Minutes of the Twenty-Second Annual Meeting
of the Michigan Branch Woman's Auxiliary

Minutes of the Twenty-Second Annual Meeting

of the

Michigan Branch Woman's Auxiliary

The twenty-second annual meeting of the Michigan branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church parish, Detroit, Tuesday, May 7, 1901.

Holy Communion was celebrated in the church at 9:30 a. m., the rector of the parish being celebrant, assisted by the dean of the Detroit Convocation and the curate of the parish.

Immediately after this service adjournment was had to the church house, where the business sessions were held, the President in the chair. Delegates from twenty-eight parochial branches responded to roll call.

Reports were submitted and accepted in the following order: Recording Secretary, Treasurer of General Expense Fund, Chairman of Committee on packing boxes sent to Alaska, Diocesan Secretary and Treasurer, Domestic Secretary and Treasurer, Foreign Secretary and Treasurer, Treasurer of United Offering, Treasurer of Junior Auxiliary, Head of Little Helpers, Correspondent of Church Periodical Club. In order that the reports might not become too tedious they were interspersed with addresses and papers. The Rev. Dr. McCarroll, Dean of the Detroit Convocation, told in a general way of the distribution of the funds which the Woman's Auxiliary had placed in his hands during the past year, and of the needs for the coming year. The Rev. Mr. Sayres, General Missionary of the diocese, spoke of some of the interesting details of his labor, including his efforts to awaken an interest in auxiliary work, and thanked the women for the help extended to him. Mrs. Caswell, of St. Paul's Church, Detroit, read a very interesting original paper entitled "Woman in Missions."

At 12 o'clock business was suspended and the Rev. Dr. Maxon read the noonday prayers for Missions, after which business was resumed until half past twelve, when adjournment was had for luncheon, which was bountifully served by the ladies in the dining-room of the church house.

The meeting was again called to order at two o'clock, when there was a discussion as to the best method of raising the amount necessary to pay the freight from San Francisco on the barrels sent to Alaska. Decided on motion that a collection be taken at this meeting and another at the meeting to be held on June 5th, at which the Secretary of the Board of Missions is to speak.

Miss Trowbridge made a very interesting report of the work that had been done during the year in connection with the lantern slides, and announced that the name had been changed to "Missionary Exhibit."

Mrs. Mason, of St. Paul's Church, Detroit, read extracts from her daughter's letters, written from China and giving many interesting details of her surroundings and occupations in the commencement of her calling as missionary.

The Domestic Secretary read a letter from Bishop Leonard in regard to Rowland Hall, saying that although the school is in better condition than ever before, yet it is not entirely self-supporting. In consequence of this it was decided that we continue to give something towards its support.

On motion of Mrs. Chittenden a vote of thanks was tendered to Mr. C. J. Hupp, of the Michigan Central railroad, and to Mr. Thorpe, of the Ferguson Truck Co., for the aid they have extended this branch of the Auxiliary in the dispatch of all missionary boxes, and the Secretary was instructed to notify said gentlemen of this action.

A letter was read from the Rev. Mr. Pott, of China, giving an account of the the young man who is being educated under the Harris memorial scholarship; also a letter from Miss Bull, giving an account of her work in Osaka, Japan, and saying she expected to be in America soon for a much needed rest.

Mrs. R. W. Clark, of St. Paul's Church, moved that a committee be appointed to consult with Miss Adams upon the revision of our constitution and the reorganization of the Michigan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. Carried. The President named as that committee Mrs. Woodcock, Mrs. Mason, Mrs. Chittenden, Mrs. Barbour, Mrs. Minor and Miss Adams.

Pledges were taken for the work of the ensuing year, after which the Rev. Dr. McCarroll announced the appointment by the Bishop of the diocese of Mrs. James Austin, of Grace Church, Detroit, to fill the vacancy caused by Mrs. Johnson's resignation as Diocesan Secretary and Treasurer.

A letter was read from Miss Emery urging a special effort to secure more gifts for the united offering, and also bearing upon the next triennial meeting.

