THE THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
**Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary
to the Board of Missions.**

*To The Rt. Rev. D. S. Tuttle, S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri, and
The Rt. Rev. Frederick F. Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coad-
jutor, and Members of the Missouri Branch of the
Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions:*

Swiftly the days of another year have passed, and again our annual meeting is before us, with its gathered up reports of what we are doing and plan to do for the coming of Christ's Kingdom.

A cloud of sadness rests over the whole earth, the well-springs of sympathy have opened up a river of mercy for suffering Europe. The joy of giving has been stimulated as never before, yet in spite of the many demands we report to-day the largest sum ever given by the Missouri Auxiliary. In these days of storm and stress the Church raised the Emergency Fund. A continuance with each of us of giving one day's income will prevent a recurrence of debt. We who daily ask a loving Father for our daily bread will be giving to His work on earth just His gift to us, in material prosperity for one day in the whole year. A small return for priceless mercies.

A large part of our money comes in regular pledges, the united effort of all our Branches, so that counting out special individual gifts we can readily approximate the results. If you could read the letters the officers receive, and know that one hundred dollars, or one thousand would sustain a work that would otherwise have to be closed, you would know how hard it is to turn down such appeals. We only have one or at the most two open pledges at each meeting that can be

utilized to meet these requests. An outside speaker presenting his own work always finds a welcome that takes tangible form. In no case has this been better exemplified than last winter when we had unusual speakers and unusual responses. We taxed Dr. Jefferys with constant addresses during his short visit to us. As a medical missionary from China the supposition was that his special work at St. Luke's, Shanghai, would be presented. Instead of which we had a soul awakening for ourselves. Not once was money or the need of it mentioned. "To know the Living Christ and to make Him known" was his theme always, and in contrast were our wilfulness, "our desire to propitiate with a half service and divided affection, and our low standards fairly well fulfilled, which forbid progress by crushing the motive at its source."

The allegory of the Shuffling Coolies with each repetition sank more deeply into our hearts. We have tried to see the suffering Christ in each poor starving sufferer who appears at the hospital clinic, and always two less will be turned away for want of room, through your gifts. A personal gift of \$1,000 was made by one woman to endow a bed to be known as The Shuffling Coolie Bed, and another to be known as the Diocese of Missouri Shuffling Coolie Bed, because Dr. Jefferys has honored us by using our gifts of about \$600 for this purpose.

Archdeacon Stuck was with us for special parlor meetings. An annual pledge of \$100 was made by one parish, and generous gifts came from several.

Dr. Kumm, whose work to establish a line of missions across Central Africa against the inroads of Mohammedanism, made a strong appeal at our autumn meeting. As Church women the response was most generous. The work not being under the care of the Church precludes its being reported under the Auxiliary.

Dr. Reifsneider's visit was not known to us in time to arrange a meeting. At a Sunday service many of us heard him present the needs of St. Paul's College, Tokyo, and a personal

gift of \$1,000 was made by a member of the Auxiliary. The claims of St. Paul's College and of St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, made it hard to decide our open pledge for to-day. The hope that Dr. Teusler might be here to-day, and the challenge of the Japanese Government for us to raise \$250,000 in order to claim their gift of \$75,000 seemed to make the latter imperative.

The Provincial Synod for the Southwest was held in Kansas City in February, at which time a simple Provincial organization of the Auxiliary was effected with Miss Scheetz, our traveling secretary, as its officer.

For diocesan work a word may not be amiss regarding our fund for St. Stephen's Current Expenses. The rector in charge reports three young men, the products of the mission, studying for Holy Orders at the Theological Seminaries, while a fourth is to be ordained on Whitsunday, and become a member of the staff at the Cathedral. It is more than worth while, it is a vital need, that we give a full and generous support to what is proving a recruiting station for the soldiers of the Cross.

The leader for our Quiet Day was one of our own clergy, the Rev. Z. B. T. Phillips, D.D. By all hearers it was acknowledged one of the most helpful we ever had.

Miss Mary Hough, of Kirkwood, entered into rest last October, between the time of her appointment as a representative and our autumn meeting, so she never came face to face with the Auxiliary. Her parish work was such as to make us realize how valuable she would have been to the Auxiliary.

An impetus was given to study class work through a visit from Miss Matthews, of Cincinnati, urging attendance, especially of our young women, at the Summer Missionary Conferences. If in planning a summer holiday, a week or ten days could be spent at one of these summer schools, the work would profit unspeakably, for interest only comes with knowledge. In the evolution of the Auxiliary, Study is such a large part of the work that a special secretary is appointed in New

York to further it. As we know more we will pray more, till the Golden Age will come when prayer for missions will be the Auxiliary's chief concern.

