OF THE
Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary
to the Board of Missions.

President's Address.

*To the Rt. Rev. Daniel S. Tuttle, D.D., Bishop of Missouri,
and the Rt. Rev. F. F. Johnson, Coadjutor, the Officers
and Women of the Missouri Branch of the Woman's
Auxiliary:*

In looking over our year just drawing to a close, it gives me great pleasure to see how we have gone forward, and all our work has made advancement, which is progression.

We were asked to try to put a worker in the field, and we have helped to do so; to have a Traveling Secretary, which has proven most satisfactory. All our branches have taken on new life, and some new ones have been added. All of our Officers were in attendance at the General Convention in New York, and received instruction, guidance and spiritual help. It gave us a greater insight into our work and privileges, and now that we are to have the Convention here in 1916, we must prepare to grapple with its problems and master its difficulties.

We have been most fortunate in having good speakers for our meetings, both from the foreign and home fields. Bishop Roots is always a welcome guest. Mrs. Standring we will remember for her bright, happy face and her interest and love for her work. She was the inspiration for the motor boat which we hope to send to China. Bishop Kinsolving, of Brazil, won all hearts with his eloquence and plea for his people.

Our Juniors are setting us a wonderful example in their

work. All the branches have been interested, separately and together, in boxes for those near and far away. I think our sum total will exceed what it has ever been before.

Miss Allen, our Secretary for the Church Periodical Club, has sent us her resignation to take place at this meeting. We accept it with great regret. She has served us so very acceptably and faithfully for many years, and we are sorry she felt it best she should resign. Mrs. Baker has kindly consented to accept the position, and we will give her a most cordial welcome among us.

We were very grateful to Bishop Lloyd for his uplifting talk to us, and glad so many of our representative women heard him, and afterwards were able to meet him. He is a strong power in the Church for her good. It will be added pleasure to make our pledge for him at this meeting.

In view of the Convention of 1916, we are especially asking your co-operation, time and prayers for the success of our meetings in preparation for it. By the time of our fall meeting, we will have appointed heads of committees with power to act, when our real work will begin, so when 1916 is here we will be ready to give the General Auxiliary a warm Western welcome. All must be giving it thought, and bring in suggestions as to ways and means for the accomplishment of our efforts.

We have many privileges and blessings which we do not always appreciate. May "God give us His Holy Spirit to see and know what things we ought to do, and grace and power to fulfill the same."

Secretary's Report.

To the Rt. Rev. Daniel S. Tuttle, S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri; the Rt. Rev. Frederick F. Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coadjutor, and Members of the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions:

To gather together the records of this year's work has been the writing of a veritable "glad book," so full it is of golden deeds and many mercies. Any fears your Secretary may have had lest the work be hindered by her long holiday were entirely unfounded.

In her absence two things were accomplished that she had made her aim for many years. Look over a file of old reports and see how often she has asked that a fund might be in the treasury for traveling expenses of the officers to enable them to go about the Diocese encouraging an interest in the Auxiliary. For thirty years we have paid our own expenses for every missionary journey and necessarily they could not be many. Now you have appointed a Travelling Secretary with this pleasant duty and her expenses are met by a fund pledged expressly for it. Her own report will tell what Miss Scheetz has done and we hope another year will show as the result of her work, more organized branches through the Diocese. Cape Girardeau reports an organized branch but too late for any work this year, as does also St. Timothy's, St. Louis.

The other aim of our Auxiliary is an accomplished fact. We have "our own missionary." Not from our own diocese, but from our own Province, which is the first step beyond our immediate Diocesan family.

At the Auxiliary Institute a year ago, the Rev. Mr. Silver told of two physicians in our department ready and willing to go to China, but the Board had no money to send them, and suggested that we bring it to pass. That hint was all that Miss Scheetz needed to get the co-operation of some of the other

dioceses in the Province and the result was accomplished. Dr. Stover, of Little Rock, sailed with his wife on Thanksgiving Day to help carry on the blessed ministry of healing in our hospital at Anking. But the climate and life have already proved too much for him and he must return. The other man who had offered himself, Dr. Wassells, has now gone and will be our missionary at Wuchang. This gift counts on our apportionment and Missouri has given one-half of it, \$700.00. The suggestion came from Mr. Silver and for that and in gratitude for the help and inspiration he gave us during his three years as Department Secretary it seemed fitting that the fund should bear his name and be known as the "Percy Silver Missionary to China from the Southwest Province."

