive a larger share of our benefactions; not only because of the relief given to suffering bodies, but because through their ministrations many souls are won.

The work under the charge of the Mexican Committee was never in more hopeful condition. Since the Synod of the Mexican Church disbanded and Mexico became a Mission of the American Church, the devoted band of Native Clergymen are able to go forward with confidence that their work will be sustained, and the Church at home must see to it that larger gifts are made to enable the Board of Missions to meet the appropriations for work in Mexico. The Hooker and Dean Grey schools continue their good work, and with larger funds at their disposal could double the number of students.

In Brazil and Cuba wonderful success has crowned the labors of the Missionaries, and the urgent desire of the people for the ministrations of the Church is proof of their need. The usual help has been sent to Haiti.

To the Altar Society we owe most grateful thanks. The value of its work cannot be estimated in dollars. Who can tell the number of those who have been won to the Church, through the beauty and fitness of the services, made possible by its gifts to Church or Chapel.

Will not Churchwomen, especially those unable to engage in other forms of missionary service, consider seriously the claims of this Society—for more helpers are urgently needed?

The Correspondent in Massachusetts for the Church Periodical Club is very successful in holding the interest in this useful society. Thirty-seven Branches are now working with her—but she wishes everybody could realize the good and the cheer that may be carried into numberless households with little cost of time or money, just a thought for others—a willingness to share our intellectual good things with those who are unable, but for our sympathetic generosity, to obtain them. Will not each *individual* into whose hands this report may come, send a ray of sunshine into some home? The Correspondent for Massachusetts can tell you how.

This is the last year for the collection of the United Offering for 1907, all of which should be in the hands of the Treasurer by Sept. 1st. We would urge renewed effort, that this great Thankoffering may be more worthy. The Treasurer reports a larger amount than ever before at the end of the second year. She reports also a gain of greater value—the assurance that the feeling of privilege, in thus becoming co-workers with the devoted women in the field, is growing.

A careful study of the reports and tables will show that the necessary expenses are not met by the contributions for this purpose, and the parish branches are asked to give the subject serious consideration. Every parish in the Diocese receives the reports, leaflets and notices issued by the Auxiliary, and should willingly share in the expense of distributing them. If the stronger parishes will give more help in this direction, and individual members will show their interest by special contributions, there need be no anxiety as to our ability to meet our expenses. There is another matter to which your Committee would draw your attention. Personal appeals and the response given them, is a question of real importance. Individuals and parish societies are asked to give to these only after thorough investigation; because though the person asking may be zealous it does not follow that he is always wise, and many appeals are made without proper endorsement. If individuals as well as parishes will report such gifts to the respective committees it will be of real advantage to the work. It will enable us to know what Missions are receiving aid, and it encourages us to be sure that worthy appeals are being answered.

The names of givers are never reported, so none need fear that the warning "let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth" is being disregarded.

We are commanded to let our light shine. May we all keep steadily in mind our Lord's words, "Neither do men light a candle and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house."

"Let *your* light so shine before men that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in Heaven."

## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

---

NINE Committee and nine Monthly Meetings have been held during the year, also the Twenty-Eighth Anniversary, the Quiet Day, the Ninth Conference for Parochial Officers, and a Conference in Fall River held by the Vice-President of the South-Eastern District.

The average attendance at the Monthly Meetings was one hundred and twenty-one delegates from fifty-two parishes. Sixteen parishes were represented at every meeting, namely: Church of the Advent, Emmanuel, Good Shepherd, St. Paul's, St. Stephen's and Trinity, Boston; Holy Spirit, Mattapan; St. James', Roxbury; St. Mary's, Dorchester; Church of Our Saviour and St. Paul's, Brookline; Christ Church, St. James', St. John's and St. Philip's, Cambridge; St. Chrysostom, Wollaston. Trinity Church, Boston, sent the largest number of delegates for the year, 76, and also the largest number at any meeting, 24.

There were eighteen speakers at these meetings: Mrs. Goodman, W. Texas; Miss Wheeler, Va.; Rev. Robb White, Va.; Dr. Mann, Boston; Bishop Van Buren, Porto Rico; Miss Hyashi, Japan; Rev. T. S. Tyng, Japan; Mrs. Worden, Diocesan Missionary; Bishop Mann, N. Dakota; Rev. F. W. Neve, Va.; Miss Bush, Altar Society; Rev. J. G. Meem, Brazil; Rev. J. A. Wellbourn, Japan; Miss J. C. Emery, New York; Archdeacon Appleby, Minn.; Miss Ward, C. P. C.; and Miss Wall, Japan.

