President's Address.

*To The Rt. Rev. D. S. Tuttle, S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri, and
The Rt. Rev. F. F. Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coadjutor, Officers and
Members of the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the
Board of Missions:*

In looking back over the twelve months just past we realize this has been a memorial year for us in many ways. It has been ours to rejoice in the great honor and distinction of our beloved Bishop's fiftieth anniversary of his consecration, and to witness and have a share with the whole Church in expressing our deep gratitude to Almighty God for his saintly character and power for good throughout this land of ours.

We yield to him our most loving loyal service.

This year of the gathering of the Church's General Convention in our city will ever be a memorial landmark to us. We have felt the inspiration that came to us at that time throughout our winter's work, and will in all the years to come.

We felt that Almighty God had come to dwell with us in a very real and mighty way. The presence of our Master in our midst was manifest in the saintly lives of His servants as they gathered here.

For thirty-six years we have the unique distinction and honor of the unremitting and faithful service of one of our officers—the one under God to whom we owe the organization of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions in our Diocese.

For one short year we have had as our First Vice-President Mrs. Johnson, the wife of our beloved Bishop Coadjutor. But we take comfort in the belief that it is only that she may be freer to render service to the Church and her Bishop's field in other ways.

We love her and would like for her to have continued with us.

Our Second Vice-President, in charge of Junior work, is leaving us, much to our regret, but with our deep appreciation for the beautiful work she has done in developing our Junior Department.

In behalf of the Woman's Auxiliary I thank Mrs. Howard for her helpful services.

For three years the Church Periodical Correspondent in this Diocese has been associated with us as one of our appointed diocesan officers. The association has been a most delightful one. The work she has developed deserves the highest praise. It is with deep regret we accept her judgment that this must be her last year with us in this office. To Mrs. Baker we extend our loving, hearty thanks.

I've been saying good-byes. Now I want to say a warm, hearty how-do-you-do, and welcome to our dear Miss Emery, whom we so unexpectedly and gladly receive as our guest of honor to-day. There is none more welcome to us, as visitor and friend, than our beloved Miss Emery. Four years ago, when we had our January meeting in the hospitable home of Grace Church-Holy Cross House, Miss Emery was our guest, and we assure her of the pleasure it gives us to have her at this time. Miss Emery will tell us of the plan for "The Pilgrimage of Prayer" which we shall have in our Diocese this coming August, from Sunday, the fifth, to Sunday, the twelfth.

Let us seek earnestly in this week to be enabled of God to use the weapons of the Spirit in the doing of His work, of which there is none more effectual than that of prayer.

Secretary's Report.

To The Rt. Rev. D. S. Tuttle, S.T.D., Bishop of Missouri, and The Rt. Rev. Frederick Foote Johnson, D.D., Bishop Coadjutor, and Members of the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions:

Our hearts linger lovingly on our memories of 1916, and we would fain hold back the year which brought the General Convention to us. Our greatest hopes were realized for its success in every way. And our Bishop was well and all delighted to honor him. It was the place where east met west in the interest and love of missions. Every field was represented except Africa. One thousand women registered at the Auxiliary headquarters; 402 were official delegates from their diocesan branches. Great as was the inspiration of the United Offering service, when the women laid \$352,000 on the Altar at the Cathedral, for the support of the women missionaries, just as great a one was the united offering of womanhood's best gifts of self consecration to God's service. The golden gift was but the expression of that love and devotion. The deep spirituality of the women put even the most practical subjects on a high plane. The pity was that our own women were so cumbered with much serving that little time was left for many of them to attend the conferences. From the faithful little pages who were hands and feet for us all to those who bore the great responsibilities there was a whole-heartedness and co-operation that took weariness away from any task. The consecration of the women is the memory that will linger and be the inspiration to those who heretofore had but little comprehension of the work. The officers of the Auxiliary thank you each and all for your helpfulness.

