President's Address.

OMAHA, NEB., May 20, 1902.

Dear Women of the Auxiliary:

Another year has passed, once more we are assembled in this Cathedral, and the walls are again echoing the sounds of praise "to Him from whom all blessings flow."

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you, my fellow workers in the cause of missions, to this our annual meeting, also to our Bishop and the Clergy here assembled, and our good friends who have so kindly come to us from a Sister Diocese, I bid you a hearty, cordial greeting.

And now I ask the question: "What have we accomplished as an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions during the past year?" Four new branches have been organized, one reorganized, and two quarterly meetings held. The monthly meetings of this city have been well attended, interest manifested and interesting papers read. There have been three Junior branches formed. Through the efforts of our first vice-president, Mrs. Williams, and her secretary, there has been greater interest shown and the work is steadily growing.

We have the Periodical Club. Though not one of the branches of the Auxiliary work, it is so closely allied with us that its office and reports are classed with our Diocesan work.

Our record is not what it ought be, and are we, the women of this Auxiliary, satisfied with the results? Were each of us asked these questions what could we reply? Have we, as members of the Auxiliary, done all that we should? Have we given all that we could? Have we made any real sacrifice or denied ourselves anything for God, His work and missions?

What we have done—has it been as a duty or a real love for Him and for those who know Him not?

Lastly, how many have you and I tried to interest in this great work of missions? Do you, my women, realize what the need for workers in the missionary field is? Both at home and abroad, for Diocesan, Domestic and Foreign Missions, the need for workers and the support of the work is great. And to assist in this is the work of the Woman's Auxiliary.

I wonder how many present realize and understand what the Woman's Auxiliary really is. May I tell you? It is the Church claiming her daughters as her own. Claiming their love, their service and their devotion. Its history is very briefly told.

Thirty years ago, in 1871, in Baltimore, Md., it began as an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, with the most flexible of constitutions to govern it, and only one condition of membership, namely—that of being a baptized woman.

Its aims are:

- To increase the funds of the Board,
- The circulation of missionary publications,
- The education of missionaries,
- The making, collecting and distributing of articles of clothing for missionaries and their families, and
- The education of children of missionaries.

This society thus formed has grown and strengthened until every Diocese, and almost every parish, throughout the country has its branches.

How many branches have we in this Diocese, and how many of our women's names have been enrolled as workers?

May I ask the women who are present, and who are not members of the Woman's Auxiliary, why it is they do not join in the work of advancing God's Kingdom? Why is it so many intelligent church women, and baptized into the church, stand aloof from this work? And why are there so many women of our various churches here in Omaha who do not belong to the Auxiliary? Something is wrong. Is it with the women or with the clergy?

There are three departments of the Auxiliary work to which I wish briefly to call your attention. The United Offering, our Missionary Library, and the systematic visitation of the parishes and missions of the Diocese.

The women of the Auxiliary throughout our church can justly feel proud of the United Offering made last October in California, which you know amounted to over one hundred thousand dollars. Five hundred dollars of this amount was contributed by this Diocese, twenty-two branches taking part. Can not we do better than this during the next three years?

If we were to establish a more systematic and frequent collection of the funds placed in the mite boxes which are distributed to the members of the various branches throughout the Diocese, more interest might be manifested and a larger amount be given during the next three years.

A knowledge of our Auxiliary work is most important. Without this there cannot be and will not be interest, and without being interested we will not give.

If each and every member of this society would only feel it her duty to subscribe to the "Spirit of Missions" there would soon be a greater interest felt. If this is not possible, a copy can at any time be secured from our librarian, Mrs. Burnett, as well as many interesting volumes giving the history of the mission work carried on in our church. This library should be used and maintained, and I venture to suggest that each branch of the Auxiliary in this Diocese would not only consider it its duty, but a pleasure and privilege, to give an annual contribution, no matter how small, for the purchase of books.

I also feel and know that much more interest would be created in our work could there be a systematic visitation throughout the Diocese to every parish or mission, whether or not they are branches of the Auxiliary already formed. This we have found hard to accomplish owing to the expense of traveling from point to point. And I wish to urge upon you to consider and propose some plan by which a contingent fund can be created to meet such expenses. The necessity of this is great, and I trust before the closing of this meeting some action will be taken to further this end.

My dear women, it is with pleasure, in looking into your faces that I recognize many who for years have not failed to be present at these annual gatherings of faithful, earnest workers.

But with a saddened and aching heart I note there is a vacant place among us. One of our number is missing. Never again will she be found in our midst. (The place will know her no more.) One week ago today God called her unto Himself, and as we saw her laid in her last resting place I felt I could almost hear the voice of her Savior saying unto her, "Well done good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joys of the Lord."

It is indeed hard to realize that never again will she be found with us; never again within these walls will we hear the sound of her voice, or feel the warm pressure of her friendly hand. No more shall we see her form move up these aisles and take her accustomed place. Never more shall we behold her sweet and lovely countenance illuminated with Christian faith and hope, but ever will her memory be cherished and revered by the congregation of this Cathedral, by the members of this Auxiliary, yea, by all throughout the length and breadth of this Diocese Mrs. Clarkson will ever be lovingly remembered, as is also her sainted husband, the Bishop. She is not dead, she has only gone before. For such a life as hers we should not sorrow. For her there is a beautiful resurrection. Her life and example should ever encourage and stimulate us in our work for God and others.

We all know that the work of the Clarkson Hospital was very dear to her. Could not we, the women of the Auxiliary, take a part in the erection of the new building which will be a monument to her work and zeal in the care of the sick and suffering? Let us try. Let us assist in carrying on the work she has left for others to do.

And now my dear friends and workers, in conclusion I wish most sincerely to thank you for the help and support you have given me during the years that it has been my privilege to work with you. For your co-operation, manifestation and interest I thank you. During the three years I have served with you as your president I feel my work has fallen far short of what it should have been. Visits throughout the city and Diocese arranged for I was unable to make, and work planned I was prevented from carrying out owing to severe illness in my family both this and last year. With the anxiety and care which comes to us when a loved one is laid low, I have been prevented from carrying on the work of the Auxiliary as it should have been. I have always received your sympathy, patience and assistance, and I thank you for it. May God bless and keep you; may you be more earnest to do His will in this work of the Woman's Auxiliary in Nebraska.

Pray, work and give, with a zeal and with a jealousy for God's name and glory, with a true desire for the extension of His kingdom, remembering that "he whose gift saves a soul has earned reward."
