# Proceedings of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society

(In its missionary capacity the Montana branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions).

June 19, 1912.

The ninth annual meeting of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of the Diocese of Montana was held in St. Mark's Church, Anaconda, opening at 9:30 a. m. The Holy Communion was celebrated by the Bishop assisted by the Rev. J. L. Craig, rector of St. Mark's parish and the Rev. C. H. Linley of Kalispell, who also delivered an address. After the service the business meeting was called to order by the Vice President, Mrs. J. L. Craig. The chair appointed as committee on credentials, the Secretary, Miss Withers and Miss Baldwin. The committee reported a quorum present and the Secretary called the roll of delegates showing the following representation: Belt, 1; St. John's, Butte, 3; Helena, 3; Deer Lodge, 2; Virginia City, 2; Missoula, 1; Bozeman, 3; Anaconda, 3; Lewistown, 1; Buffalo, 1; St. Paul's, Butte, 1; Townsend, 1; Red Lodge, 1; Virginia City, 1; Great Falls, 3; total, 27.

A resolution was offered that all Church women present be given the privileges of the floor, which resolution prevailed.

Mrs. J. B. Lockwood of Helena moved the following resolution:

"RESOLVED, That the members of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of the Diocese of Montana express their sincere regret at the absence of their esteemed President; their gratification that she continues to improve in health and the hope that she may be able to meet with them in the future. They also desire to send her greetings on this day accompanied with flowers, a small amount of the offerings of the day being used to defray the necessary expense and that a committee be appointed to attend to the matter."

This resolution was unanimously adopted by a rising vote and the chair appointed as committee, Mrs. Lockwood, Miss Rumsey and Miss Withers.

The annual report of the Secretary was read showing \$11,100.22 raised for parochial purposes and \$919.63 for missionary purposes, the grand total for woman's work for 1912 being \$13,019.85.

Mrs. Moore then reported on the Alaska box. The report showed increasing interest in this work.

The Secretary read a communication from Bishop Rowe at the close of which Mrs. Messias offered the following resolution:

"Whereas, the Rt. Rev. Peter T. Rowe, Missionary Bishop of Alaska has solicited the aid and support of the Woman's Auxiliary of this Diocese on behalf of a bill which he expects to be introduced into Congress for the medical and sanitary relief of the natives of Alaska;



"Be it therefore resolved, We give our hearty approval of the Bishop's laudable purpose and do sincerely hope the bill will become a law.

Resolved, That our Secretary be instructed to write to the Senators and Congressmen representing Montana, requesting them to support the said bill in the most effective way in their power.

"Resolved, the Secretary's letter be signed in the name of all the baptized women, members of the Episcopal Church, in this Diocese."

Mrs. Lillian B. Cain, Diocesan Secretary of the Daughters of the King made the annual report of the Order.

The Diocesan Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary and the Babies' Branch, told of the growth of this work in Montana and the excellent work done during the year by these organizations.

Mrs. J. L. Craig, gave an account of the year's progress in the work of the United Offering.

Mrs. Lockwood of Helena reported on the work of St. Peter's hospital.

Noonday prayers were read by the Rev. A. E. Macnamara.

Recess was taken until 2 o'clock.

#### Afternoon Session.

After the singing of hymn 672 the Secretary read a letter from Miss Julia C. Emery, General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary. Miss Withers moved that a copy of Miss Emery's letter be sent to every guild in the Diocese after the summer holiday season.

The Vice President then read her address as follows:

I am sorry that it has become my duty to address you this afternoon and I am sure that Mrs. Hooker has our most sincere sympathy. We earnestly hope that she may be well enough to be with us at another Convention time. Today we know that her heart is with us and that she is praying that we may have guidance to do our work in the best possible way to set forward the kingdom of Christ in the world.

Mrs. Hooker has always been able to bring us news of woman's work in other dioceses, but I have no knowledge of that other than appears in the books and magazines you can all read.

