## BY-LAWS.

---

I. There shall be a Public Anniversary of the Society in the Autumn of each year, with missionary addresses or a sermon; upon which occasion a collection shall be taken up in behalf of the Society.

II. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Society upon the third Wednesday in October, unless otherwise duly notified, at such time and place as the Officers and Standing Committee shall indicate.

III. The election of Officers and of the Standing Committee shall take place at the Annual Meeting, and they shall continue in office one year, or until their successors shall have been appointed.

IV. In case of the vacancy of any office by the death or removal of its occupant, the same may be filled by nomination of the Standing Committee, which nomination shall be approved by the Society at a Stated Meeting; and any person so elected shall continue in office until the next Annual Meeting.

V. Ladies coöperating with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, will be considered members of the Society.

VI. Ladies appointed by the ministers, or by the benevolent organizations of Churches working with "The Woman's Auxiliary, etc., etc.", as delegates, shall be enrolled accordingly, and shall be the members entitled to vote at its meetings; Provided, that the number of such delegates from any church shall not exceed three for each division of the work undertaken by said church or any of its working Societies. The Officers and Standing Committee shall also be entitled to vote at its meetings.

VII. The Stated Meetings of the Society shall be on the third Wednesday of each month.

VIII. At Stated or Special meetings of the Society, twenty members entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum; but at the Annual Meeting, members representing not less than one-third of the Churches connected with the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, or else not less than forty members entitled to vote, shall be necessary to form a quorum.

## MASSACHUSETTS BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY. THIRTIETH ANNUAL REPORT.

As we review the work of the year and realize how many are the opportunities which have been given us for enlightenment upon all our Missionary undertakings, and our privilege in hearing from their own lips the experiences of our Missionaries, our hearts are filled with gratitude that we have been permitted to share in their labors, and with regret that we have not been more faithful in furthering them.

The presence of Deaconess Clara M. Carter was a benediction. As we looked into her face we knew that God had blessed her with power to do His work, and that peace and joy in it are her great reward.

Death has taken from us many members of the Auxiliary. It is not possible to name them all here, but their names are written in the hearts and lives of those with whom and for whom they labored.

One of these, Mrs. Edward R. Cogswell, left a gift to be used by each committee for some special need in the mission field.

This is the first legacy received by us since that of Mrs. Page in 1895.

It is with deep regret that we record the loss from our Committee of Mrs. Jos. W. Woods, Mrs. James M. Hubbard, Miss Mary Hoague, and Mrs. Philip Dalton. Mrs. Woods has held the office of Treasurer of the Domestic Committee for more than twenty-eight years. From the beginning she made the Missionaries, who were strangers in Boston, welcome to her home, and she is known and beloved by many in all parts of the land. Throughout her life it has been her blessed privilege to smooth the rough places, and she has cheered and encouraged us in all our anxieties and perplexities. For twenty-one years the Dakota League has had in Mrs. Hubbard a Secretary whose devotion to the Indians has been recognized by all the agencies for work among these people. During her service the Dakota League has prospered. Her sympathy is wide, and she has shown us how true it is that "The Field is the World."

Miss Hoague's marriage and removal to another Diocese compelled her resignation, and Mrs. Dalton's retirement leaves the Mexican Committee bereaved indeed.

We lose in them wise councillors, but we keep our friends. We ask you, the Officers and Members of Parish Branches, to welcome their

successors, to remember how arduous are their duties and how greatly they will need your support and encouragement, and we beg you to give them both in unstinted measure.

After nearly 40 years of continuous service for the Dakota League, Miss Caryl retires from active work, but remains an honorary member of that committee, and as such will still guide us by her wisdom and encourage us by her loving interest.

The Educational Secretary conducted two classes for the Study of Missions. The Normal Class was confined to those who agreed to teach Missions in their own parishes or elsewhere. The general class was open to all members of the Woman's Auxiliary, and was of great value to those who availed themselves of the privilege of attending it. Miss Houghton also conducted a Normal class in Cambridge for the students at Radcliffe.

Interesting district meetings were held in St. Stephen's church, Lynn, and St. Thomas' church, Taunton. On both occasions the Auxiliary was hospitably entertained by the ladies of the parish.

The Committees report good work done, though the apparent lack of interest in many parishes is deplored. The officers stand ready, and are glad of the opportunity to speak at parish meetings or to advise with individuals by correspondence or otherwise. Never have there been greater opportunities, never greater need for consecrated services.

The pledges for the year have been met, but the falling off in the number and value of boxes is disquieting, and your Committee asks the parish officers to give this matter serious consideration. There is also a decrease in the report of money given as compared with the report of 1906.

