The thirtieth annual meeting of the Nebraska Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, was held in All Saints' Church, Omaha, Tuesday, May 16th, and at Jacobs' Hall, Wednesday, May 17.

The opening service was the celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Williams, the celebrant, assisted by the Reverend T. J. Mackay, Rector of All Saints, and Rev. R. S. Flockhart, Assistant Rector. Ninety-eight women in attendance. Offering \$9.79.

The business meeting was held in the Guild Room, called to order by the Diocesan President, Mrs. Philip Potter, and roll call was answered as follows: Ashland, St. Stephen's, 4; Beatrice, Christ Church, 1; Columbus, Grace Church, 3; Fairbury, Immanuel Church, 5; Falls City, St. Thomas, 2; Florence, St. Mark's, 2; Fremont, St. James, 3; Lincoln, Holy Trinity, 5; Lincoln, St. Luke's, 1; Nebraska City, St. Mary's, 3; Omaha, All Saints, 16; St. Andrew's, 14; St. Barnabas, 15; Cathedral, 22; St. Philip the Deacon, 4; Good Shepherd, 5; St. Paul's, 15; Plattsmouth, St. Luke, 12; South Omaha, St. Martin's, 12; Schuyler, Holy Trinity, 4; Wymore, St. Luke's, 2; Wyoming, Christ Church, 3; York, Holy Trinity, 3; Winnebago, All Saint's, 8. There were five visitors from Council Bluffs, and one from Chicago, welcomed to the meeting.

Miss Grace Lindley from the Church Missions House, New York city, was introduced and gave a word of greeting from Miss Emery and the Board. Then fol-

lowed the annual address from the President, Mrs. Potter.

Reports were then received from Mrs. Albert Noe, Vice President, and the District Vice Presidents. On motion these reports were approved. Mrs. T. H. Tracy, Diocesan Secretary, then read her report, which, on motion, was accepted. Mrs. J. D. Fairchild, Diocesan Treasurer, then read her report which, on motion, was accepted. Then followed the reports of the Custodian of Boxes, the Educational Secretary, the Diocesan Librarian, the Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club, and the Treasurer of the United Offering: all of which reports, on motion, were approved. Then followed the reports of the Directress of the Juniors, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Juniors and the report of the Bishop's Guild, which reports were, on motion, approved. The reports being completed, the Bishop then gave his annual address.

Pledges were taken for the coming year, with those for the Bishop's Special, as usual. The meeting then adjourned for luncheon, which was served by All Saint's, Good Shepherd, and St. Martin's Churches.

The afternoon session opened at two o'clock. After some announcements the election of officers took place. This resulted as follows: President, Mrs. Philip Potter; Vice President at Large, Mrs. Albert Noe; Secretary, Mrs. T. H. Tracy; Treasurer, Mrs. J. D. Fairchild; United Offering, Miss Jessie Royce; Custodian of Boxes, Mrs. James A. Tancock; Diocesan Librarian, Mrs. J. P. Trimble; Directress of Juniors, Miss Eleanor Sprague; Assistant Directress of Juniors, Miss Alice Fry; Secretary-Treasurer of Juniors, Miss Caroline Barkalow; Delegates to Triennial meeting at St. Louis, Mrs. Philip Potter, Miss Caroline Barkalow, Miss Jessie Royce, Mrs. Oscar Williams, Miss Dora Wiggenhorn; Alternates, Mrs. C. G. Hargrave, Mrs. H. J. Peck, Mrs. Robert Doherty, Mrs. Wm. Jones, and Mrs. T. J. Ryan.

Then followed a few words from Mrs. Butler and Mrs. Ahmel from the new branch at Winnebago. The

annual letter from Miss Emery was read by the Secretary. On motion, it was decided that the Honorary President, Mrs. Arthur L. Williams, should present the United Offering from Nebraska at the Triennial meeting at St. Louis. Miss Lindley then gave the annual address for the meeting, stressing the educational part as a means to increase both the interest and membership. Mrs. Fowler, the Missionary in charge of the Woman's work at Winnebago, then presented in a few words the needs of the Indians in her charge. Mrs. Allingham, Secretary of the Iowa Branch, brought greetings from Iowa, and invited our ladies to attend their annual meeting to be held at Sioux City on the 22d and 23d. Mrs. Star, from St. Mark's Parish of Chicago, gave a word of greeting.

The Secretary was instructed to send a message to Mrs. John Williams expressing regret that she could not attend the meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 4:30, closing prayers being read by the Rev. George St. George Tyner.

After the adjournment, Sectional Conferences were held.

