Minutes of the Twenty-Third Annual Meeting
OF THE
Michigan Branch, Woman's Auxiliary

The twenty-third annual meeting of the Michigan branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Grace Church, Detroit, Tuesday, May 6, 1902.

Holy Communion was celebrated at 9:30 a. m., Dean McCarroll, rector of the parish, being celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Mr. Sayres, general missionary of the diocese.

After this service the business session was called to order, the president in the chair. The rector of the parish welcomed the ladies in a few well chosen words, tendering them the freedom of the parish. Roll call showed twenty-six parochial branches represented. The minutes of the last monthly meeting were read and approved.

Reports were submitted and accepted in the following order: Recording Secretary, General Treasurer, Diocesan Secretary and Treasurer, Domestic Secretary and Treasurer, Foreign Secretary and Treasurer, Treasurer of United Offering, Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, Secretary and Treasurer of the Missionary Lantern Slides and Exhibits, and Head of the Little Helpers. In connection with these reports Mrs. Chittenden read an article from a Girls' Friendly Magazine on Friendliness, in which a lovely tribute was paid to Miss Mason, their missionary in China; also a leaflet on the Twing Memorial, and reported that more than the \$15,000 asked for had been given for that object. Miss Warriner prefaced her report with the reading of a circular explaining the object of the Church Periodical Club, and the Rev. Mr. Sayres testified to the inestimable value of its work as brought to his notice in his travels as General Missionary.

The Rev. Mr. Woodcock, rector of St. John's, Detroit, gave a brief talk on the subject of General Missions and commended the plan of the Michigan Branch to ask for pledges for that object.

At twelve o'clock the Rev. Mr. Sayres read the prayers for Missions, after which an offertory was taken.

Miss Trowbridge gave a report of the meetings of the Junior Auxiliary during the past year, showing novel and interesting methods in conducting them and a bright outlook for the future; and Mrs. Mason read interesting extracts from her daughter's letters, describing the consecration of Bishop Ingle.

An invitation was extended by the ladies of St. Paul's, Detroit, to hold the next annual meeting in their parish. The invitation was unanimously accepted.

The president reported the resignation of the foreign secretary and treasurer, who for many years has held the office so ably and faithfully. In this connection it was moved by Mrs. Henry Allen and seconded by Mrs. Eber Cottrell: That the Woman's Auxiliary of Michigan hear with great regret of the necessary retirement of Mrs. William J. Chittenden from the office of Secretary-Treasurer of the foreign work, and that we place on record our profound appreciation of the great ability and fidelity with which she has filled the office. We furthermore desire to express the hope that she may long be spared to assist her successors in office by her large experience and good judgment. This motion was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

The meeting was then adjourned for luncheon, which was bountifully served in the basement of the church.

At two o'clock the meeting was again called to order and Miss Higgins, of Cape Mount, Africa, addressed the branch upon the work of the church in that far-off land, compelling the sympathy of her audience by her straightforward recital of the hardships to be undergone and the work that might be accomplished there. She dwelt particularly upon her desire to establish an industrial school that the boys' hands may be trained as well as their minds and their hearts.

Dean McCarroll spoke of the work in the Detroit Convocation, thanking the Auxiliary for help extended to him in that field during the past year, and showing an encouraging outlook for the future. The Rev. Mr. Sayres followed with an account of his work as General Missionary of the diocese.

After the singing of a hymn, the Rev. Dr. Clark, of St. Paul's, Detroit, spoke in regard to the noonday prayer for missions, giving a brief history of the growth of the custom from the time of its inception in Wuchang, China, by the Rev. Mr. Sayres and other missionaries in 1880; its adoption by the American Church in 1887, and so on down to the present time, asking those who wish to join the prayer circle which has been started in the diocese of Michigan, to send in their names for enrollment.

Pledges were made for the work of the coming year, after which a vote of thanks was tendered to the rector and ladies of Grace Church for their kind hospitality.

The meeting was then adjourned.

Report of the Recording Secretary.

If our growth as an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions be gauged by the amount of our gifts, then we were stronger ten years ago than we are to-day, which knowledge must make us pause and consider why we are not able to extend the interest in the work and increase our membership. I am not going to attempt to solve this problem, but simply note the fact as food for reflection. We can find no cause for satisfaction in this, though there is some foundation for hope for better things to come in the indication that for the past four years there has again been a slight increase each year in our gifts as also in our membership. We have three new parochial branches to report this year: St. John's, of Saginaw, St. Mary's, of Detroit, and Church of Our Saviour at Leesville. We extend to them a cordial welcome with the hope that their example may inspire a like spirit in others.

