MINUTES
OF THE
Thirty-second Annual Meeting

May 14, 1918

The thirty-second annual meeting of the Nebraska Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Omaha, May 14th, in the Cathedral Parish House, Mrs. Tracy, Diocesan President, presiding.

Rt. Rev. Arthur L. Williams, Bishop of the Diocese, opened the meeting with a communion service in the Cathedral at 9:00 a. m., assisted by Canon Marsh and Rev. Harry Tancock, Acting Dean. There were seventy-one communicants and the offering was \$6.85.

The regular session opened in the Parish House at 10:00 a. m., with the address of welcome by Mrs. Alfred Blundell, Vice-President-at-Large, followed by the annual address of the Bishop.

Mrs. Williams, wife of the Bishop, then invited every one to the Bishop's reception at their home, and asked all Diocesan officers to assist in entertaining.

Roll call showed the following members and delegates present: Beatrice, 2; Blair, St. Mary's, 2; Blair, St. Margaret's, 3; Columbus, 3; Fremont, 3; Lincoln, Holy Trinity, 4; Lincoln, St. Luke's, 3; Nebraska City, 4; Norfolk, 3; Omaha, All Saints, 18; Omaha, St. Andrews, 11; Omaha, St. Barnabas, 13; Omaha, St. Paul's, 12; Omaha, St. Philip's, 4; Omaha, Good Shepherd, 6; Omaha, Trinity Cathedral, 17; Omaha, St. Martin's, 8; Omaha, St. Matthias, 2; Plattsburgh, 14; Neligh, 3; Schuyler, 4; Winnebago, 3; Wymore, 1; Wyoming, 5; York, 3.

Mrs. Philip Potter, Chairman of the Committee on

Amendments to the Constitution, made some suggestions and recommendations. Discussion followed regarding the use of the United Offering, whether it should go entirely to the support of women workers in the missionary fields, or part of it be used for buildings or for the care of women workers when ill. We have one hundred women workers in the domestic mission field; should some form of insurance be put in effect for the workers?

Moved by Mrs. Potter, seconded by Mrs. Blundell, and carried, that the amendments to the Constitution be left to the delegates to the triennial convention.

The annual letter from Miss Lindley was read with a special call for a diocesan worker to attend the conferences.

Rev. Mr. Barnes, of Nebraska City, asked permission to announce that at 3:00 p. m., in the crypt of the Cathedral a special meeting for educational leaders would be held, and at 8:00 p. m., a conference on Church work and Junior plans would be held in the same place.

Reports of officers were resumed as follows:

Mrs. J. D. Fairchild, Diocesan Treasurer, reported the best work ever done in the Diocese.

As the Bishop Williams Special was reported short \$11.50 it was made up at once by individual contributions.

Mrs. Oscar Williams, Educational Secretary.

Mrs. Wm. H. Jones, Custodian of Boxes.

Mrs. M. C. Nicol, Diocesan Librarian, being ill, report was read by Mrs. John Douglas.

Miss Eleanor Sprague, Directress of Junior Work, reported 22 branches.

Miss Alice Fry, Vice-President-at-Large for Juniors, reported visits made.

Miss Caroline Barkalow, Secretary-Treasurer for the Juniors.

Miss Lucy Updike, President of the Bishop's Guild, being absent, report was read by Mrs. Williams.

Mrs. Joshua Leete, for Church Periodical Club.

These reports, on motion, were accepted. It was also reported that the Adelaide Williams Scholarship was over-subscribed this year and suggestion made that the boys, in starting new organizations, might start a scholarship.

Bishop Williams announced that as this was the fiftieth anniversary of the Diocese of Nebraska, a special service would be held on Wednesday morning at 10:00 o'clock in the Cathedral to celebrate the anniversary. He also confirmed the invitation to the reception at their home, Wednesday night.

Mrs. Potter asked that a vote of congratulations be extended to the pioneer members, the oldest member, in point of membership, being Mrs. Dexter Thomas. Also asked that a rising vote of sympathy for the death of Mrs. A. L. Poppleton, who died during the year, be taken. All stood for a moment in silent sympathy, and prayer.

Lunch was announced to be served by the ladies of Trinity Cathedral at 1:00 o'clock.

Bishop Williams offered the noon prayers.

Mrs. J. P. Trimble reported for Spirit of Missions.

Mrs. S. D. Barkalow, chairman for the Pilgrimage of Prayer, made a report on the splendid work done.