Mrs. O'Brien moved that a vote of thanks from the Woman's Auxiliary be tendered to Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Cole, the retiring Diocesan and Domestic Secretary, respectively, for their able and untiring services as officers of the Michigan branch, together with the regrets of the Auxiliary that they are no longer to be associated with us in that capacity. Unanimously carried by a rising vote.

After a vote of thanks on motion of Mrs. Minor, which was unanimously carried, to the women for their beautiful entertainment, the meeting adjourned.

REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY.

In looking over the records of the meetings of the past year I find very little to chronicle that differs from the proceedings of previous years, which in itself will stamp the report of your Recording Secretary no less dull and tedious than in the years gone by. We will attempt, however, to give it at least one commendable element, that of brevity—though it may not have the outward manifestation of wit. Yet in spite of the fact that we have done little more than to preserve the even tenor of our way, the retrospect shows us that the same earnest spirit has invested our members, with a strengthening of purpose on the part of many.

The monthly meetings were resumed on the first Monday in October and have been seven in number. In some instances they have been more than usually interesting, as we have had with us at different times those who have had much to give us of their experiences in the missionary field. Dr. Mary F. Gates, of St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, told us of many interesting events in her work as a missionary physician among the Chinese women, both in and outside of her hospital. Having so recently come from that country upon which the attention of the world was fixed and all Christian hearts were filled with anxiety for the missionaries, her words were specially interesting.

Then that forcible and entertaining speaker, Miss Elliott, deaconess under Bishop Leonard in Utah, spoke to us of the great good that had been accomplished through Rowland Hall, the Bishop's school, and aroused our sympathy for the Mormon women for whose emancipation she has used her strongest influence and labor. The attendance at these monthly meetings, we are sorry to say, has not been all that could be desired. We know this is a busy age, but we cannot help feeling that the obligation to attend the meetings does not rest alone upon the officers.

At the quarterly meeting in January which was held in St. John's Parish House we had the pleasure of listening to Mrs. McGrew, of Cleveland, whose subject was "Principles of Missions." She appealed to us on the spiritual side of our work, which must be in the truest and fullest sense the well-spring of all successful effort.

On the 15th of April a special meeting was called for the purpose of hearing the Rev. Mr. Prevost, of Alaska. It goes without saying that the work in this perhaps most difficult of all fields in its physical aspect has an especial place in the hearts of the Woman's Auxiliary of Michigan for the sake of its self-sacrificing Bishop.

The Quiet Morning this year was conducted during Lent in St. John's chapel by the Rev. Chas. E. Woodcock, rector of the parish, to whom our thanks are due for his most inspiring and helpful words on that occasion.

There was one event in the past year which was fraught with great interest to the Auxiliary, namely: the departure of Miss Mason as a missionary to China; for although the Girls' Friendly Society of America claim her as their special representative, and we do not wish to usurp their right to do so, yet we feel she is in a secondary sense our representative also, and she will ever have our prayers and in some degree our support. The service at St. Paul's, which was held as a farewell to Miss Mason, will never be forgotten by those who were present.

We have one new branch to report at Wyandotte and we hear that about it which makes us feel that its members have the true Auxiliary spirit. Accounts have also come to us of great encouragement from some of the other smaller branches.

There is a shadow in our hearts to-day in the knowledge that we are to be deprived of the efficient service of two of our faithful secretaries. To the officers of the Auxiliary this comes as the severing of a tie between friends, and a protest arises involuntarily in our hearts; yet we must submit to the powers that be, and can find our reconciliation only in the thought that they are still our sisters in the faith.

REPORT OF THE LITTLE HELPERS.

May 7th, 1901.

When I first presented the work of The Little Helpers to the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese; so many said what a pretty idea, but too sentimental, not practical at all. In my anxiety to prove that the work is very practical, I sometimes feel as if I had neglected the other and greater part—the spiritual.

I wonder if you know that very soon after the Holy Ghost had planted in the hearts of some members of our church that seed which germinated in that new petition which was added to our Litany—"That it would please God to send forth laborers into His harvest"—that the Little Helpers was born.

