Minutes of the Twentieth Annual Meeting
OF THE
Michigan Branch Woman's Auxiliary

The Twentieth Annual Meeting of the Michigan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions and the Junior Department was held in Christ Church, Detroit, Tuesday, June 6, 1899.

Holy Communion was celebrated at 10 o'clock by the Bishop of the Diocese, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Maxon, rector of the Parish, and the Rev. Dr. McCarroll, dean of the Detroit Convocation.

After this service adjournment was had to the Chapel, where the Rev. Dr. Maxon read a short opening service and the business session was called to order by the President, who spoke a few words of greeting to those present. Mrs. Pitkin, the first President of the Branch, occupied a seat upon the platform.

Roll Call showed thirty-three Parochial Branches represented, and the Chapel was well filled throughout the day.

The minutes of the last quarterly meeting were read and approved, and reports were submitted by the Secretaries and Treasurers of the different departments of the work, including the Junior Auxiliary and the Babies' Branch.

A letter was read from Mrs. Minor, one of the Vice-Presidents, containing greetings to the Michigan Branch.

The President recommended a slight change in the Constitution, which would fix the time of holding the annual meeting in the autumn instead of June, when such extreme heat usually prevails, and also

name Detroit as the place of meeting. The roll of parishes outside the city was called and all expressed themselves in favor of the autumn as the time of meeting, and the majority in favor of Detroit as the place, provided that one or more of the quarterly meetings be held outside the city. As a change in the Constitution can be effected only with the Bishop's approval, it was decided that his consent to such change be requested.

A letter was read in commendation of Miss Eichbaum, whose strength did not permit her to finish her course in the Deaconess Training Home in Philadelphia, but who is doing satisfactory work in the mountains of North Carolina.

At half after twelve o'clock the meeting was adjourned for luncheon, which was served in the Church House. At the close of luncheon Dean McCarroll, on behalf of the Auxiliary, extended thanks to the rector and ladies of Christ Church Parish for their generous hospitality, which was so beautifully and graciously dispensed.

At a quarter after two o'clock the meeting was again called to order.

During the afternoon session Dean McCarroll made an address on Diocesan Missions, asking that the Auxiliary continue its help for this work; the Foreign Secretary read several articles relating to Foreign Missions and to the United Offering, giving suggestions for obtaining good results for the latter, making the mite box an important factor; Mrs. Eastwood urged that an interest be taken in the work of the Church Periodical Club; the Rev. Mr. Sayres told something of his plan to carry on the General Missionary Work of the Diocese; Miss Charlotte Mason spoke very sweetly of the life in the Training School in Philadelphia, where she is taking a course in preparation for the work of a Missionary in China, Mrs. Baldwin called attention to the fact that the last United Offering has become a means for the education of women for this work, and Miss Bailey told of her experience in the Indian Schools in Bishop Hare's jurisdiction.

Pledges were made for the work of the coming year, and the Rev. Mr. Arnold, rector of St. Peter's Church Detroit, closed the meeting with prayer and the benediction.

The annual service was held in the Church in the evening when an inspiring sermon was preached by the Rev. E. W. Hunt, of St. Paul's Church, Lansing.

A short adjourned meeting was held on Wednesday afternoon, June 7, when several matters were discussed in an informal way, but no official business was transacted.

REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY.

In reviewing the work of the past year we notice that there has been little if any departure in the order of holding our meetings or in our methods of work. Our inspiration has been drawn almost entirely from home sources. We have had very few speakers from outside the Diocese, the Bishop of Alaska being almost the only exception, and we have scarcely become accustomed to looking upon him as an outsider, though he is now so far away. Our own clergy have been most kind in responding to all requests to address our meetings or to help us with their counsel, consequently it has not been necessary to seek for aid elsewhere.

The quarterly meetings during the past year have been only half day sessions instead of lasting through the entire day, as has generally been the custom. This has not been because the work has lessened, but in this age, when there are so many demands upon one's time and strength, it has been deemed wiser to shorten the business meetings as far as possible. The first of these meetings was held in St. John's Parish Building, Detroit, on November 21, and was devoted principally to descriptions of the sessions of the Triennial General Convention and the General Meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary, held in Washington in October. These accounts, which were graphic and especially interesting, were given respectively by the Rev. Dr. Prall and our President.

The second quarterly meeting was also held in St. John's Parish Building and took place Tuesday afternoon, January 3d. It was on that occasion that we were privileged to have with us the Rt. Rev. the Bishop of Alaska, who stirred all our hearts with his account of that field, so set in the midst of hardships and so in need of workers to help him in his noble and self-sacrificing undertaking.

The monthly meetings were resumed in September as usual, and have been seven in number. There is no longer any question as to the wisdom of holding them, for they have become simply necessities. The April meeting was held in Monroe in connection with the meeting of the Detroit Convocation and was not only successful as regards the work of the Auxiliary, but as is ever the case when we hold our meetings outside the city, the members of the Parish were "on hospitable thoughts intent," and their cordial welcome made glad the hearts of their guests. At this meeting Mrs. Cram gave an instructive and

beautiful paper on Corean Missions, and Mrs. Sterling kindly consented to read again her spicy paper on "Missionary Boxes."

The Quiet Morning this year was conducted by the Rev. Wm. Gardam, of Ypsilanti, whose instructions were most impressive and made one feel that these "rests by the way" are close by the fountain of inspiration, which is the source of Spiritual health and strength.

Our last report has the names of 41 Parishes on the roll, all of whom, with perhaps one or two exceptions, have contributed toward the work. Our next report, we trust, will add to these the names of three new branches namely, Monroe, Plymouth and Birmingham, all of whom we most gladly welcome.

The last year of the century will soon be upon us, and plans are already being discussed and formed among those in authority for some fitting demonstration on the part of this Church of ours that will increase the interest in missions and incite to greater effort in the cause, and we are confident that the Woman's Auxiliary will not be lukewarm toward this plan when called upon to help it on.

As time goes on our responsibilities are added to and our interest and sympathies are extended and multiplied, calling each year for greater effort and zeal. May we live up to our opportunities and privileges in this regard.
