MINUTES

OF THE

EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

Michigan Branch Woman's Auxiliary.

The Eighteenth Annual Meeting of the Michigan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and Junior Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. Paul's Parish, Jackson, Wednesday and Thursday, June 9 and 10, 1897.

The initial meeting in the interests of the Junior Auxiliary was held in the Church Tuesday evening, June 8, at which the Right Reverend, the Bishop of the diocese, presided, and Mrs. H. Albin Jones, Deaconess of St. John's Church, Detroit, read an interesting paper on the relation of the Sunday School to the Junior Auxiliary. This was followed by brief addresses by the Rev. Messrs. Sayres and Hughson, of Detroit, bearing upon the same subject.

On Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock the opening service was held in connection with that of the Diocesan Convention. Holy Communion was celebrated by the Bishop of the diocese, assisted by Rev. Dr. Clark, Rev. Mr. MacLean and the rector of the parish. The Rev. Mr. Gardam, of St. Luke's Church, Ypsilanti, preached the sermon.

Immediately after this service the business meeting convened in the Unitarian Church, which had been kindly placed at our disposal, the President presiding.

Roll-call showed delegates present from thirty-three parochial branches. After taking the names and addresses of the officers and delegates of the different parishes, an adjournment was had for luncheon, which was most hospitably served by the ladies of the parish in their Church House.

The afternoon session convened at 2 o'clock. The minutes of the last quarterly meeting were read and approved and the annual reports of the several Secretaries and Treasurers were submitted in the following order: Recording Secretary, General Treasurer, Diocesan Secretary and Treasurer, Domestic Secretary and Treasurer, Foreign Secretary and Treasurer, Treasurer of the United Offering, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, Secretary of the Junior Department, and Secretary of the Babies' Branch. These reports were interspersed with addresses and letters relating to the different departments of the work. The Rev. John McCarroll, Dean of the Detroit Convocation, made an earnest and convincing address in regard to diocesan missions, appealing more specially to those interested in his convocation, and asking for a column for that work in our list of pledges. This request was granted when the pledges for the ensuing year were made.

Then followed an interesting letter from the Bishop of Marquette, thanking the Branch for past assistance, and saying that his departure for Europe would prevent him from being present at this annual meeting, and that, in view of the many demands upon the Auxiliary, he would not ask for a renewal of the pledge for his diocese, though it would always be poor. Marquette, however, was not forgotten when the pledges were made, as many of the Branches renewed those of the past year.

The President requested that at the time of holding the Quiet Day in Detroit, the Branches outside the city observe at least a portion of that same day, and that all shall have an offertory for the same special object.

The Rev. Mr. Ewing, of Jonesville, made a very interesting address regarding his work, thanking the Auxiliary for its assistance to that parish and giving a history of its life and an account of their methods of working.

Following the report of the Treasurer of the United Offering an earnest appeal was made for that object, and especially for the use of the mite chests. In this connection Miss Eichbaum, a young lady who has offered herself as a foreign missionary, was introduced, and Mrs. H. Albin Jones, Deaconess, spoke a few words in regard to the necessary training of women for the mission field.

Mrs. Babbitt, of Ypsilanti, gave a report of her work in placing Bibles and Prayer Books in the railway stations, embodying in it a history of the scheme and its growth.

A circular letter was read from Miss Emery, entitled "Suggestions for the Summer," addressed to the diocesan and parochial officers and

individual members, asking them to remember the Auxiliary during their vacations with their prayers and efforts to extend its influence.

The meeting then adjourned until 9:30 o'clock Thursday morning.

The Thursday morning session was opened at 9:30 o'clock with a short service conducted by the Rev. Mr. Munday, of Grace Church, Port Huron.

The Domestic Secretary read a letter from Bishop Gailor, of Tennessee, in regard to Hoffman Hall, giving an encouraging report of the work done at this college for the education of colored students; also a letter from a resident clergyman giving a full description of the school and its methods, and of the two students supported by the Michigan Branch. The Rev. Mr. Sayres made a short address in behalf of the work among the colored people of Detroit.