The evening session was held in St. Barnabas' Guild room, opening with a short service by the Rector, Rev. Lloyd B. Holsapple, who also gave the stereopticon lecture on the "Conquest of the Continent." The offering was \$4.30.

Wednesday morning business was resumed at Jacobs' Hall, opening with a service conducted by Rev. W. S. Leete. The President reminded the ladies that September 29th was the day set apart by the province for special Communion Service, and advised that missionary addresses be given every branch. Dr. Jeffrey, a Medical Missionary, is expected to make the address in Omaha for the city branches. The questions discussed, were "In What Three Ways Does the Auxiliary Help Most?" and "What Does the Auxiliary Most Need?" The clergy who were in attendance assisted in this discussion. A vote was taken to make the definite

aim of the Auxiliary for the coming year an effort to Increase the Membership.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 with a Benediction by the Bishop.

## President's Address



Right Reverend Sir: We are gathered today to make to you our annual report, and transact the regular annual business of the Auxiliary.

Women of the Auxiliary: It becomes my very great pleasure to bid the women of the Diocese of Nebraska welcome once more to our Annual meeting. These reunions are very pleasant; we enjoy them more and more as the years go by. We have a wonderful bond of union and friendship in the work for our Lord and Master. We miss some familiar faces, one especially from the Cathedral, Mrs. S. H. Burnett, whose faith and works will be an inspiration to all who knew her as long as memory lasts.

We greet with pleasure the new faces, especially those of the younger women. We find them more and more willing to take some of the responsibility and they are efficient. They find us older ones a little set in our ways some times, but they are learning to manage us, and the old guard keeps up its interest faithfully, beautifully.

Our gifts are a little larger each year, but can we not still do more? Beside our cash gifts, we now have two of our young women at work in the South, two in Western Nebraska, one in Alaska, and one just ready to graduate in Philadelphia, who will take up the work amongst the Southern Mountaineers.

Since our last annual meeting, the Provincial meeting has taken place in our own Diocese, and we have had a panoramic view of the missionary work being done by the other dioceses and districts in this province. The splendid addresses gave us fresh courage and inspiration, and made us realize very thoroughly that all eleven are engaged in the same work for our beloved church.

With the Bishop's consent, we have abandoned the semi-annual meetings, as the district meetings seemed to make the semi-annual meetings unnecessary.

The Church Periodical Club has begun its work under Madam Leete of Plattsburgh, and any of you who have Church papers or magazines that you are willing to mail to the missionaries or clergymen on small salaries, will confer with Madam Leete at any time.

Last summer was gathered up the One Day's Income, and many are resolving to make this an annual gift to missions. The women of the Auxiliary will surely be glad to lead in this. Will you please discuss in your own home branches in what three ways the Auxiliary helps the most, and what three things that the Auxiliary most needs. This suggestion comes from Miss Emery.

The favorite study has been, this year as always, Bible study, but as you will hear, many of our members have been taking the course in the Business of Missions, a little dry, but most necessary.

Outside of pledges for Diocesan and General Missions, interest has centered around Alaska and St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai. Of the \$100,000.00 which the Woman's Auxiliary started to raise two and a half years ago for St. Mary's, all but \$5,000 is subscribed. Of this amount, Nebraska has given \$200 and nearly \$100 more is pledged.

Will you please think over what should be our definite aim this coming year. Let us have a goal and work toward it. "Are the faithful few so very faithful when they bring in no more members?" We shall commence the new year with a special service September 29th, a day set apart in this Province for a missionary gathering. Dr. Jeffrey of China, is expected as the special speaker in Omaha. In your other branches, can you not have a talk by your Rector, or some invited speaker, on some special portion of the missionary field?

I want to thank you, one and all, for your very cordial hospitable reception of me, whenever I have visited you. It has seemed to me a great honor, and has certainly been a deep joy to work with you. Let us feel, everyone of us, that there is nothing too much for us to do in the Master's service. Perhaps in that way we may

attain the great Happiness defined by Phillips Brooks, as  
"A great love and much serving."

Branches of this District have responded liberally in their donations toward the amount to be raised for the building of the new St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai, having given \$67 in all thus far.

All the Branches have members interested in Mission Study, the larger Parishes having two or three classes.

NO. 2—NORTHWESTERN.



I have the honor to submit the following report of District work done during the past year:

June 1—Visited Silver Creek, where I enjoyed the hospitality of Mrs. Bell. A meeting of the Guild was held at her home, with good attendance. I took with me United Offering Boxes. Mrs. Boman was elected Treasurer.

Septemeber 10—Visited Central City and met the Guild at the home of the President, Mrs. Scott. Twenty-one members were present. I put out United Offering Boxes, and there was a Treasurer appointed for this work. There is here a good prospect for a Junior Branch.