One Junior Branch has graduated and become a part of the Woman's Auxiliary. The Theodora Branch at Kirkwood has been welcomed by a special service into our ranks, and may they be indeed a gift of God to us with all the hope and enthusiasm that only youth can bring, and may they be the first of many to bring their junior training to the work.

The wonderful success of our year has been largely due to the honored visitors we have had. Bishop Roots for our autumn meeting and Mrs. Standring in January gave us vivid pictures of China in its needs in this great crisis of its history, when the door is open and the opportunity awaits us to plant the cross in that great land. In Mrs. Standring's address she told of the need of a motor boat for the Rev. Robt. Wilson, whose life is spent in going from city to city on the highways of China, the great canals which are the only means of communication. Quite spontaneously, with a word of commendation from the Rev. Mr. Wise, a sum we hope sufficient was pledged, and we expect soon to arrange for sending such a boat as is required. Special meetings were held for Bishop Thomas and Bishop Kinsolving, always welcome guests, and from the Board we have had Mr. John Wood and Bishop Lloyd, and each has helped in his own way. The vision always so near Bishop Lloyd is made clearer to us, dollars

and cents are no longer just our pledges which must be kept or our apportionment which must be met, they are just the material tangible tokens of a higher perception of a love that gave all for us.

That blessed institution of the Missouri Auxiliary, our Quiet Day, was given by the Rev. Robt. N. Spencer, of Kansas City, and was most helpful.

In doing for the lands that are very far off we must not overlook the needs that lie close to us. The silent churches in our diocese are gradually being opened and while we are giving to the Board of Missions we must do our part in helping some of our own weak places.

The two hundred and fifty dollars that we give to Diocesan Missions is most needed and many times that amount could be wisely used, while here in our city St. Stephen's and Holy Cross could double their activity with larger gifts.

We rejoice to welcome again our little branch at Canton, which for years headed our list of parishes, and which had fallen away probably just for the lack of personal visitation. Columbia sends no report, nor St. Charles, and De Soto and Sullivan and Epiphany are held because some one woman cared and sent her offering.

Our United Offering of nearly \$3,000 given last October in New York has sent its glad note through all our work.

With thankfulness we write the record that death has not called one of our representatives from us this year.

Do you wonder that as we make up these records of God's goodness to us we call it a "glad book"?

Just one minor note is heard. Our faithful and most efficient correspondent of the Church Periodical Club has sent in her resignation. She has given to the work nineteen years of devotion and fidelity and success such as we scarcely realize. Because the work has no money report and is the gift of what we have used and cast aside we hardly estimate at its full value the cheer our passed on magazines give, nor the persistent effort on Miss Allen's part to increase its efficiency.

Her long continued absence from our midst is our only reason for willingness to accept her resignation.

In 1916 the General Convention comes to us. It is a great privilege and a great task. It will need the help of every woman in the diocese to carry out our part in the Woman's Auxiliary. Unless one has attended a General Convention and seen the eager throng at the United Offering Service, at the Study Classes, at the Morning Conferences, one does not realize the thought, the planning and the work that are before us. When our Vice-President gave the invitation to the Auxiliary in New York she said "co-operation" was the thought she would put before the women for the next three years. That is the aim we must keep before us in our preparation. When you know that 2,500 women registered in New York at the Auxiliary headquarters you will realize that we need the co-operation of every woman giving her best for the common good, for a pride in our city when we shall welcome our Auxiliary sisters who are strangers in our gates, when we gather together to talk of the things concerning the Kingdom of God.

