## ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

---

*To the Right Rev. Daniel S. Tuttle, D.D., Bishop of Missouri,  
and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

Looking backward is not always a pleasant task. We would rather dream of the possibilities of the future, than face the realities of the time that is gone. But as the New Year is the time for looking backward as well as forward, for seeing where we have failed, as well as gained, and where the weak places are, which must be fortified with good resolutions, so the beginning of the diocesan year brings the time for looking backward upon what we have done and left undone, and forward, with strength and resolution for still greater things in the Church's work, that we may make our own.

Upon the first reading, there seems a decided decrease in our work this year that makes the looking backward a little painful, until we recollect that last year was an unusual one for us; that it is not every year we find a generous woman ready to give a rectory to a Missionary, and then the lines have been drawn more closely upon what constitutes Auxiliary work; so, though the figures are smaller, the work has really increased, and that looking backward may be without regret.



The same demands and calls and interests of each year have come to us. Miss Mailes' visit was an inspiration to work for Japan, and we have \$100 ready for her to take back to her work in the autumn. Mr. Partridge would have converted any skeptic from an unbelief in foreign missions, and \$50 have been sent him for China. Missions have been helped in Arkansas and East Carolina, and the Mission of the Holy Cross in New York. But all these are *new*. We must have new work and life, or we shall not grow; and yet, when we look backward we find our Mite Boxes have brought in just one-half of what we had last year, which means our scholarships must suffer. A little caution in looking to our regular pledges first would make the looking backward brighter. Our great gain has been a more methodical way of working. Each year we report more money as having passed through the Treasurers' accounts, and again the sum given in money far exceeds the value of boxes.

As a diocesan officer, I cannot help wishing that we might do more of our work in connection with the General Board of Missions. We all enjoyed Miss Emery's visit last fall and felt the good of it; and yet, if all the dioceses worked as we do, who would keep Miss Emery at her post? We have rarely sent any money to the Bible House for general work, except the annual \$25 for Foreign Missions, and yet the Auxiliary has its pledges to fulfill, and looks to the diocesan branches to help it.

For the first time since its organization, we have been called upon to give up to a higher life and service, one of our Auxiliary officers. Our Vice-President, Mrs. John W. Harrison, entered into rest October 24th, 1891. Her successor, Mrs. Lackland,



who promised such loyalty, and had such interest in the work, has been stricken down upon a bed of pain, and though God in His mercy has seen fit to restore her in part to her bodily health, hers must hereafter be a quieter service, and it is with great regret that we have received her resignation.

The Missions Class has been carried on through the winter. Our President's paper on the subject, read at the Conference for Churchwomen in Philadelphia, has led to the formation of classes in that city and elsewhere. We must feel a little pride that our success has helped to create a deeper interest in the study of Missions, with greater intelligence than ever before. Would a plea for a better attendance at this class be unfitting?

At the beginning of Lent, Father Huntington gave a Quiet Day for women. The Cathedral was crowded all day with an earnest, attentive congregation. But the record of that day must be written in our hearts and read in our lives.

Next October the General Convention meets in Baltimore. At the same time the Auxiliary holds its triennial meeting. If any Churchwoman can see her way clear to attend that meeting she will be amply repaid. The intelligence she will gain, the interest and inspiration that will be roused within her, will help her and her parish upon her return. It is proposed that there shall be a United Offering that day, carried there by the officers from their several branches. The Enrollment Fund is the first object suggested, but it is now decided that the diocesan offering may go for any specified work.

Last year the plea for an Emergency Fund found favor among



you. Because it was not needed will be no reason for not providing it another year.

Taking the work of the year as it stands, need the looking backward discourage us? Seeing our failures, we shall know where our strength must lie for future needs, and then, "forgetting those things which are behind," shall we not press forward towards the mark for the prize of our high calling in Christ Jesus?

CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSOURI BRANCH  
OF THE  
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

---

*Adopted May 25, 1888.*

ARTICLE I.

This Society shall be called the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Its object is not to change the work of any Parish, but, by united and sympathetic action, to increase the interest, and to unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's Missionary work.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of Missouri who so desire, and who work for Missions in connection with their Parish organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Society.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

All Parish Societies in the Diocese, who so desire, shall be considered constituent members of this Society; provided they send their reports of money collected and work done for Missions to their respective Parish Representatives in the Board of Managers.

ARTICLE VI.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, the Treasurers of Special Funds, and the Parish Representatives. Nine shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VII.

Each Parish with a Society or Societies working for Missions shall be entitled to four Representatives in the Board, one of whom shall be their Corresponding Secretary.

ARTICLE VIII.

The qualifications of a Representative which shall constitute her a member of the Board shall be:

1. Certification of her appointment by her Rector, or her election by the Parish Society to be such Representative.
2. Payment of a membership fee of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer.

ARTICLE IX.

The payment of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary Member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary Members shall be entitled to seats, but not to votes, and shall not be counted in making a quorum



ARTICLE X.

There shall be four meetings of the Board of Managers each year, to be held as follows: On or about the last Fridays, respectively, in October, January and April; and the annual meeting for the election of officers, which shall be on the Friday following the Diocesan Convention.

ARTICLE XI.

One of the said meetings shall be also a general meeting of the Society, and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ARTICLE XII.

The meetings shall be held in any Church or Chapel designated by the President.

ARTICLE XIII.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the Managers.

ARTICLE XIV.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.
2. The Vice-President shall take the duties of the President in her absence.
3. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society; send notices of the meetings and keep a record of them; keep an account of the work done by the women of the Diocese, as reported by the Parish Secretaries, and report this annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York; and prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Convention.
4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board, shall receive and disburse all moneys sent to the Society for any

branch of Missionary work, and for the expenses of the Society, presenting a report of same at each quarterly meeting.

ARTICLE XV.

The Parish Representatives are to report through their Corresponding Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary all work done for Missions, and all money raised for Missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for Missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board, and to carry back to their Parish Societies Missionary intelligence, and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in Missions.

ARTICLE XVI.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.
