Secretary's Report.

TO GIVE a fair and full report of all the different Parochial Branches which are united in our Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, would require a close and personal acquaintance with the methods, the work and the leaders of the individual Branches, which was totally impossible to one taking up this work near the close of the year, with but a few weeks to familiarize herself with even its general details. I must crave your indulgence, therefore, to correct with kindness the inaccuracies, to overlook the defects of this necessarily meagre report.

The constitutions of the twenty Branches which have reported are what we are all familiar with, an average of three officers and an aggregate of members, a rather small percentage of whom seems to attend the regular meetings. St. James's, Fremont, however, has struck out new lines, and deserves special mention. There are four officers, who constitute the executive, untrammelled by written constitution, by-laws or popular suffrage. These ladies meet and plan the work, each of the four taking her share. Each has ten ladies pledged to help her in any work she undertakes, and with these ten, forms a special committee which carries through the matter in hand. That the plan has been eminently successful the Treasurer's report will show. That it is totally subversive of the principles of liberty upon which our glorious state is founded only shows how naturally we women take to the despotic form of government, and how well we work under it.

Liberty, if its meaning is liberty to be idle, is too costly a commodity for our Woman's Auxiliary, and we have to thank our sisters of St. James's for their object lesson in simplicity of government, resulting in such practical application of the teaching of their patron Apostle.

We have perhaps four hundred members, and four hundred women, working hand in hand, and working as only women can work when thoroughly roused, ought to be doing a wonderful work in this Diocese—are doing it; for who that looks around our churches during the services, can doubt that it is the women who are mainly supporting them. Alas! my sisters, that this should be. And are we wholly without blame? We ask our brothers, husbands, fathers, to take us to the theatre, the concert, the ball; do we ask them to take us to church? Are we not too apt to leave them with their cigar and their double measure of newspaper, and go alone to church, rather than disturb their serenity? It is not for women to do the work of men; it is rather for them to put the men in noble remembrance of their duty. Women should be the urgent power of the world, men the active. And let our very name keep us in remembrance of this—that we are to assist the doing, not take the doing into our own hands.

The Parish is indeed an important part of our work as a Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. If our twenty-fifth anniversary reminds us that we are no longer in our infancy, at least we have not yet attained the full stature of a grown up diocese, and it might be well for some of our smaller Branches to make their box for their own half-paid rector, reporting it as they would one sent away. One word more about boxes. I noticed in the list of boxes of last year one (and it was from one of our struggling churches) to a hospital in the richest city in the Union. Let us be judicious in the selection of our charities as well as ardent in carrying them out.

I have spoken of working together. Shall I leave out praying together? If there is force in united work, is there not also power in united prayer? "Except the Lord build the house, their labor is but lost that build it." It is He Who blesseth and there is increase; Who withholdeth, and behold a famine. Let us then not forget to besiege the Throne of Grace, not singly, but in

mass, joining hands in our supplications as in our work. Let nothing but a real necessity interfere with our attendance at the special Communion for our Auxiliary, whether at home in our own parish, as it comes month by month, or here at the great annual meeting as it will be held tomorrow in this sacred place.

The suggestions that your Secretary would respectfully submit to your consideration in view of this general survey are:

I. That there should be greater communication between the Branches, keeping them in mind that they are parts of a great organization, and not each working to itself. This may be attained by the revival of the quarterly meetings which have fallen into abeyance during the past year, and a fuller attendance both at them and at the annual meeting. Also by a system of visiting, at least the smaller Branches, by the officers of the Diocesan Branch, who may thus become more closely acquainted with the special conditions of work in the different Branches, and also bring encouragement and help to those who are struggling under difficulties, and a sense of the largeness of the work and of the great army of workers to those who are feeling narrow lines pressing them in on every side.

II. With this larger view of the Auxiliary as a great living organization, with a thousand hands and a thousand hearts working and praying together, there should be also greater individualism in the work. We should carry our interest and enthusiasm into our homes, teaching our children to love the Church and the Church's work, urging upon our men the needs of the Church, which should be their opportunity, even as the noble women of old armed their knights for the battle.

III. We need to study. We are so ignorant of all that is going on throughout the great Church Militant. We ought to want to know how our Brethren are faring here at home, East and West, South and North, and across seas in China, in Japan, in Africa.

These suggestions are presented in all humility. We have gained nothing these last two years in size, perhaps we have gained in concentration and energy. Let us see to it this next year we do not fall back.