A personal word may be pardoned if I speak of the privilege which was mine in my year of holiday. I have come face to face with the Church's missions in Honolulu, the Philippines, China and Japan. The splendid men and women who are doing that work deserve our respect, our sympathy and our prayers and our support of their efforts. Not once did I hear a word of complaint or discontent for the discomforts which come in their work nor for the loneliness which is one of their greatest trials. I have come back to the work with a deepened interest and I hope a greater consecration for my service. In 41 addresses this winter I have tried to give our women a clearer idea of what it means to carry the Cross to a pagan people. With my own eyes I saw the need of a new St. Mary's Hall for the girls at Shanghai and we have sent a generous gift towards it. A joyful gift of 12 American dolls which some of you dressed so

daintily has also gone to these same girls. A ward in St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, has been furnished with tables and chairs because I told women quite outside our diocese how much they were needed. St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, needs not my words to tell of its great work as an international hospital as well as for the Japanese, and Miss Lewis has brought with her efforts a splendid gift to that. I have seen heathen mothers bring their little children to worship the great bronze statue of Buddha and kneel with a reverence and devotion we well might emulate, and I know we can hardly estimate the blessing of having been born in a Christian land.

Never have we had such a record as closes this book of golden deeds. The calls have been unusual and have all been generously met, but it gives us a standard which we may find hard to live up to, and we can only pray that we make not the measure of dollars and cents the standard of our service but only the vitalized message of Christ's love and peace to all mankind.

The United Offering.

MOTTO—"A gift from every Church woman in the Diocese."

The United Offering is a *thank-offering*, made triennially, at the time and place of the General Convention, by the women of the Church. After its presentation, it is sent to the Board of Missions, and is used for the training, sending and support of women missionaries, and the care of them when sick or disabled. Over *one hundred and fifty women* missionaries, teachers, doctors and nurses, are now being supported by this offering. It is not limited to the Woman's Auxiliary or to any organization, but is open to all who have any desire to help the mission cause, or to express to their Heavenly Father their thanks for the many mercies that come unheeded in all our lives.

In this Diocese, we are following our usual plan of asking each woman to select an anniversary of personal interest, and on that day to send a gift large or small, to the United Offering. *No sum* is specified. It should be a *free will thank-offering*. Pledge cards for names and dates are provided, and when filled out should be sent to the Parish United Offering treasurer, who sends them to the Diocesan treasurer of the United Offering, to be enrolled in the Anniversary Book.

We also have the United Offering Mite Boxes, for any who prefer that way of giving, and they may be had on application.

Our part in the United Offering of 1913 was \$2,850.00 from 33 parishes and missions, the Juniors, and \$15 from miscellaneous sources.

At our annual meeting, May 29, 1914, we reported \$568.15 on the United Offering of 1916.

Traveling Secretary's Report.

From May 30th, 1913, to May 29th, 1914.

To Mrs. E. C. Simmons, President, and the Women of the Missouri Auxiliary:

It is with many misgivings that the first Traveling Secretary of this Branch presents the first annual report of a new enterprise—a meagre report for twelve whole months, showing little accomplished, but some possibilities for the future. During the year she visited the following places, and talked to the women on the history, purpose and work of the Auxiliary: Bonne Terre, Palmyra (twice), Monroe, Macon, Mexico, Thayer, Poplar Bluff, Rolla, St. James, Cuba, St.

Charles, Jefferson City, Fulton, Columbia, Cape Girardeau, Chaffee, and Overland Park, besides accepting the invitations of several city and suburban parish branches. On two trips she was accompanied by the Juniors' President, Mrs. Howard, who added greatly to the interest of the meetings. In several places the Auxiliary already existed in a more or less flourishing condition; in one (Macon) a branch was organized at once, while in most of the others there was some promise of future development. In two of the weakest missions, Fulton and Chaffee, the mission study idea was taken up with interest, and in four or five others some mission study has been carried on. A few new subscriptions to *The Spirit of Missions* were secured, some "Little Helpers" mite boxes were given out, and an effort made to introduce the United Offering everywhere. The Traveling Secretary in this year's experience has learned the meaning of "I was a stranger and ye took me in," and she wishes to record here her gratitude for the cordial hospitality shown her everywhere, for the help and co-operation of the clergy and the Church women wherever she went, and also for the support and counsel of the Bishop and Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese. Wishing to justify herself somewhat for what seems an inadequate year's work, may she add that she would gladly have visited a number of other points, but the "convenient season" did not seem to come.

Her report in brief is as follows:

Visits to parishes and missions outside the city, 18.

Visits to city and suburban branches, 6.

Letters written, 92.