During that year several large personal gifts were made. The money for the memorial beds and relief work in California and Alaska (all of them being *specials*) made the money report for 1906 larger than could again be expected. In gifts for general work and other pledges, there has been no falling off. The Dakota League in both departments, the Foreign and Diocesan Committees report gains over last year. The Domestic and Mexican Committees, a gain over 1905, which was a normal year.

The Chairman in charge of the work for Colored People reports 80 parishes contributing to work in her department.

All the Committees ask for a deeper interest and more generous support.

We desire to again call the attention of all the members of the Auxiliary, and especially to the parish officers, who so largely direct the giving in the parishes, to the responsibility devolving upon them, to support the work under appropriation of the Board of Missions. After consultation with the Missionary Bishops, and due consideration of the whole field, the Board of Missions makes appropriations for the most important needs in its various Missionary districts, and for these asks the generous support of Churchmen and Churchwomen. Manifestly it is our duty to see that first of all those Missions and Institutions under appropriation are cared for.

"Specials" are generally interesting and often necessary, but should not be the first consideration of loyal Churchwomen, and can never be the test of our faithfulness.

It is impossible for us to judge the relative merits of special appeals, therefore the only safe way for us as an Auxiliary Society, is to conform to the rule of the Board of Missions, and to give only to such objects as are endorsed by it.

The Altar Society has gone on in its quiet helpfulness. Some of us little realize the loving service which this Society renders,—a help which no statistics and no money value can express.

The Church Periodical Club has gone on with leaps and bounds. More than 40 Branches have been organized by Miss Ward in eight years. This is certainly a most encouraging record. The C. P. C. is now so widely known that the Clergymen and Missionaries naturally turn to it for the books they so greatly need. Inspiration and strength come from united work. May we all join hands in strengthening the Church Periodical Club.

The statistics given by the Secretary and Treasurers should be carefully studied that we may see where we have failed as well as where we have in a measure succeeded in furthering the work committed to us.

This is the 30th Report of the Mass. Branch of the Auxiliary. During these 30 years (and including the United Offering of 1907) over \$375,000 have been contributed, and boxes valued at \$359,221 sent. A total of more than \$734,221.

As we look back over these 30 years and see how we have grown in numbers, we ask ourselves if we have also grown in zeal and knowledge and faithfulness. These far more important things cannot be recorded or valued in dollars.

Not all of the parishes are helping in this great cause. Is there any reason why, in this Diocese of Massachusetts, every parish and mission should not be working with us, praying with us for the coming of the Kingdom, and praying for us that we, who are their representatives, may have right judgment in directing the work?

Is it not a sign that we do not sufficiently appreciate the necessity for personal consecration when the one day in the year set apart for united prayer and instruction—the "Quiet Day" in the Epiphany season—is attended by so few that they may be easily counted?

Is it not a reflection upon our devotion when year after year the earnest call for more workers falls upon deaf ears?

If the consciousness of our duty and privilege is always with us, and if by our life we testify to the faith that is in us, shall we not win for the work those who are able to carry the glad tidings into the dark places of the earth?

As we look forward to the future there are many hopeful signs.

When the Auxiliary in this Diocese was organized there were no Mission Study Classes, no Junior Auxiliaries, no S. S. Auxiliaries, very few missionary leaflets or publications, and the "Spirit of Missions" was little known and little read.

In the Mission Study Class is the hope of the future. When our Christian Women *understand*, they will serve.

It should be our earnest endeavor to persuade the Rector of every parish to establish a class for the study of Missions, and if they could be persuaded to conduct the classes, the perplexing question of how the "apportionment" can be met and the Churches' Missions provided for, would be solved.

With the Sunday School Auxiliary actively interested—the Junior Auxiliary growing in grace—and our own Auxiliary Members realizing our duties, our privileges, our blessings, and faithfully giving ourselves in consecrated service, what can hinder us? "For the Lord is King forever and ever."

## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

---

THE Diocesan Branch has held its usual meetings during the past year,—nine Committee and nine Monthly Meetings, the Twenty-ninth Anniversary, the Quiet Day, and the Tenth Conference for Parochial Officers. Also Conferences in both the North and South-eastern Districts.

The average attendance was 129 delegates from 56 parishes, a slight gain over last year.

Eighteen parishes were represented at every meeting, namely: St. John's, Arlington; St. James', Roxbury; St. Paul's, St. Stephen's and Trinity, Boston; All Saints, Church of Our Saviour, and St. Paul's, Brookline; Christ Church, St. James', and St. John's, Cambridge; St. Paul's, Malden; Messiah, Auburndale; St. Mary's, Newton Lower Falls; St. Paul's, Newton Highlands; Trinity, Newton Centre, and St. Chrysostom, Wollaston. St. Stephen's Church, Boston, sending the largest number of delegates for the year, 56.

