CONSTITUTION.

I.

NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY
BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF
MISSIONS."

II.

OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.

OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall consist of a president, five vice-presidents, and a secretary and treasurer, to be chosen by the delegates from parish societies at the annual meeting, and approved by the Bishop.

IV.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings, and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexico, and one for Diocesan Missions.

The secretary and treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society, preparing and reading the minutes of each meeting.

V.

REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society, by appointing a secretary, and notifying the president. The secretary of the parish society is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VI.

VOTES.

Two votes are allowed for each parish. (If delegates disagree, the votes are lost).

VII.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April.

There may be division meetings appointed by the corresponding secretary, with the approval of the president.

The work must be directed by the officers of the different branches, and no collections of moneys or work done be reported hereafter through the corresponding secretary, as it complicates the reports of the officers to whom they properly belong, and sometimes causes duplication of the same.

The collections at division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the auxiliary, and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

VIII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.

TEN-CENT MISSIONARY ASSESSMENT FUND.

The following resolution was adopted at the annual meeting of the Auxiliary, held in Trinity Church, Moorestown, October 19th, 1882 :

Resolved, That each member of the auxiliary be assessed ten cents annually towards a general missionary fund. This assessment to be collected by the parish secretaries and sent to the secretary of the auxiliary before the annual meeting.

REPORT OF SECRETARY AND TREASURER.

THE seventeenth annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was held at St. Mary's Church, Burlington, on Wednesday, April 27th, at 10.30 A. M. The meeting was a large and interesting one, more than one hundred and fifty delegates representing thirty-six parishes of the diocese being present, together with a number of the neighboring clergy.

The morning session opened with a celebration of the Holy Communion, the Bishop of the diocese officiating. The rector of the parish, the Rev. Mr. Hibbard, gave a cordial welcome to the members of the Auxiliary, after which stirring missionary addresses were made by Bishop Scarborough and the Rev. Dr. Langford.

At the afternoon session the reports of the president and vice-presidents of money and boxes sent to the different departments of the mission field were presented and were as follows:

The corresponding secretaries read encouraging reports of the division meetings held during the year, testifying to their importance and usefulness in awakening an interest in missions.

The reports of the librarians stated that over one hundred and sixty-six papers and periodicals are regularly mailed, of which more than ninety are sent from the Upper Division, forty from the Middle Division, and thirty-six from the Lower Division. Besides these, many books, leaflets, cards, etc., have been forwarded to struggling parishes and missions in different dioceses throughout the extent of the church. The results of this truly missionary undertaking can be judged by the letters of appreciation received from those who have been benefited by it. Any person wishing to send church papers or periodicals can obtain from the librarians the names and addresses of clergymen who will most gladly receive them.

The "Ten-Cent Missionary Assessment Fund" amounted during the past year to \$128.01, the largest sum ever collected from this source, annual dues having been received from fifty parishes and missions. It was with sincere regret that shortly after the beginning of the year's work we were obliged to accept the resignations of Mrs. Thomas Roberts from the Foreign work, and of Miss Townsend from the office of librarian of the Lower Division. We are greatly indebted to Mrs. White and to Miss Kelley who kindly consented to fill the vacancies for the remainder of the year.

At the annual election, Mrs. White was chosen as Foreign vice-president and Miss Kelley as librarian of the Lower Division. With these exceptions, the officers, corresponding secretaries and librarians of the preceding year were reinstated.

The Enrolment Fund has by an appeal sent throughout the diocese again been brought to the attention of the Auxiliary. It is hoped that every parish may have a part in the thanksgiving offering to be made at the triennial general meeting of the Auxiliary at Baltimore next October.

During the year three new branches have been added to the roll : St. Paul's, Bound Brook; Holy Innocents, Dunellen, and Trinity Church, Cranford.

We bring before you to-day the report of the seventeenth year's work of the different branches of our Auxiliary. You have heard the figures, but these do not express the interest and energy which have been the motive powers of our success.

No year before perhaps has shown such progress in real interest and missionary zeal.

In those parishes where monthly or semi-monthly meetings have been held, either for work or conference upon the subject of missions,

we note the highest results. Especially is this the case where earnest rectors give to the women their sympathy and aid.

Five division meetings have been held in different parts of the Diocese, and it would be difficult to decide which was the most interesting.

We have been favored with attractive speakers, and in every instance the rector of the parish which entertained the delegates showed his approval and stimulated the workers by words of comfort and cheer.

What then do we feel has been accomplished?

Shall we not record a year of mercies and blessings, though one in which sickness and sorrow has come to many homes?

We welcome to-day several new parish branches, may they stimulate us to fresh activity. With over 1,000 members we may look forward with assurance to greater degrees of usefulness.

A little selection from a parish paper well illustrates the power of sympathetic effort: "A visitor to a glass manufactory recently saw a man moulding clay into the great pots which later were to be used in shaping the glass, and noticing that all the mouldings was done by hand, said to the workman, 'Why do you not use a tool to aid you in shaping the clay?' 'There is no tool that can do this work' replied the artisan. 'We have tried a number of tools, but somehow it needs the human touch.' In this simple reply is the philosophy of all successful church work. Neither money nor machinery can take the place of *individual* effort and sympathy."