During the past year there have been held six regular and four special meetings, and we have been more than usually favored with inspiring speakers. On the 5th of June, shortly after the annual meeting, we were called together to hear Dr. Lloyd, Secretary of the Board of Missions, who told us of the Board's request that the Auxiliary raise \$100,000 toward the general fund for missions and asking that Michigan should give some portion of this. As auxiliary to the Board it behooves us to do what we can in response to this call.

In October the Rev. Mr. Forrester and his daughter were with us, the former speaking about the work of the Mexican Church, and Miss Forrester telling in a very interesting manner of their girls' school. A few weeks later many of us had the pleasure of hearing Miss Bull talk of her work in Japan at a parochial meeting in St. John's, Detroit.

At the quarterly meeting in November we had a report of the triennial general meeting of the Auxiliary in San Francisco, and of the committee on the revision of our constitution. Their resolutions recommending the appointment by the Bishop of one or more vice-presidents in each convocation and outlining their duties, and that the Deans be asked that the work of the Auxiliary be given an hour at the convocation meetings, were unanimously adopted and incorporated in the constitution. We trust the near future will see this plan put into full execution.

In January our hearts were made glad by the visit of Bishop Rowe, who must ever be the wonder and admiration of all who appre-

ciate the difficulties and dangers which surround him in his work. In February we were fortunate in having Bishop Johnson, of Los Angeles, whose presence reminded us of his wise council and ready help to the Auxiliary in the past, and we were interested in hearing of the work in his present field. By this time we had become so accustomed to Bishops that we hardly appreciated the extent of our good fortune in having the opportunity to hear Bishop Brent, who came to us in March, until he spoke to us. Then our hearts went out in sympathy to the work which he is planning to undertake in the Philippine Islands, and his proposed methods could but meet with our approval.

The quiet morning was held as usual in Lent and was conducted in St. John's chapel by the rector, Rev. C. E. Woodcock, to whom our thanks are due for the practical as well as spiritual help received from his instructions. It was gratifying to see an increased attendance at this service.

There has been one innovation introduced into our monthly meetings, that of taking up some subject for missions study with a view to a better knowledge of the work of the Church and its needs. We hope it may be continued the coming year.

The Auxiliary at large has sustained a great loss in the sudden taking away of Mrs. Twing, the honorary secretary, and Michigan is glad to have had some little share in the establishment of a memorial to her.

Change is an inevitable law of all things material, yet we so often protest against it, as we do now in hearing of the resignation of another of our efficient officers. Our consolation will be in the hope that we may still have the benefit of her wise council, which we shall plead for.

Even though there are hindrances and discouragements in our work, let us not be weary in well doing, but increase our efforts, asking for guidance to do the right and leaving results to the Master whose wisdom cannot fail.

Report of Little Helpers.

May sixth, 1902.

Today I will tell you of some of the united work the Little Helpers in the Church at large are doing. Every year we are uniting more and more in our work. We are forgetting the smaller thought of the parish and the diocese in realizing we are one great flock under one Great Shepherd, coming nearer to Him as we come near to each other, in a united purpose to feed His lambs and to bring the other sheep into His fold. In this way the idea of church unity is made very clear.

Throughout the Church, we have 10,000 Little Helpers, each praying and giving for the Master's work. Our first united work was the giving of the bell and tower for the Indian Church at Cannon Ball, North Dakota. This was given as a thank offering in memory of Gaylord Hart Mitchell, the founder and first member of the "Little Helpers." Since 1898 we have supported a Little Helpers' bed for colored children in St. Agnes Hospital, Raleigh, North Carolina. In 1899 we sent a little portable organ to Mr. Pratt at Porto Rico for his work there. Then we gave a font to Bishop Partridge for Trinity Cathedral, Kyoto, Japan. Last year we began the support of a Little Helpers' bed in St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, China. These little beds we hope some day to have in all the Church Hospitals. The little white bed with the picture of the Christ Child above it, and, under this picture is printed the names of the dioceses contributing to the bed. A brass tablet hangs at the foot, bearing in red letters the words, Little Helpers' Bed.