The nominating committee, which had been appointed by the executive board, Mrs. Clinton Miller chairman, offered the following names for nomination which were placed on the blackboard for inspection:

Council then adjourned for lunch.

AFTERNOON SESSION

At 2:00 p. m., the Council reassembled. Mrs. Tracy
read her annual address.

The election of officers being next in order, Mrs. Guy Brown moved that the report of the nominating committee be accepted and the secretary instructed to cast the vote for the ballot; this was seconded and unanimously carried.

Delegates to the Provincial meeting were elected as follows: Mrs. Philip Potter, Mrs. Oscar Williams, Mrs. T. H. Tracy, Miss Eleanor Sprague, Mrs. J. D. Fairchild. Alternates: Mrs. Charles Tyner, Mrs. Albert Noe, Mrs. Alfred Blundell, Miss Dora Wiggenhorn and Mrs. A. E. Marsh.

Election of a nominating committee proceeded as follows: Mrs. Sloan, chairman, Mrs. C. N. Janecek, Mrs. A. E. Marsh, Mrs. Chas. Perkins, Mrs. S. E. Yoder. Moved and seconded that the nominations be closed. Carried. The secretary was instructed to cast the ballot for the nominating committee.

As Miss Royce wished to explain why she could no longer be the United Offering Treasurer, she was called to the platform, and said that she had been made a member of the Board of Religious Education for Sunday School Work and did not have time for both.

Bishop Williams introduced Rev. Dr. Wood, from the Missions House, New York, who gave a talk relative to Auxiliary Work.

Rev. Dr. Rollitt, Field Secretary of the sixth province, gave a short talk on the work of the Diocese.

Pledges for the next year were taken by the treasurer, Mrs. Fairchild.

The offering was taken amounting to \$14.80.

Mrs. Williams announced the names of the chairmen for the Red Cross drive in Omaha, from each Church.

Miss Fowler gave a short talk on the Indian work of Winnebago, and put on the blackboard a list of things needed badly for the maintenance of the school. Little Mamie Logan, a 5-year-old Indian girl, recited the Lord's Prayer, Twenty-third Psalm, and the Ten Commandments.

A recess of one hour was taken for conference, following which the pledges for Winnebago were taken.

Nomination for Chairman of the Committee for Prayer Work in the fall; Miss Katherine Hilliard was unanimously elected, and is also to attend the Conference to represent the Diocese as requested by Miss Lindley.

Minutes of the meeting were read by the secretary and approved.

Mrs. Tracy proposed a rising memorial for all members of the Auxiliary who have died during the year. The following names were given: Mrs. A. L. Poppleton, charter member Trinity Cathedral; Mrs. Chas. W. Bragg, Mrs. Mark Parmer, of Trinity Cathedral; Mrs. Helen Weilles, wife of Rev. C. S. Weilles, Trinity Church, Norfolk; Mrs. Helen Woolsey, charter member of Christ Church, Wyoming; and Mrs. R. R. Livingston, charter member of St. Luke's, Plattsouth.

The meeting then adjourned with benediction by the Bishop.

President's Address

Right Rev. Sir, and Co-Workers of the Nebraska Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary:

Swiftly the days of another year have passed—a very eventful year—but I sincerely trust our reports will show that with all the war relief and Red Cross work which each of us has been called to do, has not interfered with our Church work, and that we have been faithful to both.

Our week of the Pilgrimage of Prayer, under the able management of Mrs. Barkalow, chairman, stands most prominent in our year's work. Mrs. Biller's visit preparatory to the training school with Miss Withers and Miss Matthews, could not have been other than a source of deep strength and inspiration with two such women as leaders. While the Vice-President-at-Large, on account of sickness, has been unable to take a very active part in the year's work, we most deeply appreciate her interest and help at all times.

The District Vice-Presidents have been another source of great helpfulness: In the Northeast District, when Mrs. Leslie asked to be released from the presidency on account of the work she was called to do in Red Cross, the board decided to have the Institute take the place of the district meeting and not appoint another president until the end of the year.

In Mrs. Thomas' and Mrs. Noe's districts splendid meetings were held when Mrs. Biller was with us. In Mrs. Yoder's district the year has been fraught with changes. She had planned several times for a meeting but changes made it impossible to hold one, but the branches have all been faithful as their reports show.

Everyone knows that the real business, hard work and success of any organization are due to the efficiency of the Secretary, Treasurer (both Diocesan and United Offering), and to the Custodian of Boxes, and we have been most fortunate in having conscientious women in these offices who have never failed to understand or neglected to carry out the tasks committed to them, and I owe them sincere thanks and appreciation.

