REPORT OF RECORDING SECRETARY.

The bond of sympathy which comes from a common interest and a common aim is the force that has been strongest in bringing this body of women together to-day to review the work of the past year and to plan for that of the year to come. If, as Byron says, "the best of prophets of the future is the past," it behooves us to put our best endeavor into the present. As we look at the results of our efforts in the year that has just closed, let us consider whether we are satisfied to take them as an indication of what we shall accomplish in the coming year. Yet, in this examination we must not lose sight of the many good results.

There have been eight regular and two special meetings during the year which have been held in nearly as many different parishes. This going from branch to branch, judging by the cordial welcome extended to us on each occasion, has been a successful innovation, which we hope will grow into a custom—though we trust it may not be narrowed down to the city branches—but that we may go farther afield for at least one meeting in the year. I am sure that the memory of more than one such meeting can be pleasantly recalled by many of us. We have always taken home with us as much inspiration as we could have imparted on those occasions.

It was fortunate that early in the year we could have Miss Emery, our General Secretary, with us, for the inspiration imparted and enthusiasm enkindled by her visit have remained with us through the year. Her conference with the officers at the residence of Mrs. Mason, I am sure has helped them in the solution of many difficulties, while individual members must have felt their duty clearly defined at the meeting in St. Paul's Chapel. It was gratifying to see both these meetings so well attended.

At the monthly meeting in November we were fortunate in hearing Mr. Hope Gill, a missionary sent out from England to Western China, whose consecration to his work was strongly evident.

In December, Miss Paddock, the Deputation Secretary of the Girls' Friendly Society, told us of the large sums given to Missions by that society, which information was as gratifying as it was new to most of us.

One of the most inspiring and successful meetings of the year was held in January and was called an "experience meeting," to which each parochial branch was asked to send a delegate or letter. Responses were received from twenty-three branches, including several from outside of the city, all giving some report of their work. We hope this may be repeated each year and that all branches may be heard from.

It was our privilege at a special meeting to hear Mrs. Ridgley, of Wuchang, China, who came to tell us of her work; and later we enjoyed a talk by Miss Babcock, a missionary from the diocese of Tokio, Japan.

At the February meeting the Rev. Walter Hughson gave an account of many of his experiences among the poor whites in the district of Asheville, North Carolina.

In listening to these devoted workers who have given themselves to the cause one can easily comprehend how paramount to everything else is personal service. Yet our prayers, our interest and our gifts, though of secondary importance, are needed also.

The Quiet Morning was conducted by the Rev. J. N. McCormick, of Grand Rapids, in St. John's Chapel, on March 27, and adds one more to those precious "rests by the way" which mean so much to the spiritual life.

The success of the meetings of the year has been largely due to the Committee on Missionary Intelligence, who have provided a program for each meeting, and to those faithful ones who have responded to the request of the Committee to prepare papers on the different topics. We are pained to record the loss of one of the members of this Committee who has "gone before to that unknown and silent shore" to her final reward. How truly the poet has said, "To live in hearts we leave behind is not to die."

The subject of "General Missions" has been the all-absorbing topic of the past year and must remain so until we are able to give our proportion of the amount which the Board of Missions has asked of its Auxiliary. It seems to me that in view of the object for which we were organized (to help the Board) it is not a question only of—to what objects do we prefer to contribute on account of our personal interest, but first, to what objects can we contribute that will help the Board with its appropriations. That being settled and our duty in that respect being discharged, we can be free to follow our wishes in regard to "specials" which certainly do appeal to us very strongly and are quite worthy of our interest and help. May we be inspired to devise some means whereby our membership may be increased and our interest in the cause broadened. Could we arouse the zeal and enthusiasm which is now lying dormant in the diocese we should be able to more than meet our obligations. Let our endeavor be toward that end.

Hart and to her friends our heartfelt sympathy in their great bereavement, and praying that God may give them the comfort of His peace. Rejoicing with them “that the after glory of her earthly living is left to lighten them upon their way.”

When the petition was added to the Litany “that God would send forth more laborers into His harvest” God granted that request. Many noble men and women went forth to work in His vineyard. With the grant God sent a special blessing which He made manifest in a specific work for His Little Ones. That of a greater and wider knowledge and love of missions. The visible form of the blessing to-day is the band of Little Helpers.

Many of you have hurried past the wonderful wheat fields of the West during harvest-time. Have you ever thought of the spring-time, when the sower went forth to sow the seed. How he did all he could, and then waited through the long summer days until the harvest time,

when he could gather in the grain and then send it forth to feed some of the nations of the world. So, women of the Auxiliary, we who are honored in being workers with Christ's Little Ones are only sowing the seed. With us it is still the early spring-time. We know that this work is God's work, and that in His own time The Little Helpers will have grown to such proportions that, at His great harvest, it will be found that the fruit of The Little Helpers will have fed the souls of many of the nations of the world.

