Secretary's Report.

The twenty-third annual meeting of the New Jersey Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, was held in Trinity Church, Trenton, Wednesday, April 27, 1898, at 10:30 A. M. Thirty-nine parishes were represented by about one hundred delegates. At the opening service and in the Holy Communion the Bishop was assisted by the Rev. Mr. Edmunds, Rector of Trinity Church, the Rev. Mr. Harding, of St. Paul's Church, Trenton, and the Rev. Mr. Olmsted, of St. Mary's Church, Burlington. The Bishop gave a short review of the work accomplished in the past year, and expressed a strong hope for the future. The Rev. Theodosius S. Tyng addressed the meeting, and in his clear, quiet way, gave much information on the work being done in China and Japan.

At the afternoon meeting, reports of the different branches of the work were presented by the vice-presidents and read as follows:

The Junior Auxiliary reported thirty-one branches and the value of boxes sent and the amount of money given, \$790.71, of which sum the Babies' Branch contributed \$52.49, all included in the above figures. The following resolution, passed at the last Executive Meeting, was read and adopted: The Executive Committee recommend that each Parish contribute, through the Diocesan Treasurer, the sum of \$2.00 or more annually, as a Systematic Offering to Missions.

Three new branches have been added to the roll: St. Stephen's, Camden; St. John's Sewaren; and St. Peter's, Medford.

On the report of the Nominating Committee all the officers were nominated for re-election. Mrs. Ryder, Diocesan Vice-President, declined the nomination, but it being too late for the committee to make another nomination and the delegates hoping that Mrs. Ryder might reconsider her decision, the ticket was elected as a whole. As Mrs. Ryder could not be persuaded to withdraw her resignation the Board was left without a Diocesan Vice-President.

President's Address.

The annual meeting of 1897 was held a year ago in St. Michael's Church, Trenton. Our dear friend, Dr. Langford, came from New York to address the members of the Woman's Auxiliary. A week before he had asked what he should say to the women of New Jersey.

Could the lesson have been more complete, had he known that these were the last words he would ever speak to those for whom he never considered any trouble too great which might draw them nearer to the missionary cause so dear to his loving heart! Few of us had ever heard such a grand, concise epitome of the work of Missions in our own country from its earliest conception. His bright presence, his gracious smile can never be forgotten, as with those most persuasive words, he urged the duty of personal work for the Master. Two months had scarcely flown, when the tidings of our great loss came to thousands of sorrowing hearts; but he had entered into the eternal joys reserved for the faithful servant of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Our work in the Autumn began, still in the shadow of this general grief, shared by the whole church, at Red Bank, early in October. A remarkably large meeting of the Upper Division came to hear the words of loving testimony to his friend by Bishop Scarborough. The Rev. Dr. Osborne, of Newark, gave us a grand foreign missionary sermon. Mrs. Williamson kindly asked the privilege of printing it, and she has distributed it most widely in our own and other Dioceses.

The Lower Division was entertained at Salem, the Rev. Mr. Aigner, of Mount Holly, giving us a forcible address upon the subject of woman's work for Missions, and Dean Perkins interesting all of the women in the Missions of the Diocese, showing the duty all owe to them. This was also a well attended meeting, and much enjoyed by all privileged to be there.

The mid-winter meetings were held in Trinity Church, Elizabeth, and St. John's Church, Camden, and showed increasingly large attendance and growing interest. The Rev. Mr. Atkinson, Rector of Trinity Church, spoke upon the duty of all Christians to aid the work of Missions. Almost every branch of our Auxiliary was presented by the Bishop and our Vice-Presidents, and Miss Carter and the Rev. Mr. Merrill gave us an insight into some new work among Indians. The Rev. Mr. Cole spoke in the interest of foreign Missions, and Archdeacon Johnston gave great pleasure by his spirited address upon Wyoming and Idaho.

At Camden, the women were most beautifully entertained, although there was an unusually large number present. The Rector entered into the spirit of our work and was very kind and attentive. Our own Bishop, Bishop Wells and Mrs. Hunter made addresses and the Rev. Mr. Rodrick, of St. Paul's Church, urged upon the members of the Auxiliary, as members of the Church of Christ, more earnest zeal. We have all enjoyed the help and interest the different Rectors have kindly shown us in the past year.

Two Executive meetings have been held, one at the residence of Mrs. White, Elizabeth, in October, when we were treated to an exquisite object lesson upon Japan, and

the other in March, when the Bishop and Mrs. Scarborough made us thoroughly at home at their house in Trenton. Those of our officers who were able to attend these meetings, so full of helpful teaching, have surely much for which to be thankful and must feel greater obligations in the performance of their duty.

There have been several small new Auxiliary and Junior Branches organized during the past year.