This year we hope to help Miss Higgins support the little colored child whose mother gave her baby to Miss Higgins that she might bring the baby to know and love the Lord. We are hoping to take up the responsibility of some work in Alaska. It may be a half scholarship, valued at fifty dollars. So you see our Little Helpers are no small workers in Christ's vineyard. This does not tell all the good these Little Helpers do. Michigan gives from forty-five to sixty-five dollars a year, but her gifts for the united work is about ten dollars a year. The proportion is about the same for the different dioceses.

At the last united offering given in San Francisco in 1901, the Little Helpers gave \$525 59. Up to May 15, 1901, the Little Helpers have given \$13,614 16, an increase of \$7,128 27 since 1898.

This year, many of our oldest members have left us to take up a larger work in the Junior Auxiliary. We bid them Godspeed. Our branch has been brought closer and nearer to the Father this year, because into His loving arms we gave in faith and in tears two of our youngest and sweetest buds, Charles Locke Stevens and Charleine Emelye Strellinger. We who believe in the communion of saints know there is no spiritual separation. The work and the influence of

those sweet lives will not cease and the world will be made better because they were with us for a little while.

Can there be any more beautiful monument to the memory of any baby than the living memorial of gifts collected and sent in its name with loving prayers to them who have not the knowledge of God.

I ask the Presidents of the Woman's Auxiliary, in behalf of my faithful Little Helpers, your help and co-operation. The growth of this work depends at first wholly on you. There is no clergyman in this city who would object to the "Little Helpers" in his parish. If you would suggest the name of some one who would be interested in this work among Christ's little ones, you would oblige your rector. You are responsible if there is not a branch in your parish. The work of the Woman's Auxiliary is not being fully carried on in your parish under your direction. It is no burden to any parish. Some may say, the result is very small. It is not worth the trouble. There are more important things to look after than the work of the Little Helpers. What is the hardest task you have to do in your Auxiliary work? To try and get your members interested in missions. Why are women not interested in the greatest work of the church? First, they do not know anything definite about missions. Second, they do not want to know, and won't come to a meeting if they know "Missions" is to be the subject.

Children are willing to learn about missions, and how joyfully they give. The work of the Little Helpers is to train the children from their earliest infancy to know of Christ's Kingdom, its work, their privilege. They learn to pray for missions, work for missions, give for missions. The children appreciate the great honor and dignity that is conferred upon them in being made a co-worker with Christ Himself. To us is given the responsibility of planting the seed in their hearts. It must be watered and cared for. Of course it takes time and thought and care. Is there anything in the world that is worth while that does not take time and thought and care? We are not planting seed for today or next year, but—for eternity. Is that worth while? We are planting the seed on Christ's promise, "Whosoever you ask the Father in My name, He will give it you." "Ask of Me and I will give you the heathen for your inheritance."

Is there any work that you are doing in your parish more important than that? The children should have the best training we can give them, because in their hands lies the future of our beloved church.

Annual Report of the Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary for 1901
and 1902.

At the annual meeting of the Junior Auxiliary last year we were extremely sorry to have two of our officers resign: Mrs. Richard Macauley, who had been president of the Junior Auxiliary since its organization, and Miss Holmes, the secretary and treasurer, who was leaving the city and consequently had to resign.

We felt that we should miss both of these officers very much, and we thoroughly appreciated their long service in the work.

At the beginning of the present season the officers of the Auxiliary, upon discussing the matter, decided to have general meetings every two months instead of every month as formerly, and to try to make them bright and interesting, and have them as largely attended as possible.

All the meetings have been very successful and very well attended.

The success of the programs that have been given is due to Miss Trowbridge, the chairman of the Program Committee, who has planned all this work.

The regular monthly meetings of the officers of the Junior Auxiliary were resumed on September 14th, 1901, and there have been six meetings during the year, with an average attendance of eleven representatives from the different branches.

Three general meetings of the Auxiliary havn been held this year, the first at St. Peter's Church on Dec. 7th, 1901. At this meeting the committee appointed to pack the Christmas box reported that two large barrels and one box, containing clothing, books, pictures, toys and candy, 421 articles in all, had been sent to the Rev. Walter Hughson, Morganton, N. C. These barrels reached their destination before Christmas and helped make glad the hearts of many children in this mountain district, some of whom had never received a Christmas gift before.