A penny a week, and a prayer offered up to God a few years ago by Gaylord Hart Mitchell has grown so wonderfully that in nearly every diocese and missionary jurisdiction in our church there are hundreds of little ones following Gaylord's goodly example; 12,000 Little Helpers giving over \$3,000 a year. Is this work sentimental and unpractical? Any business man would consider \$3,000 in ready money a very solid and substantial fact.

We believe that The Little Helpers is one of God's special blessings to His church. It is also a special blessing to each parish. We could not help noticing this fact: That where there was a strong branch of Little Helpers, there was sure to be a strong Woman's Auxiliary. In the history of the Little Helpers there was a time when we had secretaries looking for Little Helpers, but in some parishes it is changed. The harvest is ripe but the laborers are few. The Little Helpers have no one to lead them. Feed My lambs, Christ said, not once but twice. In the parishes where there are no secretaries do you at your meetings offer up a special prayer that God will put into the heart of some member to care for His lambs. "And all things whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive." Let not Christ's rebuke unto His disciples be said unto your parish. "Suffer the Little Ones to come unto Me, and forbid them not." We say these words not only to the President of the Parish Branch, but to every woman in that parish. "For it is not the will of your Father which is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish."

The little red box brings blessings with it. It blesses him that gives and him that takes. It blesses her that teaches the little heart to pray and the little hand to give. The little one drops the penny in the box first for the sake of the sweet smile of the mother and afterwards for the dear Lord's sake. So the mother may give the penny to the child to give to missions for the child's sake, but, as she learns more of God's work, she will give of her own accord for His dear sake. In such a way may the little red box be a blessing in your parish.

It is the wish of several branches that we should unite each year in our gifts to the work. So The Little Helpers will support a day school at Shanghai, China, and one at Wuchang, China, the latter a memorial to Mrs. Angelica Church Hart. To this Michigan pledges \$5.00, to be equally divided between the two schools. \$1.25 we gave to the Juniors to help them in their pledge for the Rev. E. P. Smith scholarship at St. Hilda's School, China. \$12 will be given to Miss Hayashai for our little brother Goishi Jinbo, of Osaka, Japan. We were asked to give \$2.50 for a baby organ as Michigan's share for the united work in Japan. We hardly knew how to answer that request because we are giving more to Japan than any other place, but The Little Helpers of Michigan want to have a share in every united gift. So we asked if any one would like to send a thank-offering in the name of some Little Helper who had come into their hearts and home lately. Immediately the thank-offerings came in and Michigan's Little Helpers have their share in this gift.

\$6.25 will be sent to Miss Higgins to care for Momo her African boy. She is ill and cannot do for him, so we must help one of Christ's faithful soldiers to carry her burden. Let us pray that God will raise her up once more to go forth and fight the good fight among the people of Liberia, whom she loves so well.

This year The Little Helpers of the church will send a font to Alaska. To this we will give \$5.00. To the kindergarten at St. Augustine's, Raleigh, N. C., we will send \$2.00 and to The Little Helpers' bed at the hospital there \$5.00. This is united work.

I want the Woman's Auxiliary of this diocese to know and love little Red Moon and South Wind, of White Rock, Utah, the wards of Miss Lucy N. Carter, because Michigan has asked the other branches to help her care for them. This special work is a memorial to one of our own sweet little members who was with us for a short time—Charles Locke Stevens. This fund is known officially as The Lucy N. Carter Emergency Fund. To the Board of Missions we sent \$10.00 to be spent as they thought best. To our friend, the Rev. Mr. Sayres, \$5.00. Aged and Infirm Clergy Fund, \$3.00. The Current Expense Fund \$11.31. Again have we been called by the Father to give Him another of our little band, John Armstrong Alexander. He took him into His arms to be with Him for evermore.

The Little Helpers have given to our beloved church, with the exception of the Holy Communion, one of the most beautiful sacred and spiritual services that we have. It is new to all of you; only two such meetings have occurred in our diocese. When you hear your rector announce that there will be a meeting of The Little Helpers at such a time, know that it is your privilege to come. Can you conceive of a more beautiful service than this of Christ's little ones coming to Him, not only for the blessing which He so surely will give them, but coming to Him with their little hearts full of praise and thanksgiving and their little hands filled with gifts as a thank-offering unto Him Who is their King.

The little box should be opened at home. The contents counted and placed in an envelope with the Little Helper's name and address. The child should bring the envelope and place it herself on the alms basin. The church or chapel should be prettily trimmed with flowers, if possible, and every thing done to make the service a beautiful one. The service should be short and bright, the especial prayer of The Little Helpers used, a hymn or two, a short address; then the offering taken up and placed on God's altar.

Holy offerings rich and rare,
Offerings of praise and prayer,
On Thine altar laid, we leave them.
Christ present them. God receive them.