The Twenty-Eighth Anniversary was held in Trinity Church, Boston, Thursday, November second, the first Wednesday of the month, being All Saints' Day. The Bishop of the Diocese celebrated the Holy Communion, assisted by the Rev. H. St. G. Tucker and the Rev. F. E. Lund. At the session in the Chapel the roll was called, two hundred and nineteen delegates responding for sixty-four parishes. The speakers were Miss J. C. Emery, and Miss Chung of Honolulu. At the Missionary Meeting in the Church at three o'clock, the speakers were the Rev. H. St. G. Tucker, and the Rev. F. E. Lund.

The Quiet Day services were held in St. Stephen's Church, Boston, Thursday, January eleventh, and were conducted by the Rev. J. McG. Foster.

The Ninth Conference for Parochial Officers was held in Trinity Chapel, March fifteenth. There were present one hundred and sixteen officers from fifty-eight parishes. The subject for discussion was: "How to interest people in Missions."

## REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1905-6.

---

THE report of the Junior Auxiliary for 1905-6 is one of gradual gain; in the number of branches, in increased gifts, and in systematic study. Four new branches have been formed; a new scholarship has been undertaken in St. Agnes School, Kyoto, Japan; and the number of branches reporting regular study during the winter has been very encouraging. This last fact must, however, be qualified by the statement that we are still very far from reaching a satisfactory position in the educational side of our work in Massachusetts. If we were to judge by the reports which were sent in in the Spring from the branches, it would appear that only twenty-two branches out of sixty were systematically studying missions. Fortunately, this poor showing is due largely to the failure of the officers to report; only thirty-one reports having been sent in; but the fact remains that though we have made a satisfactory beginning along this most important line, there is still very much to be done; and it behooves us, as we close our report for the year that is past, to face the future with renewed energy and determination to make the educational campaign of the Junior Auxiliary in Massachusetts thorough and systematic.

Two normal classes for leaders were held in November and December, one at the Diocesan House, Boston, by Miss Sturgis; the other at Fall River by Miss Brayton. Japan was the subject studied, and fifteen study-classes resulted in as many branches. Similar normal classes will be held during the coming winter, due notice being sent to the branch leaders in advance.

As usual, conferences of Junior leaders were held in St. Paul's Parish House, in November and February; and an extra conference was called in April at the Diocesan House, to consider the question of the Christmas boxes.

The Annual Meeting was held at the Trinity Parish House on the second Saturday in May, the attendance being larger than ever before, although only thirty-three branches were represented. Archdeacon Babcock presided and made a short opening address, and Dr. Mann gave the Juniors a cordial welcome to Trinity Parish, and promised that by another May a Trinity branch should be numbered among them. Instead of the usual short reports being read by the branch secretaries, these were handed to Miss Sturgis during the calling of the Roll; and twelve branches brought reports from the Mission Field, as follows:—

These reports have been type-written and bound in a scrap-book, which is to be sent early in the year from branch to branch among those who gave the reports, to be illustrated by them, and afterwards placed at the Diocesan House; from which place it may be loaned upon application to Miss Margaret Bush.

One more encouraging fact must be mentioned here. From a number of branches has come the report of successful work accomplished in the way of obtaining subscriptions to the "Spirit of Missions." No better work can be done by the Juniors, and it is to be hoped that this is but the beginning which will lead to constantly increased activity along this line.

And now, once again, as we review the work that is done and look forward to that which is before us to do, let us stop to remember the reason for it all;—not that barrels may be sent;—not that mite-boxes may be filled;—not even that our Juniors may learn of the Church's Missionaries and their work;—though all of these things are part of it;—but beyond these things, that the children of the Church may learn, through their training in the Junior Department, that the natural outcome of their loyalty to their Lord and His Church is the active interest they take in the way that Church is seeking to carry out the King's desire, that His kingdom may come to the whole world; and that their hearts may be set upon having as large a share in this work as is possible, all through their lives.