Postal cards, 31.

A few books and many leaflets distributed. Well-regulated traveling secretaries seem to record also "letters received," but because a comparison of number might be embarrassing, the present one has omitted this item.

In February, the officers of the Woman's Auxiliary and Junior Department went out to Kirkwood, and with quite a formal ceremony our first Branch of Juniors became the Theodora Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. We are sorry here to record the loss of St. Margaret's Branch in this parish, but are made glad again by the addition of a younger branch. The Church of the Ascension lost one branch also, but gained another. We have new branches at St. Stephen's, St. Mary's, St. Timothy's, St. Philip's, Trinity, Cathedral, Rolla and Mexico. So you see we are steadily growing. The work all along the line has im-

proved. All the branches have done some mission study work, and excellent and intelligent box work. We had a splendid Corporate Communion for the United Offering in December at St. George's, and a well-attended Good Friday service at St. Timothy's. We must not forget the Juniors' voluntary Christmas gifts outside their usual box to some mission. Bishop Johnson gave a list of children in out-lying country districts and some in our own city, who would probably not be remembered at this season—to each of these was sent a personal gift. About two hundred all together were thus made happy, and now the Bishop has a "Remembrance Book" in which he is writing the names of the sick, sorrowful and "shut-in" ones. So I hope next Christmas we shall be able to accomplish much more. If the mothers of the Juniors and the members of the Woman's Auxiliary will give us their help and their prayers I feel sure that we shall be finer and better than before.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSOURI BRANCH
of the
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Adopted May 25, 1888. Amended May 30, 1913.

Article I.

This Society shall be called the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

Its object is not to change the work of any Parish, but, by united and sympathetic action, to increase the interest, and to unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's Missionary work.

Article III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of Missouri, who so desire, and who work for Missions in connection with their Parish organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Society.

Article IV.

The officers shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, of whom the second shall be the President of the Junior Auxiliary, Secretary, Treasurer, and United Offering Treasurer, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Article V.

All Parish Societies in the Diocese, who so desire, shall be considered constituent members of this Society, provided they send their reports of money collected and work done for Missions to their respective Parish Representatives in the Board of Managers.

Article VI.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, the Special Secretaries and Treasurers, and the Parish Representatives. Nine shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article VII.

There shall be an Executive Committee, composed of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and Special Secretaries and Treasurers, who shall have authority between regular quarterly meetings to appropriate funds in the hands of the Treasurer.

Article VIII.

1. Each Parish with a Society or Societies working for Missions shall be entitled to four (4) Representatives in the Board, one of whom shall be the Corresponding Secretary, and may increase this number to five by appointment of a Junior Director as Representative, her dues being paid to her own Treasurer.

2. Any additional branches formed hereafter in a Parish where the Auxiliary already exists shall be entitled to two (2) representatives.

Article IX.

The qualifications of a Representative which shall constitute her a member of the Board shall be:

1. Certification of her annual appointment by her Rector or her election by the Parish Society to be such Representative.

2. Payment of a membership fee of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer.

Article X.

The payment of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary Member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary Members shall be entitled to seats, but not to vote, and shall not be counted in making a quorum.

Article XI.

There shall be four meetings of the Board of Managers each year, to be held as follows: On or about the last Fridays, respectively, in October, January and April; and the annual meeting for the election of officers which shall be held on the Friday following the Diocesan Convention.

Article XII.

One of said meetings shall be also a general meeting of the Society, and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese.

Article XIII.

The meetings shall be held in any Church or Chapel designated by the President.

Article XIV.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the managers.

Article XV.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.
2. The First Vice-President shall take the duties of the President in her absence.
3. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society; send notices of the meetings, and keep a record of them; keep an account of the work done by the women of the Diocese, as reported by the Parish Secretaries, and report this annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York, and prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Convention.
4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board or Executive Committee, shall receive and disburse all money sent to the Society for any branch of Missionary work, and for the expenses of the Society, presenting a report of same at each quarterly meeting.

Article XVI.

The Parish Representatives are to report through their Corresponding Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary all work done for Missions; and all money raised for Missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for Missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board, and to carry back to their Parish Societies missionary intelligence, and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in Missions.

Article XVII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.
