THE THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
**Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary
to the Board of Missions.**

President's Address.

To The Rt. Rev. Daniel S. Tuttle, D.D., S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri; The Rt. Rev. F. F. Johnson, D.D., Coadjutor, and The Officers and Women of The Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary:

We are about to close our Thirty-Fourth Year of The Missouri Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary, and we are most grateful for what it has been to us, and the help we have tried to be to the Board which we represent. Our year in some respects may not show great advancement, but in others more.

We had our Vice-President and Educational Secretary present at the meeting of the Provincial Synod of the Southwest, and they brought us inspiration and knowledge of its workings. We were asked to consider the question of the Woman's Auxiliary having a provincial organization, and to send a representative to the next meeting of the Synod— instructed how to vote.

It was our privilege to have a few days' visit from Miss Tillotson, the General Secretary of the Study Classes from the Board of Missions, and rare days they were. She gave most helpful talks and suggestions on Mission Study Classes—their importance and helpfulness; and we know that many were actuated to start such classes, and they were successful. Every one felt her inspiration and we were glad she came, and hope to see her soon again.

Another pleasure of more recent date was the visit from Miss Hobart, with her wonderful personality and her fine

presentations of the Chinese and Indian Monologues, which we enjoyed and which were so well received.

This is the end of the Twenty-Sixth Year of our Mite Box Auxiliary Scholarship at the Bishop Robertson Hall. It has served a good purpose and helped in many ways. The girls who have had the privilege of the scholarship have been greatly benefited, and it has enabled them to accept and fill positions which they could not otherwise have held. In all these years we have received in the mite boxes, the sum of \$5,148.58. We do not expect to give them up, as on the little blue box it says, "For the General Treasury, to be used for special objects as shall be selected and voted on at the Quarterly Meetings." Our General Treasury is always having many demands on it and it often cannot comply for want of funds. So please take them as usual and help us.

Our preparations for the General Convention in 1916 have been well inaugurated. Our Executive Committee has been formed and some of the heads of the committees selected—so this fall work will really begin in earnest. We hope every Auxiliary woman will hold herself in readiness to assist all she can. I wish that we *all* might realize more than we do that we are truly a part of the Woman's Auxiliary. Let us not forget we are a great company of earnest, loving and thoughtful women, and that we want each one honestly to do her best. It means the daily prayer, with unfaltering faith in the answer which must come.

Let us therefore turn glad hearts to face the work of the new year, and ask God's blessing on it.

Secretary's Report.

*To The Rt. Rev. D. S. Tuttle, S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri, and
The Rt. Rev. Frederick F. Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coad-
jutor, and Members of the Missouri Branch of the
Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions:*

In the Pastoral Letter of the House of Bishops issued from Minneapolis last October, the clergy and people are urged in view of the terrible war and its consequences "to let the spirit of self sacrifice be called into willing action so that the beneficences of religion, charity and missions may not suffer loss."

In our simple way of expressing it we have tried to maintain all our pledges this year. The figures of our report show a decrease from last year, when several generous specials and the last six months of the United Offering of 1913 made us write such a glad book. In that only tangible measure, of figures, we have held our own. In consecration, in love, in service we pray that the gifts may be acceptable in God's sight.

The cries of wounded soldiers, of homeless women and little children have reached our ears, and no women have responded more generously to the needs of the Red Cross and the Belgian Relief than have our Auxiliary Members. We realize that in time of peace the spirit and capacity to give are only latent, waiting to be roused by some pressing need. Our aim must be to see that our soldiers who fight under Christ's banner may not suffer loss.

Our guests this year, Rev. Mr. Betticher and Bishop Howden, both had splendid gifts to help the work on the far banks of the Yukon and in New Mexico. Our pledge for Mr. Chapman in Alaska last May was used to dig a much needed well at the mission at Anvik so that as he wrote we literally gave cups of cold water to Christ's little ones. Our Quiet Day was conducted most helpfully by our Provincial Secretary, the

Rev. Mr. Eckel. Miss Tillotson's visit was a true inspiration for missionary study, for it is impossible to care for a thing of which we know nothing, and Miss Hobart's impersonations gave us a vivid touch with life in the foreign field.

