SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Thirteenth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in the Diocese of Minnesota, was held at Holy Trinity, Minneapolis, September 27th, 1894.

The service commenced at 10 a. m., with an address by Rt. Rev. E. S. Thomas, D. D., Bishop of Kansas, followed by the celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishops Whipple, Gilbert, Thomas, the Ven. Arch-Deacon Appleby and Dean Graham, being in the Chancel.

After the morning service the President took the chair and the Secretary called the roll, 35 parishes being represented by 263 women.

The meeting then adjourned to the Guild room, where the women of Holy Trinity served a bountiful lunch to 343 persons.

The afternoon meeting was opened by Bishop Whipple, Bishop Gilbert following with a short address. The President then delivered her annual address reviewing the work of the past, and considering plans for the ensuing year. She urged that we hold meetings for instruction as well as work; that each member subscribe to the "Spirit of Missions" and our own "Minnesota Missionary and Church Record."

That prayers for Missions be said at each Parish meeting.

For the Church Periodical Club she earnestly urged more encouragement, and warmer support than has been shown in the past.

She noted a marked increase of interest in the work in our Diocese, more mite chests distributed, and four new branches welcomed—St. John's, Mankato; St. Matthew's, Minneapolis; St. Cornelia, Birch Cooley, and St. John's in the Wilderness, White Bear Lake. Trinity, Anoka, and St. Paul's, Duluth, have been re-organized. In the field at large, she noted especially that new workers have been sent to Alaska, and a teacher to the Jane Bohlen school in Wuchang, China, both of which are of special interest to us, we having had the pleasure of meeting the Rev. John W. Chapman, and his companion, on their way to Alaska. The Jane Bohlen school is always dear to us, through the scholarships which we have supported for five years in the name of our Bishops, and for which the Duluth branch has pledged \$50.00 a year toward the support of a teacher.

Five special meetings have been held the past year—in November in Christ's Church, St. Paul, and St. Paul's, Minneapolis, to hear Miss Emery.

In January, through the kindness of Dean Graham, and earnest efforts of Mrs. Denis Follett, we were invited to meet for the first time with the clergy of the Central Convocation, in Gethsemane Church, Minneapolis. In April, at St. John's, St. Paul, to hear Rev. John W. Chapman, Alaska.

Our first semi-annual meeting was held in St. Paul during the Diocesan Council, June 7th. Bishop Whipple gave us one of his eloquent and loving appeals, and Rev. Dr. Ryan, of Duluth, delighted us with his address on "Strength in Unity of Purpose", emphasizing concerted action.

Three informal meetings of Diocesan officers have been held with an attendance of four.

The Vice-Presidents of the Convocations have aided greatly in sharing responsibility and by their wise counsel.

348 letters have been received and 642 written. In this vast Diocese, where visits must necessarily be few, we hope

the work may be broadened and quickened by letter-writing.

Our thanks are due the "Minnesota Missionary and Church Record" for full reports of our meetings.

The junior work has made so great an advance that it deserves a place by itself in this year's report. One more hopeful interest should be mentioned, viz: the mission study classes and "mission teas", where carefully prepared papers on missions are read and discussed.

Looking forward we must face the fact that our work will be harder than ever. More to do and less to do with. Letters received from our missionaries in this cold Northwest are most touching, the reduced stipend does not alone mean the denial of luxury, but actual discomfort.

One missionary writes: "Our small salaries are cut down, but we are comforted by the thought that the box will help us out." Since our faithful missionaries so count upon our boxes, we must see to it that the contents of the boxes meet their exact needs, that nothing superfluous or unworthy find a place there. Love must be put in, and love neither omits the useful nor throws in the useless.

"It is not the deed we do,

Though the deed be never so fair,

But the love that the good Lord looketh for

Hidden with tender care,

In the heart of the deed so fair."

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

This association shall be called the Minnesota Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions

ARTICLE II.

The object of this association shall be to unite all the Parishes in the Diocese, in the different branches of Missionary work; Foreign, Domestic and Diocesan.

ARTICLE III.

Any Parish may become a member of this association by the payment of one dollar annually.

ARTICLE IV.

The annual meeting shall be held in either St. Paul or Minneapolis in the autumn of each year, as shall be appointed, for the election of officers, and for the transaction of such other business as shall properly come before the meeting.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. The officers shall be two, President and Secretary and Treasurer. *

SEC. 2. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all meetings, to arrange for the organization of Parochial branches, and to have general charge of the work.

SEC. 3. The duty of the Secretary shall be to keep a correct record of the meetings, and to conduct the necessary correspondence.

SEC. 4. The duty of the Treasurer shall be to receive

and disburse funds, under direction of the President and Secretary, and render account of the same at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Each Parochial branch shall submit a report of the year's work to the Secretary of the Diocesan branch, to be read at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

Each Parochial branch may be represented at the annual meeting by four delegates who shall be entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VIII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

BY-LAWS.

I.

The election of officers at the annual meeting shall be by ballot.

II.

Special meetings may be called by the President at such time and place as she may designate, for the purpose of stimulating interest in the work.

III.

The regular order of business for the annual meetings shall be as follows:

1. Offices of devotion.

2. Reading of the minutes of last meeting.
3. Report of officers and committees.
4. Election of officers.
5. Miscellaneous business and addresses.

IV.

These By-Laws may be amended at any meeting by vote of a majority present.

* NOTE.—At the annual meeting, 1891, by motion, the President was authorized to appoint managers in the Convocations, which was done, with the title of Vice-President.