Hearing as we did of all the lines of missionary work from those who were doing it, we did not need the special speakers for our quarterly meetings. We could not hear of the need of the Technical High School at Sagada without a desire to have a part in its building. St. Agnes, Kyoto, had waited too long for its new buildings, and the work of raising \$50,000 this year is the task the Auxiliary has undertaken. The first is to be the Sallie Stuart Hall to commemorate the work of Miss Sallie Stuart, the first and oldest officer, who from the beginning was the secretary of the Virginia Branch. We have pledged \$200 for this and the pledge is to be made to-day. Appeals were made for many objects, and Missouri responded to every call. An incident in one report seems worth recording. At the New York Convention, three years ago, the Auxiliary set itself to raise \$160,000 for a new St. Mary's Hall at Shanghai. Just before coming here the committee met in

New York. They wished to cable Bishop Graves to begin work, for the funds were in hand. But there was not one word in the cable code that would express any such idea. Never once had the Board of Missions flashed that message across the Pacific to a lonely and possibly dispirited missionary. The message went in plain words, but since then a cipher has been added to the code that stands for joy and renewed hope. And the women have added it.

In our Diocese we have only bright things to record. Branches have been started in Hannibal, where our work was sporadic, and in Mexico, and we welcome the name of Moberly as a new one on our list. Six of our officers made a day's auto trip to Herculaneum where the work has been claiming our attention lately. We found the Deaconess busy with her work among the children, which has been showing good results. A little side reading revealed the fact that the lead smelter was established there in 1809, and is the largest in the world, and yet the Church only discovered it within the last five years, and it is the special product of the Coadjutor.

After providing the missionary boxes for our Diocese, we have given our attention to making up general boxes for our mission schools and hospitals. Those sent to Arden, N. C., and to the Shoshone Indians have been even beyond the standard of our Missouri boxes.

A special meeting was held to hear addresses from the Rev. Mr. Lobdell on the mountain work in North Carolina, and from Miss Bowden, in charge of St. Philip's School, San Antonio.

In selecting speakers for our Quiet Days we have not failed to receive the best from those of our city clergy who have given them. Bishop Wise, who came to us this year, we still want to call our own. He is our friend and knows our needs. We are most grateful for his godly counsels.

Not many who read the death notice of Mrs. E. A. Manny harked back far enough to know that she was our first Vice-President. She reached the wonderful age of 93, and was interested in the work till the last.

A new year begins with a shadow over our land. Our time, our means, our talents must be given to the men who are waging a war for the world's freedom. Everything is at stake. We beg that the Cross be not overshadowed by the flag. England has been able to meet her missionary budget. New work may have to wait, but let nothing be dropped, or else the privations and labors of our soldiers of the Cross will be for naught if their work is now forgotten.

Some one has said that "an institution was but the lengthened shadow of one man." The Auxiliary as it lives in every land is the shadow of one woman. And the shadows are longest at eventide, so Miss Emery saw her vision fulfilled when she resigned from 40 years

of service as our General Secretary at the close of our General Convention. Miss Lindley, who succeeds her, was trained in her office and was in charge of the Junior work. We rejoice that it is not a stranger whom we are to follow, and promise Miss Lindley the same loyalty we gave her predecessor.

The Auxiliary was a young and plastic thing when we in Missouri began the work 36 years ago. Bishop Robertson appointed the present Secretary in 1881. She and the Secretary of the Missionary Board are the only ones left in office who were here when Bishop Tuttle came to Missouri. The first year we reported 3 parishes working and the amount given by the branch was \$410. This year we reported 38 organized branches and six more contributing, and the result, including the Junior Branch, which is now an important factor, is \$13,159.22. We have contributed to every line of work the Auxiliary aimed to carry out. We are one of the few branches that has a completed Church among its gifts. Newer methods are coming in. Mission study and prayer are being stressed, but we know that no such results would ever have been attained if prayer had not been the secret source of strength of the women who have accomplished these great things.

A Pilgrimage of Prayer has been inaugurated in which every diocese has an appointed week of prayer for the world's great needs. Our week falls at an unfortunate time when our members are scattered for the summer, as well as our clergy on whom we must depend for our services, but even as a scattered branch we hope to have a part and make our pilgrimage. At the close of one of our noon-day services, the preacher stopped and spoke to the scrub woman who was washing the floor. He pointed out how clean and bright and presentable she had made it, in comparison with the soiled and stained parts. The woman lifted her face and replied, "I have done it on my knees." So must much of our work be done if we would prepare a highway for our God.