The shadow that falls on our gathering to-day is the absence of our beloved president. During eight years as our vice-president, and sixteen as our president, her record, and that of our treasurer, probably surpass for faithfulness, those of any officer in any diocese. Each has missed but one meeting in all her years of service. We pray that Mrs. Simmons may soon be restored to health.

For the last three months our absorbing thought has been our preparation for General Convention and our Triennial next October. To feel that we belong to such a countless throng will inspire many who have never had any idea what a force and power the Auxiliary stands for. The treasurer of the United Offering has taken for her slogan, "A gift from every Church woman in the diocese." No woman who has not given can have any interest in the great Thanksgiving Service when the offering is made. The dominating thought is a sense of shame that we have not made some greater sacrifice to enlarge our gift. We are planning many things for our guests, but we shall find that what we gain from them in the inspiration of the Church working as a whole will be a vision and a blessing to us far beyond anything we do for them. Perhaps we will believe "That the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions is not a select body of a few women in each parish whose time and taste lead them to join together to do some missionary work. It is as leaven that leaveneth the whole,—an influence reaching to the woman who sits in the pew behind you and the pew in front. It is a body resting not until all are interested and brought into that organization to which they really belong by virtue of their baptism—the great Missionary Society of the Church."

The United Offering.

*To the Rt. Rev. D. S. Tuttle, D.D., S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri;
The Rt. Rev. F. F. Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coadjutor, the Officers
and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary.*

In reporting for the United Offering for the year, we have first to acknowledge many helps. In October we had the lantern slide lecture, which was given six times, and was of value as showing the progress and development of the United Offering in concrete form. The December Conference was on the United Offering, and many helpful and suggestive points were brought out, and the Intercessions, led by the Rev. Mr. Bunting, raised us to a high plane. The Little Blue Box, a play given by the Juniors in March in Ascension Parish House, was so greatly appreciated that it has been repeated in two parishes with increased interest. Two hundred and fifty blue boxes were given out through this little play. Twenty-one treasurers in the parishes have done faithful service. Miss Scheetz, as she travels through the Diocese, makes the United Offering her constant theme, and I have visited eleven parishes and been received with eager interest. It would be strange indeed if we could not report progress as the result of all these helps.

But, we have set before ourselves a great ideal, "A gift from every Church woman in the Diocese." We are pressing on, but have not yet reached the goal. Thirty-one parishes and missions, and the Juniors, have sent in amounts ranging from \$248 to \$1. Far down on the list is a small mission, remote from the city, suffering under many losses by removal, to which belongs the distinction of sending a gift from every member. This point, of ever increasing numbers of gifts, is our most encouraging sign. One hundred and eighty-one women are being supported by the United Offering, holding positions of responsibility and helpfulness. Six are in training.

As yet, we have no United Offering worker in the field from Missouri. Should we not, one and all, earnestly pray that God the Holy Spirit would breathe upon our gifts and change them into life!

Since her last report to you, the Traveling Secretary has paid four visits to Auxiliary branches in the city, has revisited five parishes and missions out in the Diocese, and visited five others for the first time—Canton, Herculaneum, Kirksville, Hannibal and Florissant.

Hannibal has, of course, been long connected with the Auxiliary, and, it is hoped, is now about to take on new strength; Kirksville, with the interest and co-operation of its new rector, Rev. Mr. Putney, and his wife, is sure to have an organized branch soon; the other three, with only a few Church women in each, fear to attempt organization yet, but are joining in the work of the Auxiliary through the United Offering. The Secretary has recently sent out to the clergy of those places where little or no Auxiliary work is done, a letter signed by the diocesan officers, and endorsed by both bishops, asking their help in making the Auxiliary known throughout the Diocese before the Triennial in October. To this she hopes to have many early replies, and holds herself in readiness to respond in person to any plans that may be suggested for meeting with the women of the Church.

Report of Educational Secretary.

The subject of our mission study this last year has been Africa and Afro-Americans, taking as our text book, "Anglican Church Work in Africa," and Mrs. Roberts' "Hand Book of Colored Work in the Southern Dioceses," although the study has not been confined by any means to text books.

Our banner class in the parish of Grace Church, Kirkwood, which might be considered a normal class, as six different women lead the work in turn, took up in addition to Africa the work of each of our missionary districts, finding out through correspondence with missionary bishops what he considered the greatest helps and hindrances of his especial field, thus bringing the class into close touch with the missionary bishops and their work. As a definite result of their work last year, they increased the United Offering 50 per cent. over that of the preceding year. Another class at Emmanuel, Old Orchard, under its inspiring leader, Mrs. Cushing, has taken up "The Why and How of Foreign Missions," and will continue this study with a class of young men during the summer.

