

## Proceedings of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of Montana

Great Falls, Montana, May 14th, 1923.

The thirty-second annual meeting of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of Montana was held in the Guild Hall of the Church of the Incarnation, beginning at 9:30 a. m.

The business meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. L. J. Christler, who opened the meeting with Collects and The Lord's Prayer.

The officers to be nominated are Vice-President, Educational Secretary, Daughters of the King Secretary, Secretary of "The Spirit of Missions" and a Church School Service League Secretary.

Mrs. Gatley explained the rotation of officers. Mrs. Christler read a letter from Mrs. Grimes who is Secretary of the Provincial Synod. Mrs. Larabie read a letter from Mrs. Bishop of Denver, asking for a donation of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) toward the building of homes for working women, both white and colored.

Mrs. Clinton Moore told of the Alaska box sent from Butte. Mrs. Burton asked (for Mrs. Winchester) that all Guilds put the valuation on boxes, when sending them to her. Mrs. Christler read the box assessment for 1924 sent by Mrs. Wade.

This year we shall have two boxes, one for Rev. B. W. Gaither, Eagle, Alaska, and one for Rev. H. Hamilton, of New Castle, Wyo.

The following women gave informal reports on the methods used in preparing the Alaska box in their respective parish or mission: Missoula, Mrs. Gatley; Dillon, Mrs. Bennett; Helena, Mrs. Snell; Townsend, Mrs. Mitchell; Havre, Mrs. MacKenzie; Miles City, Mrs. Cross; Anaconda, Mrs. Nell; Great Falls, Mrs. Beard; Lewistown, Mrs. Hirst.

Mrs. Whitehouse being absent, the chair appointed Mrs. Bennett to read her report at the next session.

It was moved and carried that our assessment of five dollars (\$5.00) be sent to the Sixth Province at once.

Mrs. Christler reminded the Guilds of the Per Capita tax, five cents per member.

Mrs. Gatley talked informally on the Per Capita tax.

Mrs. Moore told of the method used in Butte for raising the Per Capita tax.

Mrs. Christler reminded the women present that United Thank Offering money should be sent to the Vice-President, Mrs. Geo. Hirst of Lewistown who is also United Thank Offering Custodian.

The meeting was at this time adjourned for a meeting of the Executive Board.

The Executive Board held a meeting in the Rectory, beginning at eleven o'clock.



The officers present were: Mrs. L. J. Christler, President; Mrs. Geo. Hirst, Vice-President; Mrs. R. D. Larabie, Treasurer; and Mrs. H. A. Duncan, Secretary.

Mrs. Edna Biller of the Church Missions House, New York City, met with the Executive Board. Mrs. Biller told of a fund being raised to send leaders to help in the work of the weaker parishes and missions.

Suggested program meeting, aiming to get these subjects before the women: Educational work, Supply work, United Thank Offering devotion, Social Service and Religious Education.

Also suggested that the following committees named from the various guilds or organizations would aid very materially in the work of a parish or mission—Devotional Committee to organize prayer groups and establish systematic Bible reading; Visiting Committee; Hospitality Committee; Publicity Committee.

Asked that we send to headquarters for suggestions whenever needed.

The hour of twelve having arrived, noonday prayers were read by Mrs. Biller, and the meeting adjourned.

The afternoon session was called to order by the President in the Guild Hall at 1:30 o'clock. Collects were read and the Creed recited in unison.

The roll was called and the minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Mrs. Biller addressed the meeting, discussing the proposed homes for white and colored women.

Mrs. Gatley moved that we take time to receive pledges toward our donation of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the proposed homes. This motion carried. Following are the pledges received, to be paid by Jan. 1st, 1924: Missoula, \$10.00; Helena, \$20.00; Butte, \$10.00; Miles City, \$10.00; Lewistown, \$10.00; Dillon, \$5.00; Great Falls, \$15.00; Billings, \$10.00; Emigrant, \$5.00; Anaconda, \$5.00; Deer Lodge, \$5.00; Choteau, \$5.00; Havre, \$50.00; or making a total of \$160.00.

Mrs. Biller addressed the meeting on "The Children's Work" in the Church.

Mrs. Kellogg told of "The Little Helpers' Work" in Great Falls.



Mrs. Christler made a plea for some one to offer to take charge of the Church School Service League, without election.

The Treasurer's report for 1922 was read by Mrs. Larabie, and accepted.

At this time, Bishop Faber announced to the women that a canon had just been passed allowing women to be elected delegates to convention.

Mrs. H. H. H. Fox read a report on "The First Day of General Convention" in Portland.

It was moved and seconded that this report be printed in the Montana Churchman.

The noon hour having arrived, Rev. George Hirst read the prayers.

Mrs. Gatley moved that a resolution be adopted to show our appreciation for what the Convention had accomplished for us.

The Chair appointed Mrs. H. S. Gatley and Mrs. H. H. H. Fox on the resolution committee.



Mrs. Hirst addressed the meeting on "The United Thank Offering Day" at General Convention in Portland.

It was moved and carried that this address be printed in the Montana Churchman.

The meeting adjourned for luncheon.

The afternoon session was called to order by the President at 1:45 o'clock.

The roll was called, Secretary's report was read and accepted.

Mrs. Bennett, acting Treasurer, reported the morning offering \$34.25.