There were 15 speakers at these meetings: Rev. G. A. McGuire, Arkansas; Miss Ward, C. P. C.; Archdeacon Hughson, Asheville; Deaconess White, Oklahoma; Dr. Street, Kyoto; Deaconess Carter, Alaska; Bishop Johnson, So. Dakota; Mr. Camp, Seabury Society, N. Y.; Dr. Hayden, Raleigh; Miss Wheeler, Raleigh; Rev. W. C. Clapp, Bontoc, P. I.; Rev. Primus P. Alston, N. C.; Mr. Knapp, Alaska; Mr. Thurber, New Hampshire; Rev. A. W. Cooke, Japan.

The Twenty-ninth Anniversary was held in Trinity Church, Boston, November 7th. The Bishop of the Diocese celebrated the Holy Communion and preached the sermon. At the session in the Chapel, 68 parishes were represented by 187 delegates. The speaker was Miss Richmond of China. At the Missionary Meeting in the Church at three o'clock, the speakers were, Bishop Knight of Cuba, and the Rev. Hugh Burleson, Sec. pro tem, New York.

The Quiet Day services were held in Emmanuel Chapel on January 10th, and were conducted by the Rev. Wm. G. Thayer.

The Tenth Conference of Parochial Officers was held in Trinity Chapel, February 14th. There were present 116 officers from 58 parishes. The subject of discussion being, "How can the Monthly Meetings be made more interesting?"

DEAR FRIEND :

The WOMAN'S AUXILIARY needs *you* and *every woman* in your parish. It cannot do its full work until every baptized woman in the Church is working with it.

In the Diocese, out of some 27,000 women communicants, only about 4,600 are enrolled members of the Auxiliary. Will you do all that you can to reach the 22,000 women who are "left out"?

The extent and meaning of our work was brought home to us at the Quiet Day services held for the women of the Diocese by the Rev. Philip M. Rhinelander of the Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge. He said :

"Every Christian has a mission which is the very same as that of Christ Himself. The Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world. That is Christ's mission, which began with His birth at Bethlehem, and has continued ever since, and will continue to the end. This is the mission of the Church. After His resurrection, Christ said to His disciples : 'As the Father hath sent me, even so send I you.' At Pentecost, by sending His Holy Spirit to dwell in them, He gave them power to carry out this mission, power to be His witnesses both in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. And this is the mission of the Christian. The whole Church is made up of individuals. The one Body has many members. Members

of the Body of the Living Christ sent to save the world—that is Christ's account of Christians. We may not realize it, we may not want it, but it is true. We can be useless, unworthy, diseased members, hurtful to His holy Body, hindering His saving work. Or we can be willing, healthy members, living to serve and save. In any case, as St. Paul says, we are the Body of Christ and severally members thereof. To be a Christian means to be one sent to save the world, and it means nothing else."

Let us then realize that He did not send His Church to save our own small neighborhood, or even the United States, but to save the uttermost part of the earth. This is the meaning of Missions; this the reason that we women are Auxiliary to the Board of Missions of the Church!

All can help in this saving work who understand that His great mission has been left in their hands. They can pray: Thy Kingdom come, that all the kingdoms of this world may become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ. They can study the progress of His Kingdom in all lands. They can work. They can give. But let all remember that the one great gift is a loving, faithful heart.

It is hard for a member, here and there, to know the details of this work. Therefore the Woman's Auxiliary stands ready,—on the one hand, to learn from the Board of Missions in New York, what is the work of the Church, what are its needs,—and, on the other hand, to pass on this knowledge through all the parish branches to each individual member.

We need your help to do this work. May we first help you to know more about it?

No parish need say that it is too poor to help, for it can always pray ; nor too small, for He has given His promise to the two or three who gather together in His name. For those who can work, there are missionary boxes to fill ; for those who can give there are churches, schools and hospitals to support, that so we may save our brethren, soul, mind and body. For many still sit in the shadow of death whom Christ would call to eternal life.

Can you bring the great missionary call home to the women of your parish ? In doing it, can we be of service to you ?

## REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1906-7.

---

WITH the closing of the year 1906-7 the Junior Department of the Auxiliary in Massachusetts can once more bring in a report of slow but steady progress. Five new branches have been formed, and two others which had suspended for want of leadership have been re-organized upon active working foundations under able leaders. Our scholarships and pledges have been met, with one exception, and our educational work has been, on the whole, encouraging, although there is still plenty of room for improvement along this line. In consideration of the general rules of the Junior Department, it would seem almost unnecessary to state that the subject of Prayer for Missions is receiving careful attention in many of our branches, were it not that often in the past, the importance of this part of our work has been so taken for granted that its actual development, in close connection with study and work, has seemed to be overlooked. Another cause for encouragement during the year is the feeling, which is evidently increasing, on the part of both Auxiliary and Junior leaders, toward closer co-operation. We have still far to go and much to do before a satisfactory connection is made in every branch between its Senior and Junior members, but the very fact that the subject has been under constant discussion in our meetings, that the desire is earnestly expressed to overcome whatever stands in the way, and that in some branches a satisfactory solution of the question has already been found, gives us courage to go ahead with assurance of success in the future. It may not be amiss to state here that the difficulties which confront us in this respect are far from being peculiar to Massachusetts. Throughout the country at large the question is being asked, "How can we draw the Auxiliary and its Junior department together?" and the most encouraging answers that have been given have come from the practical experience of branches in which all have united over a common interest, such as a study course or the preparation and packing of a mission box. Here in Massachusetts we are fortunate in being spared certain difficulties of organization and sentiment which make this question doubly hard to solve in some of the other dioceses. Nowhere ought the connection to be more easily effected than here, and it is partly to further this effort that a slight change has been made in the Junior committee. Miss Sturgis has resigned from the position of Junior Chairman and accepted that of Educational Secretary for Juniors and Seniors alike, thereby acting, for the present at least, in the capacity of an official connection between them both.

We regret that, as yet, no one has been found to occupy the Chairmanship, but trust that before long the position may be satisfactorily filled.

Two normal classes for Junior leaders were held early in the year, one in Boston and the other in Taunton. The Pacific Island course was the one studied, and the classes were well attended and followed by practical results. The course recommended by the Board for the coming winter will be upon China, and normal classes will be planned for as early as possible in the year, notice being given in advance.

The usual meetings of Junior leaders were held in November and February, and the conference in April. At the latter a number of questions were discussed which will have direct bearing upon our next year's work. It was voted that the experiment be tried of increasing the number of leaders' meetings from two to six, a special subject to be assigned in advance to form the central theme for discussion at each meeting. These meetings will be held on the third Wednesday of each month, beginning with October, at 11.30, in the Parish Rooms of St. Paul's Church, Boston. It was also recommended that in future, so far as is possible, graded study classes should be held in each branch, and that the leaders avail themselves of the opportunities afforded by the normal classes.

The annual meeting was held at Trinity Parish Hall on the second Saturday in May, thirty-six branches being represented. Dr. Mann, rector of the parish, presided and made the opening address, and Dean Burleson of North Dakota carried the Juniors with him to the Indian missions of his district, and gave them a good idea of what the Church means to the children of the Redskins. The branch reports were handed in unread at the calling of the roll, and were afterwards placed on file for reference at the Diocesan House. The time usually occupied by them in the meeting was devoted to a short exercise upon the examination questions prepared for the Pacific Island course. Twelve branches which had been studying the course were represented, each participant having one question assigned to her, and as the answers were given quite at length, the exercise was of interest not only to those personally concerned, but to all who heard it. The branches represented and the questions answered were as follows:—

1. What is the great missionary message; what does it mean, and who brought it to the world? *St. John's Branch, Fall River.*
2. What was the first missionary society organized for; who belonged to it, and who belongs to the great missionary society of our Church now? *St. John's Branch, Roxbury.*
3. How can the members of the Junior Auxiliary help to pass along the missionary message? *St. Stephen's Branch, Lynn.*
4. How did it come to be carried to the Islands of the Pacific? *Church of the Messiah Branch, Boston.*
5. Why did the Islanders need to have it? What difference did it make to them? *St. Paul's Branch, Dedham.*
6. What did they do with it when they got it? Were they generous with it? Why? *St. Stephen's Branch, Boston.*

7. Who were some of the men who carried the message to the Islands? Which of them is your favorite? Why? (Williams.) *Church of Our Saviour Branch, Longwood.*
8. Which is your favorite? Why? (Paton.) *St. Chrysostom's Branch, Wollaston.*
9. Which is your favorite? Why? (Patteson.) *Christ Church Branch, Quincy.*
10. What are the names of the different groups of Islands about which we have been studying? Which of them belong to the United States? *St. Mary's Branch, Dorchester.*
11. What is the name of the Bishop of Honolulu; what sort of people is he helping, and how can we help him? *St. Thomas's Branch, Taunton.*
12. What is the name of the Bishop of the Philippines; what is he doing for the people, and how can we help him? *Church of the Advent Branch, Boston.*

And now, as we face again the opportunities and efforts of another year, and stand once more looking for the inspiration that never fails to come from the meetings and conferences of missionaries and workers assembled in connection with the General Convention, a realization cannot fail to come to us of all the blessings which have been ours during the past three years. Twenty-four new Junior branches have been organized in Massachusetts since the Convention met in Boston; our central committee has been enlarged and an efficient district secretary set to work in the Southeastern section; and our educational work has taken a distinct start forward toward systematic united study. Truly we have much for which it behooves us to offer thanksgiving, and which should spur us onward to redoubled effort, in renewed faith that He Who has called us to this work will prosper it in our hands if we continually study to know His will and to follow it.