After 36 years of service as Secretary I close my work with this report. It has been the blessing and privilege of my life. You have been patient with my mistakes. You have given me a loyal confidence. No day has ever been so dark or night so long that the work has been a burden. Love for it and much leisure are my apology for keeping it so long. Many of you are my oldest and best friends, and I hope through you to keep in touch with the work, which must always be close to my heart. My daily prayers of almost a lifetime will not cease because my responsibility is over, for the only gift I have had to offer was a loving service.

of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

The visits of the Traveling Secretary have been few this year, only nine points having been reached—Cape Girardeau, Chaffee, Mexico, Hannibal, Palmyra, Moberly, Jackson, Louisiana and Eolia, the last four for the first time. Her special effort has been to effect a prompt organization of the Auxiliary wherever it was not already established, and in Moberly and Louisiana this was undertaken at once, while at Mexico, under the vigorous leadership of the rector's wife, a branch has recently been organized. The week following her visit to Hannibal, the Secretary was made glad by receiving word that the Auxiliary was an established fact and its officers were elected. Hannibal has long been connected with the Auxiliary in a rather desultory way, but is now ready to take a place in the Auxiliary's work worthy of the largest parish outside St. Louis and its suburbs. At Eolia (Prairieville) the "United Offering" made a special appeal to Mrs. Brennan's little guild, possibly to be followed by other work later. It was also the most practical thing for the three active communicants of Jackson, with whom a day was happily spent. In addition to these out-of-town places, a visit was paid to St. Philip's S. S., and a short talk given on some diocesan work. One suggestion in closing! It is the business and pleasure of a traveling secretary to invite herself to the parishes and missions of the Diocese in the interest of the Auxiliary, but it would be a much greater pleasure to be invited wherever and whenever it seems she could be in any way helpful. It may be worth while to add that there are several sets of lantern slides (of missionary subjects) available in the Diocese, which may be had with, or without, the Traveling Secretary.

Report of Educational Secretary.

Our study work this last year has received a great impetus and inspiration from the General Convention, during which many of our leaders attended some of the fifteen classes which were held at the Sheldon Memorial House. Prayer and Latin America being the subjects studied there, while Dr. Gray held a class at the Bishop's House for Diocesan Educational Secretaries.

Our own study classes have been attended by 153 in all, in which fourteen parishes have been represented, while reading circles have been held on missionary instruction of some kind in every parish Auxiliary. As spiritual work can never be estimated in its results by statistics, we hope and pray that the work of these classes may be far-reaching in carrying the message of the gospel beyond our own immediate parishes.

The first year's work of our Junior Educational Secretary has been more than gratifying. She has endeavored to follow the plan of Miss Lindley in combining the work of the Junior Auxiliary with that of the S. S., and has given missionary talks to seven Sunday Schools, where she has been received with the greatest cordiality and courtesy on the part of the rectors; she has held meetings with the Junior Branches and during Lent had a study class for the Junior Directors.

Our own Diocesan Secretary, Miss Triplett, untiring in her efforts, has held two Lenten classes for S. S. teachers, and our former Secretary of the Juniors, Mrs. D'Arcy, has had a class of older Juniors. Thus we of the Auxiliary, both Senior and Junior, are going hand in hand with the great forward movement in religious education which we of the Auxiliary, I am proud to say, were the first to inaugurate, and it is our desire that the two should be more and more co-ordinated in the future.

I would strongly urge all of our leaders and Junior Directors that they attend one of our own Church Conferences of which there are to be four this summer, or one of the seven summer conferences of the Missionary Educational Movement, and that they read for further information what Dr. Sturgis says of them in the May number of the *Spirit of Missions*.

At these conferences special instruction will be given in the courses recommended to us for the year. The subject will be the Missionary Message of the Bible. The text books for these courses are written by Bishop Rhinelander, of Pa., Miss Lucy Sturgis, of Boston, and Mrs. Cowan, of Louisville. Our own classes in these courses will be during the Epiphany and Lenten seasons.

In closing, may I ask of you all that you avail yourselves of the inspiration and help that will surely come from a hearty co-operation in the Pilgrimage of Prayer, and that we pray at that time for a special blessing on our work, remembering that without prayer as the motive power our work must count for naught.