The Diocesan Librarian, through sickness and an operation, has most successfully carried on her work.

The Educational work has proceeded with regularity and has become a vital part of our work. We have learned many things from our capable Educational Secretary—one is that the more knowledge we have of missions, the harder we will pray. And the Juniors, with their corps of splendid officers in the glory and freshness of their youth, are a most encouraging part of our work, and are living examples of their aim: "To become valuable officers and members, so that by their efforts the Woman's Auxiliary may become a stronger force in bringing the world to Christ."

The Church Periodical Club and the Spirit of Missions have carried and brought many interesting and happy bits of news and kept us in touch with others during the year.

Credit is due each Parish president and every Auxiliary member for work done during a very trying year, when many other calls have been made upon their time and money.

The problems which confront us for the new year are rather appalling; many calls for help will crowd in from all sides. The duties of citizenship will make insistent calls upon us all. Let our judgment be guided by prayer, that we may be inspired to a better service in our work for the Church and the hastening of Christ's Kingdom.

NO. 1—NORTHEASTERN.

Saturday, September 29th, Corporate Communion was held at Trinity Cathedral at 10:00 a. m. Immediately after the service a business meeting was held in the crypt of the Cathedral.

Saturday, November 3rd, Mrs. Biller, of South Dakota, wife of the late Bishop Biller, spoke to the Auxiliary women at Dean and Mrs. Tancock's, 3217 Dodge street, at two o'clock. Her talk was very inspiring and we all had the pleasure of a little informal visit while tea was served.

November 11th, I wrote letters to six Parishes in the district arranging the closing day of prayer and

notifying the other Parishes by phone. In Nebraska we were asked to give our offering on St. Andrew's Day to fulfill our pledge to St. Agnes School, Kyoto.

When I was asked for a report at the Council, my chagrin was great for owing to the great need of war workers I had resigned. It is always with great regret that one leaves a place that she has tried to fill, but the regret is far greater, let me assure you, if she leave that place with the feeling that much was left undone.

I have the honor to submit the following report of District work done the past year.

I had the great pleasure of introducing our new President, Mrs. T. H. Tracy. She talked on United Offering and Auxiliary work. At 12:30 luncheon was served at Mrs. O. T. Bishop's residence. At 2:00 p. m., we returned to the church. Rev. Freebern opened services with prayer. Miss Fry gave a talk on Junior Auxiliary and Little Helpers' work. Mrs. W. H. Jones addressed us on Box Work in the Diocese. Mrs. George Biller spoke on Auxiliary and Missions.

A meeting of the Northwestern District of the Wom-

an's Auxiliary was held at St. Stephen's Church, Silver Creek, on November 1st. That morning Rev. Purce came to Columbus, where communion was celebrated. He then, very kindly, took Rev. Purce opened our meeting with prayer. Mrs. Fred Caulton gave us a very hearty welcome. Here, I also had the pleasure of introducing Mrs. T. H. Tracy, where she again addressed us on United Offering and Auxiliary work. Mrs. J. B. Jones talked on the Pilgrimage of Prayer. Mrs. W. H. Jones talked on Box work. The Pilgrimage of Prayer was observed in this Diocese, beginning July 15th. I wrote letters to each Auxiliary in the Southeastern District asking the members to make the week one of devotion.

The annual meeting of the District was held in St. Mary's Church, Nebraska City, on the second of November. The meeting opened with a celebration of the Holy Communion, the Rev. Mr. Noble and the Rev. Mr. Barnes, Celebrants. Forty women partook of the sacrament. A brief morning session of the Auxiliary then took place, Mrs. Tracy presiding. Mrs. Biller spoke on Box Work in South Dakota, after which there was a general discussion of Box Work, the Pilgrimage of Prayer, the Church Periodical Club and other matters of interest to the Auxiliary. Luncheon followed served by the hospitable women of St. Mary's branch. The afternoon session came to order at 2:30. Miss Morton, president of St. Mary's branch, graciously welcomed the visitors. Mrs. Tracy, Diocesan President, responded. Miss Donelan, of St. Luke's, Plattsmouth, gave an interesting address on the work of the Junior Auxiliary, after which time was given for discussion. Mrs. Biller, from the Board of Missions, was the speaker of the day. It was a great privilege to have her present. Her address on the "Many Missionary Needs" inspired all present to greater effort. She made an appeal for St. Luke's Hospital, Kearney, which resulted in fifteen dollars being sent to St. Luke's for the purchase of bedding. Rev. Mr. Barnes gave an historical sketch of St. Mary's Church. The following delegates responded to roll call: St. Mary's, Nebraska City, 15; St. Luke's, Plattsmouth, 11; Christ Church, Wyoming, 6. There were also a number of visitors.

