Minutes of the Twenty-First Annual Meeting

OF THE

Michigan Branch Woman's Auxiliary

The Twenty-first Annual Meeting of the Michigan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. John's Parish, Detroit, Tuesday, May 29, 1900.

The opening service was held in the church in connection with that of the Detroit Convocation. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 A. M., the Dean, Rev. Dr. McCarroll, being celebrant, assisted by the rector and curate of the parish. The Bishop of the diocese pronounced the absolution and benediction, and the sermon was preached by the Rev. C. E. Woodcock, rector of the parish.

Immediately following this service the meeting was adjourned to the parish building where it was called to order by the president.

The roll was called and names of delegates taken, after which reports were presented and accepted in the following order: General Treasurer, Diocesan Secretary and Treasurer, Domestic Secretary and Treasurer, Foreign Secretary and Treasurer, and Treasurer of United Offering. Miss Trowbridge read her report of the work which had been done with the stereoptican slides, a new undertaking last year, and the president asked that the parish branches should pledge something for the furtherance of this work.

The meeting was adjourned for luncheon, which was served in the dining room of the parish house by the members of the Junior Auxiliary.

At 2 o'clock the meeting was again called to order, and the opening prayers were read by Dean McCarroll, the Bishop made a short address in which he expressed his appreciation of the help rendered in the diocese by the Woman's Auxiliary.

Dean McCarroll read a detailed report of moneys received and expended which had been given by the Auxiliary for work in the Detroit Convocation and elsewhere in the Diocese during the year just closed.

The president asked how the \$18.00 should be appropriated which had been received from the collection taken on May 19, at the time of the visit of the Rev. Mr. Wilson and Mr. Eugene Stark of England. On motion it was decided that it be sent to the church in Havana, Cuba.

Miss Holmes, secretary of the Junior Auxiliary, read a portion of her annual report which had been submitted the evening previous at their annual meeting and which made a most satisfactory showing for the Junior department. Following this Miss Armstrong read her report of the Babies Branch, or "The Little Helpers" as they are now known.

Mrs. R. W. Clark spoke of the missionary to China whom we are to send out this year as our first foreign missionary, saying that although the Girls' Friendly Society claim the right to support Miss Mason, yet we can help by furnishing her rooms and adding to the comforts of the general house. In this connection she read a letter written to Miss Mason from an associate who has already gone to China, giving details of furnishing.

Pledges were then taken for the work of the coming year, after which the meeting adjourned to Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock.

A missionary service was held in the church Tuesday evening at which time addresses were made by the Rev. Dr. Maxon, Rev. Mr. Sayres and others.

Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock the meeting was called to order by the president and the Rev. Mr. Sayres, the General Missionary of the diocese, read the opening service, after which he made an appeal in behalf of diocesan missions and gave an account of some of the work done by him during the past year.

Then came a letter of greeting from Miss Emery, the General Secretary, after which Mrs. Joseph Eastwood, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, read her annual report and gave a plain talk on the work of the club which was followed by a discussion of the best methods to follow in that work.

A letter was read from Mrs. Hunter of St. Augustine's School, in Raleigh, N. C., in regard to a Christmas box which she would like to have for the school. It was decided that this be taken as a general box for the fall work.

The president called for reports by parishes of the work accomplished during the past twenty years, or since the organization of the Michigan branch. Reports were submitted by the diocesan recording secretary and the secretaries of the parishes of St. Paul's, Christ Church, St. John's and Church of the Messiah of Detroit; St. Paul's, Jackson; Zion Church, Pontiac, and St. Andrew's, Ann Arbor. On motion of Miss Holmes these reports were ordered placed on file.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY.

It was twenty years ago the 22d of April just past that our late beloved Bishop Harris called the churchwomen of the diocese together to consider the matter of organizing a branch of the Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. The parishes which responded to that call were St. Paul's, Christ Church, St. John's, Grace, Emmanuel, Mariners, and Trinity of Detroit, St. Paul's of Jackson, and Trinity Church, Alpena. Miss Emery, the General Secretary, was present and assisted by her wise counsel in the organization of the branch.