The Nominating Committee brought in the following report:

For Vice-President, Mrs. Geo. Hirst of Lewistown; Secretary Daughters of the King, Mrs. Christoph Keller of Great Falls; Educational Secretary, Mrs. S. D. Hooker of Helena; Spirit of Missions Secretary, Mrs. C. R. Cross of Miles City. Mrs. Keller withdrew her name, and Mrs. Wm. Beard of Great Falls was nominated from the floor. It was moved and carried that the Secretary cast a ballot for Mrs. George Hirst, Vice-President; Mrs. Wm. Beard, Secretary Daughters of the King; Mrs. S. D. Hooker, Educational Secretary; Mrs. C. R. Cross, Secretary of Spirit of Missions. Each in turn was declared elected.

The Nominating Committee reported the following names for delegates to the Provincial Synod of the Sixth Province: Mrs. H. H. H. Fox, Billings; Mrs. Clinton Moore, Butte; Mrs. John Lloyd, Havre; Mrs. Christoph Keller, Great Falls; and Mrs. S. D. Hooker, Helena. Mrs. Christler was authorized in case of necessity to appoint some one to represent the Diocese of Montana in Duluth.

The Committee on the Revision of the Constitution reported, and the following Constitution and By-laws were adopted:

## CONSTITUTION

Article I. The name of this Society shall be "The Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of the Diocese of Montana", and in the latter capacity shall be considered "The Montana Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council".

Article II. The objects of this Society are: To arouse greater interest in all Church work, to diffuse missionary intelligence and to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese; to work to-



gether for the strengthening and upbuilding of the Church in Montana, and to assist as much as possible, the work of the National Council.

Article III. Its membership shall be composed of the Parish societies of women and children within the Diocese, and where no parish organization exists, all baptized women who desire may become individual members.

Article IV. The officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President, who shall be ex-officio United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Secretary of the Church School Service League, a Box Secretary, a Secretary of the Spirit of Missions, an Educational Secretary, a Secretary of "The Daughters of the King", and Secretary of "The Girls' Friendly Society". These officers shall constitute an Executive Board to direct the active work of the organization.

Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Article V. All amendments to this Constitution shall be presented in writing at the first session of the annual meeting, be voted upon at a following session, and be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

## BY-LAWS

### I. Duties of Officers.

Section I. The President shall call meetings and preside over them and exercise a general supervision of the work.

Section II. The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President in her absence and shall be the United Thank Offering Custodian of the Diocese. As United Thank Offering Custodian, she shall furnish the women of the Parish branches with United Thank Offering boxes and leaflets, and bring to their attention in other ways the purposes of the United Thank Offering. She shall keep a list of contributions, make collections, and put these amounts at interest. Each year a report shall be made and the third year the offering shall be made ready for presentation.

Section III. The Secretary shall prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, conduct the correspondence of the Society with Missionaries and with the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council, and keep a record of all meetings.

Section IV. The Treasurer shall take charge of all money sent to her and disburse the same as directed by the Parish or Mission sending it or by the Executive Board. She shall give a report at the Annual Meeting of all money which has passed through her hands.

Section V. The Box Secretary shall make plans for that work and report at the Annual Meeting.

Section VI. The Secretary of the Spirit of Missions shall use every effort to increase the circulation of "The Spirit of Missions", and shall report thereon at the Annual Meeting.

Section VII. The Educational Secretary shall co-operate with the Educational Department of the Woman's Auxiliary in all their plans for



Mission Study, and each year follow the courses presented by them, so far as she may be able.

Section VIII. The Secretary of the "Church School Service League", shall direct the work of that organization, and shall report in full at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Section IX. The Secretary of the "Daughters of the King" shall have a general supervision of the work of branches in the Diocese; keep a record of existing branches and make a report at the Annual Meeting.

Section X. The Secretary of the "Girls' Friendly Society" shall have a supervision of the work in the Diocese; and keep a record and report at the Annual Meeting.

2. Fees.

Every organization in a Parish or Mission shall pay annually an amount equal to five cents for each member on the roll for such organization. This fee shall be payable on or before December first of each year, and with the offering at the general meeting, shall constitute a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the Diocesan Branch.

3. Meetings.

The Annual Meeting shall be held at each Annual Convention, and general meetings may be held at such other times and places as may be designated by the Bishop of the Diocese and the President. Each meeting shall be preceded by a conference of Diocesan Officers.

4. Elections.

All elections shall be by ballot. All officers shall be elected for terms of three years.

5. Vacancies.

If a vacancy occurs, the President, with the consent of the Executive Board, shall make such appointment as shall be necessary.

6. Nominating Committee.

A nominating committee of three members shall be appointed by the Executive Board at the first session of the Annual Meeting, such Committee to report at the later session.

7. Delegates.

Each organization, whether in a Parish or a Mission, shall send two or more delegates to the Annual Meetings. Every delegate is required and expected to attend every meeting of this organization, and to make a report of the same to the Society sending her.

8. Order of Business.

The order of business at the meetings shall be as follows:

1. Calling of the Roll.
2. Reports of Diocesan Officers.
3. Reports of Committees.
4. Election of Officers.
5. Miscellaneous Business.

9. Amendments.

These By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote at any general meeting.



The following report of the Courtesy Committee was read and adopted:

RESOLVED: That we, the members of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of Montana, wish to extend our sincere thanks to the Rector and members of the Church of the Incarnation of Great Falls, for their gracious hospitality and many courtesies shown us while in attendance at our annual meeting.
