## REPORT OF SECRETARY AND TREASURER.

THE twenty-first annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Trinity Church, Elizabeth, on Wednesday, April 29th. The attendance and interest displayed were most gratifying, one hundred and sixty-five delegates being present from thirty-one parishes. At the opening service there was a celebration of the Holy Communion with an address by the Bishop of the Diocese. The rector of the parish welcomed most cordially the members of the Auxiliary, after which missionary addresses were made by the Rev. Mr. Oberly and the Right Rev. Bishop Talbot, the latter making an earnest appeal for his clergy and scholarship funds.

At the business meeting the reports of the secretary and treasurer, corresponding secretaries and librarians were read and accepted.

The reports of the vice-presidents of money and boxes sent to the different departments of the mission field were as follows:

The reports of the Missionary Lending Library and of the Junior Auxiliary followed, the latter reporting twenty-one branches and the amount raised in boxes and money \$631.71.

Article VII of the Constitution was amended by striking out the words "third" and "middle" and by substituting in place of "January" the word "February."

From the Ten Cent Assessment Fund which amounted to \$142.37, the following appropriations were made: For the Brierly Memorial, 88.60; Rescue Mission, Columbia, S. C., \$10.00; Associate Mission, Trenton, \$42.45.

The sum of \$821.18 was sent by New Jersey to the General Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary last October as her share to the United Offering. The amount was made up of small contributions and represented thirty-two parishes.

The president in her annual address alluded with much feeling to the recent death of Mrs. Thomas Clarkson of Beverly, the vice-president of Mexican Missions, who through a period of fifteen years had

served the Auxiliary as a most faithful and efficient officer. Mention was also made of the loss of another longtime associate, Miss Isabella P. Thompson of Salem, a member of this association from its beginning and serving for many years as vice-president of Indian Missions. A resolution expressing the great loss the Auxiliary had sustained in the death of these two faithful members was unanimously adopted.

A scholarship in memory of Mrs. Clarkson has been created in Mrs. Hooker's Orphanage in the City of Mexico.

At the annual election which resulted in the reappointment of the former officers, Mrs. Wm. B. Abbey of Mt. Holly was chosen as vice-president of Mexican Missions.

Bishop Scarborough in his closing address paid a beautiful tribute to the memory of the Rev. Dr. McAllister whose loss was in the minds and hearts of all present as they met in the church where he had so often welcomed the Auxiliary.

#### PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

---

In offering to-day our twenty-first annual report, we are glad to remember that the first meeting looking towards the organization of the New Jersey Branch Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in this church. There were only two Diocesan Branches already enrolled at that date, and we commenced with five officers and twenty parishes represented by parochial secretaries, of which two still serve in the same churches. Our Bishop, who has ever been foremost in missionary effort, by his fostering care and guidance, now welcomes 68 parishes as contributing to the missions of the Church, and aiding in the Diocesan work.

The impetus given to the missionary spirit of the Church through the grand "united offering" at St. Paul, Minnesota, last October, may never be truly appreciated in this world. With the share which New Jersey was privileged to send the earlier work of our Branch began in August and September, last year. It has been sometimes questioned why the women should require six months of rest after their six months of

winter work. No other force in nature is found taking so long a vacation. Could not the preparation for the missionary boxes be begun during the pleasant days of summer, has been asked by some of our parish branches?

Two Division meetings, with large attendance, were held at Asbury Park and Mt. Holly last fall. These were followed by two more in the winter at Plainfield and Haddonfield. We never remember more enthusiastic or pleasanter meetings in the New Jersey Women's Auxiliary. The Rectors were so cordial, the parishes so hospitable, that there could not have been greater incentives to work or earnestness manifested. Each branch has felt its pulses quickened and energies stimulated. Neighborhood meetings have been held at many parishes in both Upper and Lower Divisions. A new branch composed of five parishes has been organized in Plainfield for mutual encouragement and conference. They enjoy the gracious hospitality of the mother church in the city, and are zealous in good works.

Our vice-president for Foreign Missions has visited in various parishes and made stirring addresses. Others of the officers have cheerfully gone to many places where new branches were desired, or old ones to be revived. It is still necessary to teach our women that the last command of our risen Lord is the *first* duty of our lives. Nothing but systematic and proportionate giving can effect this change.