An adjourned meeting was held in St. Paul's Chapel the next afternoon, of which Mrs. Willard Parker was chosen chairman, and Miss Hattie Pope secretary. A form of constitution was adopted and the Michigan Branch was fairly launched upon its way with Mrs. Pitkin as president, Miss Adams as secretary of the Domestic department and Mrs. Chittenden of the Foreign. It was not until the second year that the diocesan department was added and Mrs. Johnson appointed Secretary and Treasurer.

In 1882 Mrs. Pitkin retired from the presidency, feeling to the regret of all that she must give it up. Mrs. C. C. Gray was appointed in her stead, and held the office for one year. Upon her resignation the mantle fell upon Miss Adams, whose faithful service is recognized wherever the Michigan Branch is known. Mrs. D. O. Cole succeeded Miss Adams as Domestic Secretary. No words of mine are necessary to make known the faithful and efficient service rendered by these officers.

The position of Recording Secretary seems to have been temporarily filled by Miss Parker (now Mrs. Johnson), Miss Adams and others up to the time of the third annual meeting, when Miss Charlotte Robinson was appointed and served until 1885, when she was called to her final reward, esteemed and lamented by all her associates in the work. Miss Robinson was succeeded by the present Secretary who has held the office since her appointment with the exception of about a year and a half when Miss Lightner (now Mrs. Tappey) discharged its duties.

The year 1889 seems to have been quite an eventful one with us, marking the organization of our diocesan branch of the Junior Auxiliary with Mrs. Macauley as president and Miss Holmes secretary, and the Church Periodical Club with Mrs. Wm. Jennison as Correspondent, besides the inauguration of the Quiet Day. Then some six years ago the Babies Branch was added with Miss Armstrong at its head.

It may be pleasant for us all to remember that our first Quiet Day was conducted in St. John's Church by the Rev J. H. Johnson, then rector of Christ Church, now Bishop of Los Angeles. He was followed by the Rev. J. N. Blanchard, Rev. Pelham Williams, of New York, Father Huntington, Rev. Floyd

W. Tomkins, who came to us twice, the Rev. A. S. Crapsey, Bishop Morrison of Duluth, Rev. Dr. Dowling, Rev. Wm. Gardam and the Rev. Dr. Maxon, all of whom have made these "rests by the way" impressive and helpful.

Among those who have come from a distance to speak to us during these twenty years are Bishop Whipple, Bishop Paddock of Washington Territory, Bishop Garrett of Northern Texas, Bishop Potter, Bishop Coxe, Bishop Worthington, Bishop Weed of Florida, Bishop Boone of China, Rev. John McKim, afterward Bishop of Japan, Bishop Walker, Bishop Talbot, Rev. Mr. Graves now Bishop of China, Bishop Hare, Bishop Brewer of Montana, Bishop Gray of Southern Florida, Bishop Graves of the Platte, Bishop Leonard of Utah and Nevada, Bishop Gailor of Tennessee, Bishop Dudley of Kentucky, Bishop Barker of Olympia, Bishop Brooks of Oklahoma, Bishop Rowe of Alaska, Bishop Johnson of Los Angeles, the Rev. Dr. Bunn of China, Rev. Mr. Osborne and Rev. Dr. Locke of Chicago, Rev. Mr. Pott of China, Archdeacon Page of Japan, Rev. Mr. Yen, a native priest of China, Rev. Mr. Tyng of Japan, Rev. Mr. Forrester of Mexico, Mr. Gardiner of St. Paul's School, Tokio, Archdeacon Spurr, whose stirring address at our last quarterly meeting will long be an inspiring memory, Miss Scott of Africa, Miss Mailes of Japan, Miss Bland of India, Miss Sybil Carter, and our esteemed General Secretary, Miss Emery. There is much that ought to be said in eulogy of each and every one of these talented and consecrated people whom it has been our privilege to hear, but time and your patience will not permit.