September 11—Visited Palmer and called on eight women that morning. Mrs. Carklin was very anxious for the ladies to have the Auxiliary, but no interest was awakened, so no work has been done.

September 24—Met Mrs. Noe on morning train and we went to Central City for a District meeting, which was held at Mrs. Hord's. There were in attendance, twelve from Central City, six from Columbus, and three from Silver Creek. The collection was sent to Mrs. Fairchild.

November 8—Visited Niobrara. Was entertained at Mrs. Chambers' and Mrs. Saunder's. Guild met with eighteen present, at Mrs. Clark's. We had a fine meeting. Elected United Offering Treasurer and gave out boxes.

November 9—Visited Neligh, but had no meeting.

November 10—Visited Norfolk. Met the Guild at the home of the President, Mrs. R. E. Brashear. Left United Offering boxes with them. Mrs. A. K. Leonard agreed to take charge of the Juniors.

November 11—Visited Madison between trains; had

a talk with three ladies of the Guild. I talked about the money we hoped to raise for Saint Mary's School, Shanghai, in all these places. I have received money for the School from Norfolk, Madison, Fullerton, Niobrara, Cedar Rapids, Silver Creek, and Columbus; also one dollar from the Rector of Neligh. Have sent \$28.25 to the Treasurer.

NO. 3—SOUTHEASTERN.



This District has five active Branches and Christ Church, Wyoming, is the only country parish in the Diocese.

All branches have weekly meetings during Lent and monthly meetings at other times; except Wyoming which, during the past year, has had open meetings every two weeks, which were enjoyed by neighbors and friends of other denominations. This branch having been organized only two years with nine members, now has seventeen. They have worked on their altar hangings and other things, that were needed for their Church. Also given generously to the Theological Students Special, and for their study have used the Spirit of Missions and the Bible. It is the only Branch reporting the Study of the Bible.

St. Mary's, Nebraska City, is making their box work—the "Theological Students Special," and one student, who has been remembered by them for three years, will be for one more year. It hopes to give the vestments from this year's and next year's special, with Wyoming's help. A bandage circle was organized in this branch and with voluntary contributions of money in large and small amounts, also a large gift of material, bedding and towels have done splendid work. Eight hundred and thirty-five surgical dressings were made, valued at \$100.00, by the Lincoln Branch.

Luncheons were given during Lent at the weekly meetings of St. Mary's Branch and it has promoted a cordial feeling among the women members of the Parish and many new members have been added to this Branch. The luncheons were made as simple as possible, the amount that could be spent being limited; four hostesses served luncheon and the pledge was met before it was realized. The mark of thirty members which was worked for so hard, has been passed and thirty-eight members are now enrolled for St. Mary's, Nebraska City. Mr. Barnes gave a series of talks at four o'clock, on the day

of the meetings during Lent; also had readings from the Spirit of Missions and a United Offering talk.

The District meeting was held in the early part of September, 1915, at Christ Church, Wyoming, with fifty-one members present. Also Rev. James Noble, Falls City; Rev. Wilber Leete, Plattsmouth, and Rev. Wesley Barnes, Nebraska City.

A short service was held, sermon given by Rev. James Noble. Holy Communion was served by the Vicar, Mr. Barnes, assisted by Rev. Mr. Leete, and the closing hymn was then sung and the meeting turned over to the Vice President. The report of the last District meeting was read, the roll called and a talk was given by the President, Mrs. Potter. Miss Royce gave an interesting talk on the United Offering, and informal talks were given on Box work and Mission Study. The meeting adjourned at one o'clock for luncheon, which was served at Mrs. Fenn's. The Southeastern District is indebted to the Wyoming Church people for their delightful hospitality.

Many of the members from this District, attended the meeting of the Synod in October in Omaha.

As a District, two plans have been worked out, the first: each Branch has sent quilt pieces to Mrs. Holmes at Santee Agency, and the second: a series of talks were given by Miss Florence Thwaits, a church woman of Cape Town, South Africa, at Plattsmouth, Nebraska City, and Auburn, which were greatly enjoyed.

The only Junior Auxiliary in this District are in Plattsmouth and Nebraska City. I have no report from Plattsmouth and the Juniors at Nebraska City have disbanded for the present, but met their pledges.

Although I have been unable to visit any Branch except Wyoming during the past year, I have kept in touch with all branches and all have met their pledges; and have done their part towards the fund for St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai.

NO. 4—SOUTHWESTERN.



The Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Southwestern District have done a good year's work—with all pledges paid to date. There are now ten (10) active Branches with five Branches of Juniors, all much interested in the work.