I wish today to speak of the work which we women of Montana are doing and hope to do. We have but to look over the lists of our clergy and communicants to realize how many of our people are not in organized parishes, but in mission stations. In these small places, where only occasional services are held, and where work is often so discouraging, we sometimes find our most unselfish workers. Surely there can be no better missionary work that these women are doing in carrying on Sunday Schools and keeping up the services of the Church. Because we can never know of all the work of this kind that is being done throughout the Diocese, it is never set forth in our reports. And when we urge the organization of the Auxiliary, it is with no lack of appreciation of what these women are doing in their own communities.

You have heard the reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer and know the amounts in money which have been raised for parochial and diocesan missionary purposes. You have also heard the report of the splendid box sent to the Reverend Mr. Chapman of Anvik, Alaska, and of the Bishop Brewer scholarship at a Girls' School in



Liberia, Africa, paid by the parishes of Helena, Dillon, Bozeman, Missoula and Butte. We feel that an increased interest is being manifested in the United Offerings and I am sure that the help and support of the women have done much to enable us to have more new parishes formed and thus to have fewer places dependent on the Diocesan missionary funds. These things we are all proud of and it is right that we should be.

Another encouraging feature in the past year's work has been the fact that several branches of the Auxiliary devoted their Lenten meetings to missionary reading and study. I learned of one guild in a place where they have as yet no church building and only occasional services, who, at their work meetings each week, had the collects for missions read and some articles of interest from the Spirit of Missions.

We feel very often that we cannot respond to calls for more money, but surely we can give our interest and sympathy. In fact, I sometimes feel that we give too often without knowing what is done with the money, simply because we are too indifferent to ask. An intelligent giving must certainly be more welcome in God's sight than a careless giving, just to get it over with.

Now we usually all go home from these Conventions full of enthusiasm. We want to organize a branch of the Auxiliary. We say "Why don't we have a Chapter of the Daughters of the King?" and "We certainly can have a Junior Auxiliary in our town." The trouble often is that we cannot get others to share in our enthusiasm because they have no foundation for it. This year how would it be to make a real definite effort to increase the circulation of the Spirit of Missions throughout the State? If we would each take up the matter in our own parish or mission, I think that it would pave the way for more aggressive work next year. We are proud of our record as a Diocese in always having our Missionary apportionment paid, but so few know of all the various ways in which that money is used. Then, if we have the Spirit of Missions, we can read of, and feel a fellowship for many of the mission fields that are having the same discouragements as our own. We have the privilege of reading of this or that good work and saying, "The missionary apportionment that our Church paid, helped to make it possible to build that hospital or that orphanage."

Do you all know that at the House of Missions there is an Educational Secretary whose time is given to the preparation of outlines of study for Mission Study classes? It need not take more than three or four women or girls to organize a study class during the winter months, or through Lent. We don't wish to be content with doing over again just what we did last year and the study classes would afford an opportunity for making progress.

I want to say one more word about our parish and mission work. Sometimes I feel that we do not value it as we should and therefore do not get all the happiness out of that we might. Because there is always something to be done and we have done it so often, we go at it from a cold sense of duty and miss the joy we ought to have. Surely if we had things done for us in the indifferent spirit that we often do them for God and His Church, we would not be at all grateful. Let us have the spirit of joy and gladness in all our work, and let us not forget our corporate communion on St. Michael and All Angel's Day—September 29th.

An interesting and much appreciated paper was read by Mrs. William W. Conner on the Religious Crisis in China. A musical number followed by Miss Nell of Anaconda. The Rev. F. J. Mynard made an address on The Auxiliary, A Factor in the Parish. The Bishop then made the closing address. Mrs. B. A. Conrad presented a resolution extending a vote of thanks to the members and friends of St. Mark's parish for their generous hospitality in the entertainment of our delegates. This was adopted by a rising vote.

Mrs. Gatley offered the following resolution:

"RESOLVED, that the Chair appoint a committee to induce, if possible Miss Grace Lindley, or some other trained leader of Missionary Study Classes, to be present at our Diocesan Convention of 1913 to give our delegates some real training in conducting Missionary Study Classes among our women and young people."

The resolution prevailed and the Chair appointed Mrs. Gatley and Mrs. Jackson as a committee. The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.
