Secretary's Report
For the Year Ending May, 1906.

The Diocesan Secretary respectfully submits the following report for the year ending May 15, 1906:

The number of Parishes in the Diocese having a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, thirty.

Number having Junior Branches, twenty-one.

Number having Babies' Branches, sixteen.

Number having both Woman's Auxiliary and Junior Department, eighteen.

It is a pleasure to report the formation of two new Auxiliaries, one at Albright, St. Edward the Martyr, and the other at Falls City, St. Thomas.

The membership of the Auxiliaries is six hundred and seventy-three, which shows an increase over the year 1905.

Quarterly meetings were held at Ashland in November and Beatrice in February. Among the speakers at these meetings were the Rev. Robert Diggs, Dr. Palmer and Miss Crummer. In giving her personal experiences in the foreign mission field, Miss Crummer brings the work very near to the Nebraska women.

At the meeting held at Ashland, it was recommended that hereafter the Parish Auxiliaries elect their officers after Easter and before the Annual meeting in May, in order that the names and addresses of the officers shall be given correctly in the Annual Report.

One of the results of these meetings is the feeling of cordial good fellowship that springs up among those whose interests lie along the same paths.

As in other years monthly meetings have been held in Omaha and South Omaha; and St. Matthias, Trinity Cathedral, All Saints, St. Martins, South Omaha, and St. Barnabas have each taken her turn as the hostess auxiliary.

Boxes sent by the Woman's Auxiliary to missionaries schools and hospitals outside the Diocese, eight valued at \$375.50, by the Junior Department, one valued at \$15.00.

Boxes sent by the Woman's Auxiliary to missionaries and hospitals within the Diocese, fifteen, fourteen of which, valued at \$261.25, were for Clarkson and one valued at \$10.00 was for the South Omaha Hospital.

The good work of the Juniors is shown by the donation of four boxes to the Clarkson, valued at \$17.00, two to the Detention Home valued at \$7.40 and one to the Child's Saving Institute, worth \$5.50, making a total of \$29.90.

Much gratitude is expressed by the missionaries for these boxes and for their being sent when most needed for the severe weather.

In her limited correspondence with the auxiliaries, the secretary has received prompt and cordial responses, especially is this true in regard to the boxes.

Thirty-five letters have been written as well as two hundred and twenty-five postal cards.

Ninety-eight reports were sent out.

President's Address.

*Rt. Rev. Father in God, members and friends of
Nebraska Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

Assembled in this quiet room today, hardly a stone's throw from the very centre of one of the busiest portions of our city, the thought might easily come to us how typical it is of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary all over the world. Surely we could not have lived in a more turbulent, restless, noisy age. Amid the shriek of steam, the whir of machinery, the tramp of men hurrying to and fro as they labor for their daily bread or toil in factories, reducing the raw products of the earth for our bodily sustenance and comfort. Christian women are gathered here and there, sometimes in upper chambers, sometimes in quiet churches to plan, and work, and pray that men and women may not forget, amid all this hurry and care for self, that the story of the cross has not been told to all the children of our Father; that in our distant outposts in China, Japan, the islands of the Pacific and Icebound Alaska, we have faithful soldiers struggling to plant the Standard of the cross on the ramparts of heathenism; waging a bloodless warfare against ignorance, superstition and idolatry; waiting for those at home to send relief that hospitals may be built for the care of the suffering and dying, schools for enlightenment of the ignorant, reinforcements that the warfare may be waged more vigorously until the nations are brought into the fold, the heathen into the peaceful inheritance of the Lord, the number of the elect accomplished and the coming of the Kingdom hastened.

That all baptized women are not active members of the Auxiliary is largely due to personal indifference. And indifference to the work of the auxiliary is indifference to that part of churche's work committed to us. It is not that they really disbelieve in missions

or that they need intellectual conversion but that they hear, read, or see without any responsive sympathy. Many are so absorbed in home duties they do not realize that theirs may be the blessed privilege of helping on this valiant warfare.

In a church with 400 communicants, why should there be only about fifteen Active Auxiliary workers? Why in a parish with an enrollment of fifty baptized women do we find it difficult to maintain a branch or perhaps impossible to establish one. Is it nothing to you, all ye women that live in a Christian Nation enjoying Christian privileges, that there are nations where women are yet in bondage? Every baptized woman should be an active member of the auxiliary, not simply paying an annual fee but working regularly in the organization. What a contrast between a member who gives a sum of money, and one who gives her personal service to the work, who is in touch with the domestic and foreign field through the pages of the *Spirit of Missions*, who knows how her own parish compares with others in similar circumstances and whether it is giving anything like what it should toward the spread of the Gospel.