There have been eight systematic study classes in addition to my own normal class, while there is not an Auxiliary organization in the city which has not kept up its interest in missions, either in the form of reading circles, or program meetings, or monthly addresses from our own officers, or from missionaries or bishops from other fields.

Dr. Kumm, that wonderful geographer, explorer, and missionary, addressed my class on the great needs of the African Soudan. Dr. Jefferys, of St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, in two extra sessions, gave us the spiritual uplift of his consecrated life, while Miss Matthews, the Educational Secretary of Southern Ohio, met my own class and that of the Church of the Ascension and inspired us by her wonderful zeal and efficiency.

Some members of my classes have been Sunday School teachers, and in this I am glad to feel that we have had some part in the Religious Education Movement which is being pushed so vigorously now, and I am proud to know that the Woman's Auxiliary was the first to inaugurate this work. Several of my leaders have taken the results of their studies into the Junior branches.

I was asked by the rectors at Palmyra and Hannibal to address their Auxiliaries on the subject of mission study, which I hope may result in classes another year. I attended the Conference of the Missionary Educational Movement at Lake Geneva last summer, where I found both information and inspiration for my work.

It is with mingled feelings of regret and joy that I relinquish my work, though not my interest, in the Junior Auxiliary, but the sadness is more than balanced by the joy I have in passing it on to our newly appointed Educational Secretary of the Juniors, Miss Elizabeth Hart. She was one of the first Juniors under our devoted Director, Miss Skinker, and she is a graduate of my own Wellesley College, which always mothered and encouraged missions. She comes to the

work and well qualified and full of enthusiasm and zeal, and I beg the Junior Directors to give her their earnest prayers, their loyalty and co-operation in this educational work that is growing more and more to be considered the necessary ground work of the missionary enterprise.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSOURI BRANCH
of the
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Adopted May 25, 1888. Amended May 30, 1913.

Article I.

This Society shall be called the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

Its object is not to change the work of any parish, but by united and sympathetic action, to increase the interest, and unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's Missionary work.

Article III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of Missouri, who so desire, and who work for Missions in connection with their Parish organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Society.

Article IV.

The officers shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, of whom the second shall be the President of the Junior Auxiliary, Secretary, Treasurer, and United Offering Treasurer, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Article V.

All Parish Societies in the Diocese, who so desire, shall be considered constituent members of this Society, provided they send their reports of money collected and work done for Missions to their respective Parish Representatives in the Board of Managers.

Article VI.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, the Special Secretaries and Treasurers, and the Parish Representatives. Nine shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article VII.

There shall be an Executive Committee, composed of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and Special Secretaries and Treasurers, who shall have authority between regular quarterly meetings to appropriate funds in the hands of the Treasurer.

Article VIII.

1 Each Parish with a Society or Societies working for Missions shall be entitled to four (4) Representatives in the Board, one of whom shall be the Corresponding Secretary, and may increase this number to five by appointment of a Junior Director as Representative, her dues being paid to her own Treasurer.

2. Any additional branches formed hereafter in a parish where the Auxiliary already exists shall be entitled to two (2) representatives.

Article IX.

The qualifications of a Representative which shall constitute her a member of the Board shall be:

1. Certification of her annual appointment by her Rector or her election by the Parish Society to be such Representative.

2. Payment of a membership fee of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer.

Article X.

The payment of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary Member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary Members shall be entitled to seats, but not to vote, and shall not be counted in making a quorum.

Article XI.

There shall be four meetings of the Board of Managers each year, to be held as follows: On or about the last Fridays, respectively, in October, January and April; and the annual meeting for the election of officers which shall be held on the Friday following the Diocesan Convention.

Article XII.

One of said meetings shall be also a general meeting of the Society, and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese.

Article XIII.

The meetings shall be held in any Church or Chapel designated by the President.

Article XIV.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the managers.

Article XV.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.
2. The First Vice-President shall take the duties of the President in her absence.

3. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society; send notices of the meetings, and keep a record of them; keep an account of the work done by the women of the Diocese, as reported by the Parish Secretaries, and report this annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York, and prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Convention.

4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board or Executive Committee, shall receive and disburse all money sent to the Society for any branch of Missionary work, and for the expenses of the Society, presenting a report of same at each quarterly meeting.

Article XVI.

The Parish Representatives are to report through their Corresponding Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary all work done for Missions; and all money raised for Missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for Missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board, and to carry back to their Parish Societies missionary intelligence, and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in Missions.

Article XVII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.