Deficits having been reported in several branches of the work of the past year, pledges were made to raise the amount necessary to meet them, and on motion it was decided that the officers be empowered to arrange for supplying the deficiencies as they shall deem expedient.

The business next in order was the consideration of assuming the support of the young lady who had offered herself as a missionary. In this connection Mrs. Albin Jones read a paper on the subject of preparation for a missionary's life, and supplemented it with remarks wherein she suggested a plan for the case under consideration. After some discussion, on motion of Mrs. Macauley, it was unanimously decided that Miss Eichbaum be adopted by the diocese of Michigan and educated for this work.

On motion of Mrs. Chittenden it was decided that any woman not contributing to the Auxiliary shall not be entitled to vote as to the distribution of the money.

Pledges were then taken for the ensuing year.

After the reading of a paper on the work in Mexico, written by Mrs. J. R. Emerson, of Detroit, the meeting adjourned for luncheon.

At 2 o'clock the meeting was again called to order and the business of the morning was resumed. After completing the pledges for the work of the coming year, Mrs. Macauley offered the following resolutions, which were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the Woman's Auxiliary, including its Junior department, desire to offer their cordial thanks for the most generous and abundant hospitality which will make our visit at Jackson a memorable one in Auxiliary annals.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Auxiliary be given to the Unitarian Society of Jackson for so eminently suitable and convenient a place in which to hold our meetings.

On motion of Mrs. Macauley it was decided that the Woman's Auxiliary of Michigan make the first week in October next a week of self-denial, and that the money thus saved be given to diocesan missions.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

REPORT OF RECORDING SECRETARY.

If "variety is the very spice of life that gives it all its flavor" we can well understand why reports are generally so tedious, and I am sure no one can more fully appreciate the tiresomeness of repetition than the compiler of these same reports, to whom brevity must seem their only possible merit; and yet they are necessary to show the progress of the work from year to year, and cannot well be avoided, so we can only strive to make them as brief as is possible with the matter at hand to chronicle.

The usual order of holding our diocesan meetings has been preserved during the past year. The monthly meetings were resumed in October and have been seven in number. They have been quite well attended by members of the city parishes, with an occasional representative from the other branches.

The first quarterly meeting was held in St. Paul's Chapel, Detroit, on the 2d day of December. In addition to the routine business there was an address by Dr. McCarroll on Diocesan Missions, and a series of three papers on the history of the early days of the Church in

America. The second quarterly meeting, held in St. John's Parish Building, Detroit, on the afternoon of February 17, was addressed by the Rev. Mr. Scadding of La Grange, Ill. His subject, "The Realization of the Presence of Christ" was quite a departure from the customary address at a missionary meeting, which generally assumes a thoroughly practical character, yet it contained the germ from which true effort proceeds and of which we are too apt to lose sight; for without that presence we cannot hope that our efforts will be blessed.

The Quiet Day was conducted by the Rt. Rev. Dr. Morrison, of Duluth, shortly after his consecration. His instructions were most edifying, and there was a fairly good attendance considering the inclemency of the weather.

The Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions has celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary since our last annual meeting, and can no longer be regarded as an experiment. The Michigan Branch closes its seventeenth year with this meeting, and though falling far short of its aim it may be said to have accomplished some good in the cause of missions. I wish I might report a large increase in membership, and were it possible to impart the necessary zeal and enthusiasm for that purpose, our President, we all know, would have succeeded in her efforts to that end. There have been four parochial branches added to our number during the year—one of them, however, formerly belonged with us, and was all the more gladly received again. We now number 43 branches, and although we cannot be satisfied until every parish in the diocese has an organized branch, yet we must not forget that we cannot add one cubit to our statute without the Master's help, and that He will give the increase in His good time if we work for that result.