Now a few matters of practical interest. The work of the Babies' Branch organized Jan., 1904, indicates that it is likely to grow to considerable dimensions and if carried on persistently by parents who have enrolled their children as "Little Helpers" will weave the habit of systematic giving as a cable strand by strand until at last it becomes so strong they cannot break it.

More time has been devoted during the past year to the study of missions than before the adoption of "The Forward Movement." If these study classes are conducted in the right spirit we cannot fail in results.

If after studying a mission field active interest is allowed to wane; if we forget to remember it in our prayers we may have gained intellectually but we

have lost spiritually, for every time our spiritual emotions are quickened and the impulse to do a service for others dies within us, ere we put forth effort we grow gradually into a condition where inertia waits on all our promptings to action.

A quiet day for women of the diocese was held in Trinity Cathedral during the second week of February. It was conducted by Bishop Osborne, of Springfield who in many beautiful illustrations from the Bible of the successful woman and the woman who fails, expressed most beautifully this thought of service. "Good women he said are fellow helpers with God for the perfection of man."

We believe it is well for the diocesan president to understand something of the conditions existing in the various branches in the diocese, that she may more intelligently minister to their needs. Acting in this belief she has visited 19 of the 28 branches.

It has seemed wise to hold at least one quarterly in a part of the diocese remote from the See City. It might be well, judging from the enthusiastic meeting held in Beatrice, to hold at least one quarterly a year in a remote part of the diocese, where the Auxiliaries do not have the advantage of contact with others. Miss Crummer has given most generously of her time and strength in visiting many of the branches. We feel that all who have had the privilege of hearing her delightful talks have been brought much closer to our work in China and to a broader view of the work of our women Missionaries.

It does seem dear friends, does it not, as though each branch could have a fairly good report if a little time, a little effort and a little money were expended every single week during the year?

If a branch has only five active members and each woman set aside in preserving time three glasses of fruit for Clarkson Hospital, they have given to the value of three dollars. Eight yards of sheeting and they have three sheets for two dollars, six night dres-

ses three dollars. Each woman drops a penny a week in her United Offering Box and lo at the end of fifty-two weeks the branch reports \$2 60. Follow the same plan in giving to Foreign Domestic, and Diocesan Missions and they report \$2.60 for each of these. They may then send in the report that they have given in money and work the sum of \$19.40. Each woman has given in money \$3.88 in fifty two weeks. If this is too much omit giving to one or more of the objects mentioned, but something has been given systematically and the branch will grow according to all natural law for only by doing may we grow stronger.

But in some parish or mission there may be but two or three women who care anything at all for mission. A poor woman once dropped her mite in an alms box and her Lord told the story which has lived for centuries.

There is surely not a parish or mission in this diocese in which we may not have a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. If the members meet but twice a month to study missions and pray for those into whose hands the Lord has given the active work.

The Nebraska Branch is rapidly approaching her majority. She will be twenty-one years of age May, 1907, if we count birth days from the first year she published a report. Growth has marked her progress from infancy. We pray for her broadening and deepening yr spiritual life as the years roll by and that she may ever retain the enthusiasm and buoyancy of youth tempered by the ripe wisdom of maturity.

Constitution.

ARTICLE I.

This society shall be called the NEBRASKA BRANCH
OF THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this society is fourfold: 1st. To diffuse missionary intelligence. 2nd. To increase missionary activity among the women of this diocese. 3rd. To unite previously existing societies in a common interest. 4th. To encourage the formation of new societies for missionary work.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of the church in the diocese of Nebraska shall be considered members of this association.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers of this society shall be a President and four Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers shall be chosen by ballot at the annual meeting. In case of a vacancy in any office, the same may be filled by appointment of the Bishop, and any person so appointed shall continue in office until the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the association, to call special meetings of the same, and to countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI.

It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to preside in their several districts in the absence of the President, and it shall be the duty of the three rural Vice-Presidents to superintend the work of the Auxiliary in their respective districts.

ARTICLE VII.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings and conduct the correspondence of the society with missionaries, with the secretaries of the associated branches, and with the general secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York. She shall keep a record of all meetings, prepare and keep a list of the names of all associated branches with their officers, and shall report the same once a year to the Bishop of the diocese and the general secretary in New York.

ARTICLE VIII.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed to the work of the association, to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President and present an annual report of the same.

ARTICLE IX.

An annual meeting of this association shall be held at the time and place of the Diocesan Council, Quarterly meetings shall be held at such time and place as the president shall direct. The officers or their proxies, of each associated branch, shall constitute a delegation to the general meetings of the association.

ARTICLE X.

Any parish society becomes a branch of the diocesan auxiliary by paying annually one dollar, which, together with the offertories at the general meetings, shall constitute a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the diocesan branch.