It is a great privilege to be present at any of the Triennial Meetings of our Church, but especially dear to the women is the service when the United Offering is made. As we watched the alms basins filled to overflowing with gifts from far and near being placed on the altar, it seemed as if our hearts stood still and the presence of Almighty God was very near. Last Sunday, the same feeling came to me again, only it was more joyous, as I watched His Little Ones come and lay their gifts on His altar so willingly, so gladly, so joyously, I felt, O that we could offer unto our King such an offering of pure hearts and gladsome gifts. "Of such is the Kingdom of Heaven." Such was the worship of the little active members. What peace and comfort came to the hearts of many a sorrowing mother when again from God's altar rose the prayer in memory of her beloved little one who so early laid down the cross for the crown. Thus our little ones are taught early in life the beautiful truth of the communion of

saints. There is no spiritual separation. We in this busy life forget that until in our hour of deepest grief we turn again unto Him who is our refuge and our strength. "Earth's sweetest joy needs heaven to make it complete."

I know that the men and women who attended that service were blessed. Christ and His work meant more to them than ever before. Surely a little child shall lead them.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY FOR 1902 and 1903.

The Junior Auxiliary has had on the whole a very encouraging and successful year; they have been able to send almost double the number of Christmas gifts that they did last year and the pledges have amounted to about twice the sum that they did the previous year, eighteen branches having pledged where last year there were only eight.

Eight meetings have been held during the year, six officers' meetings and two general meetings, all of which have been very well attended.

At our first officers' meeting in the fall Mrs. Austin reported that thirty-five dollars had been raised by several branches of the Junior Auxiliary and some of the Sunday Schools, to send to Bishop Rowe for a dog; later we received a most interesting letter from Bishop Rowe acknowledging the receipt of the money. At this meeting also we were extremely sorry to receive the resignation of Miss Margaret Routledge, our Treasurer, as she was going to New York, to take up the work of a deaconess in St. Faith's School.

Bishop Davies appointed Miss May Leonard to succeed Miss Routledge as treasurer.

In the fall we had the opportunity of hearing Miss Emery at a monthly meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

She told us a great many things that we had been wanting to know about the Junior work.

At a meeting of the officers in October we received a letter from Miss Emery asking for 200 Christmas gifts for the colored work under Archdeacon Joyner at Columbia, S. C., also 200 for the Indian School at White Earth, Minn.

We decided to send to both these places and to hold a general meeting of the Junior Auxiliary at St. John's Parish House, at which the different branches would bring their gifts for the Xmas boxes and see what was to be sent.

This meeting was held on Saturday, November 22nd, and was one of the largest and most successful meetings that we have ever had. About 800 Christmas gifts and articles of clothing were brought by the children, so that we were able to send almost twice as many as they had asked for to each place.

All the clothing, toys and gifts were unusually nice, and were thoroughly appreciated both at White Earth and Columbia, S. C., as the grateful letters that we received from both places testified.

At this same meeting Mrs. Gill, a Church of England missionary from China, gave a very instructive and interesting talk on the work among the Chinese and how it is being carried on by the English Church.

We also had a missionary observation contest at this meeting. This consisted of articles representing the different mission fields, and was provided by the Boys' Branch of Epiphany Church.

In January we had the privilege of hearing Bishop Hare, of South Dakota, tell of his work in a most inspiring manner, and we came away with a very warm spot in our hearts for his Indians, among whom he is doing such wonderful work.

At the second general meeting, held on February 21st, at the Church of the Messiah, we had the pleasure of hearing the Rev. Walter Hughson, of Morganton, N. C., give a most interesting talk on his work among the colored people and poor whites in the mountain district of North Carolina.

At an officers' meeting in March it was decided to adopt a badge to be used by the Junior Auxiliaries of this diocese or by any Junior Auxiliaries wishing to adopt it; this badge or pin to be in the form of a silver shield on which is a cross.

A number of branches are already wearing the pins and we hope they will be generally adopted so that we may know the members of the Junior Auxiliary wherever we see them.

One new branch has been started during the year, at St. Andrew's Church, Detroit.

The branch that was started at St. Philip's church, just before the annual meeting last year, has grown most encouragingly, until it is now one of the largest branches in the city.

In another church a missions study class has been started, which it is hoped will form the nucleus of a Junior Auxiliary.

We hope next year to have more new branches formed and that those already formed will increase in numbers and strength.

REPORT OF SECRETARY AND TREASURER MISSIONARY LANTERN SLIDES.

The missionary lantern slides have had a useful winter, having been exhibited nineteen times; twelve times in Michigan, three times in Minnesota, and once each in Washington, D. C., South Dakota, Iowa and Pennsylvania. Total exhibitions to date, eighty-one. Many applications were refused on account of conflict in dates.

This committee desires to further enlarge the work by assisting missionaries in purchasing their own lanterns. This great advantage was illustrated recently in two cases. In one case, both lantern and slides were loaned with delightful results; in the other the missionary himself traveled with lantern and slides, having enthusiastic meetings in nine different places. After four of these meetings, one missionary wrote: "The offerings taken were enough to cover expenses, and pay the whole of the apportionment for these missions."

With the consent of the Auxiliary in Michigan, we shall use one-half of our receipts this year as a lantern fund.