February 7th, in company with Mrs. Oscar Williams, I visited St. Luke's Auxiliary, Plattsmouth. It was a great pleasure to visit St. Luke's and to see how earnest and active its members were. While in Plattsmouth we were the happy guests of Miss Barbara Gering and family. The branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in this District are not numerous, the few however, are

strong and do excellent work. St. Mary's, Nebraska City; St. Luke's, Plattsmouth; St. Thomas, Falls City; Christ Church, Wyoming; Ascension, Auburn; also the Auxiliary at Peru, report all pledges for the closing year paid and generous box work done. I have left out statistics, as they will be reported by other officers.

The Southwestern District of the Woman's Auxiliary has ten Parish branches with four Junior branches. We planned a District meeting for October, then for the middle of January; but both times circumstances were such that it was given up, and sickness made it impossible for me to hold one later on. Letters have been written, and literature sent each branch, and personal visits made to DeWitt, Superior, Fairbury, York and Geneva, these last being among the most pleasant events in the year's work. I also tried to arrange for a meeting with the Church women at Crete, but it was not convenient for them to have one at this time. In some of the branches the meetings have not been regular, our women finding it hard, without the help and encouragement of regular Church services, and with the extra work entailed because of the war's activities, to go on with the regular Church work, not realizing, as many of us do not, that now, if never before, the Church must be in the "front line trenches." We attempted a Study Class at Wymore, and shall hope to derive much more benefit from the one we promise to have during the next Lenten season.

Secretary's Report

For the year ending May 14, 1918.

In June, 1917, Mrs. Tracy called the first executive board meeting for a luncheon, that all the members might become better acquainted and plan the work for the coming year.

The first regular meeting was held September 8th, and the dates for Mrs. Biller's engagements in the Diocese were announced.

On September 29th, all the Omaha branches met in Trinity Cathedral for a Corporate Communion, with Dean Tancock as Celebrant.

Monthly meetings were held in the different Omaha Churches as follows:

October 26th, at St. Barnabas' Church, Father Holsapple offered special prayers for our country at war. Interesting reports on the Cambridge Conference were given by Miss Royce, Miss Fry and Miss Barkallow. On November 3rd, all the Auxiliary women of the City were invited to meet Mrs. Biller at the home of Dean and Mrs. Tancock. Three speakers were present, Bishop Williams, Mrs. Biller and Deaconess Mills.

January 4th, a special meeting was called to arrange for the Institute, which was conducted by Miss Matthews and Miss Withers on January 15th to 18th inclusive.

January 25th, at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Dr. Mann, of Council Bluffs, spoke on the Missionary spirit.

February 22nd, at St. Martin's, South Omaha, Rev. Mr. Marsden talked on the work of the Episcopal Clergy at the different camps and cantonments.

March 14th, the Quiet Day was held at the Church of St. Philip the Deacon, to which all Church members were invited, Father Leete, of Plattsmouth, conducting it.

April 5th, at All Saints Church, Rev. Dr. Mackay offered the prayers and the short litany for the war,

then the Inter-Parochial Guild presented their play, "The Radiant Hem."

April 26th, at St. Andrew's, arrangements were made for the annual council meeting.

Fifteen meetings in all were held through the year.

The District meetings have been well attended and some of the Diocesan officers have attended each one.

One new branch, St. Matthias, Omaha, has been formed, and one branch, at Decatur, has dropped out, leaving forty branches in all, with a membership of about 900.

I should like to say that a great deal of Red Cross, war relief and other war work has been done by some of the branches, which cannot go into the Annual Reports, but deserve honorable mention.

During the year three of our clergymen have gone into active war service. Rev. Chas. Tyner, of St. Luke's, Lincoln, has been in France for the past seven months. Father Holsapple, of St. Barnabas, Omaha, is at Camp Cody, and now Dean Tancock is with the Nebraska Hospital Unit as Chaplain, at Fort Des Moines, and is soon to go over.

Notices of all meetings have been sent to the daily papers. All notices of interest in the Diocese sent to the Crozier. Eighty-eight letters, pertaining to Auxiliary work, have been written, and blank reports sent to all branches.