Several changes are coming in the work this year. After 27 years of usefulness our Bishop Robertson Scholarship, originally supported by the Alumnae, and that Auxiliary Scholarship supported by the mite boxes, will end in June with the closing of the school. Many daughters of missionaries in this Diocese have been equipped with a good education in a school where the standards of Christian gentleness and refinement ranked equally with those of secular learning. The mission of the little blue mite box must not end with the scholarship, but its contents will be used for an equally worthy cause.

Last summer Miss Edith Alter, of Kirkwood, offered as a volunteer worker for Wyoming under Bishop Thomas. In the autumn she was appointed teacher in the school, continuing her evangelistic work at the same time, so that at the time of the Bishop's visitation she had a class for holy baptism as well as a well instructed class for confirmation. Another volunteer from St. George's is taking a six months' test in the Virginia mountain work. This is the priceless gift of life added to our year's service.

By a ruling at the Missions House boxes prepared for missionaries in the Diocese are not counted as auxiliary work and are not reported to New York. Long ago the Diocese relinquished aid from the Board, but boxes were still sent our missionaries by other Auxiliary branches. At our April meeting it was resolved that we relieve the Board of the box work in Missouri and provide them ourselves. If we care for large figures we must know that this will lessen our Auxiliary report by many hundred dollars. Our missionaries will not suffer, for Missouri sends good boxes. The old time criticism of cheap goods, old finery and unshapely garments has never been made of our boxes.

Our Heavenly Father has taken to her rest one of our oldest representatives, Mrs. Geo. Storrs, of Hannibal, appointed in 1894; worked as her strength and declining years would permit, but was unknown to the Auxiliary except as our officers visited her parish.

In order that it can be more readily seen what proportion of our work has supplied home needs, helping in work at Holy Cross and St. Stephen's, rural diocesan work and our pledges for diocesan missions, the representatives at the April meeting decided that diocesan work should be separated under each parish report. You will see the change and note that about one-fourth of our gifts have been made for work in Missouri. Thus beginning with the home we have tried to aid in sending the Gospel to the uttermost parts of the earth.

At a meeting of the Auxiliary officers and representatives of the Southwest Province held in conjunction with the Provincial Synod last January, the women voted to refer the question "Shall we have a Provincial Organization of the Auxiliary" to the several dioceses, with the request that after consultation with their Bishops they appoint and instruct their delegates how to vote at the Synod next January.

This brings to the women the problem of the Provincial System which has been a leading one in the General Convention for the last 25 years. The men passed it in 1913. The question has now come to the women. To augment and to facilitate the Missionary work in every possible way is our desire. Five of the eighteen missionary jurisdictions are in this Province where the Indian, the Negro, the mountaineer and the white are all in need of help. Conference with the women coming in more direct contact with these needs is bound to give us a better insight into conditions and a desire to improve them. That Auxiliary meetings should be held in connection with the Synod is unquestionably desirable. Whether these shall be under special organization and how far the powers of organization shall extend are the only problems. They come before you to-day for decision.

We have a task and a pleasure before us in preparing for the General Convention in 1916, the year which celebrates our beloved Bishop's fifty years of service in his high office. Our president has given the whole management into the hands of the vice-president and plans are taking definite shape for next winter. In giving the invitation in New York for the Auxiliary to come to us, Miss Lewis said "Co-operation" should be our slogan. Personal effort must be used in forming committees where a woman's best talent will be brought into play, in finding the point of contact with other women, that will result in the inspiring gatherings, the great United Offering service and the same spirit of consecration that characterizes the Auxiliary Triennials. We shall meet our missionary saints and heroes face to face and hear the always self-effacing story of their work. It is the privilege of the women of St. Louis, not only the women of the Auxiliary, to give them the welcome they deserve.

The United Offering.

MOTTO—"A gift from every Church woman in the Diocese."

As President Wilson, in his masterful letter to Germany, said, the United States were never as *united* as now, so we can truthfully and thankfully say that the United Offering was never as *united* as it is to-day. From a little far away mission, in the southern part of the Diocese, where there are about twenty members, all but three have a share in their United Offering, which is three times as large as ever before. From a parish nearer home, but not in the city, 99 women, more than one-half their number, have had a part. In a city parish, where a few years ago less than ten people gave, 110 United Offering envelopes were given out in February and March, and they report gifts from sixty women. Each of these parishes have reported over \$100. In many other parishes, where the sums are less conspicuous, there has been a marked increase in the number of gifts, and with very few exceptions the totals for the year are considerably larger.

