Annual Report of the Secretary.

Reverend Father in God, Madam President:

We would respectfully report the work of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, which has been done to the best of our ability, and according to the requirements of the constitution.

Four officers' meetings and two quarterly meetings have been held and recorded, besides the five monthly meetings recorded by a secretary appointed for the same. Letters have been answered, notices given, and reports sent to the General Secretary as required.

Five new branches have been organized, and junior branches.

Early in September the President called the Omaha and South Omaha branches together in the Cathedral Chapel for an informal meeting to arrange the work for the coming year. The subject discussed was, a course of study to be taken up at the monthly meetings. A chairman and secretary were appointed by the President to take charge of these meetings.

Box lists were provided for the branches that wished them, the Diocesan Supply Box taking a number to be divided among the smaller branches, work for the Clarkson Hospital was recommended.

The first quarterly meeting was held at Plattsmouth, October 31st, which was well attended. The enthusiasm and zeal manifested were an inspiration to all present. At the opening service sixty-five women received the Blessed Sacrament, a greater number than at any previous meeting.

The morning hours were devoted to business, a letter of resignation from the second Vice President was read and accepted with regrets, and upon ballot Mrs. Frankish of Holy Trinity, Lincoln, was elected to fill the vacancy. Lavish hospitality was shown by the ladies of Plattsmouth in the luncheon served at the beautiful home of Mrs. Cook.

At the missionary meeting in the afternoon, the Bishop's address was on Missions in general, and the work of the Diocese. An able paper was read by Mrs. Orcutt of Lincoln on "The True Mission of Christian Womanhood." An address by Mr. Selden on "The results of time, money and prayers, given by Christian women as it is felt in the mission field of Alaska," and a com-

plete outline of a year's systematic study of Africa was given by Rev. Mr. Wise of S. Martin's Church, South Omaha. A spirited meeting for Juniors followed, which resulted in forming a branch of the Junior Auxiliary in S. Luke's Parish.

The second quarterly meeting was held at Fremont, February 20. A kindly welcome and unstinted hospitality were shown by the Rector and ladies of Fremont, and as a proof of their renewed interest in Auxliary work, S. James ladies asked to be enrolled as a living branch, after their silence of several years. At the afternoon meeting an interesting paper was read by Mrs. Clinton Miller on "Woman's Work in the Auxiliary." The Bishop spoke feelingly of the Indians of the Northwest, and urged support for the Indian schools.

The Rev. Mr. Craig delivered a forceful and eloquent address on "Missions in the Life of the Church," and the Rev. Mr. Fitz spoke of his work among the University students at Lincoln.

On February 17th the Rev. Dr. Webb conducted a quiet day for women in S. John's Church, Omaha.

At the annual meeting, May 19th, when the year's work was brought to a close, twenty-two branches were represented by 127 delegates, and fully three hundred church women were present, the Bishop and fifteen Priests. More than one hundred women received the Holy Communion.

After the regular routine of business, the following officers were elected for the coming year:

At the meeting in the afternoon, Bishop Williams made a short address of welcome, told what had been accomplished with the \$300.00 known as the "Bishop Williams Fund," and introduced the speaker of the afternoon, Miss Lulu Higgins, a lately returned missionary from Africa, who gave a most interesting description of the country, the people, the work of the missionary and its results

The Rev. Mr. Mackay made an address on missions, and the Rev. Mr. Fitz spoke of "The Duty of the Church to the State University."

An interesting Juniors' meeting followed, conducted by Mrs. Williams, who gave a complete report of work accomplished by the Juniors. Miss Higgins told the children of the little African boy who had been given to her. A \$50.00 scholarship was soon pledged for him. The little Chinese girl was provided for, for another year, and the largest and most successful meeting ever held in the Diocese came to a close.

The Rev. Dr. Lloyd spoke to the Auxiliary women the following day in the Cathedral, which was interesting and instructive and full of encouragement.

Thirty-two active contributing branches are reported and twenty-two Junior branches. I am unable to say how many active members there are till all of the branches have reported, but as has been the case in the past, we are made to face the deplorable fact, that a very small proportion of the women of the Church take part in the work of the Auxiliary. We, who are interested, have every reason to be encouraged over this year's work. Under the conscientious, considerate administration of our able President, Mrs. Noe, the many letters she has written, and visits made, a feeling of closer relationship, and mutual understanding exists throughout the whole Diocese, and all deeply regret her inability to go on with the work.

