

Proceedings of the Women's Parochial and Missionary Society of Montana

Anaconda, Montana, May 12th, 1924.

The thirty-third annual meeting of the Woman's Parochial and Missionary Society of the Diocese of Montana was held in the Parish House of St. Mark's, beginning at 9:30 A. M.

The business meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. L. J. Christler of Havre, who opened the meeting with the Apostles' Creed and Lord's Prayer in unison and with Collects.

Mrs. Christler made a short address and told the Convention of her appreciation of the kindness shown her, by the Women of the Diocese during her three years as president.

Twenty women from Butte, ten from Helena, and nine from Deer Lodge were present at the meetings.

Officers to be nominated: President, Treasurer, Secretary of Girl's Friendly and delegates to the Provincial Synod of the Sixth Province, which will meet in Omaha, September twenty-first to twenty-fourth, 1924.

A motion was made and carried that the Treasurer send five dollars to the Treasurer of the Sixth Province.

All organizations were urged to pay the five cent "per capita tax" which is used to defray expenses of Stationery, etc.

Mrs. Craig of Miles City told of the Educational work in her parish for 1923 and 1924.

Mrs. George Fisk of Hamilton spoke in regard to the Church School Service League at Hamilton. Telling of Sunday evening meetings held. Also that the Church School Service League purchased a beautiful new pulpit and presented same to St. Paul's Church on Easter Day.

Mrs. Kellogg told of the Lenten Study Class in Great Falls. "The Task of the Church", was used. The average attendance eight.

Mrs. Snell told of the Helena Educational work with an average attendance of twenty.

Mrs. Winchester told of a Missionary Play given in Butte for Educational Work.

Mrs. Hirst of Lewistown, addressed the meeting on the educational work in the Parish.

Mrs. Gilbert of Dillon told of the Educational work in Dillon. In Dillon they have program meetings carried through the year, average attendance of fifteen.

Mrs. Hough of Billings told of a Bible Class lead by Rev. Mr. Matthews, with an average attendance of sixty. Mrs. Hough also told of Mrs. McDonald's work for the Alaska Box. Mrs. McDonald was given a rising vote of thanks by the convention.

Mrs. Christler made a plea for donations from all Parishes and Missions for the reconstruction work in Japan.

Mrs. Hough told of a Japanese tea given in Billings for the first relief after the earth quake in Japan.

Miss Peeples told of St. Peter's Hospital. The convention gave Miss Peeples a rising vote of thanks.

Rev. Mr. Hooker closed the meeting with noon day prayers.

The Executive Board met at 12:15 o'clock. The officers present were: Mrs. Christler, President; Mrs. Geo. Hirst, Vice-president and United Thank Offering Custodian; Mrs. Larabie, Treasurer; Mrs. S. D. Hooker, Educational Secretary; Mrs. Bennett, Secretary of the Church School Service League; Mrs. H. A. Duncan, Secretary; Mrs. Winchester, packer of boxes and Mrs. Keller for The Daughters of the King.

Mrs. Hirst told how she invested the United Thank Offering funds.

Discussed traveling expense fund for Diocesan officer.

Decided to make request to Mrs. Biller for (\$100.00) One Hundred Dollars for the Diocese of Montana for traveling expenses of Officer.

Subject of continuing in the box work or of raising money for different purposes was discussed, but no action was taken.

Board adjourned to meet at another time.

The afternoon session opened at 2:15 P. M. with prayers by the President.

Mrs. Thomas Bennett of Dillon gave a wonderful report on the work for the girls and boys of the Diocese of Montana by the Church School Service League.

Mrs. Fitzsimmons of Helena is starting a clearing house for broken lessons in the Christian Nurture Study Course. By getting in touch with Mrs. Fitzsimmons broken courses may be completed.

Mrs. Harrison of Livingston gave the report of "The Mother's Union" a new organization in the Diocese, Livingston being the first Parish to have this organization.