Have written about one hundred letters and would like to add, have received very thankful and appreciative replies from those receiving the gift of a box this year, which goes to show we are doing a good, useful and necessary work in sending these boxes. If I had time to read some of the "thank you" letters I am sure they would enthuse all to greater endeavor. I think our Bishop will be gratified to know how willingly the Branches have responded to the call for boxes to All Saints' Mission and School at Winnebago, Nebraska, in which he takes a great interest.

Report of Educational Secretary

* *

The educational work of our Auxiliary for 1917-18 has met the conditions facing the Church as a whole since our entrance into war. The complete absorption of many workers in war activities, "I have married a wife, I pray thee have me excused." Because of this our returns would seem inadequate, but increased effort on the part of others has raised the average of accomplishments.

The Pilgrimage of Prayer reached us in our turn, July 15th to 22nd inclusive, and we observed the final week—last before advent—with the whole Church, as planned by Miss Emery. Mrs. Barkalow, as chairman, will speak of the joy and inspiration of this movement, although the far-reaching results may never be known to us.

In January, through our officers at the Church Missions House in New York, we were privileged to hold an Institute, having Miss Withers and Miss Matthews as leaders, with enrollment of 109. Miss Withers' classes were on organization and methods, presenting the Christian Nurture Course with the new Junior plan, using charts and practical demonstrations from her own school. Miss Matthews, in four morning classes, outlined the study for the year, "Missions According to the Bible." Giving the Bible, not alone as our definite authority for missions, but as a Missionary Book first of all, was a new idea to many and proved a valuable study. Her four afternoon classes were on the Woman's Auxiliary—its purpose and its aim, stressing *our individual* responsibility as members. The last session on Prayer called us to develop our devotional life, praying daily for missions, that we may have our part in hastening the Kingdom of our Lord and His Christ. After a quiet hour we dispersed, with thankful hearts.

A missionary address was delivered by the Rev. W. E. Mann, of Council Bluffs, before the monthly meeting in February at the Church of the Good Shepherd, and St. Mary's Inter-Parochial Guild presented a

play "The Radiant Hem," under the direction of Miss Hilliard, at the meeting in March at All Saint's Church.

A Normal Class for leaders, led by the Educational Secretary, with an enrollment of 12 and average attendance of 7, was held before Christmas, on the Bible Course prescribed.

Five visits were made in the Diocese, when educational work and plans were presented and classes started. These visits are bright spots in the work of the Educational Secretary, and I wish every Parish and Mission in the Diocese might be visited at least once each year.

In the summer a group of young women, one from Trinity Cathedral, one from St. Andrew's, and two from St. Barnabas, were sent by the Diocesan Board of Religious Education to the Cambridge Conference. Others from Omaha joined this group, making a fine representation. This year it is hoped to send another group to the Conference at Racine, Wisconsin. This is an opportunity for help and inspiration very essential to educational leadership, and would be of great value to your incoming Educational Secretary.

Wonders may be accomplished by an enthusiastic worker in each Parish along educational lines; these leaders forming a committee with the Diocesan Educational Secretary as chairman, coming together when possible for discussion of plans and methods. Let us give the educational work a real place. I appeal to you women of the Auxiliary here assembled to elect such an officer on the staff of your branch for the coming year.

In closing, I wish to thank all my leaders who so faithfully gave themselves to the joy of service through leadership, and to urge those who have been members of classes and others interested to ask themselves with St. Paul—"Lord what wilt Thou have me to do?" and be ready when He answers "Arise and go."

Report of President of Junior Auxiliary

**

Last year at the annual meeting it was decided to have a Junior Vice-President for each district as is done in the Woman's Auxiliary. I therefore submit my report by districts as follows:

In the Northeastern District, Miss Lenore Williams has visited Genoa, Niobrara, Creighton and Winnebago and reports new Junior branches at each of these places also two new ones in Omaha—one at St. John's and one at St. Philip's.

In the Southeastern District, Miss Margaret Donegan attended the District Meeting at Nebraska City. She reports the organization of a new branch of Little Helpers at Plattsmouth.

In the Northwestern District, Miss Anne Wright resigned as she married and left the Diocese. The organized branches at Central City, Columbus, Schuyler have continued work, but no new ones have been organized.

In the Southwestern District, Miss Black reports no new branches and but two Junior organizations—Beatrice and Wymore.

Miss Fry, the Vice-President-at-Large, visited the branch in Beatrice and found them interested and active.