Owing to the condition of the treasury, we have not been able to get any one from out of the Diocese to enthuse us during the year, but we have ever had our own Bishop, and his faithful clergy to encourage and assist us, and we would render our appreciation and thanks for the kindly interest, and wise council which have so willingly been given to our every wish and need, And we would also pray that more women of this Diocese be aroused to a fuller realization of the privileges offered them of helping to make ready this part of the Kingdom for the coming of the King.

Report of the Junior Auxiliary.

We have in all eighteen active and enthusiastic branches, including Plattsburgh, Ashland, Wymore, Blair, Auburn, Florence, Schuyler, Lincoln, South Omaha and Omaha, with over two hundred names enrolled.

The Omaha branches, which naturally I know the most about, have been working like little troopers all fall and winter, and their reports show it.

We have had nine monthly meetings of the officers with their President, Mrs. Williams, which have been well attended and have proved a great help to the leaders of the different branches.

We have also had two quarterly meetings, which have been beneficial, interesting and a connecting link for the city branches, bringing the children together and giving them the thought of the one object in common for which they are all working.

The first quarterly meeting was held at S. John's, Bishop Brook of Oklahoma being the principal topic of interest. Our second quarterly meeting was held at S. Mathias, where a new branch had just been organized. There was an unusually large attendance at this meeting, and this time Bishop Keator of Olympia was the subject for the day.

The pledges this year have been a credit to the Juniors, and each branch has their own interesting little way of earning their money; some sell seeds, others pop-corn balls, fancy articles, candies, or by giving little entertainments. Then a number of boxes have been filled with clothing; and gowns, sheets and towels made for the Hospital; and yet this is not all the children have done, for with their work some time is given to the study of the Bishops and their work.

In the line of study Rev. Mr. White of S. Andrew's has set us all a very good example. He, with the help of his Juniors, has made a curtain with each Bishop's name, territory and picture on it, and then, too, he has a map with each territory marked with a black line, and each child is taught and obtains a clear idea of the Bishops, how they look, their work and their territory.

In time we hope each branch may be the proud owner of one of these very necessary outlines or study.

Constitution.

ARTICLE I.

This society shall be called the Nebraska Branch of the Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this society is fourfold: 1st. To diffuse missionary intelligence. 2d. To increase missionary activity among the women of this Diocese. 3d. To unite previously existing societies in a common interest. 4th. To encourage the formation of new societies for missionary work.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of the Church in the Diocese of Nebraska shall be considered members of this association.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a President and four Vice Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall be chosen by ballot at the annual meeting. In case of a vacancy in any office the same may be filled by appointment of the Bishop, and any person so appointed shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the associations, to call special meetings of the same, and to countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice Presidents to preside in their several districts in the absence of the President, and it shall be the duty of the three rural Vice Presidents to superintend the work of the Auxiliary in their respective districts.

ARTICLE VII.

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the society with missionaries, with the secretaries of the associated branches, and with the General Secretary. She shall report the same once a year to the Bishop of the Diocese and the General Secretary in New York.

The Recording Secretary shall give notice and keep a record of all meetings, keep a list of the names of all associated branches, with their officers, and report the same once a year to the Bishop of the Diocese and the General Secretary in New York.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed to the work of the association, to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President and present an annual report of the same.

ARTICLE IX.

An annual meeting of this association shall be held at the time and place of the Diocesan Council. Quarterly meetings shall be held at such time and place as the President shall direct. The officers or their proxies, of each associated branch, shall constitute a delegation to the general meetings of the association.

ARTICLE X.

Any parish society becomes a branch of the Diocesan Auxiliary by paying annually one dollar, which together with the offerings at the general meetings, shall constitute a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the Diocesan branch.

Directions for Parish Secretaries and Treasurers.

1. The Secretary of the Diocese has on hand letters stating the needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools. Write to her for such letters when your branch is ready to begin work.
2. When your branch has "accepted" a letter—that is, undertaken the work which that letter calls for, let the Secretary know at once the name and address of such letter, and the name and location of your parish.
3. It is of the utmost importance that you should return the rejected letters to the Secretary immediately after a decision, so that she can send them out to other parishes without delay.
4. Parish Secretaries must also write at once to the missionary whose letter has been accepted, stating when he may expect a box and from whom.
5. Secretaries will please send, as soon as the box has been despatched, a statement of its money value to the Secretary.
6. A list of the officers of each parish branch should be sent promptly to the Secretary of the Diocese for publication in the Manual. (A type-written list would be considered a special favor by the Secretary.)
7. All items of money should be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer except those of the United Offering, which go to Miss Royce, the Treasurer of that fund.
8. Quarterly collections are desired for the United Offering.