Mrs. Hirst gave us a very helpful and instructive talk on the work which the Young People's Service League of Lewistown, under the direction of Miss Eastman and Mrs. Hirst, have done this past winter. The many problems which came up in their League she believes are common to most parishes in their work among High School boys and girls. They are beginning to feel too old for Church School and yet they are many of them soon to leave the home Parish for college, and should be well grounded in the essentials of Christianity and Churchmanship. Only through an organization which gives them opportunity for self-expression can this be done.

In Lewistown the league had as its aim prayer, worship, service. The young people conducted their own devotional service with dignity and reverence. They used Course 13 of the Christian Nurture Series, and had spirited and valuable discussions. Some of the topics were: value of a creed; evolution; obedience; Has a Dog a Soul? Is a Lie Ever Justifiable? What is My Conscience? What is Instinct? What is Superman? The Ten Commandments up to Date. The Young People were never at a loss for ideas, nor ability to express them; what they said was often astonishing and rather shocking, but their leaders were glad to have it let out, and never showed they were shocked; neither did they let the subject close until it had been related to their life as Church boys and girls.

There were some social meetings, but these were only occasional, as the leaders felt the young people had a great deal of social life in other ways. Missionary giving was one of their objects. The problems were constant, but the leaders felt at the end of the year's work when examinations were held that the boys and girls as well as the leaders were better prepared for next year's work.

Miss May Case Marsh of New York gave a very interesting talk on "The Girls Friendly Society". She said the purpose of the Girl's Friendly is to unite women and girls and to safeguard the whole girl life in the community. Miss Marsh was given a rising vote of thanks by the convention.

Mrs. W. E. Lamb of Denver addressed the convention on the order of "The Daughters of the King". Mrs. Lamb was given a rising vote of thanks by the women assembled.

Bishop Tyler addressed the Convention on "Indian Work in North Dakota". He also closed the afternoon session with prayer. Bishop Tyler was honored by a rising vote of thanks.

Anaconda, May 13th.

The morning session was opened at 9:00 A. M. with a celebration of the Holy Communion by Bishop Faber assisted by the Rev. John Spencer of Anaconda. Later Bishop Faber addressed the convention in the Parish House on "A Deeper Sense of our Responsibility to the General Church". Bishop Faber was honored by a rising vote of thanks.

The business meeting was called to order by the president at 10:00 A. M.

The roll was called and the Secretary read her annual Report which was accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Mrs. Wm. Beard being absent, Mrs. Keller read the report of the Daughters of the King, which was accepted:

REPORT OF DAUGHTERS OF THE KING

In making out my report of the work done by the Daughters of the King, I feel that statistics are not nearly as important as the spirit in which we take up our work. This is to me a very important thing, for only by being filled with the spirit of our Master can we hope to be regarded as true Daughters of the King.

We have at present in our diocese three active chapters, Grace Chapter, Great Falls,, Trinity Chapter, Whitefish, and St. Mark's Chapter, Havre, with the prospect of adding one or two more chapters to this number. A Bishop's chapter composed of faithful and earnest young church women in the small towns in various parts of the diocese, women upon whom the Bishop can depend at the time of his visitations, will, I hope be established in the very near future.

The work undertaken by the daughters consists of serving on altar committees, providing flowers for the altar, later distributing these to the sick and shut ins, taking an active part in the choir and Sunday school; providing and caring for the altar linen and calling upon the sick and the newcomers. In our chapter a study of Old Testament History follows the regular business meeting.

In February last it was my pleasure to send Bishop McKim of Tokyo, Japan, an emergency bundle purchased by our three chapters; this consisted of one pair of beautiful wool blankets, two sheets, two pillow cases, two towels and two wash cloths. We were glad to have this opportunity of being of service even in a small measure. We have also made contributions to the Alaska box and toward securing altar linen for use in Japan.

In the days to come I trust we may be able to accomplish more in this direction, and now before closing my report, I beg to make a few suggestions: Let us make every effort to attend our regular corporate communion, if we have not already done so, let us learn our Daughters collect and use it daily. Let us also continue to make an earnest and prayerful effort to cause other parishes in the diocese to feel the need of a chapter of the Daughters of the King.

And last of all, let us be more prompt in sending in our report at the beginning of the year to our Diocesan Secretary.