After having read a beautiful poem, has it ever occurred to you that perhaps you saw more in the poem than the poet did who wrote it? So I believe the seed planted by the Holy Ghost in the hearts of the men meant more than was conceived by the mind of the men. As I understand it, they thought that it meant that more men and women should offer themselves to work in the Master's Vineyard. The thought has come to me again and again, Did not the seed mean more? Did it not mean that all the church should work in the vineyard? Is the aged saint more of a member of Christ's visible body on earth than the little babe whose brow still glistens with the drops of water? God gave not only what was asked for in the petition, but also sent a greater blessing. God gave a little child into this world, who after three short years fell asleep, but whose life was such "that out of the mouths of babes and sucklings has Thou, Father, perfect praise." To the honor and glory of God, and in memory of Gaylord Hart Mitchell, there was given to our church the little plant called the Babies' Branch or The Little Helpers. To-day there is a little army of soldiers of the cross being trained to know and to do their duty in that state of life in which it has pleased God to call them.

Twenty-five years ago the church accepted any Godly man or woman who offered to work in the Master's harvest. To-day, combined with Godliness, the harvest demands the best trained men and women we can secure. We send out only those who have spent two or three years of faithful labor along these lines. In the years to come our Little Helpers who have been trained from their earliest infancy to work for missions, pray for missions, give for missions, and perhaps go, will be found ready to do their duty, whether it may be in the anxieties and dangers of the mission field or in the regular routine of home life. Those at home will know that their duty and privilege is to pray and to provide the sinews of war for the faithful warriors at the front. We pray that the church

of the future will not be presented with the conditions of to-day. To the call for men to work in the Philippines, eighteen responded, but one can go, because we at home are not alive to our privileges. We will not give, nor will we pray.

The great fault, I believe, is not that the hearts of the people are hardened, but because the great mass of the people are ignorant of their baptismal responsibility. A child is taken to the font, the solemn compact between God, the Father Almighty, and the god-parents is entered into. God performs His part. The child is made a member of Christ, a child of God, and an inheritor of the Kingdom of Heaven, but do the god-parents do their part? Do they see that the child is trained in the way he should go so that he can do his best to fight manfully under Christ's banner against sin, the world and the devil, and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant to his life's end? Do they? Do the god-parents understand their responsibilities?

The Little Helpers stand waiting to aid the sponsor in his responsibility.

**REPORT OF SECRETARY AND TREASURER MISSIONARY
LANTERN SLIDES.**

Scenes from our missionary fields, made into slides and by means of a lantern thrown on canvas—such, in brief, may be a description of the “missionary slides.” Commenced in a small way two years ago, this work has now assumed large proportions, but still has much to do, for the aim is to reach every parish which has not other or better means of information.

We have now on hand—the result of two years—325 slides, 275 of which are in the traveling collection, and are in four “sets”:

- I. Our Indians.
- II. A Trip to China.
- III. Our Work in Alaska.
- IV. With a Pack-train in Idaho.

Thirty-seven of these have been duplicated for the Massachusetts Auxiliary.

We have also about 250 missionary photographs (prints from slide-negatives) for use at small meetings.

There have been 43 missionary meetings illustrated by these slides (19 the first year, 24 the second year), and 4,865 “reminding pictures” distributed. These are half-tones of one of the views (one for each lecture), and are always eagerly received when distributed among the audience.

The most successful meetings have been those at which the loan collection—missionary books, maps and curiosities—have also been sent, and this committee needs special help, and would welcome any assistance most gratefully.

One question, so often asked, may be answered here:

“How does one obtain the missionary slides and loan collection, and how much expense is involved?” Out of town the express charge is the only absolutely necessary expense, but a nominal rental of \$1 is needed to help pay the wear and tear on the slides, etc. If this is considered an obstacle, it is never insisted upon. The name of the slide secretary is given below. The loan collection will be sent by Miss Frazer, 1988 Woodward ave. In town, the expense of lantern, canvas, slides, transportation, etc., with operator, is \$4.

We are very anxious to enlarge our work gradually with pictures from Japan, Africa and our new possessions. Will others not help us? May we not have the help of the many instead of the few? Help us to “enkindle generous ardor.”

These, in addition to the many small gifts for the Foreign field, our Domestic and Diocesan work, the Juniors are certainly doing a great part in the work.