Miss Carter's helpful addresses were heard at different meetings, and we feel the interest in her work should attest the power of her appeals.

We listened to the Industrial systems as now obtaining in colored schools, and we trust more substantial aid will follow.

Hospitals, orphanages and schools have received help by boxes, but in all directions we find the money contributed is not adequate to the needs. Can we not in Diocesan, as in all mission work, make greater efforts to raise money even though fewer boxes should be filled? Let us not be weary in well-doing; may each one ask how much we can do without for ourselves, not how little we can spare for missions.

You have heard the resolutions in regard to our Mexican Branch and our sad loss. We miss to-day a familiar face, always cheerful and bright; we listen in vain for the quiet

tones of the dear friend who has gone to her reward. Could any tribute be more grateful to her heart than an added interest in the work she loved so well and served so faithfully? As another is chosen for this Branch, let the love and appreciation we bore our friend be expressed by more heartfelt efforts for Mexico, and an earnest desire to show that she who is dead yet speaks to us as of old.

A suggestion made at one of our meetings of a *suit* fund and clothing bureau, has worked most successfully; we have received in small sums about \$15.00, *one* clerical suit and *six* overcoats, which have aided in filling our Domestic boxes and adding to the comfort of the missionaries themselves. Their grateful letters are an incentive to future assistance.

Our librarians are still interested in their work. Let us ask each parochial secretary to aid them with contributions of literature and money for their distribution to clergymen and distant missions, where these gifts are truly appreciated by those receiving them.

The report of our Missionary Lending Library is encouraging. We should be glad that every parochial Branch would avail itself of this new aid in their work.

With great pleasure we welcome the Junior Auxiliary to the honorable position it now fills in the mission work of the Church in New Jersey. To its members we look for the future success of the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in this Diocese. The officers are to be congratulated upon the large number of Sunday schools enrolled among the churches, and the interest aroused in millions among the young.

Our meeting to-day is for the purpose of binding together the sheaves of the past year's work. May the Lord of the harvest accept our efforts and crown with His blessing the workers in our field.

As sunshine is always followed by shadows, we are brought to recall other loses in our midst the past year. On the 30th of November, 1895, Miss Isabella Thompson of Salem, was gently released from her bed of suffering. Since the organization of our New Jersey Auxiliary she has faithfully served in its various branches; for many years as vice-president of Indian Missions, afterwards, and *always*,

parochial secretary of St. John's. We must ever remember her with affection.

We, of the Elizabeth Branch, are deeply sensible of a very great loss to-day. For twenty years we have been ministered to and inspired by the life of our dear friend, Dr. McAllister. We seem to hear the echo of his voice as we gather in this beloved church, to which he last year invited our annual meeting. We look in vain to catch his cheery smile and return his cordial greetings as of old. We may not mourn for him, as he has entered upon a more blissful service above, has caught the brightness of the Saviour's face and heard the welcome "Well done, good and faithful servant," but let us also strive to enter into the joy of his Lord when our life's work has ended.

And now dear friends, what lessons do the shadows teach us individually? Is it not a fuller consecration, deeper knowledge of the *true* spirit of missionary service, and more earnest efforts for our blessed Master's sake?

## MEXICAN REPORT.

1895—1896.

We ask your indulgence for the imperfections of our report. Fourteen years ago our dear friend, Mrs. Clarkson, made her first report of the work in Mexico. You will all agree with the resolutions offered by the Executive Committee at their meeting the day after her funeral, when for the first time her place was vacant at our officers' committee meeting :

"We miss our friend and co-worker in the Woman's Auxiliary to-day and would place a tribute of love and appreciation upon our records. No more faithful officer has ever been associated with us in the work of our New Jersey Branch. The least interest has generally been accorded the Mexican work in our parishes. But ever true to the sincere impulses of her heart of love for that field, Mrs. Clarkson came with her burdens of ministry and anxiety, always displaying a cheerful spirit under the most trying difficulties which appeared to test the faith of almost all engaged in it.