Every member canvassing is in the air, and happily some of the Auxiliary workers think they are losing a great opportunity if the United Offering does not come in for a share of its attention.

The fact that the United Offering is to be presented here is a great incentive, and many of us are trying to carry out our motto—"a gift from every Church woman in the Diocese"—with the earnest desire that when the gift is presented, it may really represent *every* woman and girl. In visiting the parishes great interest is always felt in the 175 women workers that the United Offering supports. When we consider that this has been the middle year, when we have neither the impulse of the first, nor the spur of the last year, and that it represents no extraordinary gifts, but a healthy increase of women interested, it is gratifying to be able to report over \$1,500 on our United Offering of 1916. It comes from 30 parishes and missions, and the Juniors.

Traveling Secretary's Report.

To Mrs. E. C. Simmons, President, and the Women of the Missouri Auxiliary.

Your Traveling Secretary has but a small report to make, unworthy of the possibilities of our great Diocese. While this is largely due to her own short-comings, she begs to say she has not in every case been entirely responsible for she may not go into any parish or mission except by the invitation or permission of the rector or minister in charge. Only seven points outside the city were visited—Palmyra, Monroe, Macon, De Soto, Cuba, Rolla and St. James—and ten city and suburban parishes and missions.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSOURI BRANCH
of the
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Adopted May 25, 1888. Amended May 30, 1913.

Article I.

This Society shall be called the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

Its object is not to change the work of any parish, but by united and sympathetic action, to increase the interest, and unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's Missionary work.

Article III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of Missouri, who so desire, and who work for Missions in connection with their Parish organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Society.

Article IV.

The officers shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, of whom the second shall be the President of the Junior Auxiliary, Secretary, Treasurer, and United Offering Treasurer, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Article V.

All Parish Societies in the Diocese, who so desire, shall be considered constituent members of this Society, provided they send their reports of money collected and work done for Missions to their respective Parish Representatives in the Board of Managers.

Article VI.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, the Special Secretaries and Treasurers, and the Parish Representatives. Nine shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article VII.

There shall be an Executive Committee, composed of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and Special Secretaries and Treasurers, who shall have authority between regular quarterly meetings to appropriate funds in the hands of the Treasurer.

Article VIII.

1. Each Parish with a Society or Societies working for Missions shall be entitled to four (4) Representatives in the Board, one of whom shall be the Corresponding Secretary, and may increase this number to five by appointment of a Junior Director as Representative, her dues being paid to her own Treasurer.

2. Any additional branches formed hereafter in a Parish where the Auxiliary already exists shall be entitled to two (2) representatives.

Article IX.

The qualifications of a Representative which shall constitute her a member of the Board shall be:

1. Certification of her annual appointment by her Rector or her election by the Parish Society to be such Representative.

2. Payment of a membership fee of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer.

Article X.

The payment of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary Member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary Members shall be entitled to seats, but not to vote, and shall not be counted in making a quorum.

Article XI.

There shall be four meetings of the Board of Managers each year, to be held as follows: On or about the last Fridays, respectively, in October, January and April; and the annual meeting for the election of officers which shall be held on the Friday following the Diocesan Convention.

Article XII.

One of said meetings shall be also a general meeting of the Society, and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese.

Article XIII.

The meetings shall be held in any Church or Chapel designated by the President.

Article XIV.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the managers.

Article XV.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.
2. The First Vice-President shall take the duties of the President in her absence.

3. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society; send notices of the meetings, and keep a record of them; keep an account of the work done by the women of the Diocese, as reported by the Parish Secretaries, and report this annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York, and prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Convention.

4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board or Executive Committee, shall receive and disburse all money sent to the Society for any branch of Missionary work, and for the expenses of the Society, presenting a report of same at each quarterly meeting.

Article XVI.

The Parish Representatives are to report through their Corresponding Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary all work done for Missions; and all money raised for Missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for Missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board, and to carry back to their Parish Societies missionary intelligence, and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in Missions.

Article XVII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.