Most of you probably know that I am giving up the work, not because of discouragement or lack of interest, but for personal reasons. The three years I have had charge of the work have passed very quickly, and pleasantly. The association with Auxiliary officers and members, and parish librarians, has been most delightful, and I thank you all for your splendid support, and bespeak it for my successor.

I am very grateful to Bishop Tuttle for his contributions to the treasury—he is the only regular contributor we have—and to Bishop Johnson for his advice and help in placing things where they are needed, right here, in our own diocese, which is, as it should be, our first care.

Of the 639 books sent out, about half of them were placed in Missouri. One of the three traveling libraries, the "Memorial", has gone to St. James, Mo.; the "St. Louis" went to Tucumcari, New Mexico; and "St. Peters" to Boise, Idaho. The books in these libraries (241 volumes) are not included in the 639 books reported above.

Again we come with a report from the Junior Department—an encouraging one because we have taken on new responsibilities and have accomplished more than ever before; discouraging because we have not grown as rapidly as we wished. The General Convention was a great inspiration, and under this inspiration we waxed enthusiastic and pledged \$500 to St. Agnes School, Kyoto. You know, we had never undertaken anything so ambitious before and were a little

fearful of the outcome, but as \$300 has already been paid, with another \$100 in sight, we feel that our victory is assured. We also have a scholarship of \$100 at the school at Nenana, Alaska, and we have given \$57 as a nucleus of a fund to be used by Bishop Johnson when he commences his work at Mine La Motte. CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSOURI BRANCH
of the
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Adopted May 25, 1888. Amended May 30, 1913.

Article I.

This Society shall be called the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

Its object is not to change the work of any parish, but by united and sympathetic action, to increase the interest, and unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the Church's Missionary work.

Article III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of Missouri, who so desire, and who work for Missions in connection with their Parish organizations, shall be regarded as members of this Society.

Article IV.

The officers shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, of whom the second shall be the President of the Junior Auxiliary, Secretary, Treasurer, and United Offering Treasurer, to be chosen at the annual meeting.

Article V.

All Parish Societies in the Diocese, who so desire, shall be considered constituent members of this Society, provided they send their reports of money collected and work done for Missions to their respective Parish Representatives in the Board of Managers.

Article VI.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, the Special Secretaries and Treasurers, and the Parish Representatives. Nine shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article VII.

There shall be an Executive Committee, composed of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Special Secretaries and Treasurers, who shall have authority between regular quarterly meetings to appropriate funds in the hands of the Treasurer.

Article VIII.

1. Each Parish with a Society or Societies working for Missions shall be entitled to four (4) Representatives in the Board, one of whom shall be the Corresponding Secretary, and may increase this number to five by appointment of a Junior Director as Representative, her dues being paid to her own Treasurer.

2. Any additional branches formed hereafter in a parish where the Auxiliary already exists shall be entitled to two (2) representatives.

Article IX.

The qualifications of a Representative which shall constitute her a member of the Board shall be:

1. Certification of her annual appointment by her Rector or her election by the Parish Society to be such Representative.

2. Payment of a membership fee of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer.

Article X.

The payment of \$1.00 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary Member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary Members shall be entitled to seats, but not to vote, and shall not be counted in making a quorum.

Article XI.

There shall be four meetings of the Board of Managers each year to be held as follows: On or about the last Fridays, respectively, in October, January and April; and the annual meeting for the election of officers, which shall be held on the Friday following the Diocesan Convention.

Article XII.

One of said meetings shall be also a general meeting of the Society, and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese.

Article XIII.

The meetings shall be held in any Church or Chapel designated by the President.

Article XIV.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the managers.

Article XV.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.

2. The First Vice-President shall take the duties of the President in her absence.

3. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society; send notices of the meetings, and keep a record of them; keep an account of the work done by the women of the Diocese, as reported by the Parish Secretaries, and report this annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York, and prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Convention.

4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board or Executive Committee, shall receive and disburse all money sent to the Society for any branch of Missionary work, and for the expenses of the Society, presenting a report of same at each quarterly meeting.

Article XVI.

The Parish Representatives are to report through their Corresponding Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary all work done for Missions; and all money raised for Missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for Missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board, and to carry back to their Parish Societies missionary intelligence, and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in Missions.

Article XVII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.