Our annual meeting held in Trinity Cathedral on May 11, was quite well attended, 125 being present during the day. Forty-four received at the Communion Service, seven Omaha branches were represented besides Blair and Plattsmouth from out of town.

Six boxes were sent during the year valued at \$246.85 and pledges amounting to \$254.93 were paid.

In January, Miss Frances Withers held a conference in Omaha on the New Junior Plan to co-operate the work of the Church School and the Junior Auxiliary. This plan has the endorsement of the General Board of Religious Education and also of the Diocesan Board of Religious Education. The New Junior is to include boys as well as girls, and its object is "to train members of the Church in their youth to an active

membership in Missionary Service." In all cases each child is to be a member of two societies, one of which is to be the Junior Auxiliary the other to be chosen to meet local needs. Pamphlets have been issued on this plan and are to be had from Junior officers. A conference will be held this afternoon in regard to this "New Junior Plan."

In the closing of Brownell Hall we lose the co-operation of a branch which has always given generous support to the Nebraska Junior Auxiliary. The scholarship supported by Brownell Hall will no doubt have to be given up for a time. This means that we will have but one scholarship of \$50.00 a year, the "Adelaide Williams," supported by the Juniors of the Diocese. During the past year we have made a special effort to educate all Junior branches and Church schools as to the purpose of the Adelaide Williams' Scholarship. It seems that this would be a splendid time for the boys' organizations to show that they realize what it means to be a Junior Auxiliary to the Board of Missions by undertaking a Boys' Scholarship. If the boys' organizations of the Diocese would pledge but \$3.00 each per year this could easily be done. Will you not encourage the boys in your own Parish to help start such a scholarship?

The study book for this year is to be "His Star in the West," by Dorothy Giles. The helps will be graded to suit classes of different ages.

In closing my report let me say that the New Junior Plan involves many changes which must be worked out slowly, but if every leader will study the Plan and make a start towards carrying it out we will have a much larger and stronger Junior organization in Eastern Nebraska.

Constitution

♦

ARTICLE I.

Name

This Society shall be called the Nebraska Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Objects of the Society

The objects of this Society are: 1st, To diffuse Missionary activity among the women of this Diocese; 2nd, To unite previously existing Societies in a common interest; 3rd, To encourage the formation of new branches for Missionary work.

ARTICLE III.

Membership

All baptized women of the Church in the Diocese of Nebraska shall be considered members of this Society.

ARTICLE IV.

Officers

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President-at-Large, four District Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a President of the Junior Auxiliary, a Vice-President-at-Large of the Junior Auxiliary, four Junior District Vice-Presidents, a Secretary-Treasurer of the Junior Auxiliary, a Treasurer of the United Offering, a Custodian of Boxes, an Educational Secretary, and a Diocesan Librarian.

These officers, with the exception of the eight District Vice-Presidents, who shall be appointed by the Bishop, and the Presidents, shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting and a majority of those present and voting shall constitute an election.

Vacancies in office shall be filled by persons appointed by the Bishop, said appointees to serve until the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

Duties of Officers

The President, and in her absence, the Vice-President-at-Large, shall preside at all meetings of the Society, call special meetings of the Society, and countersign all drafts on the Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the District Vice-Presidents to visit and organize auxiliaries and to superintend the work of their respective districts.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings and conduct the correspondence of the Society with Missionaries, with the Secretaries of the Associated Branches, and with the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York. She shall keep a record of all meetings, prepare and keep a list of the names of all Associated Branches with their officers, and shall report the same once a year to the Bishop of the Diocese and the General Secretary in New York.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and keep account of all moneys contributed to the work of the Association, to pay all drafts on the funds when countersigned by the President, and present an annual report of the same. It shall be the duty of all other officers to perform such duties as shall pertain to their respective offices.

ARTICLE VI.

Meetings

The annual meeting of the Society shall be held at the time and place of the Diocesan Council.

Semi-annual meetings shall be held at such time and place as the District Vice-President shall direct. All members may participate in the deliberations of these meetings, but only three delegates or their alternates of each Associated Branch shall be entitled to vote at the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

Fees

Any Parish Auxiliary becomes a branch of the Diocesan Auxiliary by paying annually one dollar,

which with the offerings at the general meetings shall constitute a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the Diocesan Branch.

ARTICLE VIII.

Branches

All Church societies, composed of women or children in this Diocese, if they so desire, shall be considered branches of this Auxiliary. They will be expected to send annually a report of money given and work done for Missions to the Diocesan Secretary.