She, however, never wavered in her loyalty to the country whose missions were adopted with prayerful earnestness. All that was in her power to do to stimulate the workers was most conscientiously performed, and with a gentle smile she filled our hearts with commiseration for that apparently unpromising field, while our admiration was excited by the brave, patient spirit she always manifested. We mourn her vacant place to-day, believing, however, that our Lord has called His faithful servant to a higher and more blessed service in His presence forever."

We bespeak for the work laid down your more devoted prayerful interest, not only as your duty, but as a tribute to a life-work cheerfully and lovingly carried on for so many years in our midst.

The year's report of money contributed by the twelve parishes and a friend in New York, amounts to \$179.00. Of this St. Paul's, Camden, gave \$50. After deducting \$25 for Rev. Mr. Forrester's work, we have for our two scholarships in the Hooker Memorial \$154.00.

A new scholarship, which our officers elected to add to the orphanage work, in memory of their friend and bearing the name of *Maria Lindsay Clarkson*, through the filial affection of her son this year, the \$80 has been paid to the Treasurer for work in Mexico, and has been added to the report, making the total amount \$269.00.

#### REPORT OF LOWER DIVISION.

---

The Lower Division held its fall and winter meetings on October 31st, 1895, in St. Andrew's Church, Mt. Holly, and January 29th, 1896, in Grace Church, Haddonfield. Both meetings were most encouraging. At the first, Bishop Ferguson, of Africa, made an inspiring address, and the Rev. Mr. Francis spoke eloquently for Japan. At the second, though special work was discussed, there was a strong plea made for a general missionary fund, rather than for special funds.

The neighborhood meetings held during the year were also successful. It is purposed again next winter to hold monthly neighborhood meetings, at which workers of nearby parishes can convene to discuss ways and means of work. The first of such series for the season of '96-97, will be held next September at St. Andrew's Church, Mt. Holly. Certainly, the promise to the "two or three gathered together in my name" has been made good over and over again to many a weary worker.

We would urge upon the members of the Lower Division a more hearty co-operation in their attendance upon the meetings, assuring them that there is an enthusiasm for the cause begotten at such times that is deep and lasting.

The vice-president would respectfully call your attention to the Missionary Lending Library. It was created to easily place books, pamphlets and papers of missionary interest in the hands of the parochial secretaries. As yet, few of the secretaries have availed themselves of the privilege and the library itself contains but few books, but the few that it does contain, as will be seen by the catalogue appended, are most interesting as well as educating.

It is hoped that during the coming year each parish connected with the Auxiliary, through its secretary, will use this library and also solicit donations for it. It would be an easy matter for each parish secretary to get a donation of at least one book for this library and the addition of 70 volumes during the year would give the vice-president in charge a chance to circulate a large number.

The plan as devised is simple and very little trouble is given to the parishes. You are simply requested to send for the book to the vice-president and guarantee its return, post-paid, within 30 days, an extension of time can be easily secured by postal card to the vice-president.

The Vice-president and the Executive Committee feel that this library will be of inestimable value to all the women of the Auxiliary just as soon as the habit is formed of using the books. It is a step forward in aiding the dissemination of missionary intelligence and of encouraging the missionary spirit, and will greatly aid the workers for it will stimulate an interest.

Let me most earnestly commend this to you and beg for your immediate co-operation.

#### REPORT OF LIBRARIANS.

---

The New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is now sending regularly about one hundred and forty church publications and sixty secular magazines to missionaries and others.

During the year, many large boxes and packages containing good reading matter have been sent beside over two hundred Prayer books and Hymnals of the old edition, some hundreds of Christmas and Easter cards, a few books, and much miscellaneous matter. All told, probably not less than fifteen hundred *periodicals* have been sent this year.

## DIOCESAN CONSTITUTION.

---

### I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

### II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

### III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall consist of a president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be chosen by the delegates from parochial branches at the annual meeting, and approved by the Bishop.

### IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Board shall be composed of the president, vice-presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the Executive Board.

### V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexico, one for Diocesan Missions and one for the Junior Auxiliary Work. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a missionary, lending library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women mission-

ary workers in the diocese ; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the diocese of New Jersey.

The secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting, and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office ; and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents, and parochial secretaries notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

#### VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

#### VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parishes or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

## VIII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the constitution must be submitted to the Executive Board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