In addition to this long array we want to acknowledge the valuable help and inspiration received from our own Bishop and so many of the clergy of our own diocese who have always been ready to respond to any call from the Woman's Auxiliary.

Nor have I mentioned the many good and true women among our own members whom we all have in our minds, and who, either in an official or other capacity, have done so much to further the auxiliary work. Some of them have been called away either by the last dread messenger, by impaired health and strength, or by the voice of duty in other fields, while others are fortunately still with us. We can never forget the wise counsels and efficient service rendered by any of these noble women.

We cannot but be struck with the few changes in our staff of officers during all these years, and with the few inroads death has made in our ranks; yet the minor chord was notably struck when we were called to give up the wise counsel and sympathy of our beloved Bishop Harris, who was the chief source of inspiration to the Auxiliary in its earlier years.

Of the 59 parishes and missions whose names have been at different times enrolled upon our books 41 still remain. This large falling off makes us ask ourselves "where are the eighteen missing ones, and why is that so many parishes in the diocese fail to see the advantages to be gained by this banding together for the work of the Church". May the next twenty years see every parish in the diocese on the roll of the Women's Auxiliary.

Will the presidents of the Woman's Auxiliary, or, The Ladies' Aid Societies realize that this work belongs to their department of church work, and will they please ask from time to time in their regular meetings for a report from their parish secretary of the Babies' Branch.

It has been thought wise to change the name of the Babies' Branch. Little Gaylord gave it a name. When asked by his auntie "If he would like a box of his own to put his pennies in for the Indians," he said, "then I will be a little helper." It seems to me that it would be very appropriate and just that this sweet little child whose life and death has given so much inspiration to all of us, that the name he gave it "The Little Helpers" should be the name of his memorial. Another very practical reason, a young man carrying the weight of five summers on his manly shoulders is insulted if you ask him if he belongs or would like to become a member of the Babies' Branch. He is not a baby, nor does he want to have anything to do with babies. By calling the work "The Little Helpers" we can smooth the indignant feelings of the young man, and at the same time hold the children that we have until they are old enough to join some society of the Junior Auxiliary. People think that the Babies' Branch is only for young babies.

What mother will not make many sacrifices if it is necessary in order that her children may have a good education. Education is power. So early in life the children are sent to the kindergarten. All that can be done is done to prepare the children for their secular life. Does the mother show the same interest in the education of her children for their spiritual life? The experiences of Sunday School teachers verifies the fact that they do not. "The Little Helpers" is the kindergarten of the Church and teaches the fundamental truths of the Church.

In different ways is this question put to me. The ladies of our parish do not believe in foreign missions. Can I not say to them that the money in our boxes will be used for the education of some child in our own country? There is such a lack of religious education in our own country we ought to look at home before sending our money away to foreign lands. Some parishes want all the money sent back to them again because they need all the money they can get

In baptism, the sponser promises that the child shall be a faithful soldier and servant until his life's end. What is the first requisite of a soldier? Unquestioned obedience. At the font the baby was made an heir with Christ, and with that gift went the responsibility of that gift—a soldier in Christ's army. There and then it received its marching orders. The little child at the font, the aged man at the brink of the dark river are both responsible for their share in that command of commands "Go ye out into all the world and preach the gospel unto all nations." The Little Helpers teach the responsibility of the sacrament of baptism. We cannot, dare not, withhold a part of the message. We must give to the Little Helper his heritage, the full message of the divine commission. If we withhold a part of the message we withhold a part of the blessing. If we older soldiers of the cross, question our marching orders, what an example we set before the young soldier. Unquestioned obedience is our duty and our privilege. God's ways are infinite, our minds are infinite. We cannot know now *why* we should do this or that, but some day we shall know, and the reward of the faithful soldier shall be ours. We shall be joint heirs with Christ and sit with Him on His throne.