Our librarians are being much encouraged in their work by the help given them by the Daughters of the King and other young workers. We have been greatly indebted to the J. A. P. C. of Hartford, Conn. Their excellent leaflets, so useful in our Junior work, and other very helpful literature, relating to all missionary effort, have aided us in the work in New Jersey. We shall be glad when we can show by financial aid how much we prize their assistance.

Our Babies' Branch, while only one year old, bids fair to outgrow its elders. As soon as it is known, the need for its usefulness is apparent.

Each branch of our work has shown a decided gain in interest, and if the ability has not been as great as we could desire, the evident growth of love for the work, makes amends. The missionary literature and helpful maps are beginning to prove a great factor for good, only to be known and understood, to be called for.

The year has not been without sad breaches in our membership. In the early Summer Mrs. J. D. Taylor, of Middletown, was called to her rest and reward. No member of our Auxiliary has ever had the work more at heart, or given more earnestly of her means in its behalf. She was among the first interested in the Woman's Auxiliary, over twenty years ago. And on the tenth of this month, as our joys were centered around the Easter feast, our dear friend, Mrs. McRee Swift, was translated from her earthly to her Heavenly home, to be forever with her Lord. She was a most efficient member of the Auxiliary in Christ Church, New Brunswick, and it was to her untiring efforts we owe the recognition of the enrollment fund by the Board of Missions, a few years ago. May we all by prayer and faith follow their blessed examples.

The methods of the Associate Mission are to carry with them, as a first principle of duty, missionary effort outside the parish work. This aim is surely the proper one. When every woman comes to believe that as a communicant in the Church, and by reason of her baptismal vows, the last command of our Blessed Lord is as imperative, if not more so, than that of the Rector to finish, furnish or beautify the Church building, then the work of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions will have been fulfilled, as the members will divide their gifts to their Heavenly Master systematically, that there will be no lack of any service for Christ. Truly has it been said:

"The restless millions wait
The light whose dawning
Maketh all things new;
Christ also waits.
But men are slow and late.
Have we done all we could?
Have I? Have you?"

Three new parishes have been added to the roll this year, St. Stephen's, Camden; St. John's, Sewaren; and St. Peter's, Medford.

Diocesan Constitution.

I.—NAME.

The name of this Society shall be, "THE NEW JERSEY BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS."

II.—OBJECT.

The object of this Society is to interest all women in the general missionary work of the church, to communicate missionary intelligence, and to secure increased contributions and prayers for the spread of the gospel of Christ.

III.—OFFICERS.

The officers of this Society shall consist of a president, vice presidents, secretary and treasurer, division corresponding secretaries and librarians, to be chosen by the delegates from parochial branches at the annual meeting, and approved by the Bishop.

IV.—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Board shall be composed of the president, vice presidents, secretary and treasurer, and corresponding secretaries. The board shall meet twice or more each year, these meetings to be arranged by the president.

The Right Rev. Bishop of the Diocese shall be a member *ex officio* of the Executive Board.

V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

The president shall preside at all meetings and perform such duties as usually appertain to that office. The president and vice-presidents shall have charge and oversight of the several branches of mission work respectively—one for Domestic, one for Indian, one for Freedmen, one for Foreign, one for Mexico, one for Diocesan Missions and one for the Junior Auxiliary Work. There shall be one vice-president whose duty it shall be to take charge of a missionary lending library, to consist of books, maps, reports and all other literature that may be helpful to the women missionary workers in the diocese; said library to be for the use of all members of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of New Jersey.

The Secretary shall call the roll at the annual meeting, and prepare and read the minutes, performing all duties belonging to the office; and the treasurer shall take charge of all moneys appropriated to the incidental expenses of the Society.

The corresponding secretaries shall send to the rectors, vice-presidents and parochial secretaries, notices of each Division meeting, keep the minutes of said meetings, make an annual report of the same, and diffuse among the parishes intelligence concerning the missionary work of the church.

The collections at Division meetings shall be used for the contingent fund of the Auxiliary and sent to the diocesan treasurer.

Librarians shall communicate with all the parochial secretaries about such literature as may be contributed for missionary work, and keep an account of all given and where sent, reporting the same at the annual meeting.

VI.—REPRESENTATION.

Any parish may become a member of this Society by appointing a secretary and notifying the president. The secretary of the parochial branch is expected to correspond with the diocesan officers, and they *alone* correspond with the secretaries in New York, and transmit to them all moneys.

A membership fee of ten cents shall be paid annually by all members towards a general missionary fund. Each parish shall send to the annual meeting two or more delegates.

VII.—MEETINGS.

The annual meeting shall be held the last Wednesday of April. On the second and fourth weeks in October and February, there shall be meetings respectively in the Upper and Lower Divisions to enable the vice-presidents to present their several branches of work. Any other meetings which may be deemed advisable can be held at times proposed by the parishes or corresponding secretaries and concurred in by the president.

VIII.

The constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting. Any proposed alteration in the constitution must be submitted to the Executive Board in writing before bringing it before the Auxiliary.