At this meeting also, letters were read from Miss Mason, in China, the Rev. H. R. Quinn, Africa, Rev. E. P. Smith, Idaho, and the Rev. Mr. Burleson, South Dakota. The remainder of the meeting was devoted to a missionary observation party, at which those present tried to tell what country the different articles on exhibition represented and to give the names of the Bishops, missionaries and workers in the mission fields whose pictures were given.

The prize for this contest was won by Forrest Starring, a member of St. Peter's branch.

The second general meeting was held at St. Stephen's Church on Saturday, February 15th. This meeting was very largely attended and was conducted by the boys' branches of Epiphany Church, St. Paul's, St. Peter's and St. Stephen's, who told how the missionaries travel in different countries and showed the vehicles used. This meeting was especially enjoyable, as it was the first one that we have had that has been conducted entirely by the boys, and showed how successfully they could manage a meeting.

The third meeting was held at St. John's Church, Saturday, April 12th, the program being furnished by the Girls' and Boys' branches of Epiphany Church, who gave in costume a very entertaining and instructive dialogue about the mission school at Anvik, Alaska; and by the boys' branch of St. Paul's Church, who told about Mr. Smith's and Mr. Horn's missionary trip in Idaho. This talk was illustrated with lantern slides and was very interesting.

At this meeting the prize for the last contest, filling in the spaces in the missionary story about the Bishop Boone School, was awarded to Olive Dust, of the Church of the Messiah branch.

Four new branches have been formed during the year, one at Wyandotte, one at St. Mary's Church, one at St. Phillip's, and a boys' branch at St. Peter's Church.

Several of the branches had the privilege of hearing Bishop Rowe, of Alaska, tell of his work there, and also of hearing Bishop Brent.

The Juniors have contributed during the past year to the work among the colored people and poor whites in several of the Southern States, to Bishop Rowe's work in Alaska, to Bishop Brent, to Bishop Hare's work, and also have the Rev. E. P. Smith Scholarship in St. Hilda's School, Wuchung, China; besides their pledges to diocesan missions, the current expense fund and their contributions to the united offering.

Report of Secretary and Treasurer Missionary Lantern Slides and Exhibits.

The Missionary Slides and Exhibits have had a busy winter, the exhibit (consisting of curios, maps, models, books, etc.) assisting at five small meetings, and a large meeting at Bellows Falls, Vermont.

The missionary slides were sent to the following parishes, for use in illustrating missionary lectures: Emmanuel Church, Champaign, Ill.; St. Andrew's, Chicago; Trinity Church, Davenport, Iowa; St. Paul's, Grand Forks, N. D.; St. Mark's, Evanston, Ill.; Trinity Church, Williamsport, Pa.; St. Peter's, Detroit; St. Paul's, Jeffersonville, Ind.; St. Paul's, New Albany, Ind.; Good Shepherd, Chicago; Epiphany, Chicago; Christ Church, Detroit; St. Matthew's, Worthington, Ind.; St. John's, Saginaw; All Saints School, Sioux Falls, S. D. (2 sets); St. Paul's, Detroit, and two others in Chicago, while the slides were there for one month. Total number of meetings to date illustrated by the slides, 62. Reminding pictures distributed, about 6,000. The most delightful part of the Secretary's work has been the reading of many reports of enthusiastic meetings.

The year has been marked by two happy events—one, the first presentation of the Idaho slides. These pictures were taken by Rev. E. P. Smith in his travels there and make the work in the district of Spokane very real to us. The boys of the St. Paul's Juniors were the speakers on this occasion and performed the difficult task in a delightfully clear and winning way. (The boys' branch of St. Peter's also did the talking for another set of slides, and with delightful results.) The second happy event was the sending of a set of slides to a missionary to keep. These were 35 of the beautiful pictures from the Life of Our Lord (with hymns), and the sending was made possible by two generous friends, of Detroit. We should like to make this kind of work a regular branch of the slide department, especially as many missionaries now own their own lanterns.

We report with much regret the resignation of Miss Frances Frazer, who has had charge of the exhibit. Miss Frazer has been most efficient in every way, and will be much missed by the secretary especially.

This work will hereafter be in charge of Miss Alice Alexander, 464 East Congress street.