Visits have been made to all the Branches and personal letters sent to all the Missions in the District. Literature and United Offering boxes have also been sent to many places. Beatrice, Christ Church, has a Branch of Juniors, fifteen in number—organized last fall, and now doing good work under the efficient direction of Mrs. Fisher.

On April 10, I visited York, meeting the women of the Auxiliary at the home of the President, Mrs. Shidler, and I came away much encouraged by their interest, and the work done since my visit of a year ago.

From York, I went to Geneva, and attended a meeting of the Auxiliary on Tuesday afternoon, the Vicar of the Mission also being present. This is also the first year of active work as an Auxiliary for them, and the interest manifested promises much for next year. I intended going to Harvard from Geneva, but an epidemic of measles made it seem an inauspicious time, and the visit was given up for the present. I wish here to thank the Church women of Harvard for the gift of one dollar for the St. Mary's Hall Fund.

On Wednesday, April 12th, I met the church women at Crete in a very pleasant way at the Church. They seemed much interested, but as they are working very hard to help with the general expenses of the Church, they hesitated about taking up further work at present. If we could all realize that work done through the Auxiliary for Diocesan or General Missions counted on our own church assessments—besides giving us the benefits derived from all working together in the cause of our Master—I think even our smaller Missions would not hesitate to "fall in line."

On Thursday, May 13—A neighborhood meeting was held at DeWitt, delegates being present from Wyomore one, from Fairbury one, from Beatrice eight, with many of the church women of the town. The Rev. Mr. Mulligan preached the sermon and assisted the Vicar in the celebration of the Holy Communion.

After a very delightful luncheon served in the parlors of the Rectory by the women of the Parish Guild, the afternoon session was opened by our Diocesan President, Mrs. Potter, who gave us a very instructive talk. A plea was made for the United Offering by the delegate from Fairbury, Mrs. Cox, followed by the reading of "The Little Blue Box," by Mrs. Tyner, the wife of the Vicar of St. Augustine's. The meeting was closed by a very earnest address by the Rev. Mr. Tyner. Thanks are due both Mrs. Tyner and Miss Bradt of Beatrice, for the music.

The offering was \$2.15. Later, the out-of-town women were again most hospitably entertained at the Rectory until train time, and we all went home declaring it one of the best District meetings we had ever attended.

Fairbury was visited May 11th, having a very pleasant, informal meeting at the Church. They promise us a District meeting in the fall. For the number of members, I think their United Offering record is the banner one of the District.

On the evening of the same day, I attended a meeting of the Auxiliary at Superior, at the home of the President.

They have grown in number and in activities since their organization in 1913, being now sponsors for a very active S. S. which, instead of being looked after by the Church, is already helping in the support of the Mission. Their work as a Parish Guild, has resulted in a fund of \$145.00 for building purposes, besides all other Parish work. They hope to increase their Mission pledges as soon as possible but meeting as the Mission does, in a rented building, they have felt obliged to do a great deal

of their work at home. The District has paid the pledge, \$25.00 given to the St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai, fund; the response from the different Branches being most generous. While the work done in the last three years seems small, five Parish Branches have been organized beside three Junior Branches, and I believe we are all stronger and more interested in Missionary Work everywhere.

## Secretary's Report

For the Year Ending May 16, 1916.



The first work for the year 1915-16 was the meeting of the Executive Committee to arrange for the second annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Province of the Northwest. This was held in Omaha, October 28, 29, 30, 1915. Five Executive meetings were held, when Chairmen of different committees were appointed, conferred together, and made their reports. The semi-annual meeting was held in Omaha, October 27, 1915, when the final plans for the Provincial Meeting were explained and discussed. Thursday, October 28th, the Provincial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Sixth Province opened with Communion Service at 7:30 a. m. in the Cathedral, Bishop Williams, Celebrant, assisted by Very Reverend J. A. Tancock. Breakfast was served by Mrs. Tancock, assisted by the Trinity ladies, in the Deanery. Business meeting followed in Jacobs' Hall, beginning at 9 o'clock.

Friday, October 29th, an all-day meeting was held at Brownell Hall, when the main subjects for discussion were: Apportionment, Social Service, United Offering, Missions in the Province, and Missions outside the Province. The speakers were Bishop Brewer, Mrs. Thomas, Mrs. Foster, Mrs. Burnside, Rev. Philip Deloria, Mrs. Watzek, Mrs. Longley, Mrs. Holmes, Bishop Faber, Dr. Gardner, Miss Rattle, Deaconess Goodwin, Miss Willis, Miss Hilliard, and Miss Smith.

Luncheon was served by the Omaha ladies in the dining room of the School, Miss Johnson, the Principal, proving a very charming hostess. At four o'clock, delegates were given an automobile ride about the city, and the day closed with five o'clock tea at the Deanery.

The business meeting on Saturday morning was held in the Cathedral Chapel, opened with a short service. General discussion of different phases of the work took

place, with interesting reports from each Diocese and District. It was voted that the Auxiliary in the Sixth Province should aim at raising \$1,000 for St. Mary's, Shanghai. The meeting closed at 12 o'clock, after which the Juniors held a round-table conference.

First monthly meeting of Omaha, South Side and Florence, was held October 22d, Jacob's Hall, the Cathedral Branch in charge of the program. Subject: "The Provincial Meeting."

Second monthly meeting was held in St. Andrew's Church, November 26th, with Mrs. Miller in charge of the program. Subject: "Africa."

Third monthly meeting was held in St. Martin's, South Omaha, January 28th, with Mrs. Watkins in charge of the program. Subject: "China."

Fourth monthly meeting was held at All Saints' Church, February 25th, Mrs. Oscar Williams in charge of the program. Subject: "Alaska."

Fifth monthly meeting was held at St. Barnabas' Church, March 31st. Subject: "The Philippines." Stereopticon lecture given by Rev. Lloyd B. Holsapple.

Sixth monthly meeting was held at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Mrs. S. R. Patten in charge of the program. Subject: "Japan."

Current topics were discussed through all these programs.

The first Parish to make its report was the Schuyler Branch.

Total number of Branches formed..... 35

Total membership as given in reports..... 700

Notice of all meetings have been sent to the newspapers and Secretaries of Parish Branches. 100 cards sent out and 60 letters written.

## Report of the Directress of the Junior Auxiliary



### For the Year 1915-16

Twenty organized Junior Branches have been reported during the past year. No Junior text book was issued this year but many Branches report Study Work on Current Topics. A special book for Juniors on Latin-America, will be out in October. Will not each Branch try to use it and devote as much time to study as possible?

The Christmas box for 1916 is to be sent to Elizabeth House, White Bluff, Tenn. 200 useful and joyful gifts will be needed to make the box complete.

## Constitution



### ARTICLE I.

#### NAME.

This Society shall be called the NEBRASKA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

### ARTICLE II.

#### OBJECTS OF THE SOCIETY.

The objects of this Society are: 1st, To diffuse Missionary activity among the women of this Diocese; 2nd to unite previously existing Societies in a common interest; 3rd, to encourage the formation of new branches for Missionary work.

### ARTICLE III.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

All baptized women of the Church in the Diocese of Nebraska shall be considered members of this Society.

### ARTICLE IV.

#### OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice President at large, four District Vice Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Directress of the Junior Auxiliary, an Assistant Directress of the Junior Auxiliary, a Secretary-Treasurer of the Junior Auxiliary, a Treasurer of the United Offering, a Custodian of Boxes, an Educational Secretary and a Diocesan Librarian.

These officers, with the exception of the four District Vice Presidents, who shall be appointed by the Bishop and the President, shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting and a majority of those present and voting shall constitute an election.

Vacancies in office shall be filled by persons appointed by the Bishop, said appointees to serve until the next Annual Meeting.

### ARTICLE V.

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The President, and in her absence, the Vice President at Large, shall preside at all meetings of the Society, call special meetings of the Society and countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the District Vice Presidents to visit and organize auxiliaries and to superintend the work of their respective districts.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings and conduct the correspondence of the Society with Missionaries, with the Secretaries of the Associated Branches, and with the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York. She shall keep a record of all meetings, prepare and keep a list of the names of all Associated Branches with their officers, and shall report the same once a year to the Bishop of the Diocese and the General Secretary in New York.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed to the work of the Association, to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President, and present an annual report of the same. It shall be the duty of all other officers to perform such duties as shall pertain to their respective offices.

#### ARTICLE VI.

##### MEETINGS.

The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held at the time and place of the Diocesan Council.

A semi-annual meeting shall be held at such time and place as the President shall direct. All members may participate in the deliberations of these meetings, but only three delegates or their proxies of each Associated Branch shall be entitled to vote.

#### ARTICLE VII.

##### FEES.

Any Parish Auxiliary becomes a branch of the Diocesan Auxiliary by paying annually one dollar, which with the offerings at the general meetings shall constitute a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the Diocesan Branch.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

All Church societies, composed of women or children in this Diocese, if they so desire, shall be considered branches of this Auxiliary. They will be expected to send annually a report of money given and work done for Missions, to the Diocesan Secretary.
